SOUTH AFRICAN CONSTABULARY. SPECIAL WAR GRATUITY.

FORMS of application for payment of the above Gratuity may be obtained from the Chief Paymaster, South African Constabulary, Johannesburg, by men who served with the S.A.C., on or before 31st May, 1902, and have taken their discharge.

These forms, when completed, should be returned to the Chief Paymaster, S.A.C., accompanied by discharge certificates from all Corps or Regiments in which the applicant has served during the war.

No Gratuity is payable to men who have been discharged for misconduct; neither is the Gratuity paid by the South African Constabulary if applicant has served in any other Corps or Regiment since leaving the South African Constabulary.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to authorize the issue of Treasury Bonds."

"An Act to authorize the issue of Treasury Bonds (No. 2)."

"An Act to authorize the Destruction of Discharged Public Debentures Bonds and Coupons."

"An Act to further amend the *Trust Funds Act 1897*."

"An Act to further amend the *Victorian Loans Redemption Fund Act 1898*."

"An Act to further amend the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890*."

"An Act to amend Part III. of the *Police Regulation Act 1890* with regard to future Appointees."

"An Act to confirm the Union in Victoria of the Wesleyan Methodist Church, the Primitive Methodist Church, the Bible Christian Church, and The United Methodist Free Churches; to deal with the Properties in Victoria of the said Uniting Churches, and to assimilate the Trusts thereof; to vest the said Properties in the United Church under the name of the Methodist Church of Australasia; to give certain powers to the Victoria and Tasmania Conference of the Methodist Church of Australasia; to amend *The Victorian Wesleyan Methodists' Act 1887*, and for other purposes."

THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890* the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners (hereinafter called "the Commissioners,") make the following Regulations:—

348. Subject as hereinafter mentioned there shall be paid to the Commissioners in respect and for the use by any vessel of any wharf of the Commissioners the rates following, viz.:—

- (a) For each day or part of a day (not including Sundays and public holidays) during which such vessel uses such wharf one half penny per ton of the net register tonnage (British Standard) of such vessel for the first six days; and for each day or part of a day after the first six days one farthing per ton of such register tonnage. A vessel lying in tier outside a vessel moored to or alongside any wharf of the Commissioners shall be liable to the preceding rates as if she were directly moored to the wharf. This sub-section shall not apply to those berths at the wharfs known as No. 16 on the north side and A, B, C, D, E, F, and G coal berths on the south side which have been specially appropriated for the exclusive accommodation of the lessees of such berths so long as the leases thereof are in force respectively and the said berths are being used only by the vessels of such lessees respectively.
- (b) Where a vessel engaged only in the Inter-State or Bay trade is laid up out of commission and is moored to or alongside any wharf of the Commissioners the following rates shall be paid for the use of such wharf, viz.:— Five shillings for each month or part of a month during which such vessel, if not exceeding 200 tons of net register tonnage, is laid up and moored as aforesaid; and ten shillings per month, or part of a month, if such vessel exceeds 200 tons and not exceeding 400 tons net register. Nothing in this sub-section shall prevent the Harbor-master from directing the removal of any vessel so laid up from any wharf at any time he may think fit.
- (c) When a vessel arrives in the Port in distress the Harbor-master may grant her the use of any wharf of the Commissioners free of rates for a period not exceeding fourteen days, or for any further period which the Commissioners may from time to time direct.
- (d) Where a vessel requires to use any wharf of the Commissioners for the purpose of repairs only the rates mentioned in the preceding sub-clause (a) shall not be payable until three days after she was allowed to use such wharf for the said purpose or until after such extended period if any (but not exceeding fourteen days in all) as the Harbor-master may allow.

349. No tug, launch, lighter, or hulk shall use or be moored to any part of any wharf of the Commissioners or to the bed of the port unless licensed to do so by the Commissioners. Applications for such licences must be in such form as the Commissioners prescribe, and may be issued annually and on such conditions as they think fit. For every such licence a sum of £5 shall be paid, and no licence shall be in force beyond the 31st day of December in each year. The penalty for any offence against this clause shall be £5.

350. No rate or charge will be payable by any vessel using the Crane Wharf exclusively for the purpose of discharging or taking in any heavy portion of her machinery to enable such vessel to be repaired.

351. All rates and charges made payable by these Regulations shall be paid to the Treasurer of the Commissioners at the office of the Commissioners, or to a collector appointed to receive the same by the Commissioners, and such Treasurer or collector shall, on demand, give to the person who shall pay such rates and charges a receipt signed by such Treasurer or collector for the amount received by him.

352. Regulations numbered 222 and 223 of the Regulations made by the Commissioners on the 28th day of March, 1900, are hereby repealed; but such repeal shall not affect the right of the Commissioners to recover any moneys payable under any of the said clauses, or any penalties recoverable for breach thereof prior to the said repeal taking effect.

