THE HEMP TRADE IN RUSSIA.

AT the request of the Imperial Consul-General for Russia in Australasia, the subjoined notification received from his Government is published for the information of all whom it may concern.

The new Law on the Hemp Trade, sanctioned by His Majesty the Emperor, on the 8th (21st) April, 1902, contains the following regulations:—

1. The hemp which is put up for sale in the interior of the Empire and abroad shall be subject to the undermentioned dispositions (2-5).
2. The hemp must neither contain any admixture of offals, or other foreign matters, nor be moistened in order to increase, artificially, its weight.
3. The bundles of hemp must not weigh more than 40 Russian pounds each, and shall be composed of filaments of homogeneous quality and preparation.
4. The bundles of hemp shall be composed of filaments without a head, put together by their length and bound round at the first third of the bundle, by only one band, in such a way that the ends of the filaments could freely hang down on both sides of the band, in order to make possible the examination of the filaments without the untying of the bundles.
5. The bands used for tying up the bundles must be of hemp. The following penalties are fixed for non-observance of the above-mentioned regulations:—

(1) Any tradesman who sells, prepares, or keeps for sale, hemp which contains an admixture of offals, or other foreign matters, or which is moistened, with the purpose of artificially increasing its weight, shall be punished by arrest for a term not exceeding one month; or by a fine not exceeding a hundred (100) roubles.

Any tradesman who does not observe the other regulations concerning the hemp, which is put up for sale in the interior of the Empire and abroad, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding a hundred (100) roubles.

This law is to take effect on the first day (old style) of August, 1902.

SHIRE OF STAWELL.

BY-LAW No. 6, UNDER THE HEALTH ACT 1890.

A By-law of the Shire of Stawell, made under the provisions of sections 31, 32, 35, 253, and 259 of the *Health Act 1890*, numbered 6, for regulating the removal and disposal of night-soil, closet-pans, dung, soil, and other manures named therein.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Stawell make the following by-law:—

1. All former by-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things herein provided for, are hereby repealed.

2. This by-law shall come into force on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation within the boundaries of the township of Glenorchy; in allot. 14, sec. IV., parish of Glenorchy; in allot. 93, parish of Gampola; and in the water reserve north of allots. 93, 94, and 94A, parish of Gampola, all in the county of Borung.

4. The Council may, upon the recommendation of the health officer and the inspector of nuisances, exempt any premises within the above area from the operation of this by-law.

5. The ordinary system of pans or cess-pits for night-soil shall be and is hereby abolished.

6. Instead thereof every closet shall be furnished by the Shire Council with a double-pan service, and such pans shall be and remain the property of the Council.

7. At least once a week, or so much more frequently as the Shire Council may from time to time direct, the pan in use shall be closed with a tight-fitting lid, and removed between such hours as the Council may direct, in a suitable cart, and the Council shall have power to make a charge on each occupier for such service and for the said pans supplied, the amount, in default of payment, to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

8. A pan, cleansed and disinfected by efficient means approved of by the Shire Council, shall be left in the place of the one removed.

9. Every closet within the aforesaid area shall consist of a suitable privy building, constructed with proper openings and flues to provide due ventilation. The floor of such closet shall be at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and be provided with requisite means for the application of any earth or deodorizing materials to the contents thereof, and shall be so constructed and placed as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and emptying and cleansing the same.

10. The night-soil removed shall be either rendered inoffensive or treated in a desiccator, destructor, or incinerator provided by the Shire Council, or be trenched or ploughed into the land in such locality as may be provided by the Shire Council.

11. The occupier of any land in the aforesaid area on which there shall be erected any stable, cow yard, or cattle shed shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to 1 cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same may be removed by order of the Shire Council at the expense of such occupier.

12. No occupier or person shall use such a closet-pan for depositing any house or yard rubbish or any other material in (except for deodorizing) other than night-soil, or shall damage such pan and lids in any manner whatsoever.

13. Every such occupier or person shall cause to be kept in every closet a proper supply of dry earth, ashes, lime, sawdust, charcoal, or some other effective deodorant for effectually deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan placed in such closet to be, immediately on such deposit, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly disinfect the contents of such pan.

