By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Six hundred and seventy-seven thousand seven hundred and seventy-one pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and two and One thousand nine hundred and three."

The births of 1,090 children, viz., 552 boys and 538 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of September. The number was, it will be observed, the lowest recorded for the month during the previous ten years, except 1898 and 1900, and 74 below the average of September during that period, or 153 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in September numbered 636, viz., 338 of males and 298 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 454, or 71 per cent., as against 90 per cent. in September, 1901, and 109 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, the highest recorded for the month during the previous ten years, except 1893. It was also 79 above the average of September during that period, and 41 above it allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 26.44, and of deaths registered to 15.43 per annum, as compared respectively with averages of the same month in 1901 of 27.70 and 14.63, with averages of the month during the last ten years of 29.42 and 14.86, and with averages of the year 1901 of 24.85 and 15.09.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 80.0° on the 25th, and the lowest was 35.9° on the 17th. The mean temperature of the month (52.9°) was one-tenth of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (33.9°) took place on the 24th, and the least range (4.3°) on the 18th. The mean daily range was 17.3°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.211 inches on the 21st, and the lowest was 29.398 inches on the 13th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.892 inches) was slightly below the average.

Rain fell on ten days, the amount being 3.30 inches, which was the highest recorded for the month since 1885, and 1.02 inches above the average of the previous ten years.

The mean humidity of the month was 73. Males contributed 53 per cent. and females 47 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 24 per cent. to that mortality, as against 21 per cent. in September, 1901; 20 per cent. in September, 1900; 18 per cent. in September, 1899; 25 per cent. in September, 1898; 21 per cent. in September, 1897; 20 per cent. in September, 1896; 22 per cent. in September, 1895; 30 per cent. in September, 1894; and 29 per cent. each in September, 1893 and 1892.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 115, as compared with 100 in September, 1901. The rate of infantile mortality was 106 per 1,000 births registered in the month under review, as compared with 89 in September, 1901; 76 in September, 1900; 61 in September, 1899; 81 in September, 1898; 75 in September, 1897; 59 in September, 1896; 88 in September, 1895; 89 in September, 1894; 91 in September, 1893; and 72 in September, 1892.

The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A driver, aged 16, a porter, aged 19, and a carpenter, aged 66, were passed over by railway trains; a farmer, aged 74, and a male of no occupation, aged 79, by vehicles; a driver, aged 36, died of injuries, consequent on being crushed by a lorry pole; an accountant, aged 19, of injuries, caused by a fall from a roof; a bricklayer, aged 46, of injuries, the result of contact with an electric wire; a boy, aged 14, of lacerated jaw; a female child, aged 5 weeks, of compression of the brain; a female, aged 10, of burns; a fruiterer, aged 42, of chloral hydrate poisoning; a labourer, aged 67, was drowned in the River Yarra; four persons were found drowned viz.—A saddler, aged 60, and a tailor, aged 32, in Hobson's Bay; an accountant, aged 78, in the Saltwater River; and a female, aged 21, in the River Yarra; a female, aged 69, was suffocated whilst drunk; a new-born male infant, by being pressed to mother's breast; and a new-born female infant, died of umbilical hemorrhage. The suicidal deaths were those of a bootmaker, aged 46, who shot himself; a clerk, aged 71, who cut his throat; an undertaker's assistant, aged 55, who poisoned himself; a tentmaker, aged 29, a male, of no occupation, aged 53, and a female, aged 35, who hanged themselves.

One hundred and seventy-three deaths, or 27 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 152, of which 81, or 53 per cent., were of males, and 71, or 47 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 115 were under one year of age, 17 were between one and two, 12 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 3 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 484. Of these 257, or 53 per cent., were males, and 227, or 47 per cent., were females: 11 were between five and ten, 13 were between ten and fifteen, 20 were between fifteen and twenty, 20 were between twenty and twenty-five, 17 were between twenty-five and thirty, 20 were between thirty and thirty-five, 34 were between thirty-five and forty, 21 were between forty and forty-five, 33 were between forty-five and fifty, 33 were between fifty and fifty-five, 29 were between fifty-five and sixty, 39 were between sixty and sixty-five, 52 were between sixty-five and seventy, 47 were between seventy and seventy-five, 42 were between seventy-five and eighty, 32 were between eighty and eighty-five, 15 were between eighty-five and ninety, one at the age of ninety-three, one at ninety-six, and one at ninety-seven.

