PROCLAMATION

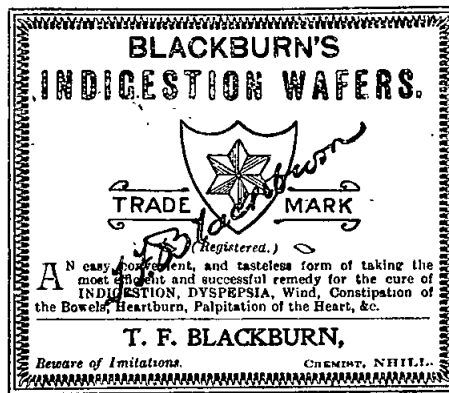

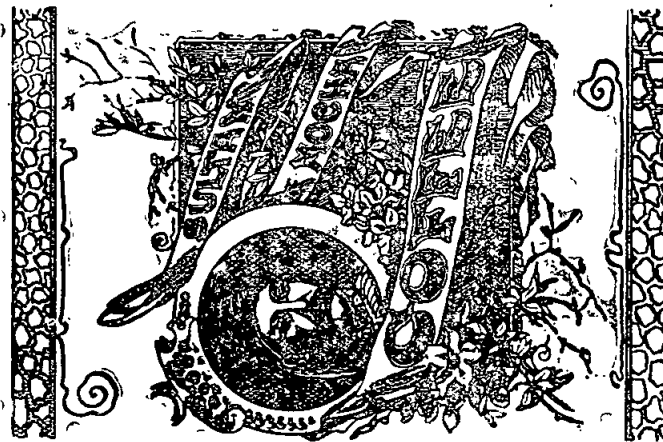

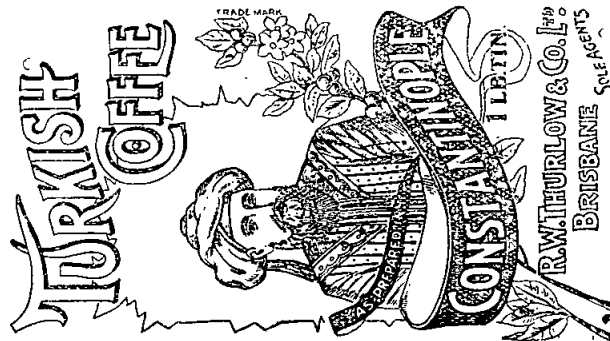

BOROUGH OF HORSHAM.

BY-LAW No. 10.

A By-law of the Borough of Horsham under the provisions of and the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution, the Council of the Borough of Horsham, in the name of and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses thereof hereby make the following by-law, being by-law No. 10:—

1. This by-law shall come into force after it shall have been confirmed by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
2. This by-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the municipal district of the Borough of Horsham.

INTERPRETATION OF TERM.

3. In the construction and for the purposes of this by-law unless the context otherwise requires:—

“Abattoir” or “Slaughter-house” means and includes the buildings and places commonly called abattoirs or slaughter-houses, and also knackers yards and any building or place used for slaughtering cattle, horses, or animals of any description,
“The Council” means the council for the time being of the Borough of Horsham.

“House” means and includes dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed victuallers' premises, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging houses, or other buildings or premises.

“Inspector” includes any acting or assistant inspector.
“Land” means and includes messuages, buildings, lands, and hereditaments of every tenure; also rivers, streams, wells, and waters of every description; also easements of every description in respect of the foregoing particulars.

“Officer” includes inspector.

“Owner” means the person for the time being entitled to receive the rent of the land or premises in connexion with which the word is used, whether on his own account, or as the agent of or as trustee for any person, or who would be entitled to receive the same if the lands or premises were let at a rent.

“Person” includes a corporation.

“Street” means and includes any highway and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular to include the plural, and the plural the singular.

WITH RESPECT TO THE DISPOSAL, DEODORIZING, AND REMOVAL OF RUBBISH.

4. *Occupier to provide receptacle for refuse and rubbish.*—The occupier of any house or premises shall provide a covered non-absorbent receptacle for the temporary deposit of house refuse and of rubbish from his house and yard.

5. *To place refuse and rubbish in receptacle.*—He shall without delay place or cause to be placed in such receptacle all such refuse and rubbish.

6. *To deodorize same.*—He shall, when necessary, introduce into such receptacle a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant.

7. *Occupier to keep receptacle on premises, save at times specified for removal of contents.*—For the discharge and removal of the contents thereof by the person thereto appointed or employed by the Council, he shall place such receptacle at or between such hours as may be specified from time to time by the Council, and in some place at or contiguous to such house or premises convenient for such discharge or removal, and after such discharge or removal he shall replace such receptacle in his own premises; and save, as aforesaid, he shall not place such receptacle in any street or lane.

8. *Householder to keep receptacle inoffensive.*—Every householder shall be responsible for keeping such receptacle in an inoffensive condition.

WITH RESPECT TO REMOVAL OF MUD, RUBBISH, FILTH, ETC., FROM STABLES AND COW-YARDS, ETC.

9. *Occupier of stables, cow-yard, cattle-shed, sheep-yard, or cattle-pen to remove mud, rubbish, filth, &c.*—The occupier of any land in which there shall be any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, sheep-yard, or cattle-pen shall cause all mud, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil collected, placed, or found in or about such stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, sheep-yard, or cattle-pen to be from time to time removed therefrom as often as the quantity of the same so collected, placed, or found shall amount to one (1) cubic yard, and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect, or fail to have such mud, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same may be removed by the Council.

10. *Power to use same as manure.*—Nothing contained in the foregoing clauses shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any such land from causing any such mud, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure on any garden or land, or to be kept for the purpose of being used on any garden or land contiguous to such premises as manure, so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used so as to contravene this by-law of the Borough, or so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

WITH RESPECT TO REMOVAL OF RUBBISH, FILTH, ETC., FROM PLACES WHERE NOXIOUS OR OFFENSIVE TRADES ARE CARRIED ON, AND FROM ABATTOIRS OR ELSEWHERE, AND THE DEODORIZING OF SUCH RUBBISH, FILTH, ETC.

11. *Removal of refuse from places where noxious or offensive trades are carried on.*—Every occupier or person having the management or control of premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, or manufactory whatsoever shall cause all rubbish, blood, filth, offal, manure, dung, or soil,

or other offensive matter and waste products of such manufacture from which effluvia may arise to be removed from such premises once at least in every 24 hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, so that no noxious or offensive effluvia arise therefrom; and if any such occupier or person shall neglect or fail to have removed any such offensive matter or waste products as aforesaid, the same may be removed by the Council.