14. No occupier or person shall employ any other persons save those authorized by the Shire Council for the removal of night-soil, and no other person shall remove any night-soil except in cases of exemption.

15. Stringent supervision shall be exercised by the Shire Council over all premises which may be inspected by the Shire Council or its officers from time to time or any other person duly authorized by the Council.

16. Every such occupier or person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds for every breach thereof, or not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued; but the justices before whom such penalty is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid.

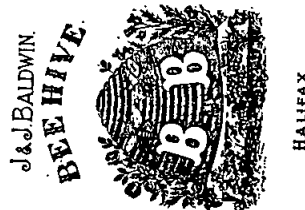

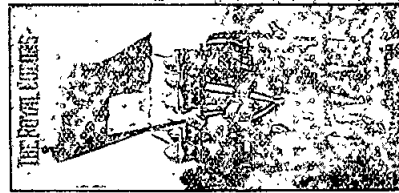

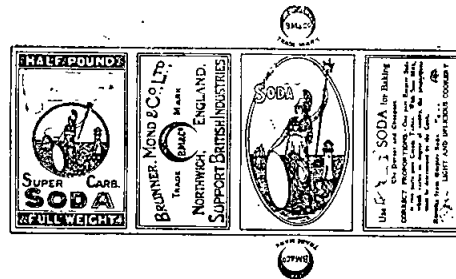

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Acts*, and after due inquiry, I, the responsible Minister for the time being administering the *Factories and Shops Acts*, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MESSRS. BRIGHT AND HITCHCOCKS, MILLINERS, DRESSMAKERS, AND TAILORS, MOORABOOL-STREET, GEELONG,

for a period of eight weeks from the 3rd September, 1902, upon the following express conditions, that is to say :—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than thirty-five females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said thirty-five females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. 5. For all vacant or unoccupied allotments of land fronting a street wherein a main pipe of the Trust is laid, and of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal valuation, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling shall be charged.
6. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly, where the water is used for domestic and other than domestic purposes, shall be the quantity which at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the assessed rate for the half-year which would be payable in respect of the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. In cases where water is sold by measure for other than domestic use solely, the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons or such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 27,000 gallons.

 6. For water supplied by measure a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in the case of special agreement with the Trust.
 7. The foregoing rates are made payable in equal moieties on 1st January and 1st July, 1903.

Provided that the said rate shall not in any case be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per annum.
 - (2) For every house or tenement situate in any street or road where pipes have been laid for the supply of water thereto, such house or tenement being used, either wholly or partly, as a domicile, where the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement does exceed the sum of Two hundred pounds sterling, a rate of Eightpence in the pound sterling for the first Two hundred pounds, and Fourpence in the pound sterling for any amount over and above the sum of Two hundred pounds sterling upon the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement shall be paid.
 - (3) For every occupied or unoccupied allotment or vacant lot, the rate to be paid shall be at the rate of Eightpence in the pound sterling, according to the municipal valuation of such allotment. Provided that in no case shall a less rate than Six shillings each be charged.
 - (4) For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one-half of the above rates. And for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile, but within half-a-mile from such stand-pipe, one-quarter of the full rate shall be paid.
3. The foregoing rate for the year ending the thirty-first day of December, 1903, shall be due and payable in two equal moieties, half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1903.
4. Such person as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rate.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS,
VICTORIA.

1. (a) Regular examinations will be held in Melbourne in March and September of every year, of which not less than four weeks' notice will be given.

(b) *Vind voce* and practical examinations will be held at any time that may be considered desirable.

2. Every intending candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for examination.

(b) A fee of £2 2s., which must be paid to the Secretary on or before the date of examination.

3. Every candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, a 40 - 20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan drawing, except paper.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

4. Every candidate shall satisfy the Board that he is of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination; but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have reached his majority.

5. Every candidate shall present satisfactory evidence as to character.

6. (1) Every candidate shall have passed, at an Australasian University, the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(2) Or he shall have served under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field, and he shall further produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(3) Or he shall have completed a course of the Degree of Bachelor in Engineering at an Australasian University, or at any University recognised by the Australasian Universities, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

Documentary evidence will be necessary in support of these conditions.

