PROCLAMATION.

THE following Despatch and its enclosure, received by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor from His Excellency the High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, are published for general information.

I have the honour to forward herewith the copies of a Proclamation which I have issued regarding the exercise by the British Agent and Consul at Tonga of jurisdiction over British subjects and foreigners in the Tonga Islands, under Article V. of the Treaty of 18th May, 1900.

Proclamation by His Excellency Sir George Thomas Michael O'Brien, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, His Britannic Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific.

WHEREAS the Treaty between Her Majesty the Queen of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, and His Majesty the No. 40.-March 29, 1901.-1.

King of the Tonga Islands, concluded and signed at Nukualofa on the 18th May, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred, by the Plenipotentiaries of their said Majesties, has now been ratified by their respective Majesties, I, George Thomas Michael O'Brien, de hiereby proclaim that from and after this date His Britannic Majesty's Agent and Consul in Tonga will exercise the jurisdiction vested in Her Majesty by Article V. of the said Treaty, which Article runs and makes provision as follows:—

vision as follows:—

"The jurisdiction to be exercised by Her Majesty in Tongashall extend to the hearing and settlement of all claims of a civil nature against British subjects or foreigners, and against British or foreign vessels by whomsoever preferred, and to the trial and punishment of all offences and crimes of which British subjects or foreigners may be accused in Tonga, except as hereinafter provided. All such cases, whether civil or criminal, shall be dealt with in accordance with the provisions of 'The Pacific Order in Council, 1893,' and of any Order amending the same, so far as applicable. The authorities of Tonga shall at all times to the utmost of their power, when called upon by the British Agent, render aid in making arrests or in enforcing judgments in pursuance of this jurisdiction.

"Provided that British subjects and foreigners charged with

"Provided that British subjects and foreigners charged with violations of the Laws and Regulations of Tonga relating to Customs, taxation, public health, and local police, not cognizable as such under the provisions of 'The Pacific Order' in Council, 1893,' shall continue to be amenable to the jurisdiction of the Tongan Courts. The proceedings at all such trials shall be public, and the records thereof accessible."

BUBONIC PLAGUE.—REGULATIONS FOR PREVENTION OR MITIGATION.

THE provisions contained in section 122 of the Health Act 1890 having been directed by the Governor in Council to be put in force in Victoria, the Minister of Health, by virtue of the powers conferred by section 18 of the said Act, and of every other power enabling the said Minister in this behalf, doth make the following Regulations for preventing or mitigating the epidemic infectious or contagious disease known as bubonic plague, that is to say:

plague, that is to say:—

1. Every person who, in the opinion of the Board of Public Health, hereinafter called the Board, is affected with bubonic plague, or is likely to be so affected, shall be isolated in some place considered suitable by the Board, and shall be removed thereto if such course is considered necessary by the Board, and such person shall be kept in isolation until, in the opinion of the Board, there is no likelihood of the spread of bubonic plague infection from such person.

2. Every article and every building that, in the opinion of the Board, is infected or may have become infected with bubonic plague shall be isolated and kept in isolation until disinfected to the satisfaction of the Board.

Every article and every building that, in the opinion of the Board, is infected or may have become infected with small-pox shall be isolated and kept in isolation until disinfected to the satisfaction of the Board.

WHEREAS by section 162 of the Water Act 1900, it is provided that, if it be proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that from any unfore-seen cause it would be inequitable to require any local governing body to make payments to the Redemption Fund and pay interest on the whole amount of its indebtedness, the Minister may recommend the Treasurer to suspend in whole, or in part, payments to such Redemption Fund and payment for interest for any period not exceeding one year at any one time, and it is further provided by such section that if the Treasurer approves of such recommendation the Governor in Council may make an Order suspending such payments into the Redemption Fund and for interest, and such payments shall be suspended accordingly.

