OF THE LATE QUEEN TO PROCEED IN THE
EXECUTION OF THEIR RESPECTIVE OFFICES.**

BY THE KING.

A PROCLAMATION, requiring all persons being in office of authority or Government at the decease of the late Queen to proceed in the execution of their respective offices.

EDWARD R.

WHEREAS by an Act made in the sixth year of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Anne, intituled "An Act for the Security of Her Majesty's Person and Government, and of the Succession to the Crown of Great Britain in the Protestant Line," it was enacted that no office, place, or employment, civil or military, within the Kingdoms of Great Britain or Ireland, Dominion of Wales, Town of Berwick-upon-Tweed, Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, and Sark, or any of Her Majesty's plantations, should become void by reason of the demise of Her said late Majesty, Her heirs or successors, kings or queens of this Realm, but that every person and persons in any of the offices, places, and employments aforesaid should continue in their respective offices, places, and employments for the space of six months next after such death or demise, unless sooner removed and discharged by the next successor, to whom the Imperial Crown of this Realm was limited and appointed to go, remain, and descend: And whereas by an Act made in the first year of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, now intituled "The Colonial Offices Act 1830," it was enacted that no patent, commission, warrant, or other authority for the exercise of any office or employment, civil or military, within any of His Majesty's plantations or possessions abroad, determinable at the pleasure of His Majesty, or of any of His Majesty's heirs and successors, shall by reason of any future demise of the Crown be vacated or become void until the expiration of eighteen calendar months next after any such demise of the Crown as aforesaid: We therefore, with the advice of our Privy Council, declare our Royal will and pleasure to be, and do hereby direct and command, that all and every person and persons who at the time of the demise of our late Royal Mother, of glorious memory, duly and lawfully held, or were duly and lawfully possessed of or invested in any office, place, or employment, civil or military, within our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Dominion of Wales, Town of Berwick-upon-Tweed, Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, or any of our Foreign Possessions, or Colonies, or our Empire of India, do severally, according to their places, offices, or charges, proceed in the performance and execution of

all duties belonging to their respective offices whilst they shall hold the same respectively during our pleasure: And we do hereby require and command all our loving subjects to be aiding, helping, and assisting, at the commandment of the said officers and Ministers, in the performance and execution of their respective offices and places, as they and every of them tender our utmost displeasure and will answer the contrary at their peril.

PERSONS AUTHORIZED TO MAKE APPLICATIONS TO FIX OR INCREASE THE SUMS PAYABLE BY PARENTS, ETC.

WHEREAS by section 51 of the *Neglected Children's Act 1890* it is enacted that applications to fix or increase the sum payable by any parent or to vary or revoke any order suspending or dispensing with payment, or to recover payment of the same, may be made by or on behalf of any person authorized by any general or special order of the Minister: Now therefore I, William Arthur Trenwith, the Chief Secretary of the State of Victoria, and the responsible Minister of the Crown administering the said Act, do by this General Order authorize the Secretary of the Department for Neglected Children, all Superintendents of Police, all Inspectors and Sub-inspectors of Police, all Sergeants of Police, and all Police Constables now holding office or hereafter to be appointed, to make applications to fix or increase the sum payable by any parent or to vary or revoke any order suspending or dispensing with payment, or to receive payment of the same.

THE BUBONIC PLAGUE.—REGULATIONS FOR PREVENTION OR MITIGATION.

THE provisions contained in section 122 of the Health Act 1890, having been directed by the Governor in Council to be put in force in Victoria, the Board of Public Health, by virtue of the power conferred by the said section, and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth make the following Regulations for preventing or mitigating the epidemic infectious or contagious disease known as the bubonic plague, that is to say:—

I. The Regulations made by the Board of Public Health on the 5th September, 1900, are hereby revoked;

II. The owner, agent, master, or person in charge of any vessel arriving in any waters of Victoria from any place proclaimed as plague-infected or any place which may hereafter be so proclaimed, hereinafter called the suspected vessel, shall observe, do, or carry out, or cause to be observed, done, or carried out, all the matters and things following, namely:—

1. He shall keep the suspected vessel off from the wharf or pier by a distance of at least 4 feet by means of fenders substantially constructed (preferably of wood), and shall prevent listing towards the wharf or pier, and shall place all fenders directly opposite mooring posts or piles.

2. He shall apply and keep applied to each end of every hawser and rope connecting the suspected vessel with the wharf or pier—

(a) tar kept constantly in a sticky condition by repeated applications, and—(b) either a funnel, at least 12 inches in diameter, or a stout metal disc at least 12 inches in diameter, and so constructed and so placed (one at each end) as to prevent transit of rats, the application of tar being made just beyond the side of the suspected vessel and just above the end attached to the wharf or pier, the tar being applied over a length of at least 1 foot at each end of each hawser and rope, and the application of the funnel or disc being made at each of the two tarred portions of the hawser or rope. The tar may be applied on bagging fixed round the hawser or rope.

3. He shall tar the fender and the fender-slings on such parts as to prevent migration of rats, and shall keep the tar in a sticky condition by repeated applications.

4. He shall not use any net between the suspected vessel and the wharf or pier, whether in connexion with the gangway or the hatches, unless the central part of the net for a width of at least 18 inches be thoroughly tarred, or be effectually covered with thoroughly tarred material, and the tar be kept in a sticky condition by repeated applications, and shall remove any such net, though tarred, between Seven p.m. and Six a.m., except only in case cargo is being discharged or delivered during that time.

5. He shall draw up and keep drawn up all gangways from the suspected vessel when not required for the discharging or the receiving of cargo from Seven p.m. until Six a.m., and shall apply tar to each gangway while down over a length of at least 1 foot at each end, just beyond the side of the suspected vessel and just above the end resting on the wharf or pier, and shall keep the tar in a sticky condition by repeated applications.

6. He shall suspend over the side of the suspected vessel along the wharf or pier four sets (or more if required) of electric or other lights, distributed so as to afford thorough illumination fore and aft along the whole length of the side of the suspected vessel.

7. He shall supply one watchman by night, shall furnish him with a stick, and see that he constantly parades on wharf or pier alongside the suspected vessel from stern to stern, and that he takes all practicable measures to prevent the passage of rats between the suspected vessel and the wharf or pier. He shall supply the watchman with a pot of tar and a brush, and see that he renews the tarring of gangways, nets, hawsers, and ropes, so as to keep the tar in a sticky condition.

8. He shall completely obstruct all pipes, ports, cabin scuttles, and other holes in the side of the suspected vessel next to the wharf or pier, and shall keep the same obstructed while the suspected vessel is alongside, in order to prevent both ingress and egress of rats.

9. He shall prevent any refuse matter from being discharged from the suspected vessel into the river.

10. He shall not allow any vessel or any lighter alongside the suspected vessel unless precisely the same conditions are observed on the lightering side of the suspected vessel as set out above on the wharf or pier side of the suspected vessel.

11. He shall not allow the landing of any rags, or of any old cordage or second-hand clothing or bedding, or of any used or returned produce-bags whatever from the suspected vessel.

12. He shall tar the wharf the whole of the length of the moorings of the suspected vessel to a width from the edge of 1 foot, and shall keep the tar in a sticky condition by repeated applications.

III. The owner, agent, master, or person in charge of any lighter or vessel going alongside any suspected vessel as hereinbefore defined, shall observe, do, or carry out, or cause to be observed, done, or carried out, all the matters and things following, namely:—

1. He shall keep the lighter or vessel from the suspected vessel by a distance of at least 4 feet by means of fenders substantially constructed (preferably of wood), and shall prevent listing towards the lighter or vessel.

2. He shall apply and keep applied to each end of every hawser and rope connecting the lighter or vessel with the suspected vessel—

(a) Tar kept constantly in a sticky condition by repeated applications, and

(b) Either a funnel at least 12 inches in diameter or a stout metal disc at least 12 inches in diameter, and so constructed and so placed (one at each end) as to prevent transit of rats, the application of tar being made just beyond the side of the suspected vessel and just beyond the side of the lighter or vessel, the tar being applied over a length of at least 1 foot at each end of each hawser and rope, and the application of the funnel or disc being made at each of the two tarred portions of the hawser or rope. The tar may be applied on bagging fixed round the hawser or rope.

3. He shall tar the fender and the fender slings on such parts as to prevent migration of rats, and shall keep the tar in a sticky condition by repeated applications.

4. He shall not use any net between the suspected vessel and the lighter or vessel, whether in connexion with the gangway or the hatches, unless the central part of the net, for a width of at least 18 inches, be thoroughly tarred or be effectually covered with thoroughly tarred material, and the tar be kept in a sticky condition by repeated applications, and he shall remove any such net, though tarred, between Seven p.m. and Six a.m., except only in case cargo is being discharged or delivered during that time.

5. He shall draw up, and keep drawn up, all gangways from the suspected vessel when not required for the discharging or the receiving of cargo from Seven p.m. until Six a.m., and shall apply tar to each gangway while down over a length of at least 1 foot at each end just beyond the side of the suspected vessel, and just beyond the side of the lighter or vessel, and shall keep the tar in a sticky condition by repeated applications.

6. He shall supply one watchman by night, shall furnish him with a stick, and see that he constantly parades the lighter or vessel from stern to stern, and that he takes all practicable measures to prevent the passage of rats between the suspected vessel

and the lighter or vessel. He shall supply the watchman with a pot of tar and a brush, and see that he renews the tarring of gangways, nets, hawsers, and ropes so as to keep the tar in a sticky condition.

Any person who fails to comply with any of these Regulations, or is guilty of any neglect or disobedience thereof, is, by section 326 of the *Health Act 1890*, thereby guilty of an offence against that Act, and is liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Twenty shillings for each day during which such offence is continued, besides any expenses which may be incurred in remedying his default.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

1. (a) Regular examinations will be held in Melbourne in March and September of every year, of which not less than four weeks' notice will be given.

(b) *Visu roce* and practical examinations will be held at any time that may be considered desirable.

2. Every intending candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for examination.

(b) A fee of £2 2s., which must be paid to the Secretary on or before the date of examination.

3. Every candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, a 40 - 20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan drawing, except paper.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

4. Every candidate shall satisfy the Board that he is of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination; but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have reached his majority.

5. Every candidate shall present satisfactory evidence as to character.

6. (1) Every candidate shall have passed, at an Australasian University, the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(2) Or he shall have served under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field, and he shall further produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(3) Or he shall have completed a course of the Degree of Bachelor in Engineering at an Australasian University, or at any University recognised by the Australasian Universities, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

Documentary evidence will be necessary in support of these conditions.

7. Every candidate shall produce, in the form hereafter, or in a like form, a certificate from a qualified surveyor with whom he has served that he is competent to undertake surveys.

Certificate of field service and competency for presentation to the Board of Examiners—

I, A. B., a registered land surveyor of the colony of _____ hereby certify that C. D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____ in the practice of land surveying for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____ and that he is fully competent to conduct surveys.

8. Every candidate shall produce, before examination, his original field notes, and plan plotted by him therefrom, of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature, or an irregular road. The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the applicant to be entirely his own work.

9. SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

Mathematics.

Trigonometry plane and spherical, geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

Reduction of traverses, computation connected with the setting out of roads and curves, adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurements of heights, surveying under the Real Property and Land Transfer Acts.

Levelling, &c.

Levelling, measurement of earthwork.

Principles of Construction, Adjustment and Use of the following Instruments, viz.:—

Steel band, plane table, compass, sextant, level, clinometer, telemeter, theodolite, barometer, thermometer.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places, elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians, declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

Plan drawing, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

MISCELLANEOUS.