7. Every candidate shall produce, in the form hereafter, or in a like form, a certificate from a qualified surveyor with whom he has served that he is competent to undertake surveys.

Certificate of field service and competency for presentation to the Board of Examiners—

I, A. B., a registered land surveyor of the colony of _____ hereby certify that C. D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____ in the practice of land surveying for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____, and that he is fully competent to conduct surveys.

8. Every candidate shall produce, before examination, his original field notes, and plan plotted by him therefrom, of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature, or an irregular road. The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the applicant to be entirely his own work.

9. SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

Mathematics.

Trigonometry plane and spherical, geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

* If the certificate be of professional employment only, the words from "and that" to "surveys" inclusive shall be struck out.

10. A certificate may be granted by the Board to an applicant who has paid the prescribed fee, and who produces satisfactory evidence as to character, and that he has complied with the condition set forth, as follows:—

Having passed an examination equivalent, in the opinion of the Board, to that prescribed in the Australasian Colonies, and producing satisfactory evidence of not less than twelve months' field experience in practical land surveying similar to that required of candidates for examination by the Board.

11. Subject to the payment of the fee prescribed, the Board may, at its discretion, issue a certificate of competency, under the Regulations adopted by the Australasian Boards, to any applicant holding a certificate as a qualified surveyor conferred prior to the adoption of such Regulations, either without examination, or upon passing such part of the examination therein prescribed as the Board may require.

Provided that the Board may confer the certificate without examination only when there is no reason to doubt that the qualifications required by the Board are possessed by the applicant.

WHEREAS by section 208 of the Land Act 1901 power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein prescribed: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in the Regulations made by Order of the 8th day of January, 1902 (that is to say):—

ADDITIONS TO THE REGULATIONS MADE ON 8TH JANUARY, 1902.—PART IV.—SAW-MILL AND TIMBER LICENCES.

STATE FORESTS, TIMBER RESERVES, AND OTHER CROWN LANDS.

Timber, other than redgum, on the undermentioned Crown lands, timber reserves, and State forests, shall, from the date hereof, be sold under special permit and royalty only, at the prices hereafter stated, and subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 140c hereto; but licences current shall remain in force until their expiration by effluxion of time, and contracts now existing for the supply of timber shall not be affected by this regulation.

1. Victoria State Forest and all Crown lands in the parishes of Beensak, Warburton, Yuonga, Manango, Steavenson, Granton, Narthoing, Woodbourne, Tarrawarra North, and the Crown lands bounded by the crest of the watershed of the Yarra Yarra River above the parishes of Warburton and Yuonga, also the crest of the watershed in the county of Wonnangatta shown on the Land Act map, adjoining and south of Mount Arnold, as shown by a pink border on plan with Forests Corr. E.35473, the portion known as the Victoria Forest being shown thereon by pink tint.

2. The Dandenong State Forest in the counties of Evelyn and Mornington.

3. Otway Forest reserves, including all Crown lands in the county of Polwarth.

Timber not otherwise specified in Regulations of this date shall be sold at rates to be fixed by the Minister.

Saw-millers may obtain the exclusive right to fell timber other than redgum, on royalty, on an area not exceeding 640 acres in connexion with any one saw-mill, should the Minister think fit to grant a licence therefor, at the rate of Ten shillings (10s.) per month for 100 acres or portion thereof; but no person or firm shall be permitted to hold more than 1,280 acres in one or more areas at any one time. These areas shall be known as "Special Areas," and every holder of such area or areas shall be entitled, within the boundaries of any such area, to a saw-mill site, not exceeding 5 acres in extent, for the purpose of operating on timber obtained under these Regulations. The locality of each site shall be approved by the forest officer, and no fee shall be charged for the site. All timber remaining on a "Special Area" after the expiration of the licence for the same shall revert to the Crown. The Minister may, however, should the circumstances, in his opinion, warrant the concession, grant a stated time after the expiration of a "Special Area" licence for the removal of any timber purchased by the licensee under these Regulations.

