By-law of the City of South Melbourne, made under section 35 of the Health Act 1850, and numbered 136, for the purpose of carrying into execution within the jurisdiction of the said city such of the matters mentioned in such section 35 as are specified or described in the By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1890, and of all other Acts of Parliament hereunto authorizing them, the Council of the City of South Melbourne hereby make

them, the Council of the City of South Melbourne hereby make and enact the following by-law:

1. The following by-laws of the city of South Melbourne, to wit. No. 112, No. 114, and No. 115, and all other parts of the by-laws of the said city which are or may be repugnant to or inconsistent with this by-law are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation.

2. No person shall place, carry, or have in any vehicle containing manure or offensive matter, any fruit, vegetables, or other food which shall afterwards be used, or be intended to be used, or be offered for sale, or sold within the city of South Melbourne, or any case or other receptacle customarily used for the reception and carriage of such fruit, vegetables, or food, unless separated by an effective waterproof covering, so that such fruit, vegetables, food, case, or receptacle shall not be in contact with such manure or offensive matter, or be liable to be contaminated by moisture or effluvia therefrom.

3. Any person committing any breach of this part of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds for every such breach, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of such penalty, such portion not being less than Five shillings, to be paid.

The occupier of every house and premises within the said city shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connexion therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and 4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said city shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connexion therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and no house garbage, house sweepings, or other house refuse shall be scattered upon or within such yard or ground, nor heaped or otherwise deposited therein save in one or more vessel or vessels, which as to material, shape, and size, when filled, shall be reasonably portable by one man; but such vessel or vessels shall not be capable of holding more than five cubic feet of refuse, and shall be specially provided by the occupier of such house or building, and be by such occupier, or by his direction, so placed and kept as to be conveniently accessible to the persons employed by the said council for the cleansing of streets and the removal of refuse therefrom and from the houses in or adjacent to such streets. The said vessel or vessels shall be of iron, with lid of the same material, in every respect similar to patterns kept at the Town Hall of the city of South Melbourne.

5. The occupier of any land in the said city on which is erected any stable, cow-yard, or cattle-shed shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manura produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises once a week. And the floors and drains and receptacles connected with such drains of such stables, cow-yards, or cattle sheds shall be so constructed and paved or flagged with brick, stone, cement, asphalt, or other like impervious material; that they shall have impervious drains and receptacles protected with approved covering for offal, dung, or other filth or refuse. And if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other imanure removed therefrom as aforesaid the same shall be removed by the council of the said city at the ex

Tand's sinks be deemed and taken to be a public place.

8. The owner or occupior of any house or tenement shall make such provision for the emptying of the cess or privy pans or earth-closets of such house or tenement as shall insure such emptying being done without any nuisance to the inhabitants of South Melbourne.

9. That from and after the coming into operation of this by-law no person shall construct or place, or cause or suffer to be constructed or placed, any privy, earth-closet, cass-pan, or urinal on premises within the city of South Melbourne at a less distance than three feet from any public highway, or any lane or street of a width at any part thereof of eleven feet or upwards, or from any street channel, nor at a less distance than six feet from the door or window of any dwelling or tenement, nor to be situated in any position on any premises where the erection or placing of such privy, earth-closet, cass-pan, or urinal would be a nuisance, either to the owner or occupier of the adjoining premises or the public, and no privy or earth-closet shall have any opening for the putting in or taking out of any pan or earth-closet which shall be flush with the building line of any street, lane, or right-of-way, exceeding ten feet in width, within the city of South Melbourne, nor within the view of any person in any such street, lane, or right-of-way. Every closet shall be provided with a cess-pan, constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be water-tight, with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding two cubic feet.

10. If the pan of any privy or earth-closet-within the said city shall at any time be leaky or overflowing, the occupier of the premises on which such leaky or overflowing pan shall be shall forthwith give notice thereof to the inspector for the said city.

11. No person, except a nightman licensed by the said council, or a nightman employed by any person or persons carrying out a contract with the said council for the removal of night-soil from places within the city, shall and then only by means of a cart, carriage, or other conveyance, properly constructed so as to prevent the escape of the contents, or any portion thereof, or of effluvia therefrom.

