## TRADE MARKS AND DESIGNS.—CONVENTION BETWEEN THE UNITED KINGDOM AND THE REPUBLIC OF COSTA RICA.

SIR,

I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the Colony under your Government, a copy of a Convention between the United Kingdom and the Republic of Costa Rica for the reciprocal protection of Trade Marks and Designs, signed at Guatemala on the 5th of March, 1898, the ratifications of which were exchanged in London on the 29th September, 1900.

2. I have to call your attention to Article II. of the Convention, from which you will observe that, if it is desired that the stipulations of the Convention should be made applicable to the Colony under your Government, notice to that effect must be given to the President of the Republic of Costa Rica within one year from the date of the exchange of the ratifications.

3. I have therefore to request that you will be good enough to inform me at your early convenience of the wishes of your Government in the matter.

## CONVENTION BETWEEN THE UNITED KINGDOM AND THE REPUBLIC OF COSTA RICA FOR THE RECIPROCAL PROTECTION OF TRADE MARKS, ETC.

SIGNED AT GUATEMALA, 5TH MARCH, 1898.

[Ratifications exchanged at London, 29th September, 1900.]

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, and His Excellency Señor Don Rafael Iglesias, President of the Republic of Costa Rica, desiring to conclude a Convention for the reciprocal protection of trade marks and designs, have appointed as their Plenipotentiaries, that is to say:—

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, George Francis Birt Jenner, Esq., Her Britannic Majesty's Minister Resident in Central America, &c., &c.; and

His Excellency Señor Don Rafael Iglesias, President of the Republic of Costa Rica, Honorable Señor Don Ricardo Villafranca y Bonilla, Consul-General of the Republic of Costa Rica at Guatemala;

Who, having communicated to each other their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon the following Articles:—

### Article I.

The subjects or citizens of each of the Contracting Parties shall have, in the dominions and possessions of the other, the same rights as are now granted, or may hereafter be granted, to subjects or citizens in all that relates to trade marks, industrial designs, and patterns.

In order that such rights may be obtained, the formalities required by the laws of the respective countries must be fulfilled.

Su Majestad la Reina del Reino Unido de la Gran Bretaña é Irlanda, Emperatriz de la India, y su Excelencia el Señor Don Rafael Iglesias, Presidente de la República de Costa Rica, en el deseo de celebrar una Convención para la protección recíproca de marcas de fábrica y de comercio y etiquetas, han nombrado para sus Plenipotenciarios, á saber:—

Su Majestad la Reina del Reino Unido de la Gran Bretaña é Irlanda, Emperatriz de la India, al Señor Don George Francis Birt Jenner, Ministro Residente de Su Majestad Británica en Centro América, &c., &c.; y

Su Excelencia el Señor Don Rafael Iglesias, Presidente de la República de Costa Rica, al Honorable Señor Don Ricardo Villafranca y Bonilla, Consul-General de la República de Costa Rica en la de Guatemala;

Quiénes, después de haber cangeado sus plenos poderes y de hallarlos en buena y debida forma, han convenido en los Artículos siguientes:—

### Article I.

Los súbditos o ciudadanos de cualquiera de las Partes Contratantes gozarán en los dominios y posesiones de la otra, de los mismos derechos que se conceden en la actualidad, ó que mas tarde sean concedidos, á los súbditos o ciudadanos en todo lo que se relaciona con marcas de fábrica y de comercio, etiquetas industriales y modelos.

Para obtener el goce de esos derechos, debe cumplirse con las formalidades que establezcan las leyes de los respectivos países.

*Article II.*

The stipulations of the present Convention shall be applicable to all the Colonies and foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, excepting to those hereinafter named, that is to say, except to—

India.  
The Dominion of Canada.  
Newfoundland.  
The Cape of Good Hope.  
Natal.  
New South Wales.  
Victoria.  
Queensland.  
Tasmania.  
South Australia.  
Western Australia.  
New Zealand.

Provided always that the stipulations of the present Convention shall be made applicable to any of the above-named Colonies or foreign possessions on whose behalf notice to that effect shall have been given by Her Majesty's Representative to the President of the Republic of Costa Rica within one year from the date of the exchange of ratifications of the present Convention.

*Article III.*

The present Convention shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged in London as soon as possible.

It shall come into operation one month after the exchange of ratifications, and shall remain in force until the expiration of one year from the day on which either party may give notice of its intention to terminate it.

In witness whereof the undersigned Plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.  
Done in duplicate at Guatemala, the 5th day of March, 1898.

*Artículo III.*

La presente Convención será ratificada, y las ratificaciones serán canjeadas en Londres lo más pronto posible.

Comenzará á regir un mes despues del cange de las ratificaciones, y quedará en vigor hasta la expiración de un año despues de la fecha en que cualquiera de las partes haya notificado á la otra su intención de hacerla cesar.

THE Secretary of State for the Colonies having issued to the Pacific Islands Company Limited a licence for the collection of guano and other fertilizing substances from Ocean Island, otherwise Paanopia, it is hereby notified that the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council, 1893, and of such of the Queen's Regulations made in accordance therewith as apply to the islands of the Gilbert and Ellice Protectorate, are extended to all persons living or being within the limits of the said island, which from this date shall be included within the jurisdiction of the Resident Commissioner and Deputy Commissioner of the Gilbert and Ellice Islands Protectorate aforesaid.

#### QUEEN'S REGULATION.

(Made by Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, in accordance with the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council, 1893.)

TO PROHIBIT THE COLLECTION AND REMOVAL OF GUANO AND OTHER FERTILIZING SUBSTANCES FROM WASTE OR UNOCCUPIED LANDS IN THE GILBERT AND ELLICE ISLANDS PROTECTORATE.

(L.S.) G. T. M. O'BRIEN.

1. In this regulation the term Gilbert and Ellice Islands Protectorate shall include the island in the South Pacific Ocean situate in latitude 0° 52' S., longitude 169° 35' E., and known as Ocean Island or Paanopia.

2. From and after the first day of January, collection and removal of guano and other fertilizing substances from waste or unoccupied lands in the Gilbert and Ellice Islands Protectorate without the permission first obtained of the High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, or of the Resident Commissioner of the aforesaid Protectorate, is prohibited.

3. Any person found guilty of a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty of breach of regulation. Ten pounds, or in default of payment to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a term not exceeding one month.

4. This Regulation may be cited as "The Short title. Gilbert and Ellice (Guano) Regulation, 1900."

# THE PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS ACT 1900, TO APPLY TO THE HOLIDAY OF 26TH JANUARY.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1900* (54 Vict. No. 1661) it is amongst other things enacted that whenever pursuant to any Act any holiday to which the said *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1900* applies would fall on any day other than a Monday, then the following Monday shall be observed as such public holiday and bank holiday instead of such day, and that the provisions of any Acts relating to public holidays or bank holidays shall be deemed and taken to apply to such Monday: And whereas it is by the said Act further enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, proclaim that there shall be added to the holidays to which the said Act applies the 26th day of January and the 21st day of April, or either of them, and that thereafter, subject to the said Act, the said day or days shall in each and every year be observed as a public holiday and bank holiday: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby proclaim that the 26th day of January shall be added to the holidays to which the said *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1900* applies.

**ASSISTANT MEDICAL INSPECTOR, DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH.**

**A**PPLICATIONS will be received by the Public Service Board up to Saturday, the 5th January proximo, from persons who are qualified and are desirous of applying for appointment to the position of Assistant Medical Inspector, Department of Public Health.

