PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively mentioned, viz.:-

MONDAY, THE 18TH DAY OF FEBRUARY INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Bacchus Marsh;

WEDNESDAY, THE 20TH DAY OF FEBRUARY INSTANT, as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Daylesford;

THURSDAY, THE 21ST DAY OF FEBRUARY INSTANT, as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Beac and Horsham;

FRIDAY, THE 22ND DAY OF FEBRUARY INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the City of Ballaarat;

WEDNESDAY, THE 27TH DAY OF FEBRUARY INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Devenish and Mokoan Ridings of the Shire of Benalla;

FRIDAY, THE 1ST DAY OF MARCH NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Winchelsea.

Hannan-street, from Osborne-street northwards, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ chains.
Osborne-street, from Victoria-street to Hannan-street.

Health Act 1890.

SHIRE OF KARKAROO.

By-LAW No. 1.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution, the Council of the Shire of Karkaroo, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, doth hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 1 of the said shire, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the Shire of Karkaroo.

Definitions.

4. In the construction and for the purpose of this by-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:—

“House” shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging houses, or other buildings or premises.

“Cesspool” shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground.

“Street” shall mean and include any highway and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage (whether a thoroughfare or not).

Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females; and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular; and the word “person” shall include a corporation.

General.

5. Premises to be kept so as not to be a nuisance.—Every occupier of a house or any person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause the same to be kept in such a state as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

6. Disposal of refuse and offensive matter.—No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter in any place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health.

7. Animals not to be kept as to pollute water.—No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to be a nuisance or injurious to health or to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

8. Disposal of dead or diseased animals.—No person being the owner of any dead animal shall allow such animal to remain in any place for a longer period than twelve hours, so as to become a nuisance and injurious to health, in default the council will cause such animal to be removed and destroyed at the expense of such owner.

9. Prevention of pollution of water.—No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed in or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks, or milk or other produce of such dairy.

10. Offensive matter to be deodorized.—Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way or to be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within 24 hours of notice given by the council or one of its officers.

Refuse from Houses, &c.

11. Removal of refuse from houses.—Every occupier of a house or premises shall remove therefrom all dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, or such other refuse matter produced or accumulated thereon once every week, and in case of default of such occupier, the council may remove the same.

12. Receptacles for house refuse.—Every occupier of a house or premises shall provide and keep thereon a box or some other covered receptacle for the temporary deposit of house refuse, which box or receptacle shall be of such dimensions as the same may, with the contents thereof when full, be readily and conveniently movable by one man, or so many such boxes or receptacles as may be necessary to contain all the house refuse produced or accumulated on such premises during one week, and shall cause all house refuse to be deposited as soon as conveniently may be in some such box or receptacle.

13. Removal of refuse from places where animals are kept.—Every occupier of land on which is erected any stable, shed, sty, yard, or other place for the keeping of animals, shall from time to time remove from such premises all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon as often as the same shall amount to 2 cubic yards, or once at least every fortnight, should the quantity not amount in that time to 2 cubic yards, and in case of the default of such occupier, the council may remove the same at the expense of such occupier.

14. Power to use refuse as manure.—Nothing hereinbefore contained shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any dung, soil, or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure on any garden or land contiguous to such

premises as manure, so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used as to contravene any by-law of the council, or so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

Privies, Cesspools, &c.

15. Construction of privies.—No person shall construct or cause to be constructed, any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the contents whereof do not exceed more than 3 cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth, or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging house, and every public privy shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least $\frac{1}{4}$ an inch to the foot. No closet-door or trap shall abut or open upon a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding 10 feet in width.

16. Supply of deodorizing material to earth-closets.—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all the night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or receptacle.

17. Emptying receptacles for night-soil.—Every occupier and every owner having the management or control of any premises shall once at least in every week empty and cleanse or cause to be emptied or cleansed every earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

18. Night-soil service in Beulah and Hopetoun.—In the townships of Beulah and Hopetoun no person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil except by means of the night-cart duly licensed by the municipal council, and the said licensee or driver of said night-cart shall be entitled to demand and receive for such service such sum of money for each pan or service as above-named as the council may from time to time fix or determine.

19. Night-soil, &c., removed from any earth-closet, &c., and deposited anywhere to be covered with earth.—Every person placing or depositing or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or assisting in placing or depositing on any land (whether by way of manure or otherwise) any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place of deposit shall immediately on the deposit thereof cover the same or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered with a layer of earth not less than six (6) inches in thickness.

20. Earth-closets not to be emptied into drains or sewers.—No person shall empty, cause, or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find their way or be likely to find their way into any drain or sewer.

21. Construction of cesspools.—Every cesspool shall be furnished with a water-tight cover or roof, and every cesspool formed or made below the surface of the ground shall be provided with water-tight walls, or sides which project on all sides at least 6 inches above the surface of the ground.

22. Emptying cesspools.—Every occupier of premises, and every person having the management or control of premises on which there shall be any cesspool, shall cause the same to be emptied once at least in every week.