12. *Removal of blood from places where animals are slaughtered.*—Every occupier, licensee, or person having the management or control of any abattoir, slaughter-house, or place where any cattle or other animals are killed, shall cause all the blood from the animals killed therein, as soon as conveniently may be, to be collected in a fit receptacle, to be provided for that purpose, and to be effectually deodorized by mixing therewith commercial sulphate of iron, or chloride of lime, in the proportion of one pound to the gallon, or some other efficient deodorizer, sufficient to effectually deodorize the same, and to be removed from the premises within 12 hours after such blood is shed.

13. *Removal and deodorizing of offal.*—Every occupier of any premises on which there may be any offal shall forthwith effectually deodorize the same and remove the same from the premises within 12 hours.

WITH RESPECT TO POSITION AND CONSTRUCTION OF PRIVIES AND EARTH CLOSETS, AND THE TIME AND MANNER OF CLEANSING, EMPTYING, AND MANAGING SAME, AND DISINFECTING OR DEODORIZING, AND DISPOSAL OF NIGHT-SOIL, ETC.

14. *Privy to be in form of earth closet.*—Every person who shall construct, or cause to be constructed, any privy, shall construct, or cause to be constructed, the same in the form of an earth closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground.

15. *Ventilation to be provided.*—He shall construct, or cause to be constructed, such building, with proper openings or flues, communicating directly with the external air, to provide sufficient means of ventilation.

16. *Door or trap of privy not to open or abut on any street, lane, or right-of-way.*—He shall not construct, or cause to be constructed any privy so that any door or trap in connexion therewith shall open or abut upon any street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding 10 feet in width.

17. *Privy to be constructed so as to permit of pan being placed and filled.*—He shall construct or cause to be constructed the seat of such privy, the aperture in such seat, and the space beneath such seat in such manner, and of such dimensions as to admit of a movable closet-pan as hereinafter described, being placed and fitted in such a manner, and in such a position as may effectually prevent the deposit upon the floor or sides of the space beneath such seat or elsewhere than in such closet-pan of any night-soil or urine which may, from time to time, fall or be cast through the aperture in such seat.

18. *Council to provide pan.*—Every such closet-pan shall be provided by the Council, and shall be constructed of galvanized iron properly riveted and soldered so as to be water-tight, and shall have handles affixed thereto, and be of a capacity not exceeding 3 cubic feet.

19. *Means of access to privy for removal, &c., of pan.*—He shall construct or cause to be constructed, and place or cause to be placed such building so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the closet-pan and the contents thereof, and of replacing the closet-pan so removed by a clean pan.

20. *Privies attached to schools and public privies.*—No person shall construct any privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed victualler's premises, factory, work-room, or common lodging house, nor any public privy, unless the same is flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least $\frac{1}{2}$ an inch to the foot.

21. *Supply of deodorizing material to earth closets.*—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or other material efficient for deodorizing, and shall cause all night-soil or urine which may be deposited in any pan in such privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and efficiently deodorize the contents of such pan, and shall not cause or permit any refuse matter, slops, or rubbish of any description or kind whatever, or broken bottles or glass, or anything other than night-soil or urine to be deposited in the pan or in any privy.

22. *Where and how pans are to be removed.*—At least once a fortnight, or so much more frequently as the Council may from time to time direct, the pan in use shall by the person thereto authorized or employed by the said Council be closed with a tight-fitting lid, and removed between such hours as the Council may from time to time direct in a suitable cart, and such person so authorized or employed shall leave a pan cleansed by superheated steam or some other equally efficient means approved by the Council in place of the pan so removed.

23. *Emptying and cleansing of pans.*—The Council shall cause every such pan so removed to be emptied and cleansed by its officers, workmen, employes, or contractors, and the contents of such pans to be deposited in the borough manure depot for the time being or such other place or places as shall be from time to time approved of by the said Council, and to be trenched into friable earth in a layer not exceeding six (6) inches thick, and a covering of 12 inches of clean soil to be spread thereupon.

24. *Who may not empty, cause, or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any pan, &c.*—No person save such officer, workman, employe, or contractor, shall empty, cause, or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any pan, earth closet, privy, or any place in which night-soil is deposited.

WITH RESPECT TO PREVENTION OF PLACING OR DEPOSITING DUST, MUD OR FILTH, OFFAL, NIGHT-SOIL, ETC., IN CERTAIN PLACES.

25. *No dust or rubbish from house, &c., to be deposited on or in footpath, street, or street-channel.*—No person shall by any means place or deposit, or cause to be placed or deposited, on or in any footpath, street, or street-channel any dust, mud, ashes or rubbish collected, placed, or found in or about any house, yard, shop, or office.

26. *Disposal of refuse or offensive matter.*—No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter, in any place where the same would be a nuisance or injurious to health.

27. *Night-soil removed from any earth-closet, &c., and deposited anywhere, to be covered with earth.*—Every person placing, or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited, or assisting in placing or depositing, on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cess-pool, or place of deposit, shall immediately on the placing or deposit thereof cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, with a layer of earth not less than twelve (12) inches in thickness.

28. *Earth-closets not to be emptied into drains or sewers.*—No person shall empty, cause, or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cess-pool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any drain or sewer.

29. *Prevention of pollution of water.*—No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed in or so that the same may be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water for drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

30. *Cess-pools not to be emptied into water used for drinking or domestic purposes.*—No person shall cause or permit to be emptied or assist in emptying any earth-closet, privy, cess-pool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any water supplied, used, or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, so that the contents or any portion of the contents thereof may find its way or be likely to find its way into such water.

31. *Offensive matter not to be accumulated so as to pollute water.*—Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way or to be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the occupier of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within 24 hours of notice given by the council or by one of its officers.

WITH RESPECT TO KEEPING OF ANIMALS AND POSITION OF FOWL-YARD.

32. *Keeping of animals.*—No person shall keep any animal of any kind so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

33. *Animals or birds not to be kept so as to pollute water.*—No person shall keep any animal or bird in such a manner as to pollute any water used, or likely to be used, by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used, or likely to be used, in any dairy, so as to endanger the health of any person using such water for drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

34. *Position of fowl-yard.*—No person shall erect, construct, or permit or suffer to remain upon his premises any fowl-yard which shall be within 25 feet of any dwelling-house.

WITH RESPECT TO FOUNDATIONS AND DRAINAGE OF NEW BUILDINGS.