Salary—£450 a year.

The officer appointed will be required to give his whole time to assisting the Medical Inspector in the following matters and such others as the Board of Public Health or the Minister of Health may from time to time direct :—

- (1) Advising the Board on the medical aspects of all sanitary matters which come before it.
- (2) Preparing regulations, circulars, and memoranda for publication on all sanitary and medical subjects connected with the health of the community.
- (3) Perusing, minuting, and advising on the reports of local officers of health and inspectors, and on the reports of the Board's sanitary inspectors.
- (4) Watching the returns and notifications of infectious diseases, and advising when special inquiries are needed or when special action by the Board is required.
- (5) Investigating the causes of and conditions attending outbreaks of infectious or contagious diseases in particular localities, making recommendations for the prevention of the spread and for the abatement of such outbreaks, and guarding against their recurrence.
- (6) Making periodical inspections of and reporting on the sanitary condition and sanitary administration of the various municipal districts of the colony.
- (7) Advising the Board on the relations between the vital statistics of the colony and all conditions affecting them.
- (8) Inspecting, reporting on, and directing the work of public vaccination throughout the colony.
- (9) Advising the Board in regard to matters relating to quarantine.
- (10) Taking immediate supervision and direction of the arrangements required for stamping out any disease introduced into Victoria.
- (11) Making original investigations into prevalence of diseases in man, and the relations of the same to disease in animals.
- (12) Advising the Board concerning the wholesomeness of water, and of the various kinds of foods on analyses submitted in connexion with the provisions of any Act relating thereto and administered by the Board.
- (13) Advising the Board, acting as a Court of Appeal, in regard to applications for the granting or cancelling of licences for noxious trade establishments.

The person appointed must be prepared at any moment to clear incoming and outgoing vessels; to take the duties of Medical Superintendent of the Quarantine Station, or to take the general medical management of any isolation hospital under the control of the Board.

Applicants should be between the ages of 25 and 40 years, and must be in vigorous and sound health; have all the necessary qualifications for registration as a medical practitioner of Victoria, and engage to become at once, on appointment, registered as such, and show that he has general experience in the treatment of communicable disease.

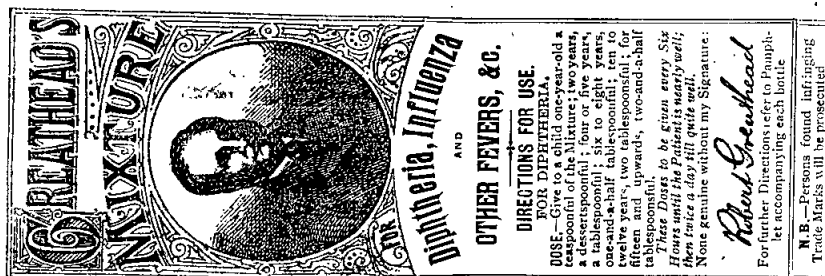

# EUROA WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR THE YEAR 1901.

THE Commissioners of the Euroa Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, hereby make the following Rating Regulations:—

A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Euroa Waterworks Trust, supplied otherwise than by meter, in all parts where the main pipes of the Trust have been extended (the minimum for each house or tenement supplied with water to be Thirty shillings), according to the valuation for the time being of such rateable property for the municipal rate of the municipal district in which such property is situate, for one year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1901, and ending on the 31st December, 1901. Such rate shall be payable in two equal portions or instalments, and the first instalment shall be payable on the 1st day of January, 1901, and the second instalment on the 1st day of July, 1901.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Euroa Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect, and recover the said rate.

## REGULATION No. 29.

The following rates and charges are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1901, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Trust's district (exclusive of the Urban District of Tungamah, as such Urban District has been proclaimed and defined):—

1. A rate of Sixpence in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Trust (excepting the Urban District of Tungamah) shall be imposed and levied for the year 1901.

2. For the supply of water to gardens and special plots of land on or near any of the Trust's channels, either within or without the Trust's district (in the Shires of Tungamah and Benalla), there shall be charged such sum as the Trust's Commissioners, in consideration of the circumstances of each case, shall from time to time by resolution of the Trust determine.

3. The before-mentioned rates and charges shall be for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1901, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1901, and shall be payable on the 1st day of January, 1901.

4. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

# WODONGA WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR THE YEAR 1901.

## REGULATION No. 1.

THE Commissioners of the Wodonga Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulations, viz.:—

1. *General Rate.*—A rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling is hereby made for the year 1901 upon all property liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the Trust, and such rate shall be based on the municipal valuation of such property by the Shire of Wodonga in existence on the 1st day of January, 1901.

2. *Minimum Rate.*—The minimum rate payable on any property on which is erected any dwelling, house, shop, office, factory, stable, or other building, shall be Twenty shillings. The minimum rate on any other rateable property whatsoever shall be Ten shillings.

3. *When Payable.*—The foregoing rates and charges shall be due and payable in half-yearly moieties in advance, that is to say on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1901. Such person or persons as may from time to time be employed by the Trust for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the rates and charges hereby made.

# OMEEO WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION.

## REGULATION FOR MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE Commissioners of the Omeo Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following rates and charges for the year 1901 upon all the lands and tenements within the Water Supply District, that is to say:—

1. On every house or tenement on which a dwelling-house is erected of the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds or under the sum of One pound sterling.

2. On every unoccupied allotment of land of the annual municipal value of Five pounds or under the sum of Seven shillings and sixpence.

3. On every house or tenement, above the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds a rate of Seven and one-half per centum shall be charged on the amount of valuation; but no rate shall exceed the sum of Twenty pounds, except where a meter is used.

4. For every water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust a charge of One pound per annum shall be made.

5. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust a charge of Five pounds per annum shall be made.

6. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be charged.

7. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in the case where the water is supplied by measure shall be:—

(a) If for domestic use and other than domestic use, the quantity for which the charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) If for other than domestic purposes only, 30,000 gallons per half-year, excepting as follows:—

Gardens and lawns  $\frac{1}{8}$  acre and less, 8,000 gallons per annum.

Gardens and lawns  $\frac{1}{4}$  acre and less, 12,000 gallons per annum.

Gardens and lawns  $\frac{1}{2}$  acre and less, 16,000 gallons per annum.

Gardens and lawns  $\frac{3}{4}$  acre and less, 28,000 gallons per annum.

Gardens and lawns 1 acre and less, 40,000 gallons per annum.

(c) Livery and carriers' stables, for each stable Five pounds per annum shall be charged.

(d) Stand-pipes or hydrant water, for each load of 100 gallons or under a charge of One shilling shall be made, and for each additional 100 gallons or fraction of 100 gallons after the first or any one load to be taken at one time Sixpence.

(e) All charges for water supplied by measure to be paid quarterly.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, receive, and recover the rates and charges hereby made.

## SHIRE OF NUMURKAH WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do make the following Regulation:—

## REGULATION No. 35.

1. Regulation No. 13, as approved by the Governor in Council on the 16th day of November, 1891, shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

1A. This Regulation shall apply to the Urban District of Numurkah, as such district is proclaimed and defined by Orders in Council bearing date the 23rd June, 1890, the 30th September, 1895, and the 17th day of July, 1899, and to the Urban District of Nathalia, as such district is proclaimed and defined by an Order in Council bearing date the 5th day of December, 1900.

2. The water supplied under this Regulation for other than domestic purposes shall be by measure, and the charges for all water so supplied shall be paid half-yearly, or as may be agreed upon.