The licence for a "Special Area" shall be in the form and subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 140d hereto.

Licences shall, at the discretion of the Minister, be granted to saw-millers of areas of not more than 5 acres each, as a site for a saw-mill, for the purpose of therein operating upon the timber obtained under these Regulations. The fee for such site shall be One pound per annum, payable in advance.

As soon as may be after examination of the entire area included in these lands by the Conservator of Forests or the Inspector

of Forests, the issue of licences to split timber within the forest shall be limited to such number as those officers, having regard to the conservation and protection of the young timber, may determine.

Every person employed by a permit-holder must obtain a "free permit," which must be produced when demanded by a forest officer, Crown lands bailiff, or police constable.

Schedule 140c.

CONDITIONS OF PERMIT FOR TIMBER OTHER THAN REDGUM.

1. This permit is available for a period of from
2. Applications shall be made to the officer in charge of the areas, who will arrange for the work to proceed without delay immediately on the issue of the permit by him.
3. The officer in charge will locate the permit-holder in any portion of the areas which, in his opinion, is most suitable, and, when necessary, will mark with the broad arrow (thus †) the trees which may be felled. He will also give the permit-holder instructions generally how to proceed with the work.
4. All forest produce cut under this permit must be branded with the Crown brand by the forest officer, and paid for before removal from the place where felled, but the forest officer may, in his discretion, arrange for branding at any depot or railway station.
5. Should the officer in charge deem it necessary, he may require that a sum of not less than £1 shall be deposited by permit-holders who obtain props and other timber, as a guarantee of strict compliance with the conditions of this permit.
6. Permit-holders must stack and burn off all debris when directed to do so by the officer in charge, and this must be done to his satisfaction, or that of the officer in charge. In the event of any wilful breach of this condition taking place, the Minister may cancel this permit, forfeit any deposit, and seize all timber already cut.
7. If the permit-holder remove, or allow to be removed, unbranded timber, cut under this permit without special authority, in writing, from the officer in charge, legal proceedings will be taken against him under the provisions of the Land Act 1901 or the Crimes Act 1890, and any person having in his possession unbranded timber cut under a permit, and without having written authority from the forest officer for the possession of the same, will also be prosecuted under the provisions of the Land Act 1901 or the Crimes Act 1890.
8. This permit is personal, and must be produced when demanded by a forest officer, Crown lands bailiff, or police constable.
9. The forest officer may, in writing, summarily suspend any permit pending the decision of the Minister, and during such suspension the permit shall have no force or effect.
10. When felling trees or burning debris the utmost care shall be taken that no young timber is broken down, injured, or burnt by fire. No live trees shall be used merely for the purpose of obtaining bark therefrom.
11. No tree shall be felled so as to obstruct any path or road used for the transport of timber or stores, or by the public generally.
12. The permit-holder may cut upon the block assigned to him as late in the year as is consistent with safety from bush fires. Upon receiving fourteen days' notice the permit-holder shall at once clear up his block to the satisfaction of the officer in charge, and shall entirely cease work within the period mentioned.
13. Fires shall not be permitted within the forest during the period from 1st December to 28th February, except special precautions be taken in lighting such fires in a bare cleared space of at least 20 feet in diameter, and in a hole dug for the purpose. Small wood only shall be used, and every fire shall be carefully extinguished by being covered with earth, or being put out by water. The burning off of debris during the period above specified is strictly prohibited. The lighting of standing trees, stumps, or fallen logs is strictly prohibited, and will be regarded as a breach of these conditions.
14. Receipt for payment of fees must be produced at any time when demanded by a forest officer, Crown lands bailiff, or police constable.
15. This permit may be cancelled for any breach of or non-compliance with any of the conditions hereof.
16. No timber of less diameter than 24 inches at a height of 2 feet from the ground shall be felled unless otherwise stated in this permit.

Schedule 140d.

CONDITIONS OF LICENCE FOR A "SPECIAL AREA."