35. *Foundations of new buildings to be rendered dry.*—Every person erecting or causing to be erected any new building shall cause the foundations thereof and the ground over which such building is to be placed to be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, so that no water, soakage, or damp shall lodge there.

36. *Drainage of buildings.*—Every owner or occupier of a building within the borough shall cause the same to be provided with spouting, down pipes, and drains sufficient to carry off all storm or rain water and all refuse water.

WITH RESPECT TO CARRYING, CONVEYING, OR EXPOSING FOR SALE, ETC., VEGETABLES, ETC., IN WAGGONS, CARTS, ETC., NOT THOROUGHLY CLEANSED.

37. *Vegetables, fruit, or perishables not to be carried, conveyed, or exposed for sale in carts, &c., in which manure, &c., has been carried.*—No person shall carry, convey, vend, or expose for sale any vegetables, fruit, or perishable products, in or on any wagon, cart, conveyance, or stand in or on which any manure, refuse, blood, offal, or other matter injurious to health, is or has been carried, conveyed, or deposited, unless such wagon, cart, conveyance, or stand has been previously thoroughly and effectually scoured and cleansed.

WITH RESPECT TO DISCHARGE OF WATER FROM CELLARS, ETC.

38. *Discharge of water from cellars.*—No person shall pour, run, deliver, or discharge any offensive water or other contents of or from any cellar, underground tank, sink, trap, pit, or excavation upon, over, into, or along any footpath, road channel, drain, or water-course within the said borough, save between the hours of Six and Eight o'clock in the morning, and Nine and Twelve

o'clock in the evening of any week day, and then only after the water or other contents shall have been thoroughly disinfected and deodorized to the approval of the Health Officer and Inspector.

WITH RESPECT TO REGISTRATION OF PERSONS CARRYING ON THE TRADE OF COW-KEEPERS, ETC., INSPECTOR OF GRAZING GROUNDS AND OF CATTLE, LIGHTING, VENTILATION, CLEANING, ETC., OF DAIRIES, COW-SHEDS, ETC., SECURING THE CLEANLINESS OF MILK STORES, MILK SHOPS, AND MILK VESSELS.

39. *Cow-keepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk to be registered annually.*—Every person carrying on the trade of cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the 1st day of January in every year, register himself by signing and forwarding to the town clerk an application in the form hereunder prescribed, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay the sum of five shillings, or such other sum as may from time to time be fixed by by-law by the said council for registration of cow-keepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk.

APPLICANT.

40. *Cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk to be registered.*—Every person who, after the date of this by-law coming into operation, shall carry on the trade of cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall register himself forthwith in the manner provided in the next preceding clause.

41. *Entry of application by town clerk.*—Upon receipt of every application for registration and fee the town clerk shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

42. *Inspection of grazing grounds.*—All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle, shall, when necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the council, or by any person authorized in writing by the chairman or clerk of the said council, and if on inspection such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any of them are, or is likely in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said council may, by an order in writing, signed by the town clerk, and served personally, or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person, served personally, or left at his dwelling, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle and other animals in dairies may also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, and any other diseased animal shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said council may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

43. *Council may order alteration of buildings and remedy of defects.*—The council on receiving a report from an inspector that the construction of any dairy, milking place, cow-shed, milk store, milk shop, or other building in the occupation of any person following the trade of cow-keeper, or dairyman, or purveyor of milk, is defective or faulty in regard to lighting, ventilation, drainage, or water supply in such a way as to prejudicially affect the health of the cows, or the wholesomeness of the milk or other dairy produce; may order the cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk to make alterations in any such buildings or structures to remedy any such defects within a time specified in such order.

44. *Closest accommodation to be provided, and situation of same.*—Every person following the trade of cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall provide such closet accommodation for the persons employed on the premises of any dairy, milk store, or milk shop occupied by him, and at such distance from milking place, milk store, or milk shop as may be directed by the council, and shall disinfect, or cause to be disinfected, the closet pans on such premises daily.

45. *Stables to be provided and situation of same.*—Where horses are kept on the premises of any dairy, milk-store, or milk-shop, every such person shall provide such stable accommodation, and at such distance from the milking place or milk-store or milk-shop as the Council may direct.

46. *Cleanliness of Dairies, &c.*—Every such person shall keep all houses, dairies, milking places, cow-sheds, milk-stores, milk-shops, or other buildings or structures in his occupation in such a state of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health by affecting the milk or otherwise, and shall thoroughly and effectively light and ventilate the same; and shall so arrange the drainage of all such buildings and milking places that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person.

47. *Yards, sheds, &c., to be swept, and, if required, fumigated.*—Every such person shall regularly sweep and shall keep perfectly clean all yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows, and shall, within 24 hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector, fumigate, disinfect, or lime-wash the same or any portion thereof, as may be in any such order so directed.

48. *Vessels to be scalded and scoured.*—Every such person shall thoroughly scald and scour daily all vessels used for holding milk.

49. *Contaminated water not to be used.*—No cow-keeper, dairyman, or person employed in milking or dairy work shall use in connexion with milking or for washing vessels used for holding milk, or for any dairy work, water that is in any way infected or contaminated, or contains matter injurious to health, and the health officer or inspector may, after inspection, prohibit by order served as provided in clause (42) of the by-law the use for dairy purposes of the water obtained from any well or tank or other source of water supply, and may require any tank to be cleaned and disinfected.

50. *Disease in cattle to be reported, milk of diseased cattle not to be used.*—If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cow-shed or dairy, or in the herds of any cow-keeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice thereof to the council, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and shall not in any way whatsoever use the milk of any diseased cow.

51. *Pigs not to be kept in sheds, &c., in which dairy cows are kept, &c.*—No person following the trade of cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

52. *Persons suffering from dangerous, infectious, or contagious diseases not to milk cows or assist in trade.*—No person suffering from any dangerous, infectious, or contagious disease, or who has been recently in contact with any person so suffering, shall milk cows or handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way take part or assist in the conduct of such trade until authorized by the council, town clerk, or health officer so to do.

53. *Epidemic, endemic, or contagious disease on premises to be reported.*—If any person (whether an adult or child) living on or occupying or staying on a visit at any premises used as grazing ground or dairy, or for cow-sheds, or as a milk-shop or milk-store, be attacked by any epidemic, endemic, or contagious disease, the occupier of the house or premises in which such person is (or if he be the person attacked, his wife or other person in charge) shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or health officer, or to the nearest member of the police force; and the council, whether or not the person so attacked has been removed from the premises, may by order served as aforesaid, prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk or the produce thereof from the premises until danger, in the opinion of such council or officer of health, no longer exists, and may order the destruction of the milk or any produce thereof on the premises.

