ELECTIONS FOR THE GIPPSLAND, MELROURNE, NELSON, NORTHERN, NORTH CENTRAL, NORTH-EASTERN, NORTH-WESTERN, NORTH-WESTERN, SOUTH YARRA, WELLINGTON, AND WESTERN PROVINCES.

It is likely that several of the tide establishments need revision: for instance, it will be seen that Cape Runaway is given on the chart as having high water at F. and C. at 9 hours 16 minutes, and Te Kaha, only 20 miles to the S.W. of it, as 6 hours 30 minutes, and the tidal stream here runs to the westward. It would seem likely, therefore, that one or other of these times is considerably in error.