1. No tree of less diameter than 24 inches at a height of 2 feet from the ground shall be felled.
2. All trees felled and not delivered at the mill at the expiry of the licence shall revert to the Crown.
3. No tree on the block under licence shall be used merely for the purpose of obtaining bark therefrom.
4. The licensee shall protect saplings and young seedling indigenous trees, and neither he nor any other person shall depasture goats on the block under licence to kill or cultivate any part of such block.
5. Within the period of one month from the felling of any tree, the portion thereof not required for use shall be so disposed of by the licensee as not to encumber the ground.
6. The licence-fee, amounting to Ten shillings (10s.) per month per 100 acres, or portion thereof, shall be paid in advance on the day of One thousand nine hundred and to the Receiver and Paymaster at collect the same.

WANDELLA AND GLENLEE TIMBER RESERVES.

CONDITIONS.

1. Application must be made to the Conservator of Forests, through the officer in charge of the reserves, who will arrange for the work to proceed immediately upon issue of permit.

2. The officer in charge will locate the permit-holder in any portion of either reserve, which is, in his opinion, most suitable, and when necessary mark the trees which may be felled with the broad arrow (thus ↑). He will also give the permit-holder instructions generally how to proceed with the work, and in the event of his instructions being disregarded, or upon wilful breach of any of these conditions, may instantly suspend the permit pending the decision of the Honorable the Minister, who may cancel the permit, forfeit the deposit (if any), and seize the timber already cut as the property of the Crown. During suspension the permit shall have no force or effect.

3. A deposit of £1 must be made if the Conservator of Forests thinks such deposit necessary.

4. All forest produce cut under this regulation must be branded by the officer in charge with the Crown brand, and paid for by the permit-holder before removal from the reserve, and should the latter remove or allow to be removed unbranded timber, unless with the written authority of the officer in charge, legal proceedings will be taken under the Land Act 1890 or the Crimes Act 1890. Permits are personal, and must be produced on demand of any forest officer, Crown lands bailiff, or police constable.

The royalty rates shall be as follow :-

- Split posts, 4s. per hundred. Round posts or strainers, 6d. each. Green fuel, 3d. per ton measurement. Dry fuel, 2d. per ton measurement.

Round corner posts not exceeding 7 feet in length and 14 inches in diameter, 3d. each. 4. Forks for sheds not exceeding 12 feet in length and 12 inches in diameter, 1s. each. 5. Firewood from dead wood lying on the ground, 2d per cord. 6. Firewood from live wood, 6d per cord.

PROHIBITION OF THE MANUFACTURE, ETC., OF RACKAROCK REVOKED.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the Explosives Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1090) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, or repeal regulations for licensing factories for the manufacture of explosives, and for other purposes in connexion with such manufacture, and notwithstanding anything in the said Part of the said Act, may from time to time, by Order, prohibit, either absolutely or subject to conditions or restrictions, the manufacture, keeping, importation from any place out of Victoria, conveyance, and sale, or any of them, of any explosive when, in the judgment of the Governor in Council, it is expedient for the public safety to make such Order: And whereas the Governor in Council did, by an Order made on the nineteenth day of August, 1902, repeal, as from that date, clauses 38, 39, 40, 41, 42, 43, 44, 45, 46, and 47 of the Regulations intitled "Manufacture of Explosives," made by Order in Council No. 2, dated the 13th December, 1897, and did by the same Order, prohibit absolutely from and after the aforesaid 19th day of August, 1902, the manufacture or keeping within, and the importation into and the conveyance or sale in the State of Victoria, of the explosive known as Rackarock, and defined in the Order in Council No. 1, made under the provisions of Section 49 of the Explosives Act 1890, on the 13th of December, 1897: And whereas it is expedient to revoke such Order: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke the hereinbefore-mentioned Order of the 19th August, 1902.

And the Honorable John Murray, His Majesty's Chief Secretary for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

7. The licence shall be produced by the holder thereof when asked so to do by any bailiff of Crown lands or police constable. 8. Non-compliance with or non-performance of any of the foregoing conditions shall render this licence null and void.

9. This licence shall be in force for one month from the date hereof, and then from month to month at the same rental, until either the licensee shall have given notice in writing of intention to abandon the licence, or until such licence shall be revoked by the Hon. the Minister.

