## PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c. &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz.:-

TUESDAY, THE 30TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1902, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Karkaroc and the North Riding of the Shire of Borung;

WEDNESDAY, THE 1ST DAY OF OCTOBER, 1902, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Deakin and the Western Riding of the Shire of Waranga;

FRIDAY, THE 3RD DAY OF OCTOBER, 1902, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Karkaroc;

WEDNESDAY, THE 8TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1902, as a Public Holiday throughout the Western Riding of the Shire of Oxley;

WEDNESDAY, THE 15TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1902, as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Carisbrook, Dunolly, Maryborough, and Rochester;

WEDNESDAY, THE 22ND DAY OF OCTOBER, 1902, as a Public Holiday throughout the North Riding of the Shire of Euroa and the North and Central Ridings of the Shire of Violet Town;

WEDNESDAY, THE 29TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1902, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Euroa;

THURSDAY, THE 6TH DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1902, as a Public Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the Town of Warrnambool.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

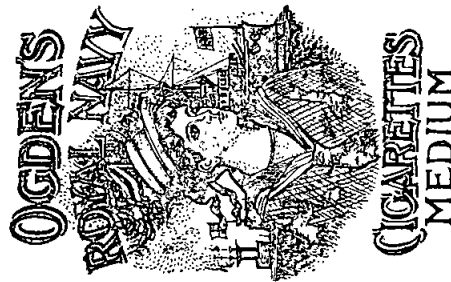

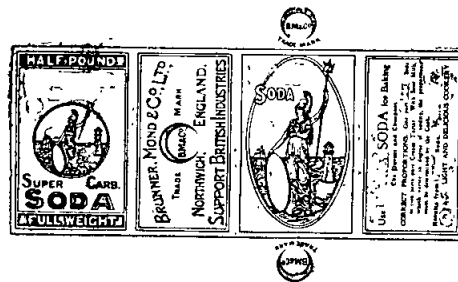

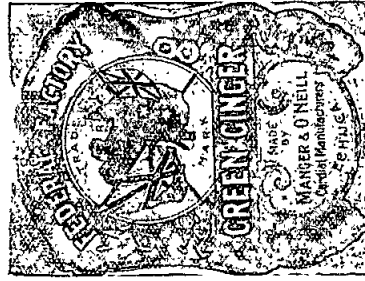

MACEDON WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING  
REGULATION FOR 1903.

THE Commissioners of the Macedon Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulations:—

The following rates are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1903, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the boundaries of the Trust District, that is to say:—A rate of One shilling and Sixpence in the pound sterling, payable in two equal instalments on 1st January, and 1st July, 1903, shall be imposed and levied on all rateable properties in the Waterworks Trust Area, according to the municipal valuation of such properties.

The minimum rate to be paid shall be Twenty shillings. All water supplied by the Trust for other than domestic purposes shall be by meter, and be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.

CHARLTON WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING  
REGULATION No. 7.

THE Charlton Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts (and whose waterworks district has, for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, been proclaimed an urban district), make the Regulation following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1903 in respect of water supplied by the Trust, that is to say:—

- (a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, or block of land supplied with water, a rate of Two shillings for each pound sterling on the amount of the municipal annual value, but the minimum annual amount to be paid shall be One pound sterling.
- (b) Occupied and unoccupied land, where no water is supplied, shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of municipal annual valuation.
- (c) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust or otherwise provided for in this Regulation, the rate shall be Fourpence for every 100 gallons.
- (d) The rate to be charged non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Sixpence for every 100 gallons.
- (e) For steam boilers the rate shall be Ten shillings per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in such cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (f) In buildings in the course of erection where water is required for building purposes, the rate shall be Ten shillings per centum on the contract price of the work, or by special agreement. Wooden houses shall be charged half-rate, payment to be made before supply is given.
- (g) The supply of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust will in each case determine, and the preliminary payment must be paid at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.
- (h) In case of any dispute as to the sub-section applying to any particular case, the Trust shall have the power to decide or to make a special rate.
- (i) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic or other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which at Fourpence per 100 gallons equals the amount of the assessed rate for the year which would be payable for the premises or lands so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (j) The rate hereby made shall be payable in equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st January and 1st July, 1903.
- (k) Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

The foregoing Regulation No. 7 was made and adopted by the Commissioners of the Charlton Waterworks Trust on the 28th August, 1902, and the seal of the Trust was hereto affixed in our presence.