23. Conveyances by which cesspools may be emptied.—No person shall empty, cause, or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse or offensive matter, except by means of a cart, carriage, or other conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof, or any effluvia therefrom.

24. Time for emptying earth-closets, cesspools, &c.—No person shall empty or assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse or offensive matter, except between the hours of half-past eleven p.m. and five o'clock a.m., or until such contents have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying, or causing to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse or offensive matter, shall remove or cause to be removed the contents thereof as soon as the same is emptied.

The Shire Depot.

25. Rubbish to be deposited only in places set apart for same.—Any person carting any rubbish to the depot shall deposit the same immediately adjacent to the last deposit and within the lines defined by four poles erected by the scavenger from time to time, and no person except the scavenger shall remove such poles after they are erected.

26. Only dry rubbish may be deposited.—No such deposit shall consist of anything but dry rubbish or material, and each deposit on being made shall be evenly spread and not left in a heap.

27. Night-soil to be deposited in trenches.—Every person depositing night-soil shall deposit the same in that part of the depot set apart for the purpose in trenches not less than 1ft. 6in. deep, in which the deposits shall not exceed 6 inches in depth, and be covered with a layer of dry earth not less than 12 inches in depth.

28. Carcasses to be burnt.—Any person carting or conveying the carcass of any animal to the depot shall deposit the same in an excavation made for the purpose, and provide a sufficient quantity of firewood and thoroughly consume such carcass.

29. Gates to be kept shut.—Any person using the depot shall close the gates before leaving it.

Drainage of Buildings.

30. Drainage of new buildings.—Every person erecting or causing to be erected any new building shall cause the foundations thereof and the ground over which such building is to be placed to be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, so that no water soakage or damp shall lodge there.

31. Drainage of existing buildings.—Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom; and to secure the healthfulness of the inmates of such building; and every tenant of a building under a lease of which fourteen years or upwards is unexpired shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of this section.

Dairies.

32. Registration of cow-keepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk.—Every person who is the occupier or owner of any dairy farm or milk store situated within the Shire of Karkaroc shall on or before the 1st day of January in each and every year register himself by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the shire an application in the form prescribed by the regulations approved by the Governor in Council, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a registration fee of One shilling (1s.).

33. Milk stores and shops to be kept clean.—Every person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman shall cause every milk store or milk shop in his occupation, or under his management or control, and every milk vessel used by him for containing milk for sale, to be kept thoroughly clean.

34. Dairyman, &c., to report disease to the Health Officer.—Every person carrying on the trade of cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of any such trade, shall henceforth report, in writing, to the health officer, the occurrence of any disease in any of his milk cows, or of any contagious or infectious disease in man or animal upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on.

Slaughter-houses.

35. Removal of blood from places where animals are slaughtered.—Every occupier, licensee, or person having the management or control of an abattoir, slaughter-house, or place where any cattle or other animals are killed, shall keep the premises on which he carries on the trade or business of a slaughterman in a cleanly and proper state, and shall cause all the blood, manure, garbage, filth, and other refuse products from the animals killed therein, as soon as conveniently may be, to be collected in a receptacle constructed of iron or some non-absorbent material to be provided for that purpose, and if allowed to remain therein for twelve hours to be effectually deodorized by mixing therewith commercial sulphate of iron or chloride of zinc, in the proportion of 1 lb. to the gallon, or some other efficient deodoriser, and to be removed within 48 hours after such blood is shed.

36. Keeping swine at slaughter-houses.—An occupier of a slaughter-house shall not at any time keep any swine, unless intended for immediate slaughter, or any dog, or cause or suffer any swine (unless as aforesaid), or any dog to be kept in or about such slaughter-house, nor shall he at any time keep, or cause or suffer to be kept in or near such slaughter-house any animal of which the flesh may be used for the food of man, unless such animal be so kept in preparation for the slaughtering thereof upon the premises, and any swine intended for slaughter shall not be kept in or about such slaughter-house for more than twenty-four (24) hours.

37. Supply of water to slaughter houses.—Every occupier or licensee or person having the management or control of a slaughter-house or abattoir shall cause the same to be supplied with a sufficient quantity of water for all purposes.

Penalties.

38. Penalties.—If any person commit a breach of any of the foregoing sections of this by-law he shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, provided the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid. And every person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty, notwithstanding that the council may be empowered by the by-laws or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such council have or have not taken advantage of such powers.

By-Law No. 2.

A By-law for the Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairymen, and Purveyors of Milk.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1850*, and for carrying the said Act into execution, the Council of the Shire of Bannockburn, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, hereby make the following by-law, being by-law No. 2 of the said council, that is to say—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*, and shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said shire of Bannockburn.

3. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, shall, on or before the first day of January in every year, register himself with the council in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the council an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Three shillings:—

4. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the secretary of the council shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

5. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

6. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within 24 hours of any order to such effect from the officer of health or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

7. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

8. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever, or other dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of any house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the council, and thereupon it shall or may be lawful for the said council, or the officer of health, by order as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending, and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such council or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows, or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business, until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

9. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the council, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force; and the milk of the diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

10. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

11. In the interpretation of this by-law words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

12. Every person guilty of any such breach of this by-law, or any of its provisions, shall be liable in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.— RATING REGULATION FOR 1901.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts and of all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following Regulation:—

Regulation for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust District.