12. It shall not be lawful for any licensed nightman, or any other person, to empty any earth-closet, privy, or cess-pan

15 That from and after the coming into operation of this by-law no person or persons shall construct the foundations of any building within the city of South Melbourne, except in the case of basements and cellars, unless the ground over which such building is to be placed is properly levelled and is at a sufficient height above the level of the lowest adjoining street channel to render such foundations and the ground over which such building is to be placed dry, sound, and well drained, so that no water soakage or damp shall lodge there.







The Governor in Council is empowered to make regulations for the election of Commissioners of Waterworks Trusts:

Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid make the following regulations for the election of Commissioners of the Nhill Waterworks Trust.

- 1. Interpretation of terms.—In these regulations "the Trust" or "the said Trust" shall mean the Nhill Waterworks Trust "Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply.
- Period for which Commissioners shall hold office.— period for which the Commissioners shall hold office shall three years, and shall date on and from the date of election.
- 3. Extraordinary vacancies, how filled.—Should any vacancy 3. Extraordinary vacancies, now filed.—Should any vacancy in the office of Commissioner be occasioned by death, resignation, disqualification, or any other cause whatever, the same shall be filled up by election under these regulations within one month after the vacancy has occurred, and the person elected to fill such vacancy shall hold the office of Commissioner during the unexpired portion of the term of office of the Commissioner whose east shall have become vacant. seat shall have become vacant.
- 4. Date of first and subsequent Election of Commissioners.—
 The first election of Commissioners under these regulations shall be held on the 13th day of August, 1901, and the ordinary election of Commissioners shall be held on the 13th day of August in each succeeding triemal year. Provided that whenever such date shall fall upon any day set apart as a public heliday such election shall be held upon the day next following.

 5. Voters' List to be prepared.—For the purposes of the first election of Commissioners a voters' list shall be prepared in like manner to that provided by section 6 of the Water Act 1900 in so far as circumstances will admit, on or before the 21st day of July, 1901, by the Secretary to the Trust, certified by him as correct, and such list shall be the list of voters for the said election of Commissioners, and shall remain in force and shall be used at any subsequent election of Commissioners that may be held prior to a fresh voters' list being made out as hereinafter provided.
- 6. Voters' List to be prepared annually.—Before the last day of February in each year a voters' list shall be made out in the manner prescribed by section 6 of the Water Act 1990, which shall, upon approval of the Commissioners under the common seal of the Trust, be the list of voters for the election of Commissioners for the twelve months next ensuing.

Form of Voters' List.—First Schedule.—Such voters' list shall be in the form in the First Schedule hereto, and shall contain, in regular numerical sequence and alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname, and address (so far as these may be known) of every ratepayer within that portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Lowan included within the district of the Waterworks Trust.

In making out such list of voters, if the property in respect of which any ratepayer is entitled to vote is only in part within the Waterworks district, then the number of votes of such ratepayer in respect of such property shall be reduced in the proportion which such part bears to the whole property of such ratepayer which such part bears to the vated in the municipal district.

Where Number of Candidates does not exceed Number of Commissioners to be elected.—If, at the expiration of the time limited as hereinbefore provided for the nomination of candidates, the number of persons who have become candidates be aforesaid does not exceed the number of Commissioners to as elected, the returning officer shall then declare such candidates to be duly elected, and they shall be deemed to be then duly elected accordingly.

Hours of Polling.—If, at the expiration of the time limited for the nomination of candidates, the number of candidates exceeds the number of Commissioners to be elected, then the returning officer shall forthwith cause the ballot-papers to be printed, with the christian names and surnames of all the candidates in full in the form of the Third Schedule hereto, and shall also give public notice by advertisement in some newspaper circulating in the Nhill township, stating the names of the persons so nominated, and that a poll will be taken for the election of such Commissioners upon the day named in such notice, at such place within the said township as the returning officer shall in and by such notice appoint; and such poll shall take place accordingly, and shall commence at Eight o'clock in the forenoon, and close at Seven o'clock in the afternoon.