RUSHWORTH WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING  
REGULATION FOR 1903, No. 6.

THE Commissioners of the Rushworth Waterworks Trust, a portion of the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Acts, make the following regulation:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1903, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of the said Trust:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual municipal valuation or under, the sum of Twenty shillings.
  2. For every house or tenement of an annual municipal valuation exceeding Ten pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling.
  3. For every unoccupied allotment of land, and for every vacant piece of land, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling of the annual municipal valuation of such allotment or piece of land, provided that in no case shall a rate less than Ten shillings be charged.
  4. For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one half of the above rates. And for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile, but within half-a-mile from such stand-pipe, one quarter of the full rate shall be paid.
  5. For every steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust, there shall be paid the sum of Five pounds sterling.
  6. For water supplied by the Trust for domestic and other than domestic purposes by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements, shall be the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Trust in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.
  7. Water supplied to the Government departments, religious denominations, and persons outside the Trust District shall be by measurement or special agreement.
  8. The above-mentioned rates and charges (except for water supplied by measure) shall be payable in equal moieties, half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1903. Water supplied by measure shall be paid for on demand any time after it has been supplied.
  9. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Rushworth Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose, shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

GENERAL RATE.—RODNEY IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.

RATING REGULATION (No. 21).

REGULATION for the making of a rate under the provisions of the Water Acts on all rateable property in the Irrigation and Water Supply District:—

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling, on the annual value of all rateable property within the Irrigation and Water Supply District of the Rodney Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rates for the shires of Rodney, Denkin, and Waranga, is hereby made for the year One thousand nine hundred and two, commencing on the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and two, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, One thousand nine hundred and two.

2. Such rate is made payable on the first day of October, One thousand nine hundred and two.

3. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trusts may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

NHILL WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1903.

THE Commissioners of the Nhill Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of all lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by this Trust within the Nhill Waterworks Trust District, that is to say:—

1. Every allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, of less than Eleven pounds sterling annual municipal value, the sum of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, whether occupied or otherwise, of less than Eleven pounds sterling annual municipal value, the sum of One pound sterling per annum.

3. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, or allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, of Eleven pounds, or more than Eleven pounds annual value, an amount equal to Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

4. For all tenements or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, in the said district; situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

5. For every steam-boiler supplied with water except by special agreement, a charge of Twenty shillings per each horse-power shall be made.

6. For water supplied to siphon pumps, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or as may be decided upon by the Commissioners, in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes.

7. In all cases of water supply the Trust reserves the right of putting on a meter at the consumer's expense, and supplying water by measure, and in all cases where water is supplied to drinking and other troughs, or reservoirs, the Trust may compel the use of a floating-ball tap, or other approved device, to regulate the supply to such drinking and other troughs, or reservoirs, to prevent the same overflowing.

8. Water supplied to the Government Departments, charitable and other public institutions, and religious denominations, shall be by measure, or by special agreement.

9. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or at such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners and occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

One-sixteenth of an acre or less, per annum 8,000 gallons.  
Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum 12,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum 16,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum 28,000 gallons.

Exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding 1 acre, per annum 40,000 gallons.

For every additional acre, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.

That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1903, and ending on the 31st

day of December, 1903, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1903, and the 1st day of July, 1903.

Where water meters are affixed payment shall be made at the end of each quarter in each year, or at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

YEA WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1903.

