## VICTORIA.

LETTERS PATENT PASSED UNDER THE GREAT SEAL OF THE UNITED KINGDOM CONSTITUTING THE OFFICE OF GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF VICTORIA AND ITS DEPENDENCIES IN THE COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA.

Letters Patent,  
dated 29th October,  
1900.

VICTORIA, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith, Empress of India: To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting.

WHEREAS, by certain Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date at Westminster the Twenty-first day of February, 1879, We did constitute the Office of Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our Colony of Victoria as therein described, and its Dependencies: And whereas, in virtue of the provisions of the Commonwealth of Australia Constitution Act 1900, and of our Proclamation issued thereunder, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council on the Seventeenth day of September, 1900, We have by certain Letters Patent under the said Great Seal of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing even date herewith, made provision for the Office of Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our Commonwealth of Australia: And whereas it has become necessary to make permanent provision for the Office of Governor in and over Our State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, without making new Letters Patent on each demise of the said Office. Now know ye that We do by these presents revoke and determine the said first-recited Letters Patent of the Twenty-first day of February, 1879, and everything therein contained, from and after the proclamation of these Our Letters Patent as hereinafter provided: And further know ye that We do by these presents constitute, order, and declare that there shall be a Governor in and over Our State of Victoria (comprising the territories bounded on the west by Our State of South Australia, on the south by the sea, and on the east and north by a straight line drawn from Cape Howe to the nearest source of the River Murray, and thence by the course of that river to the Eastern Boundary of Our State of South Australia) and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia (which said State of Victoria and its Dependencies are hereinafter called the State), and that appointments to the said Office shall be made by Commission under Our Sign Manual and Signet.

II. We do hereby authorize, empower, and command Our said Governor to do and execute all things that belong to his said Office, according to the tenor of these Our Letters Patent and of such Commission as may be issued to him under our Sign Manual and Signet, and according to such Instructions as may from time to time be given to him under Our Sign Manual and Signet, or by Our Order in Our Privy Council, or by Us, through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, and to such Laws as are now or shall hereafter be in force in the State.

IV. Every person appointed to fill the office of Governor shall with all due solemnity, before entering on any of the duties of his Office, cause the Commission appointing him to be Governor to be read and published at the seat of Government, in the presence of the Chief Justice, or some other Judge of the Supreme Court of the State, and of the Members of the Executive Council thereof, which being done, he shall then and there take before them the Oath of Allegiance, in the form provided by an Act passed in the Session holden in the Thirty-first and Thirty-second years of Our Reign, intituled an Act to Amend the Law relating to Promissory Oaths; and likewise the usual Oath for the due execution of the Office of Governor, and for the due and impartial administration of justice: which Oaths the said Chief Justice or Judge is hereby required to administer.

V. The Governor shall keep and use the Public Seal of the State for sealing all things whatsoever that shall pass the said Public Seal: and until a Public Seal shall be provided for the State the Public Seal formerly used in Our Colony of Victoria shall be used as the Public Seal of the State.

VI. There shall be an Executive Council for the State, and the said Council shall consist of such persons as were, immediately before the coming into force of these Our Letters Patent, Members of the Executive Council of Victoria, or as may at any time be Members of the Executive Council for Our said State in accordance with any Law enacted by the Legislature of the State, and of such other persons as the Governor shall, from time to time, in Our name and on Our behalf, but subject to any Law as aforesaid, appoint under the Public Seal of the State to be Members of Our said Executive Council for the State.

VII. The Governor, in Our name and on Our behalf, may make and execute, under the said Public Seal, grants and dispositions of any land which may be lawfully granted and disposed of by Us within the State.

VIII. The Governor may constitute and appoint, in Our name and on Our behalf, all such Judges, Commissioners, Justices of the Peace, and other necessary Officers and Ministers of the State as may be lawfully constituted or appointed by Us.

IX. When any crime or offence has been committed within the State against the laws of the State, or for which the offender may be tried therein, the Governor may as he shall see occasion, in Our name and on Our behalf, grant a pardon to any accomplice in such crime or offence who shall give such information as shall lead to the conviction of the principal offender, or of any one of such offenders if more than one; and further, may grant to any offender convicted in any Court of the State, or before any Judge or other Magistrate of the State, within the State, a pardon, either free or subject to lawful conditions, or any remission of the sentence passed on such offender, or any respite of the execution of such sentence for such period as the Governor thinks fit; and further may remit any fines, penalties, or forfeitures due or accrued to Us: Provided always that the Governor shall in no case, except where the offence has been of a political nature unaccompanied by any other grave crime, make it a condition of any pardon or remission of sentence that the offender shall absent himself or be removed from the State.

X. The Governor may, so far as We Ourselves lawfully may, upon sufficient cause to him appearing, remove from his office, or suspend from the exercise of the same, any person exercising any office or place under the State, under or by virtue of any Commission or Warrant granted, or which may be granted, by Us, in Our name, or under Our authority.

XI. The Governor may exercise all powers lawfully belonging to Us in respect of the summoning, proroguing, or dissolving any Legislative Body, which now is or hereafter may be established within Our said State.

XII. In the event of the death, incapacity, or removal of the Governor, or of his departure from the State, Our Lieutenant-Governor, or, if there be no such officer in the State, then such person or persons as We may appoint, under Our Sign Manual and Signet, shall during Our pleasure, administer the Government of the State, first taking the Oaths hereinbefore directed to be taken by the Governor, and in the manner herein prescribed; which being done, We do hereby authorize, empower, and command our Lieutenant-Governor, and every other such Administrator as aforesaid, to do and execute during Our pleasure all things that belong to the Office of Governor according to the tenor of these Our Letters Patent, and according to Our Instructions as aforesaid, and the Laws of the State.

XIII. In the event of the Governor having occasion to be temporarily absent for a short period from the Seat of Government or from the State, he may in every such case, by an Instrument under the Public Seal of the State, constitute and appoint Our Lieutenant-Governor, or, if there be no such Officer, or if such Officer be absent or unable to act, then any other person to be his Deputy during such temporary absence, and in that capacity to exercise, perform, and execute for and on behalf of the Governor during such absence, but no longer, all such powers and authorities vested in the Governor, by these Our Letters Patent, as shall in and by such Instrument be specified and limited, but no others. Provided, nevertheless, that by the appointment of a Deputy as aforesaid, the power and authority of the Governor shall not be abridged, altered, or in any way affected, otherwise than We may at any time hereafter think proper to direct.

XIV. And we do hereby require and command all Our Officers and Ministers, and all other the inhabitants of the State, to be obedient, aiding, and assisting unto the Governor, or to such person or persons as may from time to time, under the provision of these Our Letters Patent, administer the Government of the State.

Officers and others to obey and assist the Governor.

XV. And We do hereby reserve to Ourselves, Our heirs and Successors, full power and authority from time to time to revoke, alter, or amend these our Letters Patent as to Us or Them shall seem meet.

Power reserved to Her Majesty to revoke, alter, or amend the present Letters Patent.

XVI. And We do direct and enjoin that these Our Letters Patent shall be read and proclaimed at such place or places within Our said State as the Governor shall think fit.

VICTORIA, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith, Empress of India: To Our Trusty and Well-beloved Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Victoria, Greeting.

Date: 29th October, 1900.

We do, by this Our Commission under Our Sign Manual and Signet, appoint you the said Sir John Madden to be during Our pleasure Our Lieutenant-Governor of Our State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, with all the powers, rights, privileges, and advantages to the said office belonging or appertaining.

Appointment of Sir J. Madden, K.C.M.G., to be Lieutenant-Governor.

II. And further, in case of the death, incapacity, or removal of Our Governor of Our said State, or of his departure from Our said State, We do hereby authorize and require you to administer the Government thereof, with all and singular the powers and authorities contained in Our Letters Patent under the Great Seal of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date at Westminster the twenty-ninth day of October, 1900, constituting the office of Governor in and over Our said State of Victoria and its Dependencies in Our Commonwealth of Australia, or in any other Our Letters Patent adding to, amending, or substituted for the same, and according to such Instructions as Our said Governor for the time being may receive from Us, or through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, and according to such Laws as are now or shall hereafter be in force in Our said State.

To administer Government thereof, during Governor's absence. Recites Letters Patent constituting office of Governor. Powers and authorities.

III. And We do hereby appoint that this Our present Commission shall supersede Our Commission under Our Sign Manual and Signet bearing date the twenty-ninth day of April, 1899, appointing you the said Sir John Madden to be Lieutenant-Governor of Our Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies.