3. For water supplied by the Trust, by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), a charge of One shilling for every one thousand (1,000) gallons shall be made.

4. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract, and extras for brickwork, stonework, and plastering.

5. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for per half-year to the various owners or occupiers hereinafter mentioned shall be as follows:—

In respect of steam boilers, for each inch of the diameter of the largest cylinder 4,000 gallons. In respect of livery and carriers' stables, for each stall 1,000 gallons.

In all other cases the minimum shall be a quantity which at One shilling per one thousand (1,000) gallons equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

6. The Trust may, by notice in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely, that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may, by such notice, require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.

7. Such meter shall be submitted to and examined by the authorized officer of the Trust, who, if he shall find the same correct and in proper working order, shall give his certificate to that effect, and the meter, when fixed, shall be maintained and kept in proper working order by such person. The meter must be so placed as to be open for inspection, and so as to be protected from injury, and with means of access thereto; the keys of the meter shall be in possession of the Trust. No meter shall be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet pipe leading from the service-pipe unless otherwise permitted by order of the Trust.

8. If any meter should cease registering, or be reported by the Inspector as out of repair or registering inaccurately, the Trust shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year; or the Trust may insert a check-meter on the service-pipe, and charge upon estimate from the registering thereof.

9. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons, and no meter shall continue to be used if it is found to be inaccurate.

10. If any person refuse or delay to have such meter properly repaired and put in correct working order, after having been required by any officer of the Trust so to do, the Trust may shut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the service-pipe or otherwise, until such meter shall have been properly repaired and certified by some officer of the Trust as being in proper working order.

11. If any plumber fix or refix any meter upon any premises supplied with water by the Trust without having first obtained a certificate from the Trust that the said meter has been examined and found in correct working condition, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

12. If any person remove or alter the position of or in any way interfere with any meter without giving six days' notice in writing to the Trust, he shall for each such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds over and above the damage which he may be found liable to pay in any action at law at the suit of the Trust, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of One pound for each day the offence is continued after notice of the offence from the Trust.

13. Any person who, having been served with the notice mentioned in clause 6 of this Regulation, shall refuse or neglect to provide a meter within the time in such notice specified, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day after the expiration of the time mentioned in the notice on which he shall still refuse or neglect to comply with the terms of such notice.

14. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of premises, or of any lands or tenements, who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying on of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundaries of such land, premises, or tenements abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

15. Fire-plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them be allowed in writing by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of the officers of the Trust.

16. All service-pipes, with the necessary stop-cocks, shall be supplied and fixed at the cost of the person or persons requiring

the same, under the direction and supervision of such officer or servant as the Trust may appoint, and no service-pipe shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground of less than ten inches.

17. Excepting with the permission of the Trust, not more than one house or tenement shall be supplied from a single water service. The Trust may in special cases consent to two or more tenements being supplied from one water service, but in such cases the sub-services shall be so arranged that the supply to each house shall be independent of the supply to the remaining houses, and be controlled by a stop-cock on such sub-service, and any person offending against the provisions of this section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

18. No extensions of private services will be allowed except by consent of the Trust.

19. The service-pipes from the main, being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and if none the owner, shall, upon receiving notice that his service-pipe requires repairing, immediately proceed to repair the same, and he shall be responsible for any loss of water or other damage which shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, and in default be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after receipt of such notice, and the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting of the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

20. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

21. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

22. Such licence shall be at and during the pleasure of the Trust, and the Trust may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof being judged by the Trust to be incompetent, or by himself or his employees committing any breach of the Water Acts or of this Regulation.

23. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust the person applying for same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber, and shall pay a licence fee of One pound per annum, but the Trust may, if it so see fit, refuse to grant such licence.

24. Any person whether, licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission, in writing, of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

25. No person shall use any tap, stop-cock, valve, or other fitting in connexion with a supply of water of the Trust which is not of the best quality and approved by the Trust.

26. No person shall use any stop or bib-cocks which are not screw-down high-pressure cocks, made of hard brass or gun-metal, and in every respect of best quality and workmanship and approved by the Trust.

27. Ordinary connexions with mains must be made with proper stop-cock ferrules, to which for iron services a length of not less than three feet of lead pipe must be attached. One service-pipe only for domestic supply to each tenement will be permitted, and for houses rated at £20 per annum and under the bore of such service-pipe must not exceed  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch in diameter, and for houses exceeding £20, but not more than £100 rateable value per annum, the bore of such service-pipe is not to exceed  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch, and for premises rated over £100 per annum the bore of such pipe must not exceed one inch. For the supply of water for other than domestic purposes solely such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

28. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, or who shall make such communication, except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the Trust, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipes to communicate with the pipes of the Trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

29. Lead piping shall be of the following weights:—

Diameter of pipe.	Weight of pipe per yard.	Diameter of pipe.	Weight of pipe per yard.
$\frac{3}{4}$ inch	5 lbs.	1 inch	12 lbs.
$\frac{1}{2}$ "	6 "	$1\frac{1}{4}$ "	22 "

$\frac{1}{4}$ "	9 "	2 "	45 "

and galvanized-iron piping of approved quality only will be allowed.

30. The maximum tapping that will be allowed without clip for each size of main is as follows:—

For 3-inch and 4-inch pipes,  $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch tapping.

For 6-inch pipes, 1-inch tapping.

31. All connexions with lead and iron pipes must be made with brass union couplings.

32. All joints connecting lead pipes must be "wiped" joints, and in no case will "bolt" or "copper bit" joints be allowed on water service-pipes, either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement, on pain of cancellation of the licence of the plumber who, by himself or his workmen, shall break these regulations.

33. A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock, properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cap, shall be fixed on each water service between the main and the building line.

34. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

35. To prevent overflow all water troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps, which shall at all times be maintained in good working order.

36. No hose or pipe shall be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or plants, or washing-houses, or walls, carriages, or horses, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by measure.

37. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take or carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or who shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty not exceeding One pound for each day the offence is continued after notice of the offence from the Trust.

38. For every offence against any provision of this Regulation for which a penalty is not hereinbefore specially prescribed, the offender shall, upon conviction, be liable to and shall pay any sum not exceeding Five pounds.

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty-seven pounds annual value or under, the sum of Twenty shillings.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty-seven pounds, the sum of Ninepence in the pound sterling on the annual value of such property.

3. For all tenements in the said Urban District situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipes and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation of the several houses or tenements.

5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1901, commencing on the 1st January, 1901, and terminating on the 31st December, 1901, and shall be payable, the one moiety on the 1st January, and the other moiety on the 1st July of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation of the several houses or tenements.

5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1901, commencing on the 1st January, 1901, and terminating on the 31st December, 1901, and shall be payable, the one moiety on the 1st January, and the other moiety on the 1st July of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

On rateable property in the Shire of Donald Division, a rate of threepence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Kara Kara Division, a rate of eightpence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Dummunkle Division, a rate of fourpence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Stawell Division, a rate of eightpence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Borung Division, a rate of elevenpence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Birchip Division, a rate of twelpence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Karkaroc Division, a rate of tenpence in the pound sterling of such valuation.

Such rate is hereby made for the year 1901, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1901, and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1901, and shall be payable on the 1st day of January, 1901.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive such rates, or such portion thereof, as they may be appointed to demand and receive.

# WODONGA WATERWORKS TRUST. RATING REGULATION NO. 2.

THE Commissioners of the Wodonga Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the "Water Acts," make the following regulations for the year 1901.

