THE BOROUGH OF CAULFIELD CONSTITUTED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirtieth day of April, 1901.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Acts it is enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others, to constitute any part of Victoria not exceeding in area nine square miles and having no point in such area distant more than six miles from any other point therein, and containing a population of inhabitant householders not less than three hundred, a borough: And whereas by the said Acts it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may exercise any of the powers therein conferred as aforesaid after the presentation of a petition in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts for the exercise thereof, and after the publication of such petition as therein described and the lapse of one month at the least from the day of such publication, and one month at the least from the day of such publication, and one month at the least from the day of such publication, and one month at the least from the day of such publication, and one month at the least from the day of such publication; but that it except as in the said Acts provided, not otherwise; but that it shall be in the discretion of the Governor in Council absolutely to refuse the prayer of any such petition, or to grant the whole or any part thereof: And whereas it is further enacted that every petition for the constitution of a borough must be signed by two hundred and fifty inhabitant householders at least resident within the part of Victoria sought to be affected, including a majority of the persons on any municipal roll in respect of property in any portion of any municipal district proposed to be included in such borough: And whereas a petition signed by at least two hundred and fifty inhabitant householders and by a majority of the persons on the municipal roll in respect of property in the Shire of Caulfield, praying that the said shire may be declared and proclaimed a borough, has been presented to the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in Council: And whereas the substance and prayer of such petition have been duly published in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the said State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order declare the said Shire of Caulfield to be a Borough, under the designation of

THE BOROUGH OF CAULFIELD,

and doth hereby subdivide the said borough into four separate

wards, the names and boundaries of which shall be those severally hereunder set forth and described, that is to say:—

*West Ward.*

Commencing at the intersection of Inkerman-road and Hotham-street; thence south along Hotham-street to the intersection of Glen Huntly-road; thence east along Glen Huntly-road to the intersection of Orrong-road; thence north along Orrong-road to the intersection of the Inkerman-road; and thence west along the latter road to the starting point.

*South Ward.*

Commencing at the intersection of the Glen Eira-road and Orrong-road; thence south along Orrong-road to the Brighton or Point Nepean-road; thence west along the Glen Huntly-road to Warrein or North-road; thence east along the latter road to the Booran-road; thence north and north-west along the Booran-road to the Glen Eira-road; thence west along the Glen Eira-road to the starting point.

*North Ward.*

Commencing at the intersection of the Dandenong and Orrong roads; thence south along Orrong-road to the intersection of the Glen Eira road; thence east along the Glen Eira-road to Bond-street; thence north along Bond-street to the intersection of Station-road; thence east along Station-road to Queen's-avenue; thence north along Queen's-avenue to the Dandenong-road; and thence north-west and west along the latter road to the starting point.

*East Ward.*

Commencing at the corner of the Dandenong-road and Queen's-avenue; thence south along Queen's-avenue to Station-road; thence west along Station-road to the intersection of Bond-street; thence south along Bond-street to Glen Eira-road; thence west along Glen Eira-road to Booran-road; thence south-east and south along Booran-road to the Warrigul or North-road; thence east along the latter road to Warrigul-road; thence north along Warrigul-road to the intersection of the Dandenong-road; thence west and north-west along the Dandenong-road to the starting point.

And the Honorable William McCulloch, His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