1. A rate of One shilling and fourpence in the pound sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property, valued at Fifteen pounds (£15) and upwards, situated within the Waterworks District of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust is hereby made for the year 1901.

2. The minimum rate for such year, in respect of properties valued at less than Fifteen pounds (£15) sterling on the municipal value, shall be Twenty shillings.

3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before-mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Five pounds sterling per cent. on the amount of the annual valuation of same shall be charged, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Two shillings (2s.) per annum.

4. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic use, or for the irrigation or watering of private gardens, or distribution on or about such premises, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons, up to an amount equal to that the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid.

5. For every steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust, the charge shall be the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power (actual) of such steam boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use, where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made at the same rate as provided in clause four (4) hereof.

6. For water supplied for manufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) the charge will be One shilling per thousand (1,000) gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall be not less than equal to One shilling and fourpence in the pound on the municipal valuation of the Shire of Shepparton for the year 1901 of the property so supplied.

7. Water supplied to Governments departments, cricket grounds, bowling greens, show-yards, cattle-yards, and similar properties, shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum charge shall be not less than Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per annum.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrants, for each load of two hundred and fifty (250) gallons or under, Sixpence (6d.) shall be charged.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of a new building, repairs, or additions, the charge shall be Twenty shillings (20s.) per cent. on the amount of contract for stone-work, brick-work, and plastering, or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stone-work, brick-work, and plastering, or the said Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement, at the rate provided in clause four (4) hereof.

10. The Trust may require a meter to be used in any case where it is deemed necessary.

11. No person shall use or permit to be used on any premises any water for other than domestic, manufacturing, or fire extinguishing purposes between the hours of Nine p.m. and Five a.m. Any person committing or permitting a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty of One pound.

12. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or who shall use the same in any manner for irrigation purposes (except where the supply is by meter), shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

13. Any person not having agreed to be supplied with water by the Trust who shall, or who having so agreed shall, contrary to such agreement, use, take, or carry away, or wilfully permit to be used, taken, or carried away water from any drinking-tap, water-trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

14. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes, or wilfully permits to be done, anything in contravention of this Regulation, or fails to pay his or her rates when due, or fails to do anything which, under this Regulation, ought to be done for the prevention of the waste, misuse, undue consumption, or contamination of the water, or wilfully or negligently allows the water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the water supply from the premises of such person or persons by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may discontinue the supply so long as the cause or injury remains, or is not remedied to the satisfaction of the Trust.

15. The officer or officers of the Trust appointed for that purpose may at all reasonable times between the hours specified in sections 451 and 471 of the *Water Act 1890* enter any house, tenement, or land to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for measuring, conveying, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or examining if there be any waste or misuse of such water; and if any person hinders or prevents any such officer from entering or making such inspection or examination, the Trust may turn off the water supplied by it from such house or other premises, and cease to supply the same with water until such inspection shall have been permitted and effected.

16. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January, and the first day of July, in the said year 1901. The charges for the sale of water by measure shall be payable monthly, or at such other time or period as the Trust may in any case determine.

17. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

18. The word "person" in these Regulations shall include corporation.

BOORT WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1901.

BY VIRTUE OF THE WATER ACTS.

REGULATION for imposing, levying, and receiving water rates and charges within the Boort Waterworks Trust District.

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements within the Boort Waterworks Trust District shall pay for the year 1901, viz.:—

2. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting every street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement being of the annual value of Eighteen pounds or less, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement for the said years, the sum of One pound seven shillings.

3. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting any street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement being

above the annual value of Eighteen pounds, according to the municipal valuation for the said year, the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such valuation.

4. On every house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid down a main pipe for the supply of water, and to which house or tenement the water shall not have been laid on, a rate of Thirteen shillings and sixpence shall be paid when the municipal valuation of such house or tenement does not exceed Eighteen pounds. When such valuation exceeds Eighteen pounds, a rate of Ninepence in the pound shall be paid, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Thirteen shillings and sixpence be paid.

5. In every case where the water shall be laid on to a house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid down a pipe for the purpose of supplying water, the rates provided by clauses 2 and 3 of this Regulation shall be paid. Also that any ratepayer who may be considered to be using an undue quantity of water shall be compelled by the Trust to provide a meter, water to be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

6. The above rate shall be due and payable on the 1st day of May, 1901.

7. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.

- (b) That the lessee shall reside eight months during each of the first six years on the allotment. (Personal residence by the wife or any child not less than eighteen years of age of the lessee shall be considered personal residence by the lessee.)
- (c) That the lessee shall not transfer, assign, mortgage, or sublet, or part with the whole or any part of the allotment within the first six years of the lease.
- (d) Such other conditions and covenants not inconsistent with the *Land Act 1893* (Part III.) as the Governor in Council may by regulation prescribe.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the Land Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the *Land Act 1898*, the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 9, of the said *Land Act 1898*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6) shall not be increased: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the First Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 6, 7, and 8 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—