THE Commissioners of the Yea Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Acts, make the following Regulation:—

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual municipal valuation or under, the sum of Twenty shillings.

2. For every house or tenement of an annual municipal valuation exceeding Twenty pounds, a rate of One shilling in the pound.

3. For every unoccupied allotment of land, and for every allotment of land upon which no house or tenement has been erected, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling of the annual municipal value of such allotment.

4. For every water trough a charge of Ten shillings.

5. For every steam boiler a charge of Ten shillings for every horse-power of such boiler.

6. For stand-pipes or hydrant water, for each load of two hundred and fifty gallons or under, a charge of One shilling, to be paid on delivery.

7. For water supplied by the Trust by measure (other than stand-pipe or hydrant water), except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, a charge of One shilling for every thousand gallons.

8. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measurement (other than hydrant or stand-pipe water) shall be—

(1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a quantity for which the charge of One shilling per thousand gallons would be equal to the assessed rate which would be payable for the house or tenement so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) If solely for other than domestic purposes, thirty thousand gallons per half-year.

9. The above-mentioned rates and charges (except for stand-pipe or hydrant water), shall be paid half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1903.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Yea Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

RULES, REGULATIONS, AND SCALE OF FEES OF THE YARRAWONGA PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground is opened.

2. Any person desiring ground in the cemetery for a private grave, vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, or tombstone, or for any other purpose, shall apply to the Trustees therefor. If approved, the Trustees, on the payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a certificate of burial in the form specified in Schedule B.

3. Any person desiring to construct, add to, alter, or amend a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to erect, add to, or amend a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other construction or erection in any part of the cemetery shall apply in writing to the Trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit in writing a statement, plan, design, or drawing of the same, with full particulars, and shall obtain such permission in writing before proceeding with the work.

4. Orders for interment must be given at the office of the Trustees during the day previous to that on which it is intended to take place.

5. The Trustees will cause all common graves to be dug if requested, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults, or the friends of indigent persons who wish to dig graves themselves, are required to construct them under the direction of the Trustees, and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent in writing of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.



6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary (or to the gatekeeper or sexton).

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around the uppermost coffin previously buried in the grave.

9. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

10. Unless otherwise ordered, the hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to half-past Four p.m. in the other four months.

11. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

12. No servants or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the Trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

13. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.

14. That no wooden erections shall be allowed.

15. Sculptors, stonemasons, and others desirous of erecting tombstones, monuments, tablets, or railings, or of constructing vaults, or of placing inscriptions or epitaphs, shall obtain licences in the form of Schedule C from the Trustees. All material required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery. All refuse remaining after the work is completed shall be removed at once from the cemetery by the person employed on the work. Any workman employed in the cemetery, though not in the employment of the Trustees, shall be required to comply with such general directions of the Trustees or their Secretary as may be necessary for the control and good order of the cemetery.

16. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the Trustees.

17. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

18. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

19. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

20. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.

21. The Trustees reserve the right to make any alterations, from time to time, in these charges and Regulations.

**PART II. CROWN LANDS OTHER THAN MALLEE LANDS.**

In clause 13 of Schedule E' to the Regulations made by His Excellency the Governor in Council on 13th May, 1902, the figures 180 shall be substituted for 103, and for clause 16 the following shall be substituted:—

16. That these presents are upon this further condition that in the event of any portion of the land hereby demised being at any time or times required by the Victorian Railways Commissioner or by any other corporation or person or persons for the time being by any law in force in Victoria authorized to make construct manage or maintain any state railway or railways for the construction maintenance or management of railways railway stations or railway works already or hereafter authorized to be constructed or by the Governor or Administrator of the Government of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof hereinafter designated the Governor in Council for the construction of water supply works irrigation works reservoirs dams races water-courses or drains or for public roads or highway to be hereafter set out by the Governor in Council he the said lessee his executors administrators or assigns will upon being allowed by the Victorian Railways Commissioner or other corporation or person or persons aforesaid or Governor in Council one month after receiving notice in writing from the Victorian Railways Commissioner or other corporation or person or persons aforesaid or Governor in Council that the land is so required for the removal by him or them of any houses buildings or fences upon the land so required remove such houses buildings and fences and relinquish possession of the land so required and that neither he nor they will make any claim for compensation whatsoever for the said houses buildings fences or for any improvements upon the said land or for the cost which he or they may incur in such removal nor will he or they make any claim for compensation for any right or interest which he or they may possess in such lease or in such land beyond a proportionate