10. Should it be desired to erect a saw-mill within the boundaries of the area, the site thereof must first be approved by the inspecting forester.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council made on the 27th September, 1882, a Waterworks Trust, known as the Avoca Water Trust, was duly constituted, to carry out certain waterworks described in such Order, and a general plan and description of such works were in and by the said Order duly approved.

And whereas a weir on the Mosquito Creek was one of the works so described, and shown on such general plan and description.

And whereas by section 55 of the *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156), it is provided that when the general plan and description of any proposed waterworks have been approved by the Governor in Council, such waterworks shall be constructed, maintained, and continued by a Waterworks Trust in accordance with such general plan and description as so approved, and no alteration shall be made in the position or height or other dimensions of the weirs, dams, or sluices so approved, and no additional weirs or off-takes or extension of the water supply works shall be constructed, except on the special authority of the Governor in Council for each and every such alteration.

And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter the said weir on Mosquito Creek in such manner as will permit of not more than three-fourths of the stream of water in that creek passing or flowing down the Avoca River, and of not more than one-fourth of such stream of water passing or flowing down the Mosquito Creek.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby authorize the Auditor-General—who is at present in possession of the works of the said Avoca Water Trust under the provisions of the *Water Acts*—to make such alteration to the said weir on the Mosquito Creek as may be necessary to permit of not more than three-fourths of the stream of water in that creek passing or flowing down the Avoca River, and of not more than one-fourth of such stream passing or flowing down the Mosquito Creek.

And the Honorable Ewen Hugh Cameron, His Majesty's Minister of Mines and Water Supply for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

4. Royalty must be paid in two instalments, the first payment covering all bark removed by 1st December, 1902, and the second payment covering all bark removed by 28th February, 1903, by which latter date all work must cease, and all bark, stripped or otherwise, remaining on the area after that date shall be the property of the Crown.
5. No tree shall be felled or stripped on any beauty spot, picnic ground, or on any portion of any area which the officer in charge points out as not to be operated upon, and no particular tree, specially marked by him to remain standing, shall be felled or stripped, wherever situated.
6. No tree shall be felled so as to fall into any water-course, or so as to obstruct any road or track.
7. No tree of less than 5 inches diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground shall be stripped when of the black or feather-leaved variety, or less than 2½ inches in diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground, when of the broad-leaved species, unless otherwise stated herein, and wherever a size limit is mentioned it shall be at a height of 2 feet from the ground. Notwithstanding this, trees of any diameter may be stripped with the express permission of the officer in charge, if diseased, or for other, in his opinion, valid reason.

SHIRE OF PRESTON.

REGULATION No. 1.

A REGULATION of the Shire of Preston, made under the 44th section of the *Meat Supervision Act 1900*, for prescribing the duties of the Meat Inspector, for fixing the fees for examining and branding carcasses of animals and meat, fattened and slaughtered by any person on his own premises, which premises are situated outside the meat area, and also the carcasses of animals and meat slaughtered at any abattoir situated within the limits of the meat area as at present constituted and as may be constituted from time to time within the shire of Preston, and for the conduct of and for maintenance of cleanliness in abattoirs, and for imposing penalties.

By virtue of the powers conferred by section 44 of the *Meat Supervision Act 1900*, the Council of the Shire of Preston, being the Municipal Council of the Municipal District of Preston, do hereby make the following regulations:—

1. Every Meat Inspector appointed for an abattoir "or appointed place" shall so far as regards such abattoir or appointed place—

