PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1900* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz.:-

TRIENNIAL GENERAL RENEWAL OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

IT is hereby notified that all persons who are holders of electors' rights issued before or on the 1st November, 1901, must, not later than the 1st November next, obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names retained upon the new General Electoral Lists, which will be made up for the Legislative Assembly on the 1st November and for the Legislative Council on the 1st December next.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from such Lists.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar or Deputy, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls in April, 1903.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. If application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, the Registrar or Deputy may be unable to issue rights to all applicants, and those to whom rights are not issued will not be enrolled, and will lose their title to vote.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any roll of ratepaying electors for any division of a province may obtain an elector's right for such province.

No person whose name is already on the roll of ratepaying electors for any division of an electoral district may obtain an elector's right for such district.

Foreigners who desire to obtain electors' rights must, if not already naturalized in Victoria, obtain letters of naturalization, without which they are not qualified.

Electors' rights for the Legislative Assembly can now be obtained free of charge, and "residential" rights for the Assembly may be applied for either in person or in writing through the post. Forms necessary for applications through the post are obtainable at the offices of the Registrars and Deputies, and at all Courts of Petty Sessions, Post Offices, and Police Stations.

Each applicant for an elector's right for the Legislative Council should provide himself with the stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the right.

SHIRE OF ALBERTON.

BY-LAW No. 15, AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Alberton, by virtue of the provisions of the *Health Act 1890* and the *Health Act 1900*, and every other power enabling them in this behalf, hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 15 of the Council of the said Shire, that is to say:—

1. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This by-law shall apply to and have operation within the Shire of Alberton.

3. Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the 10th day of January, 1903, and on or before the 10th day of January in each and every subsequent year, register himself with the council in manner following, that is to say:—By signing and forwarding to the Inspector of Dairies an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of the following amount, namely:—

(a) If the person to be registered keep cows, and the number of cows so kept be—

(1) Not more than ten (10), a fee of Five (5) shillings.

(2) More than ten (10), but not more than twenty (20), a fee of Ten (10) shilling.

(3) More than twenty (20), but not more than thirty (30), a fee of Fifteen (15) shillings.

(4) More than thirty (30), but not more than forty (40), a fee of Twenty (20) shillings.

(5) More than forty (40), but not more than fifty (50), a fee of Twenty-five (25) shillings.

(6) More than fifty (50), but not more than sixty (60), a fee of Thirty (30) shillings.

(7) More than sixty (60), but not more than seventy (70) a fee of Thirty-five (35) shillings.

(8) More than seventy (70), a fee of Forty (40) shillings.

(b) If the person to be registered does not keep cows, a fee of Ten (10) shillings.

4. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the Inspector of Dairies shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

5. In the interpretation of this by-law words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

6. Every person guilty of any breach of this by-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

VITAL STATISTICS OF BALLARAT AND SUBURBS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER, 1902.

THE births of 60 boys and 47 girls, or in all of 107 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of September.
