## WESTERN PACIFIC HIGH COMMISSION.

TONGA ISLANDS.  
PROCLAMATION.

THE following Despatch and its enclosure, received by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor from His Excellency the High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, are published for general information.

I have the honour to forward herewith the copies of a Proclamation which I have issued regarding the exercise by the British Agent and Consul at Tonga of jurisdiction over British subjects and foreigners in the Tonga Islands, under Article V. of the Treaty of 18th May, 1900.

## WESTERN PACIFIC HIGH COMMISSION.

Proclamation by His Excellency Sir George Thomas Michael O'Brien, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, His Britannic Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific.

WHEREAS the Treaty between Her Majesty the Queen of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, and His Majesty the

King of the Tonga Islands, concluded and signed at Nukualofa on the 18th May, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred, by the Plenipotentiaries of their said Majesties, has now been ratified by their respective Majesties, I, George Thomas Michael O'Brien, do hereby proclaim that from and after this date His Britannic Majesty's Agent and Consul in Tonga will exercise the jurisdiction vested in Her Majesty by Article V. of the said Treaty, which Article runs and makes provision as follows:—

"The jurisdiction to be exercised by Her Majesty in Tonga shall extend to the hearing and settlement of all claims of a civil nature against British subjects or foreigners, and against British or foreign vessels by whomsoever preferred, and to the trial and punishment of all offences and crimes of which British subjects or foreigners may be accused in Tonga, except as herein-after provided. All such cases, whether civil or criminal, shall be dealt with in accordance with the provisions of 'The Pacific Order in Council, 1893,' and of any Order amending the same, so far as applicable. The authorities of Tonga shall at all times to the utmost of their power, when called upon by the British Agent, render aid in making arrests or in enforcing judgments in pursuance of this jurisdiction.

"Provided that British subjects and foreigners charged with violations of the Laws and Regulations of Tonga relating to Customs, taxation, public health, and local police, not cognizable as such under the provisions of 'The Pacific Order in Council, 1893,' shall continue to be amenable to the jurisdiction of the Tongan Courts. The proceedings at all such trials shall be public, and the records thereof accessible."

## Health Act 1890.

## BUBONIC PLAGUE.—REGULATIONS FOR PREVENTION OR MITIGATION.

THE provisions contained in section 122 of the *Health Act 1890* having been directed by the Governor in Council to be put in force in Victoria, the Minister of Health, by virtue of the powers conferred by section 18 of the said Act, and of every other power enabling the said Minister in this behalf, doth make the following Regulations for preventing or mitigating the epidemic infectious or contagious disease known as bubonic plague, that is to say:—

1. Every person who, in the opinion of the Board of Public Health, hereinafter called the Board, is affected with bubonic plague, or is likely to be so affected, shall be isolated in some place considered suitable by the Board, and shall be removed thereto if such course is considered necessary by the Board, and such person shall be kept in isolation until, in the opinion of the Board, there is no likelihood of the spread of bubonic plague infection from such person.

2. Every article and every building that, in the opinion of the Board, is infected or may have become infected with bubonic plague shall be isolated and kept in isolation until disinfected to the satisfaction of the Board.

## Health Act 1890.

## SMALL POX.—REGULATIONS FOR PREVENTION OR MITIGATION.

THE provisions contained in section 122 of the *Health Act 1890* having been directed by the Governor in Council to be put in force in Victoria, the Minister of Health, by virtue of the powers conferred by section 18 of the said Act, and of every other power enabling the said Minister in this behalf, doth make the following Regulations for preventing or mitigating the epidemic infectious or contagious disease known as small-pox, that is to say:—

1. Every person who, in the opinion of the Board of Public Health, hereinafter called the Board, is affected with small-pox, or is likely to be so affected, shall be isolated in some place considered suitable by the Board, and shall be removed thereto if such course is considered necessary by the Board, and such person shall be kept in isolation until, in the opinion of the Board, there is no likelihood of the spread of small-pox infection from such person.

2. Every article and every building that, in the opinion of the Board, is infected or may have become infected with small-pox shall be isolated and kept in isolation until disinfected to the satisfaction of the Board.

THE following Port Regulation is published for general information:—

[No. 71.]

REGULATION OF TRAFFIC TO PROVIDE FOR THE SAFE AND CEREMONIOUS PASSAGE OF THEIR ROYAL HIGHNESSES THE DUKE AND DUCHESS OF CORNWALL AND YORK THROUGH THE ENTRANCE TO PORT PHILLIP, AND FOR THE NAVAL PROCESSION THENCE TO THE LANDING PLACE AT ST. KILDA ON THE 6TH OF MAY, 1901.

