GENERAL ELECTION THROUGHOUT THE STATE OF VICTORIA.

General Election of Members of the Legislative Assembly is shout to be held throughout the State of Victoria, and any Elector thereof who appears from the rolls to reside in any of the undermentioned Electoral Districts, and who resides at least five miles from the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or who has reason to believe that on the polling day he will not be within five miles of the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or that on account of ill-health or infirmity he will be prevented from voting personally thereat, who desires to vote through the post office at such Election may, on posting an application to the Returning Officer, obtain a Postal Ballot-paper enabling him to vote through the post at such Election
