FUGITIVE CRIMINALS.

EXTRADITION TREATY BETWEEN THE UNITED KINGDOM AND AUSTRIA-HUNGARY, 1873.

Declaration amending Article XI.

Sir,

With reference to my predecessor's Circular Despatch of the 30th March, 1874, transmitting a copy of a Treaty concluded on 3rd December, 1873, between Her Majesty Queen Victoria and the Emperor of Austria for the mutual surrender of fugitive criminals, I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the colony under your Government, a copy of an Order of His Majesty in Council, giving effect to a Declaration signed on the 26th of June, 1901, and ratified on the 25th of June last, between the United Kingdom and Austria-Hungary amending Article XI. of the Treaty of 1873.

EXTRADITION DECLARATION OF THE 26TH JUNE, 1901, BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND AUSTRIA-HUNGARY.

Balmoral, 15th September, 1902.

At the Court at Balmoral, the 15th day of September, 1902.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1893, it was amongst other things enacted that where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient.

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the third day of December, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and His Majesty the Emperor of Austria and King of Hungary for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, in the case of which Treaty *The Extradition Act 1870* was applied by Order in Council of the seventeenth March, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-four;

December 10, 1902.

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And whereas a Declaration was concluded on the twenty-sixth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and one, between His Majesty and His Majesty the Emperor of Austria, King of Hungary, amending Article XI. of the said Treaty of the third of December, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Declaration is in the terms following:—

As it is considered necessary by the Government of Great Britain and Ireland and by the Governments of Austria and Hungary to extend the period of fourteen days fixed in Article XI. of the Treaty for the mutual surrender of criminals, concluded on the 3rd December, 1873, between Her late Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, &c., on one side, and His Majesty the Emperor of Austria, King of Bohemia, &c., and Apostolic King of Hungary, on the other, the respective Plenipotentiaries undersigned have agreed that—

The last paragraph of Article XI. of the said Treaty of Extradition shall be altered as follows:—

“Provided, however, that he shall be discharged if, within the shortest time possible, and at the utmost within one month, a requisition for his surrender in accordance with the terms of Article IX. of this Treaty be not made by the Diplomatic Representative of the State which requests his extradition.”

The present Declaration shall have the same force and duration as the Extradition Treaty of the 3rd December, 1873, to which it relates.

The present Declaration shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged as soon as possible at London.

In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

NACHDEM von der Regierung Grossbritanniens und Irlands und von den Regierungen Oesterreichs und Ungarns, die Verlängerung der im Artikel XI des zwischen weiland Ihrer Majestät der Königin des vereinigten Königreiches von Grossbritannien und Irland, Kaiserin von Indien, &c., einerseits, und Seiner Majestät dem Kaiser von Oesterreich, König von Böhmen, &c., und Apostolischen König von Ungarn, andererseits, am 3. December 1873, über die gegenseitige Auslieferung der Verbrecher abgeschlossenen Staatsvertrages festgesetzten Frist von 14 Tagen für nothwendig erkannt worden ist, haben die hiezu bevollmächtigten Unterzeichneten Folgendes vereinbart—

Der letzte Absatz des Artikels XI des erwähnten Auslieferungs-Vertrages wird folgendermassen abgeändert:—

“Vorausgesetzt wird übrigens, dass in der kürzesten Frist und zwar längstens binnen einem Monate bei sonstiger Entlassung des Verhafteten, durch den diplomatischen Vertreter des um die Auslieferung ersuchenden Staates eine Requisition wegen der Auslieferung in der dem Artikel IX dieses Vertrages entsprechenden Weise erhoben wird.”

Die gegenwärtige Erklärung wird dieselbe Kraft und Dauer haben, wie der Auslieferungs-Vertrag vom 3. December 1873, auf welchen sie sich bezieht.

Die gegenwärtige Erklärung wird ratificirt werden und werden die Ratificationen sobald als möglich in London ausgetauscht werden.

Zu Urkund dessen haben die Unterzeichneten diese Erklärung gefertigt und ihre Siegel beigeschrieben.

MIUTAN Nagybritannia és Irhon kormányja, és Ausztria és Magyarország kormányai a büntetettek kölcsönös kiadatása tárgyában egyrészről Ő Felsége Nagybritannia és Irhon egyesült királyságok boldogult királynője, India császárnője stb. másrészről Ő Felsége Ausztria császára, Csehország királya stb. és Magyarország apostoli királya között 1873 évi december hó 3 án kötött államszerződés XI cikkében megállapított 14 napi határidőnek meghosszabbítását szükségesnek találták, az illető alulírott meghatalmazottak a következő megállapodásra jutottak—

Az említett kiadási szerződés XI cikkének utolsó bekezdése következőképen módosul:—

“Feltételeztetik azonban, hogy a kiadás iránti megkeresés a megkereső állam diplomáciai képviselője által az ezen szerződés IX cikkének megfellelő módon a legrövidebb idő s legfőbb egy hónap alatt elő fog terjesztetni, ellenkező esetben az elfogatott szabadon bocsátatik.”