As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, there was an increase of 15 deaths under developmental, and 57 under local diseases; whilst there was a decrease of 20 under zymotic, 2 under parasitic diseases, and 8 under the head of violence. Under the zymotic class, deaths from whooping-cough fell from 14 to 1, and those from septic diseases from 9 to 4. Under the constitutional class, deaths from cancer rose from 33 to 43, whilst those from phthisis fell from 77 to 55. Under the developmental class, deaths from premature birth rose from 17 to 23, and those from old age from 15 to 22. Under the local class, deaths from diseases of the circulatory system increased by 5, those from diseases of the respiratory system by 47, those from diseases of the digestive system by 5, and those from diseases of the urinary system by 9; whilst those from diseases of the organs of generation diminished by 5, and those from diseases of the organs of locomotion by 4.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria, typhoid fever, and tubercular diseases in each month of the years 1897 to 1901, and in each of the first nine months of 1902, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November.

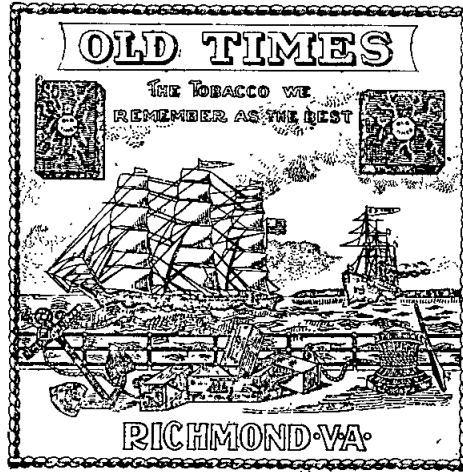

ALTERATIONS IN AND ADDITIONS TO THE REGULATIONS MADE ON 8TH JANUARY, 1902, AND 2ND SEPTEMBER, 1902.—PART IV. SAWMILL AND TIMBER LICENCES, STATE FORESTS, TIMBER RESERVES, AND OTHER CROWN LANDS.

Timber on the undermentioned Crown Lands and Timber Reserves shall, from the date hereof, be sold under special permit and royalty only, at the prices hereafter stated, and subject to the conditions mentioned; but licences current shall remain in force until their expiration by effluxion of time, and contracts now existing for the supply of timber shall not be affected by this Regulation.

1. All reserved or unreserved Crown lands in the county of Gunbower (exclusive of the Gunbower and Terrick Terrick State Forests, which are already under royalty).

2. The following Timber Reserves in the county of Borung:—

Dimboola and Wail (11,360 acres).
Wail or Pimpinio (1,469 acres).
Asbens, Jung Jung, Longerenong, and Marma (5,800 acres).
Marma (1,531 acres).

3. The following Timber Reserve in the county of Evelyn:—
Warrandyte (530 acres).

CONDITIONS.

1. Application must be made to the Conservator of Forests, through the officer in charge of the reserves, who will arrange for the work to proceed immediately upon issue of permit.

2. The officer in charge will locate the permit-holder in any portion of either reserve which is, in his opinion, most suitable, and when necessary mark the trees which may be felled with the broad arrow (thus ↑). He will also give the permit-holder instructions generally how to proceed with the work, and in the event of his instructions being disregarded, or upon wilful breach of any of these conditions, may instantly suspend the permit pending the decision of the Honorable the Minister, who may cancel the permit, forfeit the deposit (if any), and seize the timber already cut as the property of the Crown. During suspension the permit shall have no force or effect.

