IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF THE DIXON TOBACCO CO. LTD., TOBACCO MANUFACTURERS, 225-33 QUEEN-STREET, MELBOURNE,

for a period of eight weeks from the 10th inst., upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than twenty-two females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week; and that the said twenty-two females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Twelve shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

TOWN OF PORT MELBOURNE.

REGULATION No. 10.

Regulation No. 10 of the Town of Port Melbourne for Regulating Common Lodging-houses within the district, made under section 84 of the *Health Act 1890*, as follows:—

SLEEPING apartments and ventilation.—In all sleeping apartments a space of not less than three hundred and fifty (350) cubic feet shall be allowed for each person; there shall be proper and efficient means of admitting a plentiful supply of fresh air near the bottom of, and also for permitting the foul air to escape at the upper part of, every such apartment, and no room or building shall be occupied as a sleeping place without being well ventilated.

2. Cleansing.—Every common lodging-house shall be washed and scrubbed throughout once in each week at the least.

3. Access by Council's officer.—The inspector of lodging-houses shall have free access to all common lodging-houses for the purpose of examining into the cleanliness and ventilation of the same, and to see that the provisions of any Act in force relating to public health, and if these regulations are properly adhered to.

4. Males and females.—Males and females shall not be permitted to occupy the same sleeping apartment, except in the case of man and wife, or of children under ten years of age, and not more than one married couple with their children (if any) shall be allowed to occupy the same sleeping apartment.

5. The penalties for breach shall be those contained in section 85 of the *Health Act 1890*.

The foregoing Regulation, made by the Municipal Council of Port Melbourne, was passed on 19th February, 1901, and confirmed on Tuesday, the 26th day of March, 1901.

Health Act 1890.

SHIRE OF RIPON.

BY-LAW No. 7, UNDER THE HEALTH ACT 1890.

A By-law of the Shire of Ripon, under the provisions of sections 31, 32, 35, and 253 of the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 7, for regulating the removal and disposal of nightsoil, closet pans, house and yard refuse, and other matters named therein.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ripon make the following By-law, being By-law No. 7:—

1. All former By-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings pending at the time of this By-law coming into operation.

2. This By-law shall come into force on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the portion of the Shire of Ripon described hereunder, viz., commencing at the north end of Murchison-street, Beaufort; thence south by that street to a line to the south boundary of the township of Beaufort; thence west, north, and east by the township boundaries to the commencing point.

4. The Council may, upon the recommendation of the Health Officer and the Inspector of Nuisances, exempt any premises within the township of Beaufort from the operation of this By-law.

5. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause all house or yard refuse to be rendered inoffensive until removed, or that every such occupier and person shall cause all rubbish from their respective houses or premises to be placed without delay in covered non-absorbent receptacles, into which a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be introduced when necessary.

6. At least once a week, or as frequently as the shire council may from time to time direct, the contents of these receptacles shall be rendered inoffensive and removed to the depot.

7. Every such occupier or person shall keep such receptacles in their yards, and shall not place them in streets or lanes, and they shall be emptied by the occupier from time to time, as often as occasion shall require.

8. Every such occupier or person shall be responsible for the keeping of the receptacles in an inoffensive condition.

9. The ordinary system of pans for nightsoil shall be and is hereby abolished.

10. Instead thereof every closet shall be furnished by the shire council of Ripon with a double-pan service, and that such pans shall be and remain the property of the shire council, except the first pan obtained from the council, which shall be paid for by the owner or occupier.

11. At least once a week, or so much more frequently as the shire council may from time to time direct, the pan in use shall be closed with a tight-fitting lid and removed in a suitable cart, and the council shall have the power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of nightsoil, to make a charge on each occupier for such service and for the said pans supplied; the amount, in default of payment, to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

12. A pan, cleansed by superheated steam, or some other equally efficient means approved by the shire council, shall be left in its place.

