BANK HALF-HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Half-Holidays from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon on each day at the places respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

WEDNESDAY, THE 27TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT, at Daylesford.

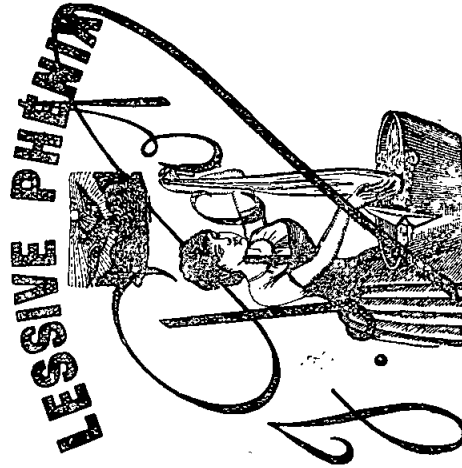

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS,
VICTORIA.

1. (a) Regular examinations will be held in Melbourne in March and September of every year, of which not less than four weeks' notice will be given.

(b) *First* and practical examinations will be held at any time that may be considered desirable.

2. Every intending candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for examination.

(b) A fee of £2 2s., which must be paid to the Secretary on or before the date of examination.

3. Every candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, a 40 - 20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan drawing, except paper.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

4. Every candidate shall satisfy the Board that he is of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination; but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have reached his majority.

5. Every candidate shall present satisfactory evidence as to character.

6. WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the hand of the Lieutenant-Governor and the seal of the colony of Victoria bearing date the ninth day of April, One thousand nine hundred, and issued in pursuance of the provisions of the *Health Act 1890* it was notified that the colonies of New South Wales and South Australia were infected with Oriental plague, and that it was probable that such disease might be brought from the said colonies to Victoria; and whereas the circumstances which led to the issue of such proclamation have ceased to exist: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation.

AREAS OF LANDS INCREASED AND DIMINISHED.*

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the Land Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the *Land Act 1898*, the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 9, of the said *Land Act 1898*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 7) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Acts provided: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 7 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the First Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 6, 7, 8, and 11 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—