353. The preceding Regulations, numbered 348 to 352 inclusive, shall be read with the said Regulations of 28th March, 1900, and if any inconsistency exists between them these Regulations shall prevail.

NOTE.—By section 116 of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890* no vessel can be cleared at the Customs unless the rates and charges imposed by the Commissioners have been paid.

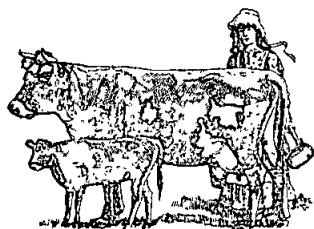

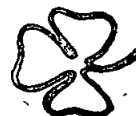

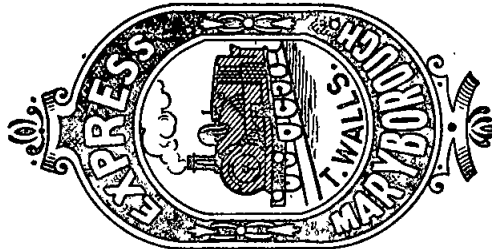

FIRST MILDURA IRRIGATION TRUST.—AMENDMENTS OF, AND ADDITIONS TO, THE REGULATIONS FOR THE SUPPLY OF WATER.

THE Commissioners of the First Mildura Irrigation Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Mildura Irrigation Trusts Act 1895*, do hereby repeal clause 1 of the Regulations for the management of the water service to the Mildura township allotments, villa sites, and lands supplied by town pump, made on the 8th day of March, 1900, and make in substitution thereof the following:—

1. For water supplied from the town mains by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, the rates shall be as follow:—

- (a) For all water supplied within the Trust District in excess of the acreage allowance under the *Mildura Irrigation Trusts Act 1895*, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (b) For all water supplied outside the Trust District, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

And the said Commissioners do hereby amend clause 7 of the said Regulations by striking out the figures "14" after the words "for two allotments," and substituting therefor the figure "1."

And the said Commissioners do hereby amend clause 15 of the said Regulations by inserting after the words "these Regulations" "The term 'domestic supply,' in clause 13A, shall not include a supply of water for livery or carriers' stables or a supply for any manufacturing purposes, or for irrigation by means of hose or otherwise, or for water power, or for any ornamental purposes."

And the said Commissioners do hereby make the following new clause, to be numbered 13A:—"No person shall after the hour of Eight p.m., and before the hour of Eight a.m., use or permit, suffer, or allow water to be used for other than domestic purposes, and any person offending against this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence. Nothing herein shall affect persons supplied by measure."

INTRODUCTION OF BONES AND BONE MEAL INTO VICTORIA.

WHEREAS by section 267 of the *Health Act 1890*, it is among other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, from time to time, make, alter, and repeal such Orders as may seem to be necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the introduction into Victoria from any country or State or part of a country or State (in which respectively any disease in cattle, sheep, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same kind or kinds whatsoever is known to exist), and for the detention in quarantine in such place and for such period as the Governor in Council by such Order appoints or directs, among other things, meat, skins, hides, horns, hoofs, or other parts of an animal likely to propagate amongst men or other animals any infectious or contagious disease whatsoever: And whereas the disease of anthrax being a disease in sheep, cattle, horses, swine, dogs, and other animals is known to exist in the States of New South Wales, Queensland, and Tasmania, the United Kingdom, France, Germany, Italy, Austria, Turkey, Greece, Russia, Egypt, Arabia, Persia, Beloochistan, India, Ceylon, Burmah, Siam, Malay Peninsula, China, Straits Settlements, and the Argentine Republic: And whereas the introduction into Victoria from thence of bones of animals, bone dust, or bone meal is likely to propagate among men or other animals the infectious or contagious disease of anthrax: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this present Order, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above-recited Act, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows (that is to say):—

1. The introduction of raw bones, bone dust, bone meal from the States of New South Wales, Queensland, and Tasmania, the United Kingdom, France, Germany, Italy, Austria, Turkey, Greece, Russia, Egypt, Arabia, Persia, Beloochistan, India, Ceylon, Burmah, Siam, Malay Peninsula, China, Straits Settlements, and the Argentine Republic into the State of Victoria is hereby prohibited except at the Ports of Melbourne, Geelong, Echuca, or Wodonga.
2. The consignee or importer of all bones, bone dust, or bone meal so introduced shall cause the same to be immediately removed in railway trucks or other vehicles under the supervision or with the written permission of the Chief Inspector of Stock, or other duly authorized Inspector of Stock, to quarantine grounds approved by the Governor in Council, and to be there at once converted by chemical processes into superphosphates, or steamed under an indicated pressure of 20 lbs. per square inch for a period of two hours.
3. If bones, bone meal, or bone dust are accompanied by a certificate from the Government of the State or country from which they are imported declaring that they have been subjected to an indicated steam pressure of 20 lbs. to the square inch for a period of two hours they may be admitted and sold in Victoria without hindrance.

