SMALL POX ON THE S.S. "DARIUS."

WHEREAS by the Health Act 1899 it is amongst other thinge provided that in any emergency or sudden necessity with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria and having any infectious or contagious disease may have appeared in the course of the voyage, the Board of Public Health may take all necessary steps to prevent infection or contagion until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council under the provisions of section 165 of the said Act: And whereas the steam-ship Darius has arrived in Victorian waters, and has on board a case of the contagious disease small pox: And whereas it is expedient to make an order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: And whereas it is also enacted by such Act that all the powers, rights, and authorities vested in the above-named Board shall, whenever he deems fit, be exercisable by the Minister: Now therefore I, the Minister of Health for the State of Victoria, do hereby order and direct that, until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council as aforesaid, and in order to prevent infection or contagion, the said steam-ship shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepsan, or at the Outer Anchorage off Williamstown, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the mainmast-head; and do further direct that no person other than the passengers for Victoria, unless directed to do so by the Health Officer or other officer in charge on behalf of the said Board, nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters, shall leave the said steam-ship, nor be taken, or allowed or suffered to be taken and removed from her, nor shall any boat put off from the said steam-ship, except only that her mails, cargo, and passengers luggage for Victoria may be discharged into lighters, and may, after careful disinfection under the supervision of the Health Officer, be afterwards conveyed to shore under his directions; and, further, that are person except the Medical Inspector or Health Officer proposed in con

By-law No. 56 .- As to Dairies, Dairy Cattle, and Milk. THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Colac, by virtue of the provisions of the Health Act 1899, and every other power enabling them in this behalf, hereby make the following by-law, being By-law, No. 56 of the Council of the said Shire, that is to say:—

said Shire, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the Gorernment Gazette.

3. The whole of this by-law shall apply to and have operation in the Shire of Colac.

4. Registration of cow-keepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk.—Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall on or before the first day of March, 1901, and thereafter on or before the first day of September, 1901, and on or before the first day of September in subsequent years, register himself with the council in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Shire an application in the form hereunder writton, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of the following amount, namely, if the person to be registered keeps cows and the number of such cows is—

(1) Not more than 5, a fee of One shilling.
(2) More than 5, but not more than 20, a fee of Two shillings and sixpence.
(3) More than 20, but not more than 50, a fee of Five than 50.

(3) More than 20, but not more than 50, a fee of Five shillings.
(4) More than 50, but not more than 100, a fee of Ten

shillings.
(5) More than 100, but not more than 150, a fee of Fifteen

shillings.

(6) More than 150, a fee of Twenty shillings.

If the person to be registered does not keep cows, a fee of Ten

For the term from 1st day of March to 31st day of August 1901, one-half the amount stated above to be payable, thereafter the full rate to be payable on the 1st day of September in each year.

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the Secretary of the Shire shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee,

and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle, shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said council, or by any person authorized, in writing, by the chairman or secretary of the said council; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are, or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said council may, by an order in writing signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling house of the registered person, or in case of an unregistered person, served personally or left at this dwelling place, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unft for use or dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said council may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cow-keeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleaniness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or reluse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in

following the trade of a cow-keeper or dairy man, whether restricted or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances be funigated, disinfected, or lime washed, as may be in any such order so directly.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person of any member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of nilk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person shall be attacked by typhoid fover, or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupior of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the council, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said council, or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such council or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, or milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business he himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contanination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or anong the

of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cow-keeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the council, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyer of milk shall keep of permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this by-law, words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this by-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

The foregoing By-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Council of the Shire of Colac this twentieth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and one.