The following are the charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by this Trust within the Wodonga Waterworks district, that is to say:—

1. In all cases where a meter has to be used the charge shall be at the rate of One shilling and threepence for every 1,000 gallons, except where otherwise provided.

2. For buildings in course of erection to which water is supplied the charge shall be One pound per centum on the amount of the contract for such building excepting the iron and wood-work.

3. That all stand-pipes used for the purpose of watering gardens and other purposes other than purely household purposes by ratepayers, the charge shall be Ten shillings per annum per pipe. Provided that water for any garden exceeding the limits of 66 feet by 50 feet or 3,300 square feet must be supplied by meter, in which case the charge shall be at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons.

4. A special charge of Two pounds per annum shall be made for water supplied to St. Joseph's Convent and St. Augustine's Convent school, Wodonga.

5. All Government buildings not connected with the Victorian Railway Department and supplied with water by the Trust shall be charged a fixed sum of Three pounds per annum.

6. Rateable consumers may at their option be supplied by meter, in which case they may have as many pipes as they may see fit, provided that all water used by each such consumer shall pass through his meter, and each such consumer shall be charged at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons until a sum has been reached equal to the amount of his rates, and at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons for all water used over and above that sum: Provided that no such consumer shall pay less than the amount of his rates, although he may not use sufficient water at One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons to equal the amount of his rates.

That the foregoing charges be made in half-yearly payments on the 30th day of June, and the 31st day of December.

# HEALESVILLE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1901.

4. Water supplied for other than domestic use shall be by measure or by special agreement, and shall be charged for at the rate of Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be agreed upon. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 20,000 gallons per half year, or a quantity which, at the price mentioned, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure.

The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1901, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may, from time to time appoint for the purpose, are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

The following rate is therefore made on the annual value of all rateable property in the said several divisions of the Lowan Shire Waterworks Trust District, according to the valuation on all such lands and tenements for the municipal rates of the Shires of Lowan and Dimboola respectively, that is to say:—

On rateable property within the Shire of Lowan Division, a rate of 6d. (sixpence) in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Dimboola division, a rate of 4d. (fourpence) in the pound sterling of such valuation.

Such rate is hereby made for the year 1901, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1901, and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1901, and shall be payable on the 1st day of March, 1901.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

All water supplied by measure by the Trust in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

3. For water supplied by measurement for other than domestic purposes solely, a charge of One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be made, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Twenty shillings.

4. Such rates and charges, other than charges for water supplied by measurement in excess, are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, one moiety on the 1st day of January, 1901, and one moiety on the 1st day of July, 1901.

5. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

**W**HEREAS the Governor in Council has, by an Order made the 5th day of December, 1900, under the provisions of section 100 of the *Water Act 1890*, divided the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust District, exclusive of that portion thereof proclaimed an Urban District on the 23rd day of June, 1890, and the 30th day of September, 1895, and the 17th day of July, 1899, and also that portion proclaimed an Urban District on the 5th day of December, 1900, into divisions, and directed that the necessary rates for paying interest on all moneys borrowed by the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust for the construction and maintenance of their waterworks, or to meet any other expenses in connexion therewith, shall be levied in such Divisions, viz.:—No. 1 Division and No. 2 Division; and has further directed that such rates be levied differentially as between such divisions; and has, by a further Order made the 5th day of December, 1900, determined the proportion in which such divisions shall be rated respectively one to another for the year 1901.

The Commissioners of the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust, under the powers conferred by the Water Acts, hereby make the following rates to be levied within the aforesaid divisions of the district of the Trust, the boundaries of which Divisions are fully set forth in the Order in Council of the 5th December, 1900, first above mentioned.

1. In No. 1 Division, Fourpence in the pound sterling; in No. 2 Division, Threepence in the pound sterling. The respective rates to be levied on the annual value of all rateable property situated as above, described according to the valuation for the time being for the municipal rates for the Shire of Numurkah. The rates hereby made shall be for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1901, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1901.

2. Such rates are hereby made payable in one instalment, and shall be due on the 1st day of January, 1901.

3. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

# KYNETON SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.— REGULATION No. 25.

THE Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in the execution of the powers and authorities conferred upon such Trust by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following regulations for the due administration and the carrying out of the powers conferred on the said Trust respecting the Kyneton Shire Waterworks District.

1. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe, or alter, repair, or in any measure interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence or authority in that behalf to execute such works.

2. No person shall be authorized or allowed to lay private service pipes, and attach the same to any pipe belonging to the Trust, or to any private service pipe already connected with the pipes laid by the Trust, unless he can satisfy the Trust or its officers that he is competent to execute such work.

3. No person shall under any pretext whatsoever, interfere with the water mains, pipes, or fittings belonging to the Trust, nor lay or repair service-pipes within the boundaries of the streets or road within the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust District, as the Trust's workmen only are empowered to execute such work.

4. No private service whatsoever to be laid, or extension made by any authorized person, unless he has ascertained at the office of the Trust that the person for whom such work is intended has duly signed the required form of application to the Trust and has received the consent of the Trust to execute such work.

5. Every authorization granted by the Trust shall apply and refer only to the individual to whom it has been granted; and such person shall not be entitled by virtue of his authorization to employ or allow any journeyman or other person to perform plumbers' work on his behalf in connexion with the supply of water unless the said journeyman or other person is himself duly qualified.

6. No private service shall be laid or extension made from one tenement to another by any authorized plumber unless the owner or occupier of the premises to which the service is to be laid produces for his inspection a written order or permission from the Trust to execute such work.

7. Before any private service is laid, extension made, or meter affixed and attached to the service-pipe laid by the Trust or otherwise to service-pipes already connected, each authorized person shall give 48 hours' notice of same, and shall after each service or extension, &c., has been completed, report on the prescribed form the nature of the work done, and lodge the same at the office of the Trust within 48 hours of such service or extension, &c., being completed as aforesaid.

8. Each authorized person shall be held solely responsible to the Trust for each service-pipe being laid and completed by him in a sound workmanlike and durable manner, and to remain in that condition (sound and watertight) for a period of three (3) months after each service has been completed.

9. Each authorized person shall be held solely responsible to the Trust for any injury occasioned by him or under his authority, from whatsoever cause, to the service-pipes laid by the Trust, their street mains, or other property, whilst attaching services to the pipes laid by the Trust, or to services already laid and connected with the Trust's water supply, and any loss of water sustained by the Trust through such injury, on its ascertained value, together with the cost of all and every repairs necessitated thereby, shall be refunded by such person to the Trust within twenty-four (24) hours after the time of such injury having occurred.

10. Every person previous to being licensed or authorized to lay private services shall read the specifications in the office of the Trust, and shall sign in witness thereof his name and address, and at the same time deposit the sum of Two pounds (£2) sterling as security for the strict observance and performance of the stipulations and conditions contained therein, and in the case of the non-observance and non-performance of any of the stipulations and conditions aforesaid the Trust may cancel such licence or authority, and shall be entitled to declare such deposit to be absolutely forfeited as liquidated damages, and the name of such person may at once be struck off the roll of those authorized to lay private services, and the same may be published in any local paper.

11. Providing that the period of maintenance of private services has duly expired, deposits may be withdrawn at any time upon seven (7) days' notice in writing to that effect being given previously to the secretary of the Trust, when the name or names of such parties withdrawing their deposits may be published as before described in a local paper, and the Trust reserve the right on its part to alter, cancel, and annul the term and nature of any licence or authority to lay such services at any time.