And whereas the Stawell Borough Council has proved to the satisfaction of the Honorable John Baffour Burton, His Majesty's Minister of Water Supply in and for the State of Victoria, that from unforeseen causes it would be inequitable to require the said council—a local governing body which has obtained a loan under the provisions of the Water Acts for the construction of waterworks—to pay in full the interest and redemption on the whole amount of its loan for the year 1901, the said Minister has recommended the Trea-urer to suspend payment to the Redemption Fund and payment of interest on such loans to the extent of £1,200 for one year. And whereas the Trensurer has approved of such recommendation. Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutemant-Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 162 of the Water Act 1990, doth hereby

order that payment to the Redemption Fund and payment o interest upon the aforesaid loans to the extent of £1,200 shall be suspended for one year.

PORTS IN VICTORIA.—ADDITIONAL REGULATION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the Marine Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1165) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the Government Grantle, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs, and may appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations; but that no rules or regulations made as aforesaid respecting any public wharf shall have any force or validity to repeal or affect any by-law passed by the corporation of the city of Melbourne or of the town of Geelong or by the council of any borough, district, or shire for preventing obstruction and encumbrances in and upon any wharf within the limits of such city, town, borough, district, or shire; and that any such limits, boundaries, rules, and regulations may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed, and others substituted in their stead: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby make the following Additional Regulation for Ports in Victoria, that is to say:—

REGULATION OF TRAFFIC TO PROVIDE FOR THE SAFE AND CREEMONIOUS PASSAGE OF THEIR ROYAL HIGHNESSES THE DURK AND DURK AND HORLESS OF CORNWALL AND YORK THROUGH THE ENTRANCE TO POOT PHILLIP, AND FOR THE NAVAL PROCESSION THEREE TO THE LANDING-PLACE AT ST. KILDA ON THE 6TH MAY, 1901.

On the 6th May, 1901, the inwards and outwards traffic through the entrance to Port Phillip shall be suspended from Eight to

Ten a.m., and while the Royal yacht Ophir and her Naval Escort shall be navigated through such entrance between the Heads, and no person shall cause or permit any vessel to enter or leave the Port of Port Phillip, or obtrude on the course of the Royal yacht Ophir and her Naval Escort.

Royal yacht Ophir and her Naval Escort.

After entering the Port of Port Phillip on the above-mentioned date, the Royal yacht Ophir and her Naval Escort will form a procession, which shall proceed from Port Phillip Heads through the South Channel of Port Phillip and Port Phillip Bay to an anchorage off St. Kildh Pier to land Their Royal Highnesses the Duke and Duchess of Cornwall and York, and during the progress of such naval procession persons in charge of vessels shall not cause or permit any vessel to precede the Royal yacht Ophir; they must leave a clear course for such Royal yacht and her Naval Escort, and shall not cause or permit any vessel to pass outwards through the South Channel of Port Phillip during the progress of such naval procession no person in charge of any vessel

During such naval procession no person in charge of any vessel whatsoever shall break into the line of the Naval Escort. Each person in charge of any vessel desiring to join the procession shall cause his ship to fall in line astern of the last vessel of the Naval Escort or other vessel formed into line in such naval procession.

During the landing of Their Royal Highnesses from the Royal yacht Ophir on the afternoon of the 6th May, 1901, no person shall cause or permit any vessel to approach within one quarter of a mile of such Royal yacht at her anchorage between Williamstown and St. Kilda, or within one quarter of a mile of the direct course between such vessel and the outer extremity of the St. Kilda Pier.

W E, John Ferrier Hamilton, David Abbott, William Mair, Thomas Bent, Alfred Born, Alfred Edward Small, Robert Mills, William Macansh, Joseph John Daly, Mackay John Scobie Gair, and Arthur George Harston, the Trustees of the Reserve for a Public Garden and for other purposes of Public Recercation in the parish of Moorabbin, at Brighton (South-road), in respect of which a Crown Grant has duly issued, do hereby, in view of the provisions thereof and of section 137 of the Land Act 1890, make the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the said reserve, and for the preservation of good order and deevency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, or any specified part or parts thereof:—

Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure for the occasion of any cricket of football match or sports may be required to deposit with the trustees any sum not exceeding £10, which the trustees may determine, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure; and the trustees may make repairs or make good any damage or loss sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by any person by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the trustees in reference to the reserve buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 137 of the Land Act 1890, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any officer or servant of the trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such officer or servant or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
