## SUPPLEMENTARY ELECTORAL LISTS, 1901.

IT is hereby notified that Wednesday, the 1st day of May next is the last day on which Electors' Rights can be obtained for enrolment on the Supplementary Lists of Non-ratepaying Electors for the Legislative Assembly.

Persons who are not already enrolled and who have not obtained Electors' Rights will be entitled to have their names entered on such Lists by obtaining Rights from the Registrars for their respective Divisions, or their Deputies, *before* or on that date. "Residential" Rights for the Legislative Assembly may be applied for either in person or in writing through the post, and any written application posted to the Registrar or Deputy Registrar not later than the 29th April instant will be in time for enrolment on the Lists. Forms necessary for applications through the post are obtainable at the offices of the Registrars and Deputies, and at all Courts of Petty Sessions, Post-offices, and Police Stations.

## The Local Government Acts.

### REMUNERATION TO GOVERNMENT AUDITORS OF MUNICIPAL ACCOUNTS TO 30TH SEPT., 1900.

IN exercise of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1891* (55 Vict. No. 1243, section 42) the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in Council has, by Orders made on the 16th day of April, 1901, appointed that the remuneration to be paid out of the respective municipal funds to the Auditors appointed by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council for their services in auditing the municipal accounts of the Municipal Districts of the Borough of Olunes and the Shires of Rutherglen, Woorayl, and Yarrowonga for the year ended on the 30th September, 1900, shall be as set out hereunder instead of at the rate set out in the schedule marked "B" attached to the Order in Council dated the 24th day of September, 1900, fixing the rates to be paid to such Auditors, such remuneration to be exclusive of the amount of Travelling Expenses and of the commuted allowance in each case, that is to say:—

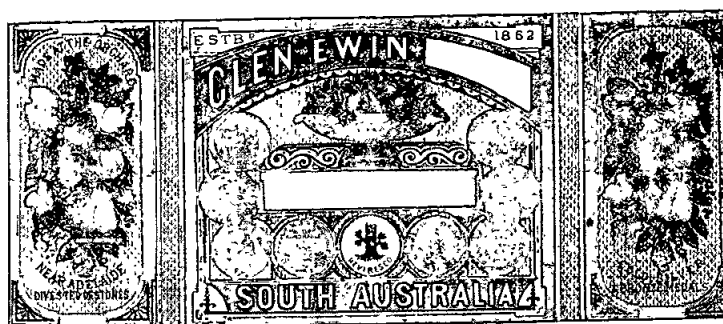

## ADDITIONAL REGULATION UNDER THE OLD-AGE PENSIONS ACT 1900.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the sixteenth day of April, 1901.*

**WHEREAS** by section 3 of the *Old-age Pensions Act 1900* (No. 1706) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations as to the mode, terms, and conditions on which pensions may be applied for, granted, suspended, or cancelled, and paid out of the sum appropriated for the purpose by the said Act, and for prescribing any alterations or additions to the form of declaration set forth in the Schedule to the said Act, and generally for the purposes of carrying into effect the provisions of the Act, and that such Regulations shall be published in the *Government Gazette*: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following addition to the Regulations made under the provisions aforesaid, that is to say:—

If an applicant for an Old-age Pension be possessed of over £10 in cash, the granting of a pension shall be deferred so long as the amount over that sum will keep him or her, estimating the cost of living at the rate of Ten shillings per week.

In the event of a successful applicant for an Old-age Pension being an inmate of a Benevolent Asylum, the pension shall only commence and be made payable from a date fourteen days prior to the pensioner leaving the Institution.

Any person in receipt of an Old-age Pension who is admitted as a patient into a hospital, and who remains there beyond a period of four weeks, will be permitted, upon his or her discharge, to draw pension for a period of four weeks only from the date of admission into the Institution.

And the Honorable Alexander James Peacock, His Majesty's Treasurer for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**REGULATIONS FOR EXPENDITURE OF THE SUM OF THIRTY-FIVE THOUSAND POUNDS, GRANTED BY PARLIAMENT TO PROMOTE THE AGRICULTURAL, DAIRY, FRUIT, AND WINE INDUSTRIES.\***

**W**HEREAS by the *Treasury Bonds Act 1896* (No. 1451) it is among other things provided that the sum of Thirty-five thousand pounds, to be raised by the issue of Treasury Bonds under the authority of the said Act, may be applied for the giving of bonuses for dairy produce, fruits, and honey of best quality, and in best order exported to markets other than Australasian; for the construction of wineries in vine-growing districts and viticultural education generally; for the sowing, and planting, and cultivation of seeds or plants to be used for the manufacture of raisins, and for the manufacture of raisins, currants, and figs, to be expended under regulations to be approved by the Governor in Council. And whereas by Order in Council dated the 16th day of November, 1896, regulations were made for payment of bonuses for export of fruit pulp, and such regulations were amended by Order in Council dated the 21st day of November, 1898. Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby further amend the regulations made for the purpose aforesaid in the manner following (that is to say):—

**BONUSES FOR EXPORT OF FRUIT PULP.**

Clause 2 in the aforesaid regulations of 16th November, 1896, is hereby revoked, and the following regulation is substituted therefor:—

2. A bonus may be paid upon fruit pulp, of a quality to be approved by the Minister of Agriculture, grown in Victoria, and exported therefrom to such foreign port or ports as may be approved by the Minister of Agriculture, of following kinds, and at the rates specified:—

Fig, One-third of a penny per lb.  
Peach, One-third of a penny per lb.  
Plum, One-third of a penny per lb.  
Quince, One-fourth of a penny per lb.  
Apple, One-fourth of a penny per lb.  
Raspberry, One halfpenny per lb.  
Apricot, One halfpenny per lb.

And the Honorable John Morrissey, His Majesty's Minister of Agriculture for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

**WHEREAS** by the *Fisheries Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1093) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Proclamations which shall have force and effect only in any waters or places specified therein for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sections 37 and 38 of the said Act, and that every Proclamation under the said Act shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and may be explained, varied, revoked, annulled, or superseded by any other Proclamation under the said Act: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council

of the said State, do by this Proclamation prohibit the use of trammels, trawls, and other nets or fixed engines at Apollo Bay within an area bounded by two imaginary lines intersecting one another and the portion of the foreshore between the points from which such two lines are drawn, one of such lines bounding such area to northwards bearing N. 70° E. from the shore 100 yards to northwards of the new jetty, the other bounding such area to eastwards bearing N. 13° E. from the white beacon on the shore to southwards of the new jetty.

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

**WHEREAS** by the Land Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the *Land Act 1898*, the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 9, of the said *Land Act 1898*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 7) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Acts provided: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 7 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the First Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 7, 8, and 11 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—
