PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz.:—

WEDNESDAY, THE 22ND DAY OF MAY INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Alberton and Wannon, and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Coleraine;

FRIDAY, THE 24TH DAY OF MAY INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the City of Hawthorn and the Borough of Daylesford;

WEDNESDAY, THE 29TH DAY OF MAY INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the North Riding of the Shire of Huntly;*

MONDAY, THE 3RD DAY OF JUNE NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout Victoria in celebration of the birthday of H.R.H. the Duke of Cornwall and York;

WEDNESDAY, THE 5TH DAY OF JUNE NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Maryborough and the Shires of Avoca and Tullaroop.