12. No person whether licensed as aforesaid or not shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving at least twelve hours' notice, or shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission of the Trust in writing being first obtained, or shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve-pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust.

13. No person whether licensed as aforesaid or not shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust or service-pipes therefrom, except according to the specifications approved of by the Trust, and, if necessary, subject to and under the superintendence and according to the directions of the engineer or some officer of the Trust, nor shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust.

*Quality of Material Required in Laying Private Services, viz.:*—

14. The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles, bends, reducing-couplings, &c., to be of the best galvanized wrought-iron.

15. All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of same.

16. All ends of pipes, bends, &c., to be properly and truly threaded, and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c.

17. The whole of the tubes, tees, bends, or fittings to be perfectly new, sound, and free from all defects, and capable of standing hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water of 400 feet.

18. All delivery-cocks to be high pressure, and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship, and of approved pattern, to screw into elbows or bends, &c. All cocks to stand the same pressure as the tubes.

19. All meters required to be fixed on private ground to be of a pattern approved by the Trust, and no meter to be provided or fixed by any person unless previously approved by the engineer or his representative.

20. No service-pipes on private ground shall be laid at a less depth below the surface of the ground than ten (10) inches.

21. All jointing between tubes, bends, couplings, elbows, and cocks to be made with red lead and flax only, and other jointing to be made in an approved manner.

22. If any person shall be guilty of a breach of any of the regulations under this by-law, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

23. In the construction of these regulations the word "Person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation or company, whether aggregate or sole; the word "Engineer" or his representative shall be deemed and be taken to mean the engineer or any officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf; and the word "Trust" be deemed to mean "The Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust."

24. Upon the coming in force of this by-law all by-laws heretofore made relating to matters herein affecting water supply within the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust shall be and the same are hereby repealed, except as to anything done or committed thereunder.

The foregoing regulations were made and passed by the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust on the first day of December, 1900, to take effect from the first day of January, 1901.

A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property valued at Twenty-five pounds sterling and upwards (except in cases of special arrangements with the Trust), situate within the Waterworks District of the Yarrawonga Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1901.

2. Upon properties of the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds sterling, and not more than Twenty-four pounds sterling, a rate of One pound five shillings sterling per annum shall be payable. Upon properties valued at Twelve pounds sterling and under a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be payable, according to the municipal value of such properties, provided that in no case shall a less rate than Twenty shillings be payable, in accordance with section 122 of *Water Act 1890*.

3. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Ten pounds sterling per centum on the annual valuation of the same shall be payable.

4. Water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any premises, and at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used beyond such an amount aforesaid. Nevertheless it shall be competent for the Trust to make special arrangements from time to time for the supply of water by meter or otherwise.

5. For any public water-trough supplied with water by the Trust the sum of Forty shillings per annum shall be charged, unless supplied by measurement.

6. For any steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust) the sum of Thirty shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In case the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made.

7. Water supplied to Government departments, cricket grounds, show-yards, cattle-yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measure. Provided the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Thirty shillings per annum, or the charge may be by special arrangement with the Trust.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrant, for each load of two hundred (200) gallons or under the sum of Sixpence, and for each additional load *pro rata* upon the above scale.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions Twenty shillings per centum on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.

10. A minimum rate of Five shillings and a maximum rate of Forty shillings per annum shall be chargeable to persons for using water for ornamental, garden, or other like purposes.

11. For each spray supplied with water by the Trust used for the purpose of cooling houses the sum of Ten shillings per annum, in addition to the charges under any previous clauses of this Regulation, providing that such spray shall only be used between the hours of Nine o'clock a.m. and Nine o'clock p.m.

12. Such rates are hereby made for the year 1901, and are made payable in equal moieties half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in the year, excepting those by measure, which shall be paid quarterly, or as the Trust may direct.

13. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

### BOROUGH OF DAYLESFORD WATERWORKS TRUST —RATING REGULATION FOR 1901.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following:—

#### REGULATION NUMBERED 20.

Fixing the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied within the Trust District, such rate being made for the year commencing on the 1st day of January and ending on the 31st day of December, 1901.

The rates and charges which shall be payable by the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements within the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust District, who are supplied with water by the Trust, shall be as follows:—

1. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel or wine shop, of the annual value of £20 and under, the sum of £1 1s. per annum.

2. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel or wine shop, above the annual value of £20, and not exceeding the annual value of £200, the sum of £5 per cent. per annum on the valuation.

3. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel or wine shop, above the annual value of £200, the sum of £4 10s. per cent. on the valuation.

4. On every hotel or wine shop of the annual value of £30 and under, a minimum rate of £2 per annum.

5. On every hotel or wine shop above the annual value of £30, the sum of £6 per cent. per annum on the valuation, provided that the charge shall not in any case be less than £2.

6. On unoccupied lands, and lands on which no tenements are erected, nor water laid on, the sum of £5 per cent. on the annual valuation. Should water be laid on, the charge to be in accordance with the rates fixed in this by-law for tenements.

7. On livery, coach, and hotel stables, at the rate of 10s. per annum for the first stall, and 7s. 6d. per annum for each additional stall. In open sheds used for stabling, each 6 feet to be considered as one stall. For horses kept on private premises, 10s. per annum for the first horse kept, and 7s. 6d. per annum for each additional horse.

Cows to be paid for at the rate of 1s. each per annum.

Water-troughs, 10s. each per annum.

8. Water supplied by meter to be at the rate of 2s. per 1,000 gallons, except to manufactories, aerated water makers, &c., to whom the charge shall be 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons, provided that not less than 60,000 gallons per annum is consumed, failing which the charge shall be 2s. per 1,000 gallons.

9. Water supplied for irrigation of gardens, nurseries, cricket grounds, &c., to be charged for at the rate of 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity charged for shall be 20,000 gallons per annum.

10. For water supplied to buildings in course of erection, the charge shall be 20s. per cent. on the amount of the contract for brickwork, stonework, or plastering; or, should the Trust require a meter to be affixed, the rate shall be 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons.

11. For water supplied to steam boilers, the charge shall be at the rate of 10s. per horse-power per annum.

12. The charge for water supplied for mining purposes shall be as per agreement.

13. These rates and charges shall be payable by equal half-yearly instalments, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1901, except in cases where the Trust may have made a special agreement regarding the times of payment for water supplied by measure or for mining purposes.

14. Such person or persons as the Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate and charges.

15. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure, except in the cases of special agreement with the Trust, shall be the quantity for which the charge, at 2s. per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if water was supplied otherwise than by measure.

### SHIRE OF TUNGAMAH WATERWORKS TRUST.— RATING REGULATION FOR 1901 IN THE URBAN DISTRICT OF TUNGAMAH.

#### REGULATION No. 28.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Tungamah Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following regulation:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1901 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of Tungamah, as such district has been proclaimed and defined:—

1. Every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Twenty-five pounds and not less than Ten pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound of such value.

3. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of One hundred pounds and not less than Twenty-five pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such value, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Two pounds ten shillings per annum.

4. For every house or tenement of a value exceeding the annual municipal value of One hundred pounds, a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound of such value, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Seven pounds ten shillings per annum.

5. For every allotment or piece of land vacant or not built upon, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the annual municipal value of such land, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Ten shillings.

6. For every water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the amount of Two pounds per annum.

7. For water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust, Two shillings and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure (and except in cases where the Trust has made special agreements).

8. A minimum of Ten shillings and a maximum rate of Two pounds to every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year.