54. *Inspector to Report.*—Every dairy, milk-store, or milk-shop, shall be inspected once in each quarter of the year by the council's inspector, who shall furnish a report to the council on the following matters, that is to say:—Condition of paddock, water supply, drains, sheds, and buildings, disposal of manure, closet and stable accommodation, storage for milk, means of scalding and cleaning vessels, cleanliness of premises, compliance with regulations.

REPEAL OF FORMER BY-LAWS, ETC.

55. All former by-laws on the matters and things herein provided for or any of them including By-laws No. 1 and 2 of the Local Board of Health confirmed on the 26th day of February, 1886, and By-law No. 3 of the said Board confirmed on the 1st day of November, 1889, are hereby repealed excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of the coming into force of this by-law.

56. *Penalties.*—Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion not being less than Five shillings, to be paid; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to

the penalty, notwithstanding that the council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

BY-LAW No. 32.

A By-law of the Shire of Shepparton, made under the Health Acts for the registration of Cow-keepers, Dairymen, and Purveyors of Milk, and for other purposes, and numbered 32.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts, and all other powers enabling them in this behalf, the Council of the Shire of Shepparton, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Shepparton, doth order as follows:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation.
2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Shepparton.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman or purveyor of milk, shall, on or before the first day of March, One thousand nine hundred and two, and thereafter on or before the first day of March in each subsequent year, register himself with the Council in manner following, that is to say:—By signing and forwarding to the secretary of the said shire an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee according to the following scale of fees, namely:—

- If the person to be registered keeps cows and the number of such cows is:—
1. Not more than eight, a fee of Two shillings;
 2. More than eight and not more than eighty, a fee of Three shillings per cow;
 3. More than eighty, a fee of Twenty shillings.
- If the person to be registered does not keep cows, a fee of Five shillings.

Upon receipt of every such application and fee the secretary of the shire shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All houses, dairies, milking places, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a

state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health by affecting the milk or otherwise, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings and milking places shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, whether registered or not.

7. In the interpretation of this by-law words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

8. Every person guilty of any breach of this by-law or of any of its provisions shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

BY-LAW No. 110.

A By-law of the Council of the Municipality of the City of Prahran, made under Section 35 of the *Health Act 1890*, providing for the Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairymen, and Purveyors of Milk, and numbered One hundred and ten.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Prahran do hereby order and direct as follow, that is to say:—

1. By-law No. 105 made by the Council of the Municipality of the City of Prahran shall be and the same is hereby repealed.
2. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk in the City of Prahran shall, on or before the first day of January in every year, register himself in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Town Clerk of the said City an application in the following form or to the like effect. Every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of £1 sterling.

3. Upon receipt of every such application and fee the Town Clerk shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the Schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall cause every milk store or milk shop in his occupation, or under his management or control, and every utensil or vessel used by him for containing milk for sale to be kept thoroughly clean. He shall sweep and cleanse his premises daily, and shall cause all animal excreta and filthy matter therein to be collected and placed where least offensive and removed from the premises at least weekly. He shall in the months of April and October in every year specially cleanse in the following manner the premises wherein he shall keep any cow, that is to say:—All dung, litter, and other matter shall be removed therefrom, and the doors, stalls, and woodwork thoroughly washed with water; thereafter a coating of lime-wash, made up by mixing freshly burned lime with water, each gallon of lime-wash containing one-fifth of a pint of carbolic acid, shall be applied to the walls, floors, ceilings, and every other part of the premises with which animals or their excreta have come in contact.

5. Every person following the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of any such trade, shall forthwith report in writing to the Town Clerk the occurrence of any disease in any of his milch cows, or of any contagious or infectious disease in man or animal upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on.

6. Neither he nor any person under his direction or control whilst suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, shall milk any cow or handle any vessel used in his business for containing milk, nor in any way take part or assist in the conduct of the business of a dairyman as far as regards the extraction, distribution, or storage of the milk until all danger of the communication of infection to the milk or of contamination thereof shall have ceased, and he shall have furnished satisfactory evidence so as to enable the Officer of Health of this city to certify that such danger no longer exists; and he shall not mix the milk of a diseased cow with other milk, and shall not sell or use the same for human food or for any other animal.

7. Whenever the Officer of Health of this city shall certify in writing that any land upon which or in close proximity to which there is any open drain to which cattle may have access, the Council may by an order in writing signed by the municipal clerk and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered proprietor thereof, or, in the case of an unregistered proprietor, served personally or left at his dwelling or posted upon the land, direct that such land shall not be used for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle or allowing them to remain thereon, either absolutely or for any time named in such order.

8. Every person committing a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds but not less than Five shillings or not exceeding Five pounds but not less than Five shillings, for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

As to Dairies, Dairy Cattle, and Milk.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Gisborne, by virtue of the provisions of the Health Act 1890 and the Health Act 1900, and every other power enabling them in this behalf, hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 2 of the Council of the said Shire, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.
2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.
3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Gisborne.
4. Registration of cow-keepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk.—Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the thirty-first day of January, 1902, and on or before the first day of February in subsequent years, register himself with the council in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the shire an application in the form hereunder

written, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of the following amount, namely, if the person to be registered keeps cows, and the number of such cows is:—

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the secretary of the shire shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said council, or by any person authorized, in writing, by the chairman or secretary of the said council; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said council may, by an order, in writing, signed by the secretary, and served personally, or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or, in the case of an unregistered person, served personally, or left at his dwelling place, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which, from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said council may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cow-sheds, milk-stores, milk-shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cow-keeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cow-keeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within 24 hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person or any member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person shall be attacked by typhoid fever, or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall

immediately inform the council, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said council or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such council or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cow-keeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the council, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this by-law words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this by-law or of any of its provisions shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890* the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulation :—

Regulation No. 235, part 2, of the regulations made and passed by the said Commissioner on the twenty-eighth day of March, One thousand nine hundred, is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following Regulation is enacted :—

347. No gasoline, benzine, naphtha, petroleum, kerosene, turpentine, casks containing oil, castor oil in cases, matches of any kind or in any description of case, inflammable acids of any description, vitriol in packages of any description, kegs or casks of white lead, or casks of any kind of paint, bales of kapok, bales of cotton waste, bales of old rags, bales of wool, bales of hemp, bales of flax, bales of tow, bales of bags or bagging, bales of gunnies, woolpacks or unbleached hessians, bales of jute or similar fibrous substances, nor any other goods of a combustible or inflammable nature; no pigs of lead, rough salt in bags, manure of any kind, green skins or hides, iron in bar or bundles, casks of hardware, casks of cement or whiting, bags of bark, cases, kegs, or casks of nails or hardware, galvanized fencing wire, bundles or bales of fibre, shall be landed or placed in any of the transit sheds. No wooden doors, windows, sashes, or any kind of woodenware shall be placed in any transit shed without the permission of the Harbor Master.

