





TOWN OF PORT MELBOURNE.

REGULATION No. 10.

Regulation No. 10 of the Town of Port Melbourne for Regulating Common Lodging houses within the district, made under section \$4 of the Health Act 1890, as follows:—

section \$4 of the Health Act 1830, as follows:—

CLEEPING apartments and ventilation.—In all sleeping apartments a space of not less than three hundred and fifty (\$50) cubic feet shall be allowed for each person; there shall be proper and efficient means of admitting a plentiful supply of fresh air near the hostem of, and also for permiting the foul air to escape at the upper part of, every such apartment, and no room or building shall be occupied as a sleeping place without being well ventilated.

2. Cleansing.—Every common lodging-house shall be washed and scrubbed throughout once in each week at the least.

3. Access by Council's officer.—The inspector of lodging-houses shall have free access to all common lodging-houses for the purpose of examining into the cleanliness and ventilation of the same, and to see that the provisions of any Act in force relating to public health, and if these regulations are properly adhered to.

adhered to.

4. Males and females.—Males and females shall not be permitted to occupy the same sleeping apartment, except in the case of man and wife, or of children under ten years of age, and not more than one married couple with their children (if any) shall be allowed to occupy the same sleeping apartment.

5. The penalties for breach shall be those contained in section 85 of the Health Act 1890.

The foregoing Regulation, made by the Municipal Council of Port Melbourne, was passed on 19th February, 1901, and confirmed on Tuesday, the 26th day of March, 1901.

SHIRE OF RIPON.

BY-LAW NO. 7, UNDER THE HEALTH ACT 1890.

A By-law of the Shire of Ripon, under the provisions of sections 31, 32, 35, and 253 of the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 7, for regulating the removal and disposal of nightsoil, closet pans, house and yard refuse, and other matters named therein.

pans, nouse and yard refuse, and other matters named therein.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1890, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ripon make the following By-law, being By-law No. 7:—

1. All former By-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby tepealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings pending at the time of this By-law coming into operation.

2. This By-law shall come into force on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the portion of the Shire of Ripon described hereunder, viz., commoncing at the north end of Murchison-street, Beaufort; thence south by that street to a line to the south boundary of the township of Beaufort; thence west, north, and east by the township boundaries to the commencing point.

4. The Council may, upon the recommendation of the Health Officer and the Inspector of Nuisances, exempt any premises within the township of Beaufort from the operation of this By-law.

within the township of Beaufort from the operation of this By-law.

5. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause all house or yard refuse to be rendered inoffensive until removed, or that every such occupier and person shall cause all rubbish from their respective houses or premises to be placed without delay in covered non-absorbent receptacles, into which a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be introduced when necessary.

6. At least once a week, or as frequently as the shire council may from time to time direct, the contents of these recoptacles shall be rendered inoffensive and removed to the depot.

7. Every such occupier or person shall keep such receptacles in their yards, and shall not place them in streets or lanes, and they shall be emptied by the occupier from time to time, as often as occasion shall require.

8. Every such occupier or person shall be responsible for the

occasion shall require.

8. Every such occupier or person shall be responsible for the keeping of the receptacles in an inoffensive condition.

9. The ordinary system of pans for nightsoil shall be and is hereby abolished.

10. Instead thereof every closet shall be furnished by the shire council of Ripon with a double-pan service, and that such pans shall be and remain the property of the shire council, except the first pan obtained from the council, which shall be paid for by the owner or occupier.

the owner or occupier.

11. At least once a week, or so much more frequently as the shire council may from time to time direct, the pan in use shall be closed with a tight-fitting lid and removed in a suitable cart, and the council shall have the power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of nightsoil, to make a charge on each occupier for such service and for the said pans supplied; the smount, in default of payment, to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

12. A pan, cleansed by superheated steam, or some other equally efficient means approved by the shire council, shall be left in its place.

left in its place.

13. Every closet within the boundaries above-named shall consist of a suitable privy building, constructed with proper openings or flues to provide due ventilation. The floor of such closet shall be at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and the closet shall be provided with requisite means for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be so constructed and placed as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and emptying and cleansing the same.

14. The nightsoil removed shall be either rendered inoffensive

removing the pan and emptying and cleansing the same.

14. The nightsoil removed shall be either rendered inoffensive or treated in a destructor, desiccator, or incinerator, provided by the shire council, or trenched or ploughed into land in such locality as may be provided by the shire council.

15. The occupier of any land within the above-named boundaries on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yards, cattle-shed, or pig-stye, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect to cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung or other manure produced or accumulated therein, to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same, so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard, and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same may be removed by order of the shire council at the expense of such occupier.

16. No occupier or person shall use a closet pan for depositing

16. No occupier or person shall use a closet pan for depositing any house or yard rubbish or any other material in (except for deodorizing) other than nightsoil, or shall damage such pan and lids in any manner whatsoever.

lids in any manner whatsoever.

17. Every such occupier or person shall cause to be kept in every closet a proper supply of div earth, ashes, cinders, lime, saw-dust, charcoal, or some other effective deodorant, for effectually deodorizing nightsoil, which may be deposited in the pan placed in such closet, to be immediately on such deposit covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly disinfect the contents of such pan.

18. No occupier or person shall employ any other person save those authorized by the shire council for the removal of nightsoil, and only persons so authorized shall remove nightsoil, except in cases of exemption.

19. Stringent supervision shall be exercised by the shire council over all premises, which may be inspected by the council or its officers from time to time, or by any person authorized by

its officers from time to time, or by any person authorized by the council.

20. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding £10 for every breach thereof, or not exceeding £5 for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, but the justices before whom any penalty is sought to be recovered shall order the whole or part only (not being less than 5s.) of such penalty to be paid.

TOWN OF TURRUMBERRY-PROCLAMATION PARTLY RESCINDED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Aus-

tralia.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of 'the Governor of Victoria and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the 31st day of August, 1874, made in pursuance of the provisions of The Land Act 1869, the boundaries of a certain Town in the county of Gunbower, parish of Patho, were therein Town of Turrumberry: And whereas by Part I. of the Land Act 1890 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, by a notice in the Government Gazette, annul and rescaind any Proclamation made under the said Land Act 1890 or any Act of Parliament thereby or theretofore repealed of any portion or portions of Crown lands as towns or townships: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Connoil of the said State, do hereby rescind the Proclamation aforesaid bearing date the 31st day of August, 1874, so far only as it relates to the portion of the said Town hereunder described, viz.:—

Commencing at a point on the west boundary of the town bearing north fifteen chains twenty-eight links from the southwest corner thereof; bounded thence by a line, section 5, and a line bearing S. 61° of E. seventeen chains eight links; thence by a line bearing south 7 chains; and thence by the town thouse by a line bearing south 7 chains; and thence by the town though early bearing east, north, west, and south to the point of commencement.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria, at Melbourne, this fourth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and one, and in the first year of His Majesty's reign.