9. Such rates and charges are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1901.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

**W**HEREAS by section 3 of the *Old-age Pensions Act* 1900 it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations as to the mode, terms, and conditions on which pensions may be applied for, granted, suspended, or cancelled, and paid out of the sum appropriated for the purpose by the said Act, and for prescribing any alterations or additions to the form of declaration set forth in the Schedule to the said Act, and generally for the purposes of carrying into effect the provisions of the Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

## REGULATIONS.

## 1. In these regulations—

“Income” shall include all the claimant's net income from all sources except any pension payable under the *Old-age Pensions Act* 1900 or any payment by way of sick allowance or funeral benefit from any registered friendly society or similar institution.

## 2. A pension being for the personal support of the pensioner shall be absolutely inalienable.

3. No pension shall be payable to any Chinese or other Asiatic, whether naturalized or not, or to any other person unless he is natural-born or has been naturalized for a period of at least five years, or to any person unless he has attained the age of 65 years, or is permanently disabled, or is in permanent ill-health, caused in either case by having been engaged in mining or any unhealthy or hazardous occupation.

4. Residence in Victoria shall not be deemed to have been interrupted by occasional absence from Victoria unless the period of such absence exceed three months in all in any year, and in that case such year shall not be reckoned as one of the years of any period mentioned in the Act; and so long as a person has his home in Victoria and proves that (if married) his wife and family or his wife (if he has no family) or his family (if his wife is dead) resided there and were or was maintained by him he shall be deemed to be residing in Victoria.

5. The pension shall be such an amount as will make the total income of the pensioner not more than Ten shillings per week, but shall be diminished by—

- (a) Sixpence for every complete Ten pounds of the net capital value of all accumulated property owned by the applicant (not including furniture and personal effects to the extent of £25) which does not return income, after deducting from the capital value of such accumulated property all charges or encumbrances lawfully and properly existing on such property.
- (b) In the case of husband and wife residing together the net capital value of the accumulated property of each shall be deemed to be not less than half the total net capital value of the accumulated property of both.
- (c) In the case of husband and wife residing together the income of each shall be deemed to be not less than half the total income of both.

6. Each pension shall, pursuant to a pension certificate and not otherwise, be payable from the date of lodging the claim, and shall continue to be paid whilst there is money available therefor under the said Act, or until suspended or cancelled pursuant to these regulations.

7. Every person claiming to be entitled to a pension must obtain from a Clerk of Petty Sessions, or Postmaster, a copy of the form prescribed in the Schedule to the Act, and after making the required declaration must lodge it with a Clerk of Petty Sessions, or with a Postmaster who shall forthwith forward it to the nearest Clerk of Petty Sessions.

8. The Clerk of Petty Sessions shall submit the claim to a Police Magistrate or any two Justices, who sitting as a Court of Petty Sessions (but not in open court) shall fully investigate the pension claim for the purpose of ascertaining whether the claimant is entitled to a pension, and if so for what amount.

9. The clerk of the court shall notify the claimant the date on which he may attend to support his claim, and the Police Magistrate or Justices shall on the day so notified or on the first convenient day thereafter proceed to investigate the same.

10. Where the Police Magistrate or Justices is or are satisfied that the documentary or other evidence in support of the claim is sufficient to establish it, and also that by reason of physical disability or other sufficient cause the attendance of the claimant should be dispensed with, he or they may dispense with the personal attendance of the claimant.

11. No pension claim shall be admitted unless the evidence of the claimant is corroborated on all material points, except that in respect of the age of the claimant the Police Magistrate or Justices, if otherwise satisfied, may dispense with corroborative evidence.

12. The Police Magistrate or Justices may admit the pension claim as originally made or as modified by the result of his or their investigations, or may postpone it for further evidence or reject it as he or they may deem equitable.

13. If delay will be occasioned in having the pension claim inquired into by a Police Magistrate or two Justices, then any Justice of the Peace in the locality may issue a temporary pension certificate, in Form A, Schedule to these regulations, limited in operation to four weeks, but such Justice should only act in the place of a Police Magistrate or two Justices if he is satisfied that there is an urgent necessity to do so. A duplicate certificate to be forwarded by the Clerk of Petty Sessions to the Treasury, Melbourne.

14. In investigating any pension claim, the Police Magistrate or Justices or Justice shall not be bound by the strict rules of evidence, but shall investigate and determine the matter by such means and in such manner as in equity and good conscience he or they shall think fit.

15. As soon as a pension claim is established and the rate thereof is fixed by the Police Magistrate or Justices, he or they shall issue a pension certificate in the form set forth in Form B, Schedule to these regulations, and the Clerk of Petty Sessions shall forward the same to the Treasury, Melbourne.

16. A certificate in the form set forth in Form C, Schedule to these regulations, shall be handed to the pensioner.

17. Particulars for identification of pensioner must also be forwarded by the Clerk of Petty Sessions to the Commissioners of Audit and to the paying officer named in the certificate.

18. Each instalment of pension shall be payable fortnightly at the pay office or money order office named in the pension certificate. In all country towns where there is a pay office it must be named in the certificate, except in Ballarat, Bendigo, and Geelong, where either pay office or money order office may be named to suit convenience.

19. On production to the Paymaster or Postmaster of an authority in the form set forth in Form D, Schedule to these regulations, signed by a Police Magistrate or any Justice or Clerk of Petty Sessions, the instalments may be paid for such period as therein mentioned to any Minister of Religion, Justice, or other person named in such authority for the benefit of the pensioner. Such authority may be issued by a Police Magistrate or Justice or Clerk of Petty Sessions whenever he is satisfied that it is expedient so to do in the interest of the pensioner, and the Clerk of Petty Sessions shall forward a copy to the Commissioners of Audit.

20. The Paymaster or Postmaster may if he thinks fit require the applicant for payment to prove his identity, but shall not be bound so to do, and may accept the production of the pension certificate as sufficient evidence that the person producing the same is the person entitled to payment.

21. When making the payment the Paymaster or Postmaster shall require the person receiving the payment to give a receipt therefor on a schedule which will be forwarded from the Treasury.

22. The Treasurer may at any time suspend or cancel any pension certificate if he considers it expedient so to do.

23. The Treasurer may at any time at the request of the pensioner change the place at which the pension is payable.

24. In the event of a pension certificate being lost or destroyed, the Clerk of the Court where the original was issued may, on being satisfied, issue a duplicate certificate so marked.

# INGLEWOOD HOSPITAL, INCORPORATED.—RULES AND REGULATIONS.

## MANAGEMENT.

THE institution is for the purpose of affording surgical and medical aid to destitute persons in cases of accident and disease.

2. The affairs of the institute shall be directed by a committee consisting of ten subscribers, and the said committee shall elect at their first meeting from amongst themselves their president, vice-president, and treasurer.

3. In accordance with section 4, Act No. 816, the annual general meeting shall be held on the last Thursday in July in each year, and shall elect two subscribers, not members of the committee, as auditors for the year.

4. Should vacancies occur in any of the offices under the second rule, the committee shall supply such vacancies according to the provisions of Act No. 1099; and, should vacancies occur in the office of auditors, a special meeting of contributors should be called before the end of the year to supply such vacancies. Any member of committee failing to attend three consecutive monthly meetings of the board may be requested to resign his seat.

5. No person shall be considered eligible for election at the annual meeting unless he, or some one duly authorized on his behalf, shall have given notice in writing to the secretary seven days before the date of such meeting of his intention to stand for such election as member of committee. Provided always that in the event of sufficient nominations not being sent to supply all the offices, it shall be competent for the annual meeting to dispense with the above conditions, and to fill up any vacancy which may exist after the formal nominations have been disposed of. All elections, when contested, shall be by ballot.