This Regulation shall be read and construed with the said regulations of the twenty-eighth day of March, One thousand nine hundred.

DANDENONG WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION.

THE Dandenong Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulations:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1902 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Trust area, and such rates shall be payable in one moiety on the 1st January, 1902.

2. On every house and tenement of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds (£10) and under, the minimum sum of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum.

3. On every house and tenement above the annual municipal value of Ten pounds sterling (£10) the sum of One shilling in the pound (£1) on the amount of said valuation.

4. Warehouses and wholesale stores, not being dwellings, or used in retail business, the sum of One shilling in the pound (£1) on the amount of municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a less rate than One pound sterling be paid.

5. A rate of One shilling in the pound shall be levied on all vacant ground fronting such streets as are reticulated.

6. Water supplied by measure to be used in private dwellings or other premises for domestic or other than domestic use shall be charged at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be that which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, shall be equal to the amount which the Trust shall be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used for the above purposes beyond such an amount as aforesaid.

7. The charge for water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes, and to buildings, lands, and institutions not rated, to be subjected to special agreement with the Trust.

8. For water supplied to charitable institutions for garden or irrigation purposes, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

9. For water supplied to cricket or bowling clubs, subject to arrangement with the Trust.

10. For water supplied to gardens or nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

11. For water supplied to syphon pumps, One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be decided upon by the Trust, in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes.

12. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum, or as may be decided upon by the Trust, in addition to a charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

13. For water supplied and used solely as a motive power for hydraulic lifts, water blasts, turbines, water wheels, electric and other motors (subject to the supply being refused or discontinued at any time), One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be agreed upon, in addition to the rating upon the assessment of the premises for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

14. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stone, brickwork, and plastering.

BOORT WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1902.

By virtue of the Water Acts.

REGULATION for imposing, levying, and receiving water rates and charges within the Boort Waterworks Trust District.

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements within the Boort Waterworks Trust District shall pay for the year 1902, viz.:—

2. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting every street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement being of the annual value of Eighteen pounds, or less, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement for the said year, the sum of One pound seven shillings.

3. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting any street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement being above the annual value of Eighteen pounds, according to the municipal valuation for the said year, the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such valuation.

4. On every house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid down a main pipe for the supply of water, and to which house or tenement the water shall not have been laid on, a rate of Thirteen shillings and sixpence shall be paid when the municipal valuation of such house or tenement does not exceed Eighteen pounds. Where such valuation exceeds Eighteen pounds, a rate of Ninepence in the pound shall be paid, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Thirteen shillings and sixpence be paid.

5. In every case where the water shall be laid on to a house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid down a pipe for the purpose of supplying water, the rates provided by clauses 2 and 3 of this Regulation shall be paid. Also that any ratepayer who may be considered to be using an undue quantity of water shall be compelled by the Trust to provide a meter, water to be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

6. The above rate shall be due and payable on the 1st day of May, 1902.

7. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.

BALLAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1902.

THE Commissioners of the Ballan Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulations:—

RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1902.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements within the Trust District shall pay for water supplied by the Trust for the year 1902:—

1. For every house or tenement of under Twenty-five pounds (£25) annual municipal value, the sum of One pound (£1) per annum.

2. For every house or tenement of Twenty-five pounds (£25) and under Thirty-five pounds (£35) annual municipal value, the sum of One pound six shillings (£1 6s.) per annum.

3. For every house or tenement of Thirty-five pounds (£35) and under Sixty pounds (£60) annual municipal value, the sum of One pound sixteen shillings (£1 16s.) per annum.

4. For every house or tenement of Sixty pounds (£60) and under One hundred pounds (£100) annual municipal value, the sum of Two pounds sixteen shillings (£2 16s.) per annum.

5. For every house or tenement of One hundred pounds (£100) and over annual municipal value, the sum of Three pounds four shillings (3 4s.) per annum.

6. All water supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per one thousand (1,000) gallons, or at a price as shall be specially agreed on.

7. For water supplied to Government departments, police station, court house, post office, State school, show yards, cricket ground, shire hall, and similar properties, shall be charged Two pounds (£2) each per annum.

8. For every public water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the sum of One shilling (1s.) per annum shall be paid.

9. All public water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow, such taps to be approved by the secretary for the time being of the said Trust.

10. It shall be unlawful for any person to have an overflow waste-pipe from any private bath.

11. The Trust may, by notice in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely that the water supplied is to be charged, by measure, and may, by such notice, require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice; and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.

12. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or who shall use or allow the water to be used in an unauthorized manner, or who are in arrears with the payment of their water rate, the Trust may, after one hour's notice, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes or by any other means that are available by or through which the water is supplied, and may cease to supply such premises with water so long as the Trust may think fit.

13. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any way interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, until he shall have obtained from the Trust a licence on that behalf to execute such works.

14. Fire plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless another use of them be allowed by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of an officer of the Trust.

15. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except under the direction of the officer of the Trust, shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

16. For any breach of any of these Regulations a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) shall be imposed.

17. The before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1902, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1902, and shall be payable in two instalments; the first instalment shall be due and payable on the 1st day of May, 1902, and the second instalment on the 1st day of November, 1902.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Ballan Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

The births of 945 children, viz., 506 boys and 439 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of December. The number was, it will be observed, the lowest recorded for the month during the last eleven years, except 1897 and 1898, and 119 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, or 179 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths recorded in December numbered 784, viz., 421 of males and 363 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 161, or 21 per cent., as against 37 per cent. in December, 1900, and 41 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, 50 more than in December, 1900, and the highest recorded for the month during the last eleven years, except 1891 and 1897; it was also 28 above the average of December during the previous ten years, but 15 below it allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 22.51, and of deaths registered to 18.67 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month of 24.79 and 18.09 respectively, and during the last ten years of 29.84 and 19.16 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 29.74 and 16.16.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 103.8° on the 28th, and the lowest was 43.8° on the 25th. The mean temperature of the month (64.1°) was two-fifths of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (47.2°) took place on the 26th, and the least range (6.5°) on the 12th. The mean daily range was 22.1°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.138 inches on the 6th, and the lowest was 29.367 inches on the 31st. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.537 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on five days, the amount being .68 of an inch, which was lower than in the corresponding month during any of the previous ten years.

