· PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

In pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the Public Service Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the Banks and Currency Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897 (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively mentioned, viz.:—

FRIDAY, THE 15TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT, as a Public Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the City of Ballaarat;*

Monday, the 18th day of March Instant, as a Public Holiday throughout the Boroughs of Inglewood, Port Fairy,* and St. Arnaud, the Shires of Alberton, Birchip, Charlton, Colac, Kara Kara, Kyneton,* Maldon, North Ovens, Oxley, South Gippsland, and Winchelsea, the West-Riding of the Shire of Bulla, the East Riding of the Shire of Gordon, and the East Riding of the Shire of Melton, as a Public Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the Borough of Wangaratta, and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Birchip, Casterton, Charlton, Kyneton, Lilydale, St. Arnaud, Seymour, and Tatura;

Thursday, the 21st day of March instant, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Avon, Maffra, and Rosedale, as a Public Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the City of Balharat,* the Mortlake Riding of the Shire of Mortlake,* and the Box Hill Riding of the Shire of Nunawading; ...

FRIDAY, THE 22ND DAY OF MARCH INSTANT, as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Ballaarat;

TURSDAY, THE 287H DAY OF MARCH INSTANT, as a Public Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the Shire of Ballan,* and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Ballan;

WEDNESDAY, THE 27th DAY OF MARCH INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Buln Buln, Glenlyon, and Mount Franklin, the North and West Ridings of the Shire of Ripon, and the Western Riding of the Shire of Waranga;

THURSDAY, THE 287H DAY OF MARCH INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Tambos and Winchelsea, and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Birregurra and Wycheproof;

WEDNESDAY, THE 3RD DAY OF APRIL NEXT, as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Jamieson and Portarlington;

THURSDAY, THE 18TH DAY OF APRIL NEXT, as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Maffra. * For Races.

Voting by Post Act 1900.

OFFICERS FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE VOTING BY POST ACT 1900 THROUGHOUT THE STATE OF VICTORIA.

, At the Executive Council, Melbourne, the twelfth day of March, 1901.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria.

Mr. Wynne Mr. McCulloch Mr. Trenwith

WHEREAS by the Voting by Post Act 1900 it is among other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, in such manner as may be prescribed, appoint or remove persons (therein called officers) who, in each Electoral Province or District, shall witness the signatures of persons who vote by post at an election in such Province or District, and that such officers shall post to the Returning Officer all postal ballot-papers received by them, and execute such powers and duties as may be prescribed:

And whereas a Regulation has been made whereby it is prescribed that the Governor in Council may, by notice published in the Government Gazette, appoint any member of the Police Force stationed within any Electoral Province or District to be such Show therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby appoint every officer in charge of a Police Station within the State of Victoria to be an officer within the meaning of the Voting by Post Act 1900.

And the Honorable William Arthur Trenwith, His Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions

ALTERATION OF CENSUS DISTRICTS.

ALTERATION OF GENSUS DISTRICTS.

N pursuance of the provisions of section 4 of the Census Act 1901 (64 Vict. No. 1669), the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in Council, by an Order made on the 12th day of March, 1901, has revoked the Order in Council dated the 14th day of January, 1901, defining the Districts for which Enumerators for the purpose of taking the Census should February, 1901, defining the Districts No. 58, "Lowan," and also the Order in Council dated the 19th day of No. 63D, "Karkarooc," so far as the same relates to the District No. 63D, "Karkarooc," so far as the same relates to the District No. 63D, "Karkarooc," and has re-defined the boundaries of the Census Districts No. 58, "Lowan," and No. 63D, "Karkarooc," as shown in the descriptions respectively set forth hereunder, viz.:—

No. 58. LOWAN (as altered).

Commencing on the boundary of the State of Victoria at the north-west angle of the parish of Neuarpur; thence east by the north boundaries of the parishes of Neuarpur, Boorcopki, and Morea; south and east by the west and south boundaries of the parishes of Dopewarra and Karnak to the west boundary of the parish of chanam; north by that boundary and further north and to a road forming the north boundary of allotment 21, parish of Karnak, north-westerly to the north-west angle of allotment 20a, and north Kalingur; north and east by the west and north boundaries of said parish to the west boundary of the parish of the west boundary of the parish to the west boundary of the parish to the south-west angle of the last-named parish; west by the north north boundaries of that allotment; north by the west and the last-mentioned allotment; north by the west boundaries of mallee allotment 280s, county of Lowan; north and east by the west and the last-mentioned allotment to the Winmera River; down the said river to the south boundary of the parish of Dimboola; east Joop to the north boundary of the county of Borung; west by that boundary to the east boundary of the county of Weeah; north by the north boundary of 34a and 34a to the east boundary of allotment 30s; north by that boundary to the north-boundary of that allotment; west to the county of Weeah; north by the north boundary of 34a and 34a to the east boundary of the State of Victoria; south by that boundary of the county of the north-east angle of the county of the county of 30s; west by the north boundary of the state of Victoria; south by that boundary of the county of the north-east angle of the county of 30s and 30s and 30s and 31s to the boundary of the State of Victoria; south by that boundary of the commencing point.