A jelen nyilatkozat ugyan azzal az erővel fog bérni s ugyanoly tartamú lesz, mint az 1873 évi december 3 án kötött kiadási szerződés, a melyre vonatkozik.

A jelen nyilatkozat meg fog erősíteni, s a megerősítési okiratok, mihelyt lehet Londonban ki fognak cseréltetni.

Minek hiteléül az illető meghatalmazottak a nyilatkozatot aláírták és pecsétjeikkel ellátták.

And whereas the ratifications of the said Declaration were exchanged at London on the twenty-fifth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and two:

Now therefore His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to him by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the sixth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and two, the said Acts shall apply in the case of Austria and Hungary under and in accordance with the said Treaty as amended by the said Declaration above set forth.

Provided always that the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as an Act of the Parliament of Canada passed in One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and entitled “An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals,” shall continue in force there, and no longer.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. CANCELLATION OF A WINE AND SPIRIT MERCHANT'S LICENCE.

SMALL-POX ON THE S.S. "VILLE DE LA CIOTAT."

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that in any emergency or sudden necessity with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria and having any infectious or contagious disease on board, or on board of which any such infectious or contagious disease may have appeared in the course of the voyage, the Board of Public Health may take all necessary steps to prevent infection or contagion until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council under the provisions of section 165 of the said Act: And whereas the steamship or vessel *Ville de la Ciotat* has arrived in Victorian waters, having had on board during the voyage a case of the contagious disease small-pox: And whereas it is expedient to make an order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: And whereas it is also enacted by such Act that all the powers, rights, and authorities vested in the above-named Board shall, whenever he deems fit, be exercisable by the Minister: Now therefore I, the Minister of Health for the State of Victoria, do hereby order and direct that, until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council as aforesaid, and in order to prevent infection or contagion, the said vessel shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean, or at the Outer Anchorage off Williamstown, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the mainmast-head; and do further direct that no person other than the passengers for Victoria, unless directed to do so by the Health

Officer or other officer in charge on behalf of the said Board, nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters, shall leave the said vessel, nor be taken, or allowed or suffered to be taken and removed from her, nor shall any boat put off from the said vessel, except only that her mails, cargo, and passengers' luggage for Victoria may be discharged into lighters, and may, after careful disinfection under the supervision of the Health Officer, be afterwards conveyed to shore under his directions; and, further, that cargo, provisions, luggage, and mails may be slung or hoisted on board the said vessel under such conditions as the Health Officer may direct, and under his supervision; and, further, that no person except the Medical Inspector or Health Officer or person authorized by either of such officers necessarily employed in fumigating or discharging cargo shall be permitted to board or approach the said vessel, nor shall any one remain unnecessarily in her vicinity; and, further, that all persons engaged in conveying any cargo, passengers' luggage, provisions, or mails to or from the said vessel shall immediately afterwards, together with their clothing, be fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Health Officer; and, further, that the said vessel and all persons and things on board of her shall be detained in quarantine until severally released by the Health Officer.

This Order shall be deemed to have been in force on and since 2nd December, 1902.

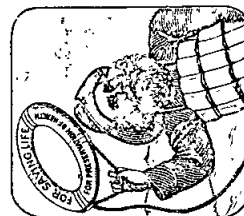

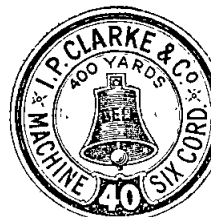

BIRCHIP WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1903.

THE Commissioners of the Birchip Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, hereby make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION No. 5.

Regulation for the making of a rate on all the rateable property comprised within the boundaries of the Birchip Waterworks Trust District.

1. A rate of Sixpence in the pound sterling on the annual value of all rateable property situated as above described within the Birchip Waterworks Trust area, according to the value for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the shire of Birchip, is hereby made for the year 1903, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1903, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1903.
2. Such rate is hereby made payable in one instalment, and shall be due and payable on the 1st day of February, 1903.
3. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the rate.

The foregoing Regulation was made by the Commissioners of the Birchip Waterworks Trust on the 13th day of October, 1902.

HAMILTON WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION No. 7.