IV. And We do hereby command all and singular Our Officers, Ministers, and loving subjects in Our said State and its Dependencies, and all others whom it may concern, to take due notice hereof, and to give their ready obedience accordingly.

## THE GORDON SHIRE COUNCIL AND THE LODDON UNITED WATER TRUST.—APPLICATION OF MUNICIPAL FUNDS.

for a period of one week from the 20th December, 1901, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than two females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said two females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

The births of 962 children, viz., 477 boys and 485 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of November. The number was, it will be observed, the lowest recorded for the month during the last eleven years, except 1897, and 150 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, or 213 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths recorded in November numbered 525, viz., 294 of males and 231 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 437, or by 83 per cent., as against 67 per cent. in November, 1900, and 79 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, 91 less than in November, 1900, and the lowest recorded for the month during the last eleven years, except 1894; it was also 96 below the average of November during the previous ten years, or 131 below it allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 23.68, and of deaths registered to 12.92 per annum; as compared with averages of the same month in 1900 of 26.18 and 15.69 respectively; and during the last ten years of 29.06 and 16.22 respectively; and averages of the whole year of 29.74 and 16.16.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 97.0° on the 24th, and the lowest was 39.3° on the 7th. The mean temperature of the month (63.7°) was the highest for the month since November, 1862, and 2.7° above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (44.0°) took place on the 24th, and the least range (6.6°) on the 5th. The mean daily range was 22.4°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.326 inches on the 6th, and the lowest was 29.599 inches on the 14th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.975 inches) was one-tenth of an inch above the average.

Rain fell on eight days, the amount being 1.91 inches, which was higher than in the corresponding month during any of the previous ten years except 1891, 1892, 1893, and 1899, and .57 of an inch above the average.

The mean humidity of the month was .663. Males contributed 56 per cent. and females 44 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 23 per cent. to that mortality, as against 28 per cent. in November, 1900, 26 per cent. in November, 1899, 38 per cent. in November, 1898; 32 per cent. in November, 1897; 30 per cent. in November, 1896; 33 per cent. in November, 1895; and 33 per cent. in November, 1894.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 85, as compared with 120 in November, 1900. The rate of infantile mortality was 88 per 1,000 births registered in the month under review, as compared with 117 in November, 1900; 174 in November, 1899; 208 in November, 1898; 134 in November, 1897; 160 in November, 1896; 127 in November, 1895; 115 in November, 1894; 147 in November, 1893; 112 in November, 1892; and 183 in November, 1891.

In striking contrast to the decline in the percentage of deaths of children under five years, the proportion of deaths of elderly persons—aged 75 and upwards—has shown a marked increase in the last ten years, proving infallibly that the percentage of elderly persons in the population has considerably increased, and has apparently not yet reached a maximum. This point is of considerable interest as bearing on the question of old-age pensions. The actual numbers of aged persons cannot be ascertained until the results of the recent census have been fully tabulated.

Twenty-five of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 33 in November, 1900—were from external causes, of which 17 were set down to accident, 5 to homicide, and 3 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—An accountant, aged 43, was passed over by a railway train; a grocer, aged 63, died of injuries to the head, the result of a fall from a cart; a carrier, aged 33, and a labourer, aged 49, of injuries, caused by being crushed by the pole of a lorry and by an elephant respectively; a blacksmith, aged 37, of fracture of the skull, consequent on a fall; a male child, aged 9 months, of heat apoplexy; four boys were drowned whilst bathing, viz.:—A boy, aged 9, in a waterhole at Oakleigh, another, aged 9, in Hobson's Bay, and two others, aged 12 and 13 respectively, in the River Yarra; four persons were "found drowned," viz.:—A contractor, aged 31, and a shunter, aged 54, in the River Yarra, a labourer, aged 41, in Moonee Ponds Creek, and a clerk, aged 32, in Hobson's Bay; two infants, a new-born male, and a female, aged 2 months, and a wool merchant, aged 41, were suffocated by vomited matter getting into the air passages. The homicidal deaths were those of a musician, aged 33, who was shot, and a female, aged 39, who died of fracture of the skull, a verdict of manslaughter being returned in each case; and three new-born female infants, who were suffocated. The suicidal deaths were those of a female, aged 37, who cut her throat; a female, aged 37, who drowned herself; and a flower-seller, aged 18, who hanged himself.

