PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1183), in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz.:—

WEDNESDAY, THE 8TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1902, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Huntly, the North and Central Ridings of the Shire of Goulburn, and as a Public Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the City of Bendigo;

THURSDAY, THE 9TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1902, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Marong, and as a Public Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the City of Bendigo;

SATURDAY, THE 11TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1902, as a Bank Holiday at Apollo Bay;

WEDNESDAY, THE 15TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1902, as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Talbot, the Shires of Avoca, Bet. Bet, Castle Donington, Deakin, Lawloit, and Lowan, the North Riding of the Shire of Huntly, and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Avoca and Numurkah;

THURSDAY, THE 16TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1902, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Bacchus Marsh, and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Bacchus Marsh;

TUESDAY, THE 21ST DAY OF OCTOBER, 1902, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Lawloit and Lowan, and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Kaniva;

WEDNESDAY, THE 22ND DAY OF OCTOBER, 1902, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Chiltern, Rodney, and Rutherglen, the Devenish and Mokoan Ridings of the Shire of Benalla, and the North and South Ridings of the Shire of Huntly;

THURSDAY, THE 23RD DAY OF OCTOBER, 1902, as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Maffra;

FRIDAY, THE 24TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1902, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Deakin;

WEDNESDAY, THE 25TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1902, as a Public Holiday throughout the East Riding of the Shire of Goulburn;

THURSDAY, THE 30TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1902, as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Sale and the Shire of Maffra;

FRIDAY, THE 31ST DAY OF OCTOBER, 1902, as a Public Half-Holiday throughout the Borough of Clunes, and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Clunes;

TUESDAY, THE 4TH DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1902, as a Public Holiday throughout Victoria;*

TRIENNIAL GENERAL RENEWAL OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

IT is hereby notified that all persons who are holders of electors' rights issued before or on the 1st November, 1901, must, not later than the 1st November next, obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names retained upon the new General Electoral Lists, which will be made up for the Legislative Assembly on the 1st November and for the Legislative Council on the 1st December next.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from such Lists.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar or Deputy, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls in April, 1903.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. If application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, the Registrar or Deputy may be unable to issue rights to all applicants, and those to whom rights are not issued will not be enrolled, and will lose their title to vote.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any roll of ratepaying electors for any division of a province may obtain an elector's right for such province.

No person whose name is already on the roll of ratepaying electors for any division of an electoral district may obtain an elector's right for such district.

Foreigners who desire to obtain electors' rights must, if not already naturalized in Victoria, obtain letters of naturalization, without which they are not qualified.

Electors' rights for the Legislative Assembly can now be obtained free of charge, and "residential" rights for the Assembly may be applied for either in person or in writing through the post. Forms necessary for applications through the post are obtainable at the offices of the Registrars and Deputies, and at all Courts of Petty Sessions, Post Offices, and Police Stations.

Each applicant for an elector's right for the Legislative Council should provide himself with the stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the right.

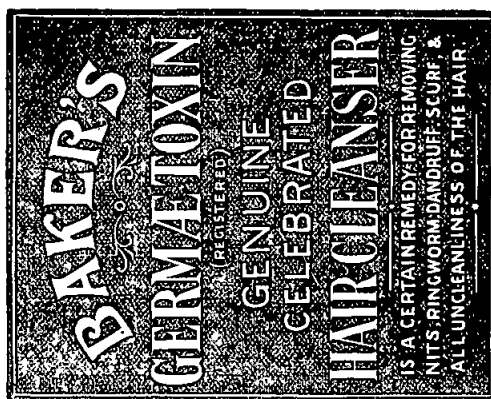

PACIFIC CABLE IN DOUBTFUL BAY.

REFERRING to Notice to Mariners, No. 27 of 1902, issued by this Department on the 27th April last, notice is hereby given that four beacons have been erected to mark the line of approach of the Pacific Cable to Doubtful Bay.

Two beacons are on Tokerau Beach, 1 mile north-west of Aorere River. These indicate the line of cable from sea through the middle of the bay to within 3 miles from the beach. They bear N. 26° E. and S. 26° W. (magnetic) from one another.

Two beacons a quarter of a mile south of Cable Station, marking the line of approach from the Tokerau line to within half-a-mile of the Cable Station beach, and bearing N. 48° W. and S. 43° E. from one another.

Two smaller beacons at Cable Station, indicating the line taken by the shore end of the cable from the station to a position about half-a-mile off the beach, and bear from one another N. 4° E. and S. 4° W.

All beacons are painted white, triangular in shape, and open-boarded, and, with the exception of the last two, are 20 feet in height, and have triangular surmounts.

A By-law of the Shire of Boroondara made under section 48 of the *Local Government Act 1891*, and numbered 21, for the purpose of repealing part 2 of By-law 15, and for the purpose of regulating the construction and erection of buildings and erections.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1891* the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Boroondara order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall come into operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. Part 2 of By-law 15 shall as and from the date of the coming into operation of this By-law be repealed, and the following provisions shall be read in lieu thereof:—

3. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed, any building or erection contrary to the provisions of this By-law, or of any regulations made by this council under or in pursuance of the powers contained in the *Local Government Acts* and in the thirteenth schedule to the *Local Government Act 1890* for the time being in force throughout the Shire of Boroondara or any part thereof.

4. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed, any building or erection without first obtaining a written permit or licence from the council to the proposed building or erection, and without first submitting to the council, its secretary or building surveyor the plan and specifications of the proposed building or erection.

5. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed, any building or erection which is intended to be used, or which shall or may be used as a shop, office, public building, or warehouse upon or within lines at a distance of thirty feet (30 feet) from and running parallel with either side of

the streets or roads mentioned in section seven (7) hereof unless the external walls thereof shall be of brick or stone, or of bricks and stone together, and unless the whole building or erection shall also comply with all the building regulations of the shire relating thereto.

6. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed, any building or erection to be used as a dwelling-house only upon or within lines at a distance of thirty (30) feet from and running parallel with either side of the streets mentioned in the seventh (7th) section hereof unless the whole of the said building or erection of whatever materials constructed shall cover an area of twelve hundred (1,200) square feet at the least; and if such building or erection be of wood the external walls thereof shall be covered with new sound boards, and the roof or roofs thereof shall be covered on the outside with incombustible roof coverings, and the height between the floors and ceilings of the main rooms shall be 11ft. 6in. at the least, and unless such building or erection shall also comply with all the building regulations of the shire relating thereto.

7. The streets to which the foregoing sections five (5) and six (6) shall apply are the following:—

- (1) Burke-road, from Whitehorse-road to a point 56 chains south of Camberwell-road opposite Anderson-street.
- (2) Riverdale-road, from Burke-road to Outer Circle Railway.
- (3) Camberwell-road, from Burke-road to Avenue-road and Arlington-street.
- (4) Canterbury-road, from Burke-road to Boundary-road and Alexandra-avenue.
- (5) Union-road, from Mont Albert-road to Kent-road and Bonn Vista-avenue.
- (6) Mont Albert-road from Burke-road to Balwyn-road.
- (7) Balwyn-road, from Canterbury-road to Whitehorse-road.
- (8) Prospect Hill-road, from Burke-road to Derby-street and Kingsley-street.
- (9) Victoria-avenue, from Canterbury-road to Mont Albert-road.
- (10) Hopetoun-avenue, from Mont Albert-road to View-street.
- (11) Burwood-street, from Burke-road to Cookson-street.
- (12) Victoria-road, from Burke-road to Loch-street.
- (13) Kintore street, from Burke-road to Loch-street.
- (14) Hopetoun-street, from Canterbury-road to Burwood-street.
- (15) Loch-street, from Canterbury-road to Burwood-street.
- (16) Avoca-street, north and south.
- (17) Russell-street, from Canterbury-road to Cookson-street.
- (18) Oliver-street, from Canterbury-road to Cookson-street.
- (19) Cookson-street, from Burke-road to Broadway.
- (20) Broadway, from Canterbury-road to Cookson-street.
- (21) Stanhope-grove, from Prospect Hill-road to Railway.
- (22) Lorne-grove, from Prospect Hill-road to Railway.
- (23) Royal-crescent, from Prospect Hill-road to Railway.

8. No person shall remove or transport, or cause to be removed or transported, any building or erection either in whole or in part into any part of the area to which this By-law extends, or from any part of such area to another part of the same, unless such building or erection when completed shall comply with all the provisions of this By-law, and of any building regulations made by the council, and unless six days' notice in writing of the intention to remove the same be first given to the council, shire secretary, or building surveyor.

9. If any building or erection shall be partly or wholly erected, built, or constructed contrary to the provisions of this By-law, the council, its secretary or building surveyor may give to the owner or builder, or leave upon the site of such building or erection, fourteen (14) days' notice in writing to bring such building or erection into conformity with the said provisions or requiring the pulling down or removal of such building or erection, and if default shall be made in complying with such notice and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty it shall be lawful for the said council, its secretary or building surveyor to enter upon such building or erection, and upon the site thereof with a sufficient number of workmen, and to demolish and pull down the said building or erection, or any part or parts thereof, and to do any other act that may be necessary for the purpose, and to remove the materials thereof to some convenient place; and if the council in its discretion thinks fit to sell the same in such a manner as it thinks fit, and all expenses incurred by the council, its secretary or building surveyor in demolishing and pulling down the said building, or erection, or any part thereof, or removing the materials thereof and selling the same, and in doing such other acts as aforesaid, and all fees or penalties due by the owner or builder thereof may be deducted and retained by the council out of the proceeds of such sale, and the council shall restore any surplus arising from such sale on demand.

10. This By-law shall not apply to any fence, greenhouse, aviary, or other separate outbuilding approved of by the said council, its secretary or building surveyor, nor to the alteration of any building in existence at the date of this By-law coming into force, nor to any Government or municipal building.

11. The Building Regulation No. 1 shall continue in force subject always to the provisions of this By-law.

12. The following words or expressions, whenever used in this By-law, shall have the meaning hereby assigned to them respectively so far as such meanings are not excluded by context, that is to say—

"Council" shall mean the Council of the Shire of Boroondara.

"Building Surveyor" shall mean the building surveyor for the time being of the Shire of Boroondara.

"Secretary" shall mean the secretary for the time being of the Shire of Boroondara.

The expression "Public Building" means a building used or constructed, or adapted to be used as a church, chapel, or other place of public worship, or as a school, college, or place of instruction (not merely a dwelling-house so used), or as a hospital,

public theatre, public hotel, public concert-room, public ball-room, public lecture-room, public library, or public exhibition-room, or as a place of public assembly, or used, or constructed, or adapted to be used, for any public purpose, also a building used or constructed, or adapted to be used, as an hotel, lodging-house, home, refuge, or shelter.

The expression "Warehouse" means a warehouse, factory, manufactory, workshop, public stable, brewery, or distillery, or any other building exceeding in cubical extent 150,000 cubic feet, which is neither a public building nor a domestic building.

The expression "Dwelling-house" means a building used, or constructed, or adapted to be used wholly or principally for human habitation.

The foregoing By-law, being By-law No. 21 of the Shire of Boroondara, was passed by the Council of the Shire of Boroondara on the 14th day of October, 1901, and confirmed by special order this 25th day of November, 1901.