## VOTERS' QUALIFICATION.

6. That no person shall hereafter be qualified to vote at any meeting of subscribers to this hospital unless he shall have been a subscriber of at least One pound sterling to the hospital within a period of twelve months previous to the time of such meeting being held, nor unless the said subscription, being the first, has been paid at least fourteen days before the meeting at which such subscriber wishes to vote, and all subscribers who shall allow more than a year to elapse since the payment of their last subscription, for the purpose of this clause their next subscription shall be considered as a first subscription.

7. Each contributor of £1, having fulfilled the above conditions, will be entitled to one vote of £5 to two votes, and of £10 and upwards to three votes. Life-governors to have two votes in addition to any they may possess as subscribers, provided that no person shall exercise more than three votes.

## AN ACT FOR HOSPITALS AND CHARITABLE INSTITUTIONS, No. 1099.—(RETIREMENT OF COMMITTEEMEN.)

8. On the last Thursday in the month of July in every year one-third part of the elected members of the committee shall go out of office (but may nevertheless be re-elected), and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been the longest in office without re-election; or where two or more shall have been in office for the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot.

## (VACANCIES: HOW FILLED.)

9. If any member of committee shall die, or resign by letter under his hand and addressed to the chairman of the committee, or become insolvent, or compound with his creditors, or be convicted for any treason, felony, or misdemeanor, or be absent for four consecutive meetings from the committee, his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of the committee may temporarily appoint thereto some contributor to such institution until the next annual meeting for the election of the committee, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire as one of those who by the provisions of this Act are required to go out of office.

10. The committee shall include all the officers named in the second rule. It shall direct the collection and distribution of funds, appoint and dismiss all paid officers and servants, frame regulations for the management of the hospital (the same being not repugnant to the general rules), present a report to the annual general meeting, and manage the affairs of the hospital generally; and may from among themselves from time to time appoint house and other committees, give the same power to perform such duties as may not be contrary to Act of Incorporation, and may also from time to time alter or discontinue such committees.

## MEETINGS AND QUORUM.

11. The committee shall meet for general business on the Monday nearest the full moon in each month, and adjourn such or any meeting as may be deemed expedient. Special meetings of the committee shall be called by the president or secretary, or upon the requisition of any three members of the said committee to the president or vice-president, such requisition to state the object of such meeting, and no other business but that stated shall be entertained. At any meeting four members to form a quorum, the president or vice-president to be chairman, and in their absence the meeting shall elect a chairman. The chairman to have, in addition to his own vote as a member of committee, a second or casting vote.

## ACCOUNTS.

12. The finance committee shall consist of not less than four members of committee, who shall meet to pass accounts on the

first Monday in every month, such accounts to be submitted at the following general meeting of the whole committee for confirmation. Such accounts must be initiated by one of the finance committee, and the said finance committee shall at each monthly meeting of the general committee present a report of the financial position of the hospital.

## AUDITORS.

13. The auditors shall at the end of each year examine the annual financial report, with all accounts, vouchers, and documents relating thereto, and shall report thereon to the annual general meeting.

14. The general committee shall present a report of the affairs of the hospital at each annual meeting, which report shall be presented at a special meeting of the committee for revision and approval at least one week before the annual meeting.

## CONTRIBUTORS.

15. Benefactors of £25 or contributors of £15 shall be entitled to be made life-governors. The word "benefaction" shall mean a sum of money raised from the public by church or other collections, by fêtes and entertainments, or contributed by mining or other companies, societies, or associations, and the bodies under the Local Government Act. The nomination of benefactors as life-governors to be made by the minister or governing body of churches, the collector or collectors, the committee of the said fêtes or entertainments, or the giver or givers thereof, the directors of mining or other companies, societies, or associations, and the councils of the local government bodies respectively. The word "contribution" shall mean a personal gift. Life-governors shall have the privilege of voting at all meetings of subscribers, and of nominating five patients in each year. Other contributors shall be entitled to nominate one patient for every pound of their contribution within the year of such contribution, provided that the funds and accommodation of the hospital will permit of the reception and treatment of such patients. Members of the board are not to be limited to the number of patients they may recommend. Any person subscribing ten shillings shall have the privilege of recommending one out-door patient, but shall not be entitled to vote.

## MINING COMPANIES.

16. Where mining companies pay sixpence per week for each man employed to the hospital funds, they shall have the privilege of nominating one patient for the year of such subscription for each pound received.

## HONORARY TREASURER.

17. He shall receive all money on behalf of the hospital, and invest the same in such bank or banks as the committee of management shall direct to the credit of the hospital. He shall pay all accounts after the same have been signed by the chairman of the meeting and the secretary as having been approved by the committee, by draft on the bank or banks, which shall be countersigned by the president or vice-president and by the secretary. He shall also keep an account of all moneys received and paid by him, and report the same at least once a month to a meeting of the committee.

## CONTRACTORS.

18. No person under contract to the hospital shall be eligible to sit on the committee during the consideration of his tender or the period of his contract.

19. A deposit of 5 per cent., based upon the average cost of the provisions or goods consumed for the previous three years, shall accompany each tender, and the amount of such deposit shall be fixed by the secretary and treasurer, and such deposit shall be forfeited if the contractor fail to carry out his contract. No deposit to be less sum than £2.

## PAYMENT OF MAINTENANCE.

20. All patients will be expected to pay towards the actual expenses of their maintenance so far as their circumstances may enable them; and all property found on patients who may die in the hospital will be appropriated to defray the expenses of the maintenance and burial, the residue, if any, to be handed over to their legal representatives.

21. The committee of management shall appoint a sub-committee to judge as to the ability of patients to pay, which sub-committee (with the concurrence of the surgeon) shall have power to discharge any patient, in case of his refusal to pay, and shall have the further power to require (if necessary) patients to make a declaration before a justice as to their means.

22. Patients are expected to pay £5 5s. a week, or less, according to their means.

## ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

23. That accidents and such cases as may be deemed of decided emergency by the medical officer in attendance be received at any time; that patients arriving from a distance of over 10 miles from the hospital be treated in accordance with Rule No. 57; but in ordinary cases patients shall be admitted daily between the hours of 11 and 12 a.m., on the recommendation of a subscriber for the then current year.

24. That no female, for the purpose of confinement, child under five years of age, insane person, or one affected with syphilis or any infectious diseases (except at the discretion of the medical officer), or any person who, in the opinion of the medical officer in attendance, is unfit to be an in-door patient, shall be received under any circumstances, and the reason of refusing any patient shall be stated to the house committee by the surgeon.

25. The house committee shall, at least once a week, visit the hospital for the purpose of inspecting the arrangements thereof, and of inquiring of the patients if they are properly attended to, and to report to the next meeting of the board any alteration or suggestion they may think necessary; such house committee to be elected by agreement amongst the members during the sitting of the committee.

## HOSPITAL SURGEON.

26. He shall examine the nature of each applicant's case, and decide the fitness of each complaint for admission, and shall discharge such patients as he considers fit to be discharged.



27. He shall have charge of all patients in the hospital and their treatment; shall attend at the hospital, and visit each patient once a day, and, in cases of difficulty or danger, shall request the attendance of the consulting medical officers available; but, in the event of the services of such honorary medical officers not being obtainable, he shall report the fact to the house committee, and shall in all other respects comply with such regulations as the committee of management may frame for his guidance.

28. He shall superintend and control the dispenser and all nurses and wardsmen, or those performing such duties in the hospital, and in cases of neglect of duty or insubordination may suspend any of them, and forthwith report the matter to the superintendent, who in turn shall report to the house committee, who may discharge or reinstate the same at their discretion.

29. He shall have charge of all surgical instruments, drugs, and chemicals, and shall carefully examine them, both as to the quantity and quality, and report any defects in any respects to the committee of management; and he must, in the absence of the dispenser, perform such duties as would devolve upon that officer.

30. He shall enter regularly in books to be kept for the purpose (such books to be provided by and remain the property of the committee) the names of patients as they are admitted and discharged, together with the nature and history of their diseases while under treatment, manner of treatment, time of attending each case, medicine prescribed, and instructions for the guidance of the dispenser.

#### HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

31. Legally qualified medical practitioners must lodge written applications for the office with the secretary ten days previous to a meeting of the committee.

32. The consulting medical officers shall attend at the hospital for consultation or operation whenever requested by the hospital surgeon.

#### SUPERINTENDENT.

33. The superintendent, or in his absence the responsible person in charge, shall receive the tickets from applicants for admission and shall hand same to the hospital surgeon.

34. He shall forward all admission tickets to the secretary for monthly committee meetings, and specially report the cause of any tickets not being produced or not bearing the patient's signature to necessary declaration.

35. He shall superintend and control all servants (other than nursing staff) in the hospital, and in cases of neglect of duty or insubordination may suspend any of them and forthwith report to the house committee, who may discharge or reinstate the same at their discretion. He shall have supervision over the nurses and servants generally.

36. He shall keep an inventory of all surgical instruments, drugs, and chemicals, in a book to be kept for that purpose (such book to be provided by and remain the property of the committee), and keep an account of the receipt and expenditure, or loss and breakage, of all such instruments, drugs, and chemicals.

37. He shall have charge of all stores and provisions, and shall be responsible for receiving and issuing same.

38. He shall instruct the yardman as to his duties from time to time.

#### SECRETARY AND COLLECTOR.

39. The secretary and collector shall keep the minutes, accounts, and records of the hospital; compile all reports, conduct the correspondence, attend all meetings, and bring all business before the same; carry out the resolutions, and perform all clerical and other duties that may be ordered by the committee.

40. He shall convene the annual general meeting of each year, as directed by the Act of Incorporation.

41. He shall convene special meetings of duly qualified subscribers when directed by the committee, or on the written application of ten duly qualified subscribers of at least One pound each, the object of such special meeting to be stated in the advertisement; and he shall also give special notice in writing to each member of the committee of such meeting.

42. He shall visit the hospital once in each week, and shall record quantity of stores and provisions, &c., received and issued.

43. He shall collect subscriptions and all moneys due to the hospital, in all cases give receipts for the same, and render an account for the same to the committee.

#### HOSPITAL SERVANTS.

44. The superintendent or dispenser, nurses and wardsmen and hospital servants, such as may be employed, shall live on the hospital premises. They shall be regular in their attendance, and conform generally to such rules as may be made by the committee.

45. All employes of the hospital, on being engaged, shall sign an agreement undertaking to give one month's notice of intention to resign their position, and in default of giving such notice shall forfeit any salary or wages due at time of leaving.

46. The superintendent shall remain on the hospital premises for at least two evenings a week; the head nurse for at least three evenings a week. In the absence of the superintendent and head nurse the night nurse must be in charge.

47. The absence from duty of any of the hospital employes will not be sanctioned without the express permission of the surgeon, superintendent, or responsible officer in charge, should the two former be absent.

48. The superintendent must, during his absence at any time, leave in charge of the hospital either the head nurse or night nurse.

49. Should the superintendent or the head nurse require to be absent from duty for a longer period than half-a-day, he or she must make such arrangements for the efficient carrying out of their respective duties as shall be satisfactory to the medical officer or the committee.

50. Applications for leave of absence must be made in writing to the committee through the secretary.

51. Should any of the other employes be absent from duty during any month, the superintendent must report the same, also cause of absence, to the committee at the monthly meeting.

52. All employes living at the hospital, other than surgeons, superintendent, and head nurse, must be in the hospital by 10 p.m., except special permission be granted by superintendent or head nurse.

53. All gates must be closed at 8 p.m. in the summer, and 6 p.m. in the winter, excepting the night gates.

#### PATIENTS.

54. The patients shall conduct themselves in an orderly manner, and strictly observe all the directions of the hospital surgeon and nurses, and such regulations as may be made by the hospital surgeon or house committee.

55. Any patient having cause of complaint shall make the same known to the hospital surgeon, the superintendent, or the committee.

56. Patients deemed able by the hospital surgeon to assist in the work of the hospital shall, at his request, so employ themselves.

57. Out-door patients shall attend at the hospital between Eleven and Twelve o'clock a.m. on Tuesdays and Fridays in each week, unless coming from over a distance of 10 miles from the hospital, when the dispenser or superintendent, in the absence of the surgeon, may provide such patients with accommodation for the night of arrival. All out-door patients must observe the rules so far as may be practicable.

58. All patients received by the dispenser or superintendent, in the absence of the surgeon, under rules Nos. 33 and 57, shall, until the surgeon has decided upon the fitness of the case for admission, be placed in a ward apart from the rest of the patients.

#### VISITORS AND PATIENTS.

59. Patients and visitors are requested not to give any fee, reward, or gratuity to any officer, nurse, or any other person connected with the hospital.

60. Visitors will be admitted on Tuesdays, Fridays, and Sundays, between the hours of 2 and 5 o'clock in the afternoon, except persons from a distance, who may be admitted at any time by permission of the hospital surgeon or superintendent, or any member of committee, but no visitor will be allowed to remain more than one hour, except ministers of religion, who may visit the patients at any time, but all visitors must retire when requested by the nurses.

61. Visitors shall not give to or leave with any patients medicines, victuals, tobacco, or liquid of any kind, nor any other thing without the permission of the hospital surgeon; nor interfere with the nurse, nor disturb the patients with loud talking or unnecessary noise.

62. Any visitor or patient violating any of the rules of the hospital, or behaving with impropriety, will be compelled to retire, or be dismissed, and will not be re-admitted at any time without special leave from the hospital surgeon or committee of management.

63. Any officer, nurse, servant, or other person in any way connected with the hospital, who shall receive, directly or indirectly, any fee, reward, or gratuity, unless by the permission of the committee of management, shall be immediately disqualified and dismissed, and shall not be permitted in future to hold any office or appointment belonging to the hospital.

64. No person shall be permitted to remain on the hospital premises longer than specified in rule 60, except by special permission.

65. All persons, including patients, are expressly prohibited from entering the kitchen and servants' quarters, unless members of committee or others duly authorized.

66. On no account will any person be permitted to undertake the duties of nursing or attending to patients without the permission of the medical officer. Should such permission be granted at any time during a month the superintendent must report same and circumstances to the committee at their regular monthly meetings.

#### NIGHT NURSE.

67. She shall be on duty for such hours as may be arranged by the hospital surgeon.

68. She must attend to all patients in the hospital.

69. She must have all chamber utensils and beds in a cleanly condition, to the satisfaction of the head nurse, before ceasing duty each morning.

70. Should the night nurse be applied to to admit any person desiring admission as a patient, she shall at once communicate with the superintendent, and should he not be present, with the head nurse.

71. The observance of these by-laws will be strictly enforced.