On the 6th of May, 1901, the inwards and outwards traffic through the entrance to Port Phillip shall be suspended from 8 to 10 a.m. and while the Royal Yacht *Ophir* and her Naval escort shall be navigated through such Entrance between the Heads, and no person shall cause or permit any vessel to enter or leave the port of Port Phillip or obstruct on the course of the Royal Yacht *Ophir* and her Naval Escort.

After entering the port of Port Phillip on the above-mentioned date the Royal Yacht *Ophir* and her Naval Escort will form a procession, which shall proceed from Port Phillip Heads through the South Channel of Port Phillip and Port Phillip Bay to an anchorage off St. Kilda Pier to land their Royal Highnesses the Duke and Duchess of Cornwall and York, and during

the progress of such Naval procession persons in charge of vessels shall not cause or permit any vessel to precede the Royal Yacht *Ophir*; they must leave a clear course for such Royal Yacht and her Naval Escort, and shall not cause or permit any vessel to pass outwards through the South Channel of Port Phillip during the progress of such Naval procession therein.

During such Naval procession no person in charge of any vessel whatsoever shall break into the line of the Naval Escort. Each person in charge of any vessel desiring to join the procession shall cause his ship to fall in line astern of the last vessel of the Naval Escort or other vessel formed into line in such Naval procession.

During the landing of Their Royal Highnesses from the Royal Yacht *Ophir* on the afternoon of the 6th of May, 1901, no person shall cause or permit any vessel to approach within one quarter of a mile of such Royal Yacht at her anchorage between Williamstown and St. Kilda, or within one quarter of a mile of the direct course between such vessel and the outer extremity of the St. Kilda Pier.

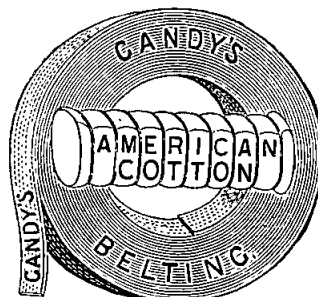

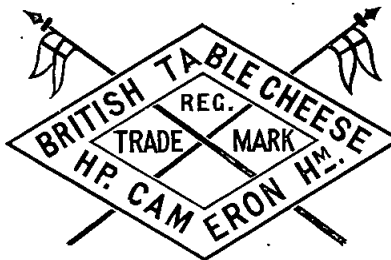

The Waterproof Cloth and Taping must be purchased from the Police Department at the prices laid down in the Schedule herein, but all other material, including buttons, must be provided by the contractor at his own expense.

No cloth other than that purchased from the Police Department is to be used in the garments, and the contractor will not be allowed to use any material purchased from the Department for any private work.

Should any emergency arise which would necessitate either Coats or Cloaks being required in less time than is provided for under the contract, the Government may obtain them elsewhere than from the contractor without in any way infringing this contract.

Delivery must be made at the Police Depot, St. Kilda-road, within two months from the date of the order, failing which a fine of One shilling (1s.) per garment per day may be enforced at the option of the Tender Board on report from the Chief Commissioner of Police, the amount to be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

The Coats and Cloaks must be cut and made in accordance with samples at the Tender Board Office, with buttons, canvas, and finishings as per sample—the canvas to run the entire length of facing of garments, to be not less than three (3) inches in width, and sewn to outer edge of garment. The best para rubber solution must be used in sticking down seams, &c. All Coats and Cloaks must be indelibly marked and numbered as required.

All garments shall be subject to the approval of the Chief Commissioner of Police or such other officer as may be authorized by him.

Any garment not fitting or bad in workmanship will be rejected, and the cost of the material that may be thereby rendered unserviceable for the purpose intended will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money; in exceptional cases arrangements may be made for any member of the force to visit the premises of the contractor for the purpose of being measured.

#### KERANG WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1901.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Kerang Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Acts, make the following Regulation:—

##### REGULATION No. 1, MAKING A RATE FOR 1901.

The following are the rates which the owners or occupiers of land and tenements within the District of the Kerang Waterworks Trust shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust:—

For every house or tenement of the annual value of over Ten pounds according to the municipal valuation, an amount of Two shillings in the pound of such valuation.

For every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds or under according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One pound sterling per annum.