One hundred and thirty-nine deaths, or 26 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—62 in the Melbourne, 15 in the Alfred, 3 in St. Vincent's, 4 in the Women's, 13 in the Children's, 5 in the Homoeopathic, and 6 in the Austin Hospitals; 7 in the Metropolitan and 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 6 in the Immigrants' Home; 9 in the Benevolent Asylum; 2 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor; 1 in the Protestant Refuge; 1 in the Eye and Ear Hospital; and 1 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 121, of which 65, or 54 per cent., were of males, and 56, or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 85 were under one year of age, 22 were between one and two, 3 were between two and three, 7 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 404. Of these 229, or 57 per cent., were males, and 175, or 43 per cent., were females; 13 were between five and ten, 9 were between ten and fifteen, 11 were between fifteen and twenty, 15 were between twenty and twenty-five, 17 were between twenty-five and thirty, 26 were between thirty and thirty-five, 37 were between thirty-five and forty, 27 were between forty and forty-five, 34 were between forty-five and fifty, 18 were between fifty and fifty-five, 26 were between fifty-five and sixty, 26 were between sixty and sixty-five, 41 were between sixty-five and seventy, 47 were between seventy and seventy-five, 23 were between seventy-five and eighty, 19 were between eighty and eighty-five, 10 were between eighty-five and ninety, 2 were between ninety and ninety-five, and 1 at ninety-nine.

As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, there was an increase of 5 deaths under dietic, 3 under constitutional, and 4 under developmental diseases; whilst there was a decrease of 25 under zymotic, 64 under local diseases, 8 under the head of violence, and 3 under ill-defined causes. Under the zymotic class, deaths from measles fell from 23 to nil, those from typhoid fever from 5 to 1, and those from diarrheal diseases from 12 to 4. Whooping-cough still continues to cause a high mortality, 16 deaths therefrom having been recorded in the month, as against 17 in October, 14 in September, 3 in August, and 13 in July, whilst the total since the 1st January last has been 81. Under the constitutional class, deaths from phthisis rose from 50 to 68, whilst those from cancer fell from 37 to 25, and those from other forms of tuberculosis, &c., from 15 to 7. Under the local class, deaths from diseases of the nervous system increased by 6, those from diseases of the circulatory system by 4, those from diseases of the urinary system by 7, and those from diseases of parturition by 5; whilst those from diseases of the respiratory system (chiefly pneumonia) diminished by 37, and those from diseases of the digestive system (chiefly enteritis) by 43. The favorable mortality of the month was thus due chiefly to the low fatality from epidemic diseases, diarrheal diseases (including enteritis), and diseases of the respiratory organs.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1900, and the first eleven months of 1901, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever during the month was very low.

**WHEREAS** by Part I. of the *Chinese Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1073) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, to exempt any person or class of persons from the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and to declare that such provisions shall not at any time, or for any specified period, apply to the person or class of persons mentioned in such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation exempt the Chinese named in the first column of the Schedule hereto subjoined from the provisions of Part I. of the *Chinese Act 1890* aforesaid, for the periods specified opposite their respective names in the fourth column of the said Schedule, that is to say:—

**WHEREAS** by the Land Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the *Land Act 1898*, the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 9, of the said *Land Act 1898*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 7) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Acts provided: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 7 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the First Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, 8, 9, and 11 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

No. 1106) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time, under regulations to be made for such purpose, to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council or mining board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner in which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite two or more commons, or add to such common any selection which may have been taken up within the area of such common and subsequently abandoned: And whereas it is also enacted that notices of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published, and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundred and twenty-eighth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby unite the Waranga Gold-field Common (proclaimed on the 6th May, 1861, increased by Proclamation of the 26th November, 1866, and diminished by Proclamation of 26th November 1888) with the Waranga Common (proclaimed on the 10th July, 1876, and increased by Proclamation of the 24th August, 1880) under the designation of the Waranga United Common.—(O.L. 16378.)

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at the station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

A tenderer not desiring to accept a contract for part of the requirements of any station should write against such station the words "all or none."

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for the sum of £5 per horse per station, based on the estimated quarterly consumption of 8 centals of oats, 1 of bran, 12 of hay, and 3 of straw per horse, or thereabouts, within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts where the sum stated in the bond is £50 and upwards, and one surety where the sum stated is under £50.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description of their respective kind, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depot for police purposes, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be indorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

13. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.