Pencils to be provided.—The returning officer or his deputy shall provide pencils in the polling booth for the use of the voters, and also a locked box, to be called the ballot-box, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the ballot-papers, and such box shall be opened and exhibited to the scrutineers before the polling begins; and the box shall then be locked, and shall stand on a table opposite the returning officer or deputy returning officer, who shall keep the key of such box.

 18. Mode of voting where Voter is illiterate.—The returning officer shall deliver to every voter who requires the same a ballot-paper, or if such voter appears by the roll to be entitled to give more votes than one, then so many ballot-papers as may be equived to the number of votes which such voter so appears to be entitled to give, such ballot-papers being in the form of the Third Schedule thereto, and initialled by the returning officer; and every such voter shall, without leaving the booth, strike out from all or any of such papers the name of every candidate for whom he does not intend to vote. And in case any voter is unable to read or write, the returning officer or his deputy, if so required, shall, in view of such one of the scrutineers as the voter may desire, strike out the name or names of such candidate or candidates as such voter may designate; and after such name or names have been so attruck out, the ballot-paper or hallot-papers (as the case may be shall forthwith be deposited in the said box.  19. Ballot-papers to be numbered. Before delivering any ballot-paper to the voter, the returning officer or his deputy shall write upon the back of each such ballot-paper, as near as practicable to the lower odge thereof, the number set opposite to the voter's name in the roll, and shall thereupon, upon a copy of

such roll, check off such voter's name as having voted, and mark against such name the number of ballot-papers delivered to such

- 20. Informal Ballot-papers.—If any voter suffer to remain upon his ballot-paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of Commissioners to be elected, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect.
- 21. What Question may be asked.—At any election of Commissioners the returning officer may, if he see fit, or if required to do so by any candidate or scrutineer, put to any person tendering his vote the question following:—

Ballot-papers, how disposed of.—The returning officer shall forthwith after the declaration of the poll indorse with a description of the contents thereof, and sign the scaled parcel of ballot-papers, and ferward the same to the Secretary of the Trust, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months, then next ensuing, and then by him caused to be destroyed in the presence of three Commissioners of the Trust.
- 25. Minister to determine question arising upon first election. If any question arise as to the due election of any Commissioner at the first election, the returning officer shall, at the request of any voter or candidate, submit such question, in writing, to the Minister, who shall decide the same; and such decision shall be final and binding.

 26. Questions arising upon subsequent election to be determined by the Trust.—If any question arise as to the due election of any Commissioner at any subsequent election (whether ordinary or extraordinary), such question shall be determined by the Commissioners of the Trust at the first ordinary meeting held after the election; but no Commissioner in respect of whose election such question shall bave arisen shall act as a Commissioner at such meeting, or be entitled to take any part in the proceedings thereof, or in any manner or at any time to act as a Commissioner until such question shall have been so determined; and the majority of the Commissioners whose election is not in dispute shall form a quorum.

 27. Appeal to Minister from Determination of Trust.—In

Appeal to Minister from Determination of Trust.—In event of any voter or candidate feeling aggrieved by the determination of the Trust with reference to any such question as last aforesaid, he may appeal therefrom to the Minister within fourteen days from the date upon which the Commissioners shall have determined the question, and the Minister may make such inquiry as to the merits of the question as may appear to him to be necessary, and determine such question in such manner as to him may appear just: and such determination of the Minister shall be final and binding.
- 28. Failure to Elect deemed to create Extraordinary Vacancies.

 —If at any election of Commissioners no vacancies or a number of vacancies less than the whole number which should have been filled up at such election are filled up, then the vacancies which are not so filled shall severally be deemed extraordinary vacancies and to have occurred on the day appointed for such election. Provided always that the Commissioners eventually elected or appointed to fill such vacancies shall go out of office as if elected at such election.
- 29. Expenses of Election to be paid by Trust.—The expenses incurred by the returning officer, or under his direction, in connexion with any election shall be defrayed by the Trust.
- 30. Penalty for Breach of Regulations.—Any person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, to be recovered in a summary manner before justices of the peace.
- 31. Interpretation.—In these regulations words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, unless there is something in the context repugnant to or inconsistent with this interpretation.