- (a) Have free access thereto at all times and at any hour by day or by night, and full power and authority to inspect the same and all appurtenances and appliances appertaining and to exercise all the powers of Health Officers under section 52 of the *Health Act 1890*.
 - (b) Examine all animals intended to be slaughtered for human food before the same are slaughtered; condemn, destroy, or otherwise effectually dispose of all animals suspected of being affected with communicable disease, consistently with the provisions of the *Stock Diseases Act 1890*.
 - (c) Examine the carcasses or meat of all animals after slaughter, cut into any part of such carcasses or meat, and give such directions to the slaughtermen as may be necessary to prevent the parts and offal of one carcass being removed or mixed with the parts and offal of any other carcass prior to examination, and after examination, for the removal of such parts and offal forthwith.
 - (d) Brand or cause to be branded with the council's brand, in accordance with the branding regulations of the Board of Health the carcasses or meat of all animals found to be sound, wholesome, and fit for human food, and personally superintend the rendering unusable for human consumption such carcasses or meat as may be diseased, or for any sufficient reason condemned.
 - (e) Give certificates of the examination of all animals, carcasses, or meat condemned, if required by the owner thereof, or by the council, or by an officer of the Board of Health, or by an order of any competent court, or by any member of the police, so to do.
 - (f) Have the custody of the council's brands and appliances required in the performance of his duties; report at every ordinary meeting of the council the number of carcasses of each kind of animal examined and branded, the number of certificates issued and to whom, the number of animals, of carcasses and parts thereof condemned and how disposed of, and any other particulars about which the council may give directions.
 - (g) Provide, subject to the consent and approval of the council, a qualified substitute as Acting Meat Inspector, to carry out his duties in the event of his absence on leave, or of his absence from sickness, or of his absence for any other reason sanctioned by the council, and such substitute or Acting Meat Inspector shall have and exercise all the powers and authorities vested in the Meat Inspector during the absence as aforesaid of such Meat Inspector.
 - (h) Exercise generally all the powers and duties imposed on Meat Inspectors by the *Meat Supervision Act 1900*, or any amendment thereof, or any regulations thereunder, and in addition so far as may be prescribed the duties imposed on inspectors by section 28 of the *Butchers and Abattoirs Act 1890*.
 - (i) Every Meat Inspector shall keep a register of, inspect and report on to the council as frequently as directed, all butchers' shops, small goods factories, and such other places within the limits of the meat area within the shire, as the Council may direct, and shall examine all carcasses, meat, offal, small goods, fittings, implements, and appliances at these places, and shall take such action in regard to these as may be authorized by the provisions of the Act.
2. (a) Abattoirs may be open, and slaughtering shall be permitted therein on every day (Sunday excepted) from 7.30 a.m. to 5 o'clock p.m. during the months of April, May, June, July, August, and September, and from 10 o'clock a.m. to 12 o'clock midnight during the months of October, November, December, January, February, and March, and the council shall from time to time fix hours for killing at each abattoir within the hours aforesaid.
- (b) At every abattoir during the absence of the owner, lessee, or manager, there shall be at all times some one person who shall be nominated as responsible for the conduct of the abattoir, and such nomination shall be notified to the inspector.
- (c) The owner, lessee, or person in charge of every abattoir shall keep, or cause the same, with its appurtenances, and all appliances used thereat, to be kept in a strictly sanitary state; shall see that the clothing of all persons engaged in slaughtering or dressing carcasses therein is

cleanly and inoffensive; shall prevent persons suffering from dangerous or communicable disease being employed in the handling of carcasses or meat; shall remove all accumulations of blood, offal, garbage, and refuse daily; shall maintain in a clean and wholesome state all carts and vehicles used for the transport of carcasses or meat; and shall cleanse, purify, and wash all walls, doors, floors, pits, bins, and receptacles on the conclusion of each days' operations.

3. (a) No person employed at any abattoir shall ill-treat, over-drive, over-crowd, or otherwise cause needless suffering to any animals taken there to be slaughtered.
- (b) No slaughterman or other person engaged at any abattoir shall resort to unnecessary cruelty in driving any animals into the killing pens or in slaughtering them when there.
- (c) All animals brought to any abattoir to be slaughtered and kept there for twenty-four hours shall be provided by the abattoir owner with sufficient food and water; and if any of them should be milking cows, he shall milk the said cows, or cause the same to be milked.

4. The fees payable for examining and branding carcasses, parts of carcasses, or meat by or under the direction of the Meat Inspector shall be as follows:—

For the carcass, part of carcass, or meat of every	
ox, cow, bull, heifer, steer, or calf	... 6d.
Sheep, lamb, or goat	... 3d.
Swine	... 3d.

And such fees shall be paid to the shire collector at the shire office once at least in each week, and the amount of such payment shall correspond with and be accompanied by a voucher from the Meat Inspector.