For all water sold by meter by the Trust, the sum of One shilling per 1,000 gallons will be charged except in cases of special arrangement.

The before-mentioned rates and charges are made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January and ending on the 31st day of December, 1901, and shall be due and payable in equal moieties on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1901.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Kerang Waterworks Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect the said rates and charges.

WHEREAS by section 121 of the *Health Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Orders from time to time directing that the provisions thereafter contained for the prevention of epidemic, endemic, and contagious diseases be put in force in Victoria, or in such parts thereof or in such places therein as in such Orders respectively may be expressed, and may in like manner, from time to time, revoke, alter, or vary any such Order, and that such Orders shall have the like effect as if the provisions therein contained were included in the said Act, provided that all such Orders shall, within one week from the making thereof, be published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas the disease known as Small-pox exists in Victoria, and it is expedient that the Board of Public Health should be enabled to enforce any regulation that may appear to be necessary for preventing or mitigating the said disease: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this present Order direct that the provisions contained in the *Health Act 1890* aforesaid for the prevention of epidemic, endemic, and contagious diseases be put in force in Victoria until this Order in Council shall be revoked.

And the Honorable William McCulloch, His Majesty's Minister of Health for the State of Victoria, aforesaid shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

A red flag will be hoisted at the masthead of a flag-pole near the targets one hour prior to and during the time such rifle practice is to be carried out. All ships and boats should be kept at a distance of at least half-a-mile from the line of fire for a distance of 3,000 yards from the beach.

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

**W**HEREAS by Part I. of the *Chinese Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1073) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, to exempt any person or class of persons from the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and to declare that such provisions shall not at any time, or for any specified period, apply to the person or class of persons mentioned in such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation exempt the Chinese named in the first column of the Schedule hereto subjoined from the provisions of Part I. of the *Chinese Act 1890* aforesaid, from the date hereof, for the periods specified opposite their respective names in the fourth column of the said Schedule, that is to say:—

PORTS IN VICTORIA.—ADDITIONAL REGULATION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

**W**HEREAS by Part II. of the *Marine Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1165) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs, and may appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations; but that no rules or regulations made as aforesaid respecting any public wharf shall have any force or validity to repeal or affect any by-law passed by the corporation of the city of Melbourne or of the town of Geelong or by the council of any borough, district, or shire for preventing obstruction and encumbrances in and upon any wharf within the limits of such city, town, borough, district, or shire; and that any such limits, boundaries, rules, and regulations may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed, and others substituted in their stead: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby make the following Additional Regulation for Ports in Victoria, that is to say:—

REGULATION OF TRAFFIC TO PROVIDE FOR THE SAFE AND CEREMONIOUS PASSAGE OF THEIR ROYAL HIGHNESSES THE DUKE AND DUCHESS OF CORNWALL AND YORK THROUGH THE ENTRANCE TO PORT PHILLIP, AND FOR THE NAVAL PROCESSION THEREON TO THE LANDING-PLACE AT ST. KILDA ON THE 6TH MAY, 1901.

On the 6th May, 1901, the inwards and outwards traffic through the entrance to Port Phillip shall be suspended from Eight to

Ten a.m., and while the Royal yacht *Ophir* and her Naval Escort shall be navigated through such entrance between the Heads, and no person shall cause or permit any vessel to enter or leave the Port of Port Phillip, or obtrude on the course of the Royal yacht *Ophir* and her Naval Escort.

After entering the Port of Port Phillip on the above-mentioned date, the Royal yacht *Ophir* and her Naval Escort will form a procession, which shall proceed from Port Phillip Heads through the South Channel of Port Phillip and Port Phillip Bay to an anchorage off St. Kilda Pier to land Their Royal Highnesses the Duke and Duchess of Cornwall and York, and during the progress of such naval procession persons in charge of vessels shall not cause or permit any vessel to precede the Royal yacht *Ophir*; they must leave a clear course for such Royal yacht and her Naval Escort, and shall not cause or permit any vessel to pass outwards through the South Channel of Port Phillip during the progress of such naval procession therein.

During such naval procession no person in charge of any vessel whatsoever shall break into the line of the Naval Escort. Each person in charge of any vessel desiring to join the procession shall cause his ship to fall in line astern of the last vessel of the Naval Escort or other vessel formed into line in such naval procession.