reduction of rent which shall in all cases be fixed by an officer appointed by the Governor in Council for such purpose or in respect of the severance of such land from the other lands held under this lease. And it is hereby expressly agreed between the parties hereto that this covenant is to be construed as a release by the said lessee his executors administrators and assigns to His Majesty his heirs and successors from all or any payment to him or them and from all claims thereto which might otherwise have been made in respect of resumption of any portion of the land hereby demised for railway purposes or for the purpose of the construction of water supply works irrigation works reservoirs dams races water-courses or drains or for public roads or highway under the before contained conditions for resumption by or on behalf of His Majesty his heirs and successors.

In condition 7 of Schedule X' to the Regulations made by His Excellency the Governor in Council on 24th June, 1902, 10s. shall be substituted for £1.

WHEREAS by section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth by this Order rescind the Regulation numbered X. of the Regulations made by Order in Council dated the 24th day of September, 1900, and doth make the Regulation following in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATION X.—SCHOLARSHIPS.

The Minister of Public Instruction may annually award 40 scholarships, or any less number, to pupils of State schools, in the manner and on the conditions hereinafter mentioned:—

1. Scholars will be selected upon competitive examinations held during December of each year. No competitor will be permitted to attend any such examination unless he shall have been classified in the sixth class of his school from at least the 1st day of July immediately preceding, and each successful competitor will be required to produce a certificate of birth showing that he will not have completed his fourteenth year before the 1st day of January succeeding the examination, and no competitor will be selected unless he shall, during the two years immediately preceding the latter date, have been continuously on the rolls of, and in attendance at, a State school.

2. The subjects for examination will be—

Composition,	} As far as prescribed in Regulation I.
Pennmanship,	
Arithmetic,	
Grammar,	
Geography,	
History,	
Elementary Science,	

3. Each Scholarship will be of the annual value of £10, tenable for three years, upon the following conditions:—

(a) That the scholar shall, at the commencement of the session following the award of the Scholarship, become a student in one of the approved secondary schools or colleges, or in one of such other schools or colleges as may be approved of by the Minister.

(b) That he shall continue to attend one of the above secondary schools or colleges, and shall obtain at the end of each year a report from the authorities of the same. If no report or an unfavorable report be received, or if at any time the Minister be satisfied that the conduct of any scholar has been disorderly or immoral, the Scholarship and all the advantages connected therewith shall thereupon cease and determine.

(c) That the scholar show progress as required in clause 7.

4. Where a scholar does not reside within 3 miles of an approved secondary school or college, the Minister may, at his discretion, allow him such sum (not exceeding £5 per annum) as will cover the cost of transit to and fro, if the school or college is easily accessible by rail or coach; or may commute the Scholarship for one of £20 tenable upon the conditions mentioned in clause 3.

5. Payments will be made quarterly. All payments, however, by the Minister will be conditional on moneys being placed at his disposal by the Legislature.

6. Examinations of State school pupils for Scholarships offered by secondary schools or colleges may be held annually, under the supervision of the Department, provided that the conditions under which such Scholarships are to be offered have been previously approved by the Minister of Public Instruction. Holders of these Scholarships will be eligible to compete for exhibitions subject to the conditions of the Regulation relating thereto.

7. Holders of all Scholarships will be required to attend an annual examination, and those who fail to pass satisfactorily will have their Scholarships withdrawn.