The mean humidity of the month was .640.

Males contributed 54 per cent. and females 46 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 41 per cent. to that mortality; 34 per cent. in December, 1900; as against 36 per cent. in December, 1899; 41 per cent. in December, 1898; 43 per cent. in December, 1897; 43 per cent. in December, 1896; 42 per cent. in December, 1895; and 39 per cent. in December, 1894.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 266, as compared with 205 in December, 1900. The rate of infantile mortality was 281 per 1,000 births registered in the month under review, as compared with 204 in December, 1900; 205 in December, 1899; 304 in December, 1898; 343 in December, 1897; 255 in December, 1896; 256 in December, 1895; 209 in December, 1894; 260 in December, 1893; 246 in December, 1892; and 273 in December, 1891.

The proportion of deaths of elderly persons—aged 75 and upwards—has shown a marked increase in the last eleven years, proving infallibly that the percentage of elderly persons in the population has considerably increased, and has apparently not yet reached a maximum. This point is of considerable interest as bearing on the question of old-age pensions. The actual numbers of aged persons cannot be ascertained until the results of the recent census have been fully tabulated.

Of these, a male of no occupation, aged 75, died of valvular disease of the heart; a housekeeper, aged 75, of pericarditis; a gentleman and a female, each aged 75, of heart disease; a sawyer, and a seamstress, each aged 75, of Bright's disease; a female, aged 75, of lupus; another, aged 75, of burns; another, aged 76, of apoplexy; a gentleman, aged 76, of softening of the brain; a bank manager, aged 76, of dilatation of the heart; a female, aged 76, of pericarditis; a blacksmith, a builder, and a female, each aged 76, of heart disease; a carpenter, aged 76, of asthma; a female, aged 77, of cancer; a blacksmith, aged 77, of Bright's disease; a male, aged 77, of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall in the street; a mariner, aged 78, of stricture of the urethra; two females, each aged 78, of apoplexy; a cook (female), aged 78, of paralysis; a female, aged 78, of varicose veins; a farmer, aged 78, of heart disease; a male of no occupation, aged 79, of diarrhoea; two females, each aged 79, of paralysis and pericarditis respectively; a gentleman, aged 79, of syncope; a contractor, aged 80, of cancer; a female, aged 80, of apoplexy; another, aged 81, of rheumatism; a minister, aged 81, of cancer; a female, aged 81, of apoplexy; a caretaker, aged 81, of pneumonia; a female, aged 81, of hepatitis; an ex-polic magistrate, aged 82, of cerebral hemorrhage; a labourer, aged 82, of heart disease; a female, aged 82, of uræmia; a medical practitioner, aged 82, of cystitis; three females, each aged 83, of cancer, obstruction of the bowels, and atheroma, respectively; a gentleman, aged 84, of cancer; a miner and a female, each aged 84, of pneumonia; a female, aged 85, of heart disease; a gentleman, aged 87, of rheumatism; a female, aged 88, of dilatation of the heart; another, aged 90, of Bright's disease; another, aged 78, two labourers, and a female, each aged 79, a miner, aged 80, a carpenter and a female, each aged 81, two females, aged 82 and 83, respectively, a farmer, and two females, each aged 85, a nurse and a female, each aged 86, a carpenter, aged 87, and a shaver, aged 96, of old age.

Thirty-six of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 30 in December, 1900—were from external causes, of which 29 were set down to accident, 2 to homicide, and 5 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 7, and two labourers, aged 42 and 50 respectively, were passed over by railway trains; a female child, aged 1 year, by a tram-car; a cartor, aged 58, by a cart; a labourer, aged 34, died of injuries to the head, the result of a fall from a waggon; a seaman, aged 51, and a driver, aged 41, of injuries to the brain, consequent in each case on a fall from a cart; an ink-maker, aged 18, of injuries caused by falling down a quarry hole; a boy, aged 9, of fracture of the skull, the result of timber falling on him; an asphaltor, aged 23, of injuries to spine, consequent on diving into shallow water; a female, aged 67, of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall in the street; a mining-speculator, aged 70, of fracture of the thigh, and a female, aged 67, of concussion of the brain, caused in each case by a fall; a boy, aged 3, and two females, aged 4 and 75 respectively, of burns; a tea-dealer and a female, each aged 66, of scalds; a female child, aged 1 year, of heat apoplexy; a boy, aged 12, was drowned at Blackburn whilst bathing; a labourer, aged 23, in Hobson's Bay by the upsetting of a boat; three persons were found drowned, viz.—A clerk, aged 17, in Moonee Ponds Creek, and a labourer, aged 60, and a female, aged 40, in the River Yarra; a new-born male and two new-born females were suffocated at birth; and a female child, aged 9 months, was overlain. The homicidal deaths were those of two infants, a male, aged 1 month, who was found dead; and a new-born female, who was suffocated. The suicidal deaths were those of a clerk, aged 48, who cut his throat; a male of unknown occupation, aged 40, and a female, aged 18, who poisoned themselves, the former with strychnine; and a clerk, aged 33, and a lodginglease-keeper, aged 70, who hanged themselves.

One hundred and seventy deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.—62 in the Melbourne, 20 in the Alfred, 3 in St. Vincent's, 14 in the Women's, 16 in the Children's, 10 in the Homœopathic, and 12 in the Austin Hospitals; 2 in the Metropolitan, and 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 7 in the Immigrants' Home; 9 in the Benevolent, and 5 in the Infant Asylums; 1 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, and 3 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 325, of which 193, or 59 per cent., were of males, and 132, or 41 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 266 were under one year of age, 41 were between one and two, 13 were between two and three, 1 was between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 459. Of these 228, or 50 per cent., were males, and 231, or 50 per cent., were females; 12 were between five and ten, 9 were between ten and fifteen, 10 were between fifteen and twenty, 22 were between twenty and twenty-five, 20 were between twenty-five and thirty, 33 were between thirty and thirty-five, 34 were between thirty-five and forty, 30 were between forty and forty-five, 29 were between forty-five and fifty, 20 were between fifty and fifty-five, 32 were between fifty-five and sixty, 31 were between sixty and sixty-five, 62 were between sixty-five and seventy, 49 were between seventy and seventy-five, 33 were between seventy-five and eighty, 22 were between eighty and eighty-five, 9 were between eighty-five and ninety, 1 at ninety, and 1 at ninety-six.

The following table shows the causes of death of persons of both sexes under and over five years of age, and the proportions per cent. of deaths from each cause, in Greater Melbourne during the month under review:—

As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, there was an increase of 30 deaths under zymotic, 4 under dietic, 23 under constitutional diseases, and 6 under the head of violence, whilst there was a decrease of 22 under local diseases. Under the zymotic class, deaths from diphtheria fell from 7 to 1. Whooping-cough still continues to cause a high mortality, 44 deaths therefrom having been recorded in the month, as against 16 in November, 17 in October, 14 in September, 3 in August, and 13 in July, whilst the total for the year 1901 is 125. Under the constitutional class, deaths from cancer rose from 46 to 55, those from tubercular meningitis from 7 to 11, and those from phthisis from 54 to 60. In the local class, deaths from diseases of the urinary system increased by 6, and those from diseases of parturition by 3, whilst those from diseases of the nervous system diminished by 13, those from diseases of the circulatory system by 12, and those from diseases of the respiratory system by 5.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1901, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. The mortality from typhoid fever in 1901 was—both absolutely and relatively—the lowest recorded during the last 41 years.

WHEREAS by the provisions of the Water Acts it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council shall have power from time to time, on the application of any Trust, or of any other body or persons authorized by the said Acts to construct waterworks, and after any such Trust, body, or persons has, or have by Order in Council, been duly appointed or authorized, to make additional Orders relating to such Trust, body, or persons not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Acts, and may in such additional Orders increase or diminish, or otherwise alter in accordance with, and not inconsistent with, the provisions of the said Acts, the extent of the district of such Trust, body, or persons:

And whereas the Gunbower West Irrigation and Water Supply Trust was duly constituted by Order in Council dated the 20th day of March, 1899:

And whereas the said Gunbower West Irrigation and Water Supply Trust has made application to have its district increased:

And whereas it is deemed expedient to increase the Irrigation and Water Supply District of the said Gunbower West Irrigation and Water Supply Trust:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby order that the extent of the Irrigation and Water Supply District of the Gunbower West Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be increased by the addition to such district of portion of allotment 14, section VII., parish of Gunbower West, county of Gunbower.

That the boundaries of the Irrigation and Water Supply District of the Gunbower West Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, as described in the Orders in Council bearing date the 20th day of March, 1899, shall be and the same are hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following shall be deemed to be the boundaries of the Irrigation and Water Supply District of the said Trust:—

Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 5, section VII., in the parish of Gunbower West; thence north-westerly and northerly by the south and west boundaries of that allotment to the north-west angle thereof; thence north across a road to a point in the south boundary of allotment 6, section VII.; thence westerly and north-westerly by the south boundary of allotment 6 to the north-west angle of allotment 6A; thence south-westerly across a road to the south-east angle of allotment 7; thence westerly and northerly by the south and west boundaries of that allotment to the north-west angle thereof; thence north across a road to a point in the south boundary of that allotment 12; thence westerly by the south boundary of that allotment to the south-west angle thereof; thence north-westerly by the west boundaries of allotments 12 and 13 to the north-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence westerly by the south boundary of allotment 17 to the south-west angle thereof; thence northerly by the west boundaries of allotments 17 and 22 to a point bearing east from the south-east angle of allotment 21; thence westerly across a road and by the south boundary of allotment 21 to the south-west angle thereof; thence southerly by the east boundary of allotment 20 and north-westerly and westerly by the south boundaries of that allotment and allotment 19 to the south-west angle of the last-named allotment, all the above allotments being of section VII., in the parish of Gunbower West; thence westerly across a road to a point in the east boundary of allotment 1A, section C, in the parish of Macorna; thence southerly by the east boundary of allotment 1A to the south-east angle thereof; thence generally westerly by the south boundaries of allotments 1A, 1, and 2, section C, across a road and by the south boundaries of allotments D and C to the south-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence northerly by the west boundaries of allotments C and 3A to the north-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence northerly across a three-chain road to the south-east angle of allotment 22B, section F; thence north-westerly by the south boundaries of allotments 22B and 22A, section F, to the west angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence westerly across a road and by the south boundary of allotment 22, section F, to the south-west angle thereof; thence north-westerly and north-easterly by the west boundary of said allotment 22, section F, to the north-west angle thereof; thence north-westerly across a road and by the west boundaries of allotments 21, 33, and 19, section F, to the most western angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence north-westerly across a road and by the south boundary of allotment 20, section F, to the south-west angle of that allotment; thence north-easterly by the west boundary of said allotment 20 to the south angle of allotment 20A, section F; thence generally north-westerly by the south-west boundary of allotment 20A, section F, and the south and west boundaries of allotment 32, section F, to the north-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence north-westerly across a piece of Crown land to the south-west angle of allotment 27, section F; thence north-westerly by the south-west boundary of allotment 27, section F, to the most western angle of that allotment; thence northerly across a road and by the west boundary of allotment 1A, section F, to the north-west angle of that allotment; thence northerly across a road to a point in the south boundary of allotment 24, parish of

Gannawarra; thence westerly, northerly, easterly, and southerly by the south, west, north, and east boundaries of said allotment 24 to the south-east angle thereof; thence southerly across a road to the north angle of allotment 1B, section F, parish of Macorna; thence southerly by the east boundaries of allotments 1B and 27, section F, to a point bearing west from the north-west angle of allotment 29, section F; thence easterly across a road and by the north boundary of said allotment 29 to the north-east angle thereof; thence southerly and easterly by the east boundaries of allotment 29, section F, and the north boundary of allotment 30, section F, to the north-east angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence southerly and westerly by the east and south boundaries of said allotment 30 to a point in the latter bearing north-easterly from the north-east angle of allotment 26, section F; thence south-westerly across a road and by the east boundaries of allotments 26, 31, and 20, section F, to a point bearing west from the north-west angle of allotment 19, section F; thence easterly across a road and by the north boundaries of allotments 19 and 18, section F, to the north-east angle of said allotment 18; thence southerly and easterly by the east boundary of allotment 18 and the north boundary of allotment 17, section F, to the north-east angle of said allotment 17; thence southerly by the east boundary of allotment 17, section F, across a road and part of the east boundary of allotment 23, section F, to the point of the latter where it turns to the east; thence easterly and north-easterly by the said east boundary of allotment 23 and across a road to the north-west angle of allotment 25, section F; thence easterly and southerly by the north and east boundaries of said allotment 25 to the south-east angle thereof; thence southerly across a three-chain road to a point in the north boundary of allotment 1, section C, parish of Macorna; thence south-easterly by the southern side of the aforesaid three-chain road to the north-east angle of allotment 14, section VII., parish of Gunbower West; thence southerly by the eastern boundaries of allotments 14 and 14B, section VII., to the south-east angle of the latter; thence south across a road to a point in the north boundary of allotment 4, section VII.; thence easterly to the north-east angle of said allotment 4; thence southerly by the east boundary of allotment 4 across a road, and by the east boundary of allotment 3, section F, to the point of commencement.

WHEREAS by the provisions of section 233 of the Water Act 1890, No. 1156, as amended by section 99 of the Water Act 1900, No. 1651, it is enacted that when the general plan and the description of any proposed works have been approved by the Governor in Council, such works shall be constructed, maintained, and continued by a Trust, or in the case of joint works by the Trusts concerned in accordance with such general plan and description as so approved; and no alteration shall be made in the position or height or other dimensions of the weirs, dams, or sluices so approved, and no additional weirs, or off-takes, or extension of the works shall be constructed except on the special authority of the Governor in Council for each and every such alteration: And whereas the Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust was duly constituted by Order in Council dated the 23rd day of March, 1888: And whereas the said Trust has constructed a work known as the No. 2 weir on the Serpentine Creek: And whereas the said Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust has made application to carry out alterations to the said work, known as the No. 2 weir on the Serpentine Creek: And whereas it is deemed expedient to make alterations to the said No. 2 weir: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth hereby order that at all times when the quantity of water available for diversion at the No. 2 weir on the Serpentine Creek is less than three thousand (3,000) cubic feet per minute the Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall insert and maintain in the permanent notch of the said weir a movable appliance of a pattern approved by the Minister of Water Supply, such appliance to provide fifty (50) cubic feet per minute of compensation water to the Serpentine Creek.

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make such Order as shall be deemed expedient upon any unforeseen emergency, or in particular cases with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria, and having any infectious or contagious disease on board, or on board of which any such infectious or contagious disease may have appeared in the course of the voyage, or arriving under any other alarming or suspicious circumstances as to infection or contagion; and also with respect to the persons and things on board the same: And whereas the steam-ship or vessel *Eastern* arrived in Victorian waters on 10th January, 1902, having on board a case of the contagious disease small-pox: And whereas it is expedient to make an Order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order direct that the said vessel shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean or at the Outer Anchorage off Williamstown, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the main-mast-head; and doth further direct that no person other than the passengers for Victoria, unless directed to do so by the Health Officer or other officer in charge on behalf of the Board of Public Health, nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters shall leave the said vessel, nor be taken or allowed or suffered to be taken and removed from her, nor shall any boat put off from the said vessel except only that her mails, cargo, and passengers' luggage for Victoria may be discharged into lighters, and may, after careful disinfection under the supervision of the Health Officer, be afterwards conveyed to shore under his directions; and, further, that cargo, provisions, luggage, and mails may be slung or hoisted on board the said vessel under such conditions as the Health Officer may direct, and under his supervision; and, further, that no person, except the Medical Inspector or Health Officer or person authorized by either of such officers necessarily employed in fumigating or discharging cargo shall be permitted to board or approach the said vessel, nor shall any one remain unnecessarily in her vicinity; and, further, that all persons engaged in conveying any cargo, passengers' luggage, provisions, or mails to or from the said vessel shall immediately afterwards, together with their clothing, be fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Health Officer; and, further, that the said vessel and all persons and things on board of her shall be detained in quarantine until severally released by the Health Officer.

AREAS OF LANDS INCREASED AND DIMINISHED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1901 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1901, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 7) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said Land Act as lands which may be sold by auction (class 7 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in Division 6 of Part I. of the Land Act 1901 aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said Act as land which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 5, 8, and 9 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1901 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

EASTERN VERMIN DISTRICT.—ANNUAL RATE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Land Act 1901* (1 Edw. VII.; No. 1749) is amongst other things enacted that the local committee for the destruction of vermin of any Vermin District shall, within thirty days from its appointment, and thereafter in the month of January in each and every year, recommend to the Governor an annual rate or assessment, specifying the amount thereof to be paid by the owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within its Vermin District, in respect of each square mile of land owned, held under lease, or occupied under the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and also in respect of the sheep or cattle depasturing thereon; and it is further enacted that such rate or assessment, on being proclaimed by the Governor in Council in the *Government Gazette*, shall be the rate payable by the owners, lessees, and occupiers of land within the Vermin District for the current year for the purposes of the said Part of the said Act, and shall be paid to the Minister at the same time as the rent payable by such lessees and occupiers: And whereas the local committee duly appointed for the Eastern Vermin District has recommended a rate of Five shillings per square mile upon all lands within the boundaries of the said Vermin District: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby proclaim an annual rate of Five shillings per square mile to be the rate payable by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Eastern Vermin District aforesaid for the current year.

REGULATION FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION AND FOR AFFORDING ACCESS TO WATER IN THE PARISH OF NEWHAM, KNOWN AS THE HANGING ROCK WATER AND RECREATION RESERVE.

WHEREAS by the Crown Grant issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works, and the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Newham, in respect of the Reserve for Public Recreation and for affording access to water in the parish of Newham, known as the "Hanging Rock Water and Recreation Reserve," it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted, and the buildings for the time being thereon, shall be maintained and used as and for a place for recreation and amusement, and for affording access to water, and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or other Officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony of Victoria, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such rules, orders, by-laws, and regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works, and the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire of Newham: And whereas by section 137 of the Land Act 1890 it is provided that where any such land has been vested in Trustees, or jointly with the Board of Land and Works and Trustees, it shall be lawful for the Trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in clause 1 of the said section: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Council of the Shire of Newham, do hereby make, in lieu of Clause 1 of the Regulations at present in force in respect of the said Reserve, the following Regulation for the care, protection and management thereof:

REGULATION.
 The Reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on the first day of each year or any holiday substituted for such day, on which a fee of Sixpence may be charged and taken for the admission to the Reserve of every person not under the age of eighteen years (18) years.
 Every person offending against this regulation shall, in accordance with section 137 of the Land Act 1890, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any officer or servant of the Trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such officer, servant or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