Physics (Matriculation standard)—Elementary Stratigraphical Geology—Description Writing.

Candidates who cannot comply with the first part of clause 6 (preliminary conditions), will be examined in elementary mathematics.

CERTIFICATE WITH REMISSION OF PART OF OR WITHOUT AN EXAMINATION.

10. A certificate may be granted by the Board to an applicant who has paid the prescribed fee, and who produces satisfactory evidence as to character, and that he has complied with the condition set forth, as follows:—

Having passed an examination equivalent, in the opinion of the Board, to that prescribed in the Australasian Colonies, and producing satisfactory evidence of not less than twelve months' field experience in practical land surveying similar to that required of candidates for examination by the Board.

11. Subject to the payment of the fee prescribed, the Board may, at its discretion, issue a certificate of competency, under the Regulations adopted by the Australasian Boards, to any applicant holding a certificate as a qualified surveyor conferred prior to the adoption of such Regulations, either without examination, or upon passing such part of the examination therein prescribed as the Board may require.

Provided that the Board may confer the certificate without examination only when there is no reason to doubt that the qualifications required by the Board are possessed by the applicant.

ADDITIONAL REGULATION UNDER THE CENSUS ACT 1901 (64 Vict. No. 1669).

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twelfth day of March, 1901.

WHEREAS by the *Census Act 1901* it is among other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations for the execution of all matters and things arising under the said Act not therein expressly provided for, and for the more fully carrying out the objects and purposes of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

REGULATION.

4. *Enumeration of Intercolonial Vessels at Sea bound for Victoria.*—It being deemed desirable to enumerate all persons on the High Seas at midnight on the Census day travelling between one Australasian State or Colony and another, as if they were located within such States or Colony, the Government Statist is authorized to collect on arrival at any port in Victoria, all information respecting persons on board any vessel which was at sea at Twelve midnight on the Census day, whose next port of call is in Victoria. The schedules so collected shall be distributed by the Government Statist to the various States or the Colony of New Zealand, on a basis to be mutually agreed upon by the Government Statists of Australia and New Zealand; and on the same basis the Government Statist of Victoria is authorized to receive schedules distributed in Victoria from any other State or Colony, and to regard and deal with any such schedules so collected or distributed, according to the basis to be mutually agreed upon, as if the ship or vessel to which such schedules relate had been actually in Victorian waters on the Census night.

And the Honorable William Arthur Trenwith, His Majesty's Chief Secretary for the State of Victoria aforesaid, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the Land Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the *Land Act 1898*, the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 9, of the said *Land Act 1898*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 7) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Acts provided :— And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 7 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto :— And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in the said Schedule as Swamp lands :— the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the First Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands :— Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 5, 7, 8, and 9 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say) :—

MIDDLE VERMIN DISTRICT.—ANNUAL RATE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106) it is amongst other things enacted that the local committee for the destruction of vermin of any Vermin District shall, within thirty days from its appointment, and thereafter in the month of January in each and every year, recommend to the Governor an annual rate or assessment, specifying the amount thereof to be paid by the owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within its Vermin District, in respect of each square mile of land owned, held under lease, or occupied under the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and also in respect of the sheep or cattle depasturing thereon; and it is further enacted that such rate or assessment, on being proclaimed by the Governor in Council in the *Government Gazette*, shall be the rate payable by the owners, lessees, and occupiers of land within the Vermin District for the current year for the purposes of the said Part of the

said Act, and shall be paid to the Minister at the same time as the rent payable by such lessees and occupiers: And whereas the local committee duly appointed for the Middle Vermin District has recommended a rate of Five shillings per square mile upon all lands within the boundaries of the said Vermin District: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby proclaim an annual rate of Five shillings per square mile to be the rate payable by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Middle Vermin District aforesaid for the current year.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.) and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officers named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned.

11. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department except the Defence Department, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a duplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for and charge the

freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. (In the case of the Defence Department, however, the consignment note only which accompanies the order must be used.) Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used.