NOTE.—The Council of Agricultural Education offers five Scholarships triennially as provided for in section 19 of Act No. 1062, as quoted below:—

*It shall be competent for the Agricultural College Council to cause to be held in each of the five agricultural divisions of Victoria a competitive examination of boys attending State schools in the said divisions, and the boys who shall excel in such subjects as may be submitted to them shall be entitled to be admitted free of charge to the agricultural college or experimental farm for a course of training, such examinations to be held every three years.*

The candidates must be over fourteen years of age. The examination will be competitive, and the subjects will be as specified above.

Two additional Scholarships are being made available by the Minister of Agriculture for the Viticultural College, Rutherglen, and will be open to competition at the same time on similar conditions—except that the competitors must be over fifteen years of age.

WHEREAS by section 267 of the *Health Act 1890*, it is among other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and repeal such Orders as may seem to be necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the introduction into Victoria from any country or colony (in which respectively any disease in sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever is known to exist), and for the detention in quarantine in such place and for such period as the Governor in Council by such Order appoints or directs of all sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever, likely to propagate amongst men or other animals any infectious or contagious disease whatsoever: And whereas it is also enacted that all Orders for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned shall have the like force and effect as if the same had been inserted in the now in part recited Act; and that all persons offending against any Order made under the authority of the said section shall for each and every offence forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding fifty pounds, or such smaller sum as the Governor in Council may in any case by such Order direct; and that such sum shall go to and form part of the Consolidated Revenue: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this present Order, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above recited Act and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, prohibit the introduction of Poultry into Victoria from New South Wales and South Australia.

## AREAS OF LANDS INCREASED AND DIMINISHED.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1901 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1901, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 7) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said Land Act as lands which may be sold by auction (class 7 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in Division 6 of Part I. of the Land Act 1901 aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said Act as land which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 5, 8, and 11 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1901 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

**I**n pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Chiltern order as follows:—

1. Throughout these by-laws the expression "machine" shall mean a bicycle, tricycle, or velocipede.

2. A person shall not ride or propel a machine upon any footway made or set apart for use of foot passengers.

3. Every person who rides or propels a machine during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall carry a lamp which shall be attached to the machine, and shall be so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which the rider is proceeding, and such lamp shall be so lighted and kept lighted as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine.

4. Every person who rides or propels a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the carriage-way, and whenever the rider shall overtake with such machine any waggon, cart, or carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or any foot passenger proceeding along the carriage-way, the rider shall, within a reasonable distance from and before passing such waggon, cart, or carriage, horse, or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell or whistle, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of such machine.

5. Every person riding or propelling a machine who overtakes and passes any vehicle, or any horse, or any other beast of burden, shall keep such machine to the right or off side of such vehicle or animal.

6. In every case where a person riding or propelling a machine meets or overtakes any waggon, cart, or carriage, or any horse, or any other beast of burden, and where any animal drawing such waggon, cart, or carriage, or such horse or other beast of burden may on such meeting or overtaking become restive or alarmed, or may cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge of such waggon, cart, or carriage, or such horse or other beast of burden, the person riding such machine shall dismount as speedily as possible and shall continue dismounted so long as may be reasonably necessary.

7. No person shall ride or propel a machine along or in any street in the town at a faster rate than 8 miles an hour or at a faster rate of speed than a walk when crossing the intersection of streets or turning any street corner, nor at any time ride or propel a machine furiously or at such a rate of speed as to endanger the safety of or injure any person, vehicle, or property in the street along or in which such machine is being ridden or propelled.

8. No person shall ride or propel or have for use a machine in any street in the town in such order or in such manner that more than two machines shall be travelling together side by side or keeping abreast of each other while travelling in the same direction, except when such machine shall form part of a duly authorized parade or procession.

9. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable on conviction thereof to a penalty not exceeding £2.