5. For every offence against any of the provisions hereof, the offender shall, upon conviction thereof, before any one or more justices of the peace of the court of petty sessions forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence, and for each continuing offence a penalty not exceeding (£2) Two pounds per day for each day during which the offence continues.

6. The above regulations shall apply to all abattoirs or appointed places, and to all owners or lessees thereof, and all persons using the same, and shall have full force and effect within all that part of the metropolitan meat area included in the municipal district of Preston.

Health Act 1890.

SHIRE OF McIVOR.

BY-LAW No. 4.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of McIvor make the following by-law:—

1. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the area within the Central Riding of the Shire of McIvor, commencing at a point on the railway line between allotments 13 and 14 in the parish of Heathcote; thence by a line N. 41° 18' E. to the McIvor Creek; thence by the McIvor Creek to a point opposite the south boundary of allotment 5c of section 28, in the township and parish of Heathcote; thence by a line S. 55° 25' W. to the railway line; and thence by the railway line to the point of commencement; and shall come into operation from and after the date of publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. On and after the date of publication thereof the ordinary system of removal of night-soil in open cesspans shall be abolished, and from and after that date every closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service, to be provided by the Shire Council.

3. No householder or occupier shall contract with any person or persons for the removal of night-soil, or permit or cause the same to be removed by any person or persons save and except the person or persons in that behalf to be appointed by the Council of the said Shire.

4. Every householder or occupier of any premises must have a closet constructed with a door or opening sufficiently large to admit of the removal of pan or pans, and shall be available for access for such removal when required.

5. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, between the hours of sunrise and sunset, allow each pan to be removed for cleansing purposes.

6. Every such occupier or householder shall use or cause to be placed for use in and in connexion with every closet a suitable disinfectant or deodorant.

7. This Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil, to make a charge on each occupier or householder for such double-pan service as specified in this by-law and for pans supplied, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

Any person who shall be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 on conviction thereof before any Court of Petty Sessions.

BY-LAW No. 5, AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.
THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of McIvor, by virtue of the provisions of the *Health Act 1890* and the *Health Act 1900*, and every other power enabling them in this behalf, hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 5 of the Council of the said Shire, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.
2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the shire of McIvor.
4. *Registration of cow-keepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk.*—Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, for the year 1902, within fourteen days after the publication of this by-law in the *Government Gazette*, and thereafter on or before the first day of January in subsequent years, register himself with the council in manner following, that is to say:—By signing and forwarding to the Inspector of Dairies for the Shire an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of the following amount, namely, if the person to be registered keep cows, and the number of such cows is—
 - (1) Not more than 5, a fee of Two shillings and sixpence.
 - (2) More than 5, but not more than 10, a fee of Five shillings.
 - (3) More than 10, but not more than 20, a fee of Seven shillings and sixpence.
 - (4) More than 20, but not more than 30, a fee of Ten shillings.
 - (5) More than 30, but not more than 40, a fee of Twelve shillings and sixpence.
 - (6) More than 40, but not more than 50, a fee of Fifteen shillings.
 - (7) More than 50, but not more than 60, a fee of Twenty shillings.
 - (8) More than 60, a fee of Twenty-five shillings.
 - (9) If the person to be registered does not keep cows, a fee of Ten shillings.

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the Inspector of Dairies for the Shire shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.
6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said council, or by any person authorized, in writing, by the chairman or secretary of the said council, and if on inspection such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said council may by an order, in writing, signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in case of an unregistered person served personally or left at his dwelling place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer aforesaid, and any such order as aforesaid the said council may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.
7. All houses, dairies, cow-sheds, milk-stores, milk-shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cow-keeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be

thoroughly and effectually lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cow-keeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within 24 hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.
9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.
10. If any person or member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family, or any visitor to any such person shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or officer of health or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the council, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said council or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such council or officer of health, no longer exists, and in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business, nor if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.
11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cow-shed or dairy or in the herds of any cow-keeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the council, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.
12. No cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.
13. In the interpretation of this by-law words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.
14. Every person guilty of any breach of this by-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings.
