DETERMINATION OF THE AERATED WATER TRADE BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the special board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of an Aerated Water or Cordial or Non-intoxicating Beer Manufacturer, has made the following determination, viz. :—

WAGES.

1. That the lowest prices or rates payable to the following classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of an aerated water or cordial or non-intoxicating beer manufacturer shall be :—

Engine-drivers	40s. per week.
Persons bottling aerated waters by hand or by any rack (other than an automatic rack)	38s. "
Persons bottling aerated waters by any automatic rack (including tying and wiring, if necessary)	32s. "
Persons, over 21 years of age, not otherwise provided for,				27s. 6d. per week.

APPRENTICES OR IMPROVERS.—PROPORTION.

2. That the number of apprentices or improvers who may be employed within any factory or work-room or shop or place affected by this determination shall be—One such apprentice or improver to fifteen adults or fraction thereof employed in the process, trade, or business of an aerated water or cordial or non-intoxicating beer manufacturer.

APPRENTICES OR IMPROVERS.—WAGES.

3. That the lowest prices or rates of pay payable to apprentices or improvers employed in the process, trade, or business of an aerated water or cordial or non-intoxicating beer manufacturer shall be :—

18 years or over, but under 21 years of age	22s. per week.	
16 " " " 18 "	17s. "	
13 " " " 16 "	10s. "	of 48 hours.

GENERAL WORK.—WAGES.

4. That the lowest prices or rates of pay payable to persons under 21 years of age engaged in general work shall be :—

Persons, other than apprentices or improvers, 18 years or over, but under 21 years of age	20s. per week.
Persons, other than apprentices or improvers, 16 years or over, but under 18 years of age	15s. „
Persons, other than apprentices or improvers, 13 years or over, but under 16 years of age	10s. „ of 48 hours.

DEFINITIONS.

5. "General Work" shall mean any kind of work done in an aerated water or cordial or non-intoxicating beer factory, with the exception of bottling aerated waters or tying or wiring.

Engine-driver shall be permitted to do other work in the factory, provided he can have continuous supervision of the steam-engine and boiler.

MAXIMUM NUMBER OF HOURS.

6. That the maximum number of hours per week for which the lowest wages price or rate shall be payable to any of the classes of persons hereinbefore described, shall be as follows :—

48 hours per week during the months of March, April, May, June, July, August, September, and October, and 50 hours per week for males, over 16 years of age, during the months of November, December, January, and February.

OVERTIME.

7. That any male employé over the age of 16 years engaged in the process trade or business of an aerated water or cordial or non-intoxicating beer manufacturer, who works for any time in excess of the maximum number of hours per week fixed in this determination, shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a quarter.

HOLIDAYS.—SPECIAL RATE FOR.

8. That the price or rate of payment payable to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed in the process, trade, or business of an aerated water or cordial or non-intoxicating beer manufacturer for all work done on Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Eight Hours Day shall be double the minimum price or rate fixed by this determination for such person or persons or classes of persons.

9. That the above determination shall come into force on and after the fifteenth day of September, 1902.