Penalties.—Any person offending against this Order shall for each and every offence forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50).

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1901* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1901*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 7) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said *Land Act* as lands which may be sold by auction (class 7 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in Division 6 of Part I. of the *Land Act 1901* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said Act as land which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1901* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by the *Fisheries Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1093) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Proclamations which shall have force and effect only in any waters or places specified therein for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sections 37 and 38 of the said Act, and that every Proclamation under the said Act shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and may be explained, varied, revoked, annulled, or superseded by any other Proclamation under the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation prohibit the use of trammels, trawls, and other nets or fixed engines in the waters within a space of 100 feet from any part of all piers and jetties around which netting has not been heretofore prohibited.

WHITE-FACED STORM PETRELS TO BE DEEMED NATIVE GAME AND PROTECTED IN A CERTAIN LOCALITY.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Game Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1095) it is amongst other things enacted that for the purposes of the said Act the term "game" shall mean and include all birds and other animals mentioned in the Second Schedule to the said Act, and the terms "native game" shall mean and include all birds and other animals mentioned in the Third Schedule to the said Act; provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, at any time after the passing of the said Act, by proclamation, to name any other bird or animal which shall be included in such Second or Third Schedule respectively, and after the publication of any such proclamation in the *Government Gazette* and the expiration of the period mentioned in such proclamation for the time of its coming into operation, the birds or other animals so named shall be deemed and considered as being thenceforward included in such schedule: And whereas it is also enacted that the period of the year during which the said Act shall be in operation as regards all or any of the birds and other animals mentioned in the Third Schedule shall be the period set opposite the name of each such bird or animal in the said schedule in each year or such other period as the Governor in Council may, by proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time direct: And whereas by the *Game Act 1896* (60 Vict. No. 1463) it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, by proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to specify any part of Victoria as a locality in which, during such period or periods in each year as shall be fixed in such proclamation, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game mentioned in such proclamation, or to kill or destroy any native game mentioned in such proclamation under such an age as is therein prescribed with regard to such native game: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby direct that the

WHITE-FACED STORM PETREL

shall be included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1890* aforesaid, and that, upon the expiration of the period hereinafter appointed for the coming into operation of this Proclamation, the said Act shall be in operation as regards White-faced Storm Petrels at the rookery on Mud Island, Port Phillip Bay, during the whole year: And, with the advice aforesaid, I do appoint that this my Proclamation shall come into operation from and after the twenty-fifth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and two.

No. 1093) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Proclamations which shall have force and effect only in any waters or places specified therein for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sections 37 and 38 of the said Act, and that every Proclamation under the said Act shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and may be explained, varied, revoked, annulled, or superseded by any other Proclamation under the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation revoke the Proclamation made under the provisions of the said *Fisheries Act 1890*, and bearing date the 6th day of October, 1896, relating to the protection of Murray Bream, Murray Cod, and Murray Perch, and do hereby prescribe as a "close season" throughout Victoria and in all Victorian waters for Murray Bream, Murray Cod, and Murray Perch the period from the 1st day of September to the 20th day of December (both dates inclusive) in every year, during which period it shall be unlawful under the said Act for any person to take, sell, or expose for sale any Murray Bream, Murray Cod, and Murray Perch.

PORTS IN VICTORIA.—AMENDMENT OF CLAUSE 55 OF THE GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Marine Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1165) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs, and may appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations; but that no rules or regulations made as aforesaid respecting any public wharf shall have any force or validity to repeal or affect any by-law passed by the corporation of the city of Melbourne or of the town of Geelong or by the council of any borough, district, or shire for preventing obstruction and encumbrances in and upon any wharf within the limits of such city, town, borough, district, or shire; and that any such limits, boundaries, rules, and regulations may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed, and others substituted in their stead: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby make the following Amendment in Clause 55 of the General Rules for Ports in Victoria, which shall come into force on and after the date of this Proclamation, that is to say:—

55. No ballast, rubbish, gravel, earth, stone, wreck, filth, or refuse, or any other material whatsoever (except ashes from the fires of steam-ships plying within the Port of Port Phillip, which may be discharged in a depth of not less than 11 fathoms of water) shall be thrown by any person into any port, river, or anchorage, or be placed, landed, or shipped in any port, except at the places and in the manner pointed out by the Port Officer; and all such ballast, gravel, rubbish, earth, stone, wreck, filth, or refuse, or other material shall be removed at such times and to such places as the Port Officer may direct.

The price must include delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oat, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oat or hay of the best quality. As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

2. The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required at any station, the contractor will be required to supply the extra forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depot for police purposes, at the same rates.

4. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

6. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

7. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.

8. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

9. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

10. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

11. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.