THE Hamilton Waterworks Trust, part of whose Waterworks District has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of Part II. of the Water Act 1890, doth hereby, under the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulation for the year 1903 in respect of such Urban District:—

- (a) For every house or other tenement fronting any street wherein the water pipes of the Trust have been laid, and not being unoccupied land, a rate of One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation of such house or other tenement shall be paid, the minimum amount to be so paid to be Twenty shillings.
- (b) For unoccupied land where water is not laid on, but which land fronts any street wherein the water pipes of the Trust have been laid, the rate shall be Five per centum per annum on the amount of the municipal valuation thereof in all cases where such rate or such valuation shall exceed Ten shillings, and in all others of such cases the rate shall be Ten shillings.
- (c) For houses proved to the satisfaction of the Trust to have remained unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, the charge per house shall be two-thirds of the amount which would be payable if such house had not been so unoccupied; but in no case shall the rate be less than Twenty shillings, and such rate shall be levied upon the persons and at the times and in the manner provided for the levying of rates by the Water Acts.
- (d) For water supplied for domestic and other than domestic purposes by the Trust by measure the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per 1,000 gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive in respect of the tenement for which such charge shall be made if the same had been rated under subdivision (a) hereof; and thereafter at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
- (e) For gas engines and oil engines the charge shall be at the rate of Ten shillings per annum, payable yearly in advance, for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used, and thereafter no water shall be supplied until such meter shall have been affixed to the supply pipe for such engine to the satisfaction of the engineer of the Trust. The provisions of sub-section (i) shall apply to this clause.
- (f) For steam boilers the charge shall be Ten shillings per annum, payable half-yearly in advance, for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used, and in such cases no water shall be supplied or used after such order shall have been given until the same is complied with to the satisfaction of the engineer of the Trust. The provisions of sub-section (i) shall apply to this clause.
- (g) For buildings in course of erection, where water is required for building purposes, the charge shall be Five shillings per centum on the contract price of the works for a brick building, or shall be fixed by special agreement. For wooden buildings with plastered walls the charge shall be One pound (£1), and all wooden buildings where no plaster is used for charge shall be Ten shillings (10s.), payment in the cases under this subdivision to be made in advance.
- (h) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein are to be paid for at such charge as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment on account of such charge must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply shall be taken or used.
- (i) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly in each case, where water is supplied by measure for other than domestic purposes, shall be 10,000 gallons, and such water (where not otherwise provided herein) shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
- (j) The charge for water supplied to public gardens, parks, show grounds, cricket grounds, and bowling greens shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons; any quantity supplied in excess of the full measure of a unit of 1,000 gallons shall be charged for as 1,000 gallons. All water so supplied must be through a meter, and paid for half-yearly.
- (k) The charge for water supplied by measure solely for railway purposes shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 1,000,000 gallons.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

ALEXANDRA WATERWORKS TRUST. — REGULATIONS FOR THE YEAR 1903.

THE Chairman and the Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust, of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following Regulations:—

The following are the rates which the owners or occupiers of land and tenements within the Urban District of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust, where such lands and tenements front streets wherein the pipes of the Trust have been laid, shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust.

For every house, tenement, or allotment of the annual value of Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence or over, according to municipal valuation, an amount equal to Seven and a half pounds per centum per annum, or One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such valuation.

For every house, tenement, or allotment under Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence sterling annual value, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One pound sterling per annum.

For all tenements in the said district, situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the above-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rates.

The charge for water supplied from and after the 1st day of January, 1903, shall be as follows:—

For street water-troughs, Twenty shillings per year. All water-troughs to be fitted with approved self-acting ball taps to prevent overflow.

For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Fifteen shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler.

For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling for every 1,000 gallons.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be—

- (1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, which would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (2) If for other than domestic only, 30,000 gallons per half-year.

For water supplied to the Government Departments, police station, churches, court-house, post-office, State school, show-yards, cricket ground, bowling green, shire hall, and similar properties shall be charged by measurement or special agreement.

For water supplied to livery and carriers' stables by the Trust, the charge shall be Five shillings per annum for each stall or loose-box.

In open sheds used for stabling, each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.

The before-mentioned rates and charges are made for the year 1903.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, and receive, and collect the said rates and charges.

The price must include delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense. The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for the sum of £5 per horse per station, based on the estimated quarterly consumption of 8 centals of oats, 1 of bran, 12 of hay, and 3 of straw per horse, or thereabouts, within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts where the sum stated in the bond is £50 and upwards, and one surety where the sum stated is under £50.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheat or oat, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown); of the best description, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oat hay of the best quality. As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.
2. The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required at any station, the contractor will be required to supply the extra forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station.
3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depot for police purposes, at the same rates.
4. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.
5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.
6. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced; failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.
7. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.
8. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.
9. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.
10. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.
11. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.