13. Every closet within the boundaries above-named shall consist of a suitable privy building, constructed with proper openings or flues to provide due ventilation. The floor of such closet shall be at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and the closet shall be provided with requisite means for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be so constructed and placed as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and emptying and cleansing the same.

14. The nightsoil removed shall be either rendered inoffensive or treated in a destructor, desiccator, or incinerator, provided by the shire council, or trenched or ploughed into land in such locality as may be provided by the shire council.

15. The occupier of any land within the above-named boundaries on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yards, cattle-shed, or pig-stye, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect to cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung or other manure produced or accumulated therein, to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard, and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same may be removed by order of the shire council at the expense of such occupier.

16. No occupier or person shall use a closet pan for depositing any house or yard rubbish or any other material in (except for deodorizing) other than nightsoil, or shall damage such pan and lids in any manner whatsoever.

17. Every such occupier or person shall cause to be kept in every closet a proper supply of dry earth, ashes, cinders, lime, saw-dust, charcoal, or some other effective deodorant, for effectually deodorizing nightsoil, which may be deposited in the pan placed in such closet, to be immediately on such deposit covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly disinfect the contents of such pan.

18. No occupier or person shall employ any other person save those authorized by the shire council for the removal of nightsoil, and only persons so authorized shall remove nightsoil, except in cases of exemption.

19. Stringent supervision shall be exercised by the shire council over all premises, which may be inspected by the council or its officers from time to time, or by any person authorized by the council.

20. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding £10 for every breach thereof, or not exceeding £5 for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, but the justices before whom any penalty is sought to be recovered shall order the whole or part only (not being less than 5s.) of such penalty to be paid.

WHEREAS by the Land Acts power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, or rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes specified in the said Acts, and generally for carrying out the provisions of the said Acts: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following additions to the Regulations previously made under the provisions aforesaid (that is to say):—

Additions to the Regulations made on 4th July, 1899.

PART III.—MALLEE LANDS.

MALLEE CLASSIFICATION BOARDS (SECTION 18 "LAND ACT 1900," (NO. 2).)

1. For the purpose of classifying all such land as the Minister directs in the Mallee country, or Mallee border, there shall be constituted Boards to be called Mallee Classification Boards.

2. Such Boards shall each consist of three (3) members, who shall be officers of the Department of Lands and Survey, or other competent persons, and shall be appointed by the Governor in Council.

3. Any lessee or licensee who is dissatisfied with the classification of his land as classified by a Mallee Classification Board may appeal in writing against such classification to the Chairman of Board, addressed to the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.

4. Such appeal shall be accompanied by a deposit of Two pounds (£2) as security for the costs of such appeal, which amount shall be returned to the applicant in the event of such appeal being sustained, but not otherwise.

5. On receipt of the prescribed amount of deposit, the Chairman of the Board shall at once forward same to the Secretary for Lands, who shall forthwith pay it into the "Trust Fund" pending the result of the appeal.

6. All appeals shall be considered and determined by the members of all the Mallee Classification Boards sitting as one Board, five members to form a quorum. In no case, however, shall any appeal be heard and determined unless the members of the Board which made the original classification are in the minority on the Appeal Board.

7. The Appeal Board shall sit in each of the sub-divisions of the mallee country, namely, the Eastern Division, the Central Division, and the Western Division, for the purpose of hearing appeals at such times and places as the Minister may direct.

8. At least fourteen days before the time appointed for the sitting of any Appeal Board there shall be inserted in a newspaper circulating in the district wherein such Board is to be held, a list of all the appeals to be heard at such sitting.

10. As soon as practicable after the conclusion of the sitting of any Appeal Board, the Chairman of such Board shall send to the Minister its report upon the appeals, and shall transmit with such report the minutes of evidence (if any) taken by the Board.

The total amount of tender must be stated in words as well as in figures.

Tenders having alterations or erasures therein will not be entertained.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes, or a bank draft in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor

will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officers named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned.

11.
