PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the Public Service Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the Banks and Currency Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897 (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz.:—

TRIENNIAL GENERAL RENEWAL OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

IT is hereby notified that all persons who are holders of electors' rights issued before or on the lat November, 1901, must, not later than the lat November next, obtain ronewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names retained upon the new General Electoral Lists, which will be made up for the Legislative Assembly on the lat November and for the Legislative Council on the lat December next.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from such Lists.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar or Deputy, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls in April, 1903.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. If application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, the Registrar or Deputy may be unable to issue rights to all applicants, and those to whom rights are not issued will not be enrolled, and will lose their title to vote.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any roll of

when rights are not issued will not be enrolled, and will lose their title to vote.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any roll of ratepaying electors for any division of a province may obtain an elector's right for such province.

No person whose name is already on the roll of ratepaying electors for any division of an electoral district may obtain an elector's right for such district.

Foreigners who desire to obtain electors' rights must, if not already naturalized in Victoria, obtain letters of naturalization, without which they are not qualified.

Electors' rights for the Legislative Assembly can now be obtained free of charge, and "residential" rights for the Assembly may be applied for either in person or in writing through the post. Forms necessary for applications through the post are obtainable at the offices of the Registrars and Deputies, and at all Courts of Petty Sessions, Post Uffices, and Police Stations.

Each applicant for an elector's right for the Legislative Council should provide himself with the stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the right.



BY-LAW No. 21. A By-law of the Shire of Borondara made under section 48 of the Local Government Act 1891, and numbered 21, for the pur-pose of repealing part 2 of By-law 15, and for the purpose of regulating the construction and crection of buildings and erections.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1891 the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Borcondare order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall come into operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication

1. This By-law shall come into operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the Government Gueette.

2. Part 2 of By-law 15 shall as and from the date of the coming into operation of this By-law be repealed, and the following provisions shall be read in lieu thereof:

3. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or cause to be creeted, built, or constructed, any building or creetion contrary to the provisions of this By-law, or of any regulations made by this council under or in pursuance of the powers contained in the Local Government Acts and in the thirteenth schedule to the Local Government Act 1890 for the time being in force throughout the Shire of Boroondara or any part thereof.

4. No person shall creet, build, or construct, or cause to be creeted, built, or constructed any building or erection without first obtaining a written permit or licence from the council to the proposed building or erection, and without first submitting to the council, its secretary or building surveyor the plan and specifications of the proposed building or erection which is intended to be used, or which shall or may be used as a shop, office, public building, or warehouse upon or within lines at a distance of thirty feet (30 feet) from and running parallel with either side of

the streets or roads mentioned in section seven (7) hereof unless the external walls thereof shall be of brick or stone, or of bricks and stone together, and unless the whole building or erection shall also comply with all the building regulations of the shire relating thereto.

6. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed, any building or erection to be used as a dwelling-house only upon or within lines at a distance of thirty (30) feet from and running parallel with either sid- of the streets mentioned in the seventh (7th) section hereof unless the whole of the said building or erection of whatever materials constructed shall cover an area of twelve hundred (1,20) square feet at the least; and it such building or erection be of weed the external walls thereof shall be covered on the outside with incombustible roof coverings, and the height between the floors and ceilings of the main rooms shall also comply with all the building regulations of the shire relating thereto.

If any building or erection shall be partly or wholly erected, built, or constructed contrary to the provisions of this By-law, the council, its secretary or building surveyor may give to the owner or builder, or leave upon the site of such building or erection, fourteen (14) days' notice in writing to bring such building or erection into conformity with the said provisions or requiring the pulling down or removal of such building or erection, and if default shall be made in complying with such notice and netwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty it shall be lawful for the said council, its secretary or building surveyor to enter upon such building or erection, and upon the site thereof with a sufficient number of workmen, and to demolish and pull down the said building or erection, and upon the necessary for the purpose, and to remove the materials thereof to some convenient place; and if the council in its discretion thinks fit to sell the same in such a manner as it thinks fit, and all expenses incurred by the council, its secretary or building surveyor in demolishing and pulling down the said building, or erection, or any part thereof, or removing the materials thereof and selling the same, and in doing such other acts as aforesaid, and all fees or penalties due by the owner or builder thereof may be deducted and retained by the council out of the proceeds of such sale, and the council shall restore any surplus arising from such sale, and the council shall restore any surplus arising from such sale, and the council shall restore any surplus arising from such sale on demand.