During the landing of Their Royal Highnesses from the Royal yacht *Ophir* on the afternoon of the 6th May, 1901, no person shall cause or permit any vessel to approach within one quarter of a mile of such Royal yacht at her anchorage between Williamstown and St. Kilda, or within one quarter of a mile of the direct course between such vessel and the outer extremity of the St. Kilda Pier.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A PUBLIC GARDEN AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF MOORABBIN, AT BRIGHTON (SOUTH ROAD).**

WE, John Ferrier Hamilton, David Abbott, William Mair, Thomas Bent, Alfred Born, Alfred Edward Small, Robert Mills, William Macanish, Joseph John Daly, Mackay John Scobie Gair, and Arthur George Harston, the Trustees of the Reserve for a Public Garden and for other purposes of Public Recreation in the parish of Moorabbin, at Brighton (South-road), in respect of which a Crown Grant has duly issued, do hereby, in view of the provisions thereof and of section 137 of the *Land Act 1890*, make the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the said reserve, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, or any specified part or parts thereof:—

**REGULATIONS.**

**1. The reserve shall be divided as follows:—**

1st. The portion enclosed containing the grand-stand, pavilion, members' and ladies' reserves, and tennis courts.

2nd. The playing ground and cycling track.

3rd. The remainder of the reserve.

2. All persons shall be admitted to the 3rd division free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding fifty (50) in any one year) as international, intercolonial, cup or other important cricket, football or tennis matches shall be played, or cycling or other sports held in the reserve.

3. No person shall enter at any time into any part of the 1st division, except on production of a ticket issued by the trustees duly authorizing such person in that behalf.

4. Every person paying for admission to the 3rd division or any part thereof, or to the grand-stand, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he shall upon demand produce, and, if required, surrender to any gate-keeper or other person having authority from the trustees to demand the production or surrender of same, and no such ticket of admission shall be of avail except on the day for which it is issued.

5. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure for the occasion of any cricket or football match or sports may be required to deposit with the trustees any sum not exceeding £10, which the trustees may determine, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure; and the trustees may make repairs or make good any damage or loss sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by any person by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the trustees in reference to the reserve buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon.

6. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

7. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

8. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or remove any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones therein.

9. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, sheep, goats, or other animals except with the written consent of the trustees.

10. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord.

11. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the trustees first obtained.

12. No person, except workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees or shrubs.

13. Any person committing in the reserve or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased and shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the reserve or any part thereof:—

(a) Being drunk, or using any profane, indecent, or obscene language.

(b) Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.

(c) Crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground during a cricket or football match or sports, or during practice at cricket, or when crossing or trespassing upon the ground would be injurious to it as a recreation ground.

(d) Being found in any part of the 1st, 2nd, or 3rd division of the reserve, and not producing, on demand, or surrendering, if required, to any gate-keeper or other person duly authorized to demand production or surrender, a ticket duly authorizing the admission of such person to the place wherein he may be found, unless such person shall forthwith satisfy the trustees or any person deputed by them that he has paid the proper charge for admission to such place, and that the ticket of admission supplied to such person has been lost.

(e) Obtaining admission to any part of the 1st, 2nd, or 3rd division of the reserve when not entitled to such admission under these Regulations.

14. The maximum scale of charges for admission to the 3rd division and grand-stand shall be as follows:—

(a) For admission of each person to the 3rd division during any international, intercolonial, cup or other important cricket or football match, or sports, such a sum as the trustees may determine, not exceeding 2s. 6d.

(b) For admission of each person to the grand-stand, such a sum as the trustees may determine, not exceeding 5s.: Provided always that the trustees may exempt any person wholly or partially from the payment of all or any such charges or fees.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 137 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any officer or servant of the trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such officer or servant or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

1. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officers named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned.

11. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department except the Defence Department, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. 3. In the event of the supplies not being delivered by the time specified in the schedule or order as the case may be, it will be competent for the Government Printer to purchase the same, or such articles as may be suitable for the service, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense that may be incurred over and above the contract price will be deducted.

4. The supplies on delivery will be surveyed by a board appointed by the Government for that purpose, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. Payment will be made on the board's certificate that the goods are of contract quality and in good order and condition.

5. If the board of survey shall decide that the goods are not of contract quality, the contractor must in that case remove the goods objected to and supply others in their stead, failing which the supplies may be purchased as in condition 3.

6. 11. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government or the contractor, as may be the case, will make a proportionate allowance by way of deduction from or increase of the price of the item so affected, provided that the duty on such item has actually been paid.