3. A deposit of £1 must be made if the Conservator of Forests thinks such deposit necessary.

4. All forest produce cut under this Regulation must be branded by the officer in charge with the Crown brand, and paid for by the permit-holder before removal from the reserve, and should the latter remove or allow to be removed unbranded timber, unless with the written authority of the officer in charge, legal proceedings will be taken under the *Land Act 1890* or the *Criminal Act 1890*. Permits are personal, and must be produced on demand of any forest officer, Crown lands bailiff, or police constable.

The royalty rates shall be as follow:—

Split posts, up to 6ft. 6in. x 7in. x 4in., 4s. per 100.
Round posts and strainers up to 7 feet in length and 12 inches in diameter, 3d. each.

Firewood cut from green trees, 3d. per ton measurement (50 cubic feet).

Firewood cut or split from dry timber, 2d. per ton measurement (50 cubic feet).

Long wood (waste lop and top lying on ground), per dozen one-horse loads, 3s.

Oak and Cypress Pine.

Bull oak, she oak, and cypress pine, for any purpose, rates to be fixed by special arrangement.

The payment for dead wood billets, within the Gunbower State Forest, shall be 2d. per ton measurement, instead of 1d. per ton measurement, as prescribed by Regulation dated 8th January, 1902, which is hereby rescinded.

In the Regulations made by His Excellency the Governor in Council on 2nd September, 1902, the words "per annum" after the words "the fee for such site shall be One pound" shall be omitted and the words "per quarter" shall be substituted.

And the Honorable Malcolm Kenneth McKenzie, His Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

No. 1111) the Governor in Council is authorized to make regulations prescribing the mode in which a poll is to be taken regarding Victuallers' Licences, and generally for all matters whatsoever relating to the taking of the poll: And whereas it is by the said section provided that such regulations may be at any time altered or repealed: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind clause 9 of the Regulations for taking a Poll of Electors regarding Victuallers' Licences made by Order in Council dated the 18th day of November, 1890, and doth make the following Regulation in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

9. The polling shall, in the Metropolitan Group of Licensing Districts specified in section 54 of the *Licensing Act 1890*, commence on the day appointed at EIGHT of the clock in the forenoon, and shall, unless lawfully adjourned, finally close at SEVEN of the clock in the afternoon; and the polling shall, in every Licensing District other than those included in the said Metropolitan Group, commence on the day appointed at EIGHT of the clock in the forenoon, and shall, unless lawfully adjourned, finally close at FIVE of the clock in the afternoon.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part III. of the *Land Act 1901* (1 Edw. VII., No. 1749) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time set apart and appropriate for occupation by the members of associations or societies under the said Part of the said Act blocks of any land not alienated from the Crown and not being auriferous lands or lands permanently reserved for any purpose whatsoever, provided that such blocks of land shall not include any mallee block or allotment except such as may have been or may hereafter be purchased by the Crown in accordance with the conditions of the *Land Act 1901* aforesaid; and that, except as to so much of any block as may be occupied or leased under the said Part of the said Act, no Proclamation setting apart a block for a society shall remain in force for longer than three years or for an association for longer than six months after in each case the survey and subdivision of such block; and that at the expiration of such three years or six months (as the case may be) all land in any block which is not occupied or leased under Part III. of the *Land Act 1901* aforesaid shall be deemed and taken to be unoccupied Crown land: And whereas by certain Proclamations as hereunder set forth, made in pursuance of the provisions of the *Settlement on Lands Act 1893*, certain lands described in such Proclamations were set apart and appropriated for occupation by the members of associations or societies under the said last-mentioned Act: And whereas it is expedient to revoke in part such Proclamations: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby order as follows, viz.:

Settlement on Lands Act 1893.

RAYMOND ISLAND.—The Proclamation bearing date the 26th September, 1893, by which certain lands situate on Raymond Island, in the parish of Bairnsdale, and comprising an area of one thousand one hundred acres, more or less, were, amongst others, set apart and appropriated for occupation by the members of homestead associations or societies, is hereby revoked so far only as it relates to the portion of the said lands hereinafter described, viz.:
