INSURANCES OF MEMBERS OF THE POLICE FORCE.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in Council doth hereby Order as follows, viz.:-

1. Every person hereafter appointed a member of the Police Force of Victoria shall, as a condition precedent to his appointment, lodge in the Office of the Chief Commissioner of Police a policy or policies on his life effected with some life assurance company carrying on business in Victoria. Such policy or policies shall provide for the payment to the person assured on his attaining the age of 55 years, or to his legal personal representatives within three (3) months from the date of his death, if the person assured should die under the age set forth in such policy or policies, of a sum or sums of money at least equal in the aggregate to the amount of the maximum annual current rate of pay provided for his rank or grade; provided that in lieu of the payment of the sum or sums of money on such person attaining the said prescribed age, such policy or policies may provide for an annuity or annuities payable to the person assured, quarterly during the remainder of his life, after he attains the said prescribed age, but the annual amount of such annuity or annuities must be in the aggregate at least equal to one-tenth of the said maximum annual salary.

2. Every person hereafter appointed to the Force shall, as a condition precedent to his promotion or transfer to any rank or grade of the Force the maximum annual rate of pay of which is greater than the sum for which he is assured, effect a further assurance for a sum or sums of money equal at least to the difference between the sum for which he is already assured and such maximum, and shall lodge in the Office of the Chief Commissioner the policy or policies for such further assurance or assurances. Provided that no member of the Force will be required to pay premiums which, if paid yearly, would amount to more than five per centum of the maximum rate of pay of the rank or grade to which he is promoted or transferred.

3. The premiums on any policy or policies lodged as aforesaid shall be of such amount and be payable at such times as may be agreed upon between the person assured and the company or companies, all which shall be clearly expressed in the body of the policy or policies; and the Chief Commissioner of Police may pay such premiums at or about the dates when they respectively fall due, and may deduct the same from the pay payable to the person assured, and the receipts for premiums paid by the Chief Commissioner of Police or by the person assured shall be lodged forthwith in the Office of the Chief Commissioner. The policy or policies shall remain in the custody of the Chief Commissioner so long as the person assured shall continue in the Police Force.

4. Every policy to be lodged with the Chief Commissioner as aforesaid shall contain a condition to the effect that, so long as the person assured remains in the Police Force, the policy shall not be made void for non-payment of premiums till one month after notice of such non-payment shall have been served on the Chief Commissioner, and that the company will, within one month after the service of such notice, receive the overdue

premiums without interest, and a further condition, in accordance with the provisions of Section 4 of the *Police Regulation Act 1902*, to the effect that such policy shall not, so long as the person assured remains in the Police Force, be assignable either at law or in equity.

5. If the person assured under any policy or policies lodged with the Chief Commissioner retires or is removed from the Police Force before the sum assured becomes payable, such policy or policies shall be delivered to such person or to his order, and thereafter shall cease to be subject to these regulations.

6. If the person assured under any policy or policies lodged as hereinbefore provided dies, such policy or policies shall be delivered up to the executors of the will or administrators of the estate of such deceased person.

7. If the person assured under any policy providing for the payment of a sum of money elects or is required to remain in the Police Force after he has attained the said prescribed age, or, if he remains in such service beyond the age at which any sum shall become payable under such policy as hereinbefore provided, the said sum of money shall be held by the company in which such officer is assured until he retires or is removed from the Police Force or departs this life, and such company shall pay the person so assured interest half-yearly at the rate then allowed by the Commissioners of Savings Banks for deposits on the sum accrued on such policy from the date of its maturing, and until the time when the person so assured retires from the Police Force or departs this life.

9. Before any person is appointed a member of the Police Force he shall sign an acknowledgment that he understands and agrees to the requirements of this Order in Council.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council, made on the twentieth day of January, 1891, under the provisions of the Tramways Act, No. 1148, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-third day of January, 1891, the Council of the Municipality of the Town of Ballarat East was authorized to construct Tramways within the municipal district of the Town of Ballarat East: And whereas the Council of the said Municipality has now made application (accompanied by plans and specification numbered 1 to 9, and attached hereto), under provisions of the *Tramways Act 1890*, to have the said Order varied and amended by adding further plans and specifications thereto, and extending the routes from the intersection of Bridge and Grenville streets along Bridge-street to the intersection of Bridge and Peel streets, and from the intersection of Main and Barkly streets along Barkly-street to the intersection of Peel and Grant streets, and increasing to fifteen (15) miles an hour, the maximum speed allowed by the said Order, except in Bridge-street, where the rate of speed shall not exceed ten (10) miles an hour, and by adding to electricity horses as motive power; and that the time allowed for the completion of the said tramways shall be extended.

And the said Council, having duly complied with the requirements of the said Act, and the regulations made thereunder, with regard to the publication of its intention to so apply, and no objections having been lodged thereto within the time provided by the said rules, and the Governor in Council being satisfied that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same, subject to the restrictions and conditions set out in the Order of the twentieth day of January, 1891.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth for the purpose aforesaid make the Order following, that is to say:—

Construction.—That the mode of construction be varied and improved as shown by further plans and specifications numbered 1 to 9.

Routes.—That the routes authorized by the said Order in Council of the twentieth day of January, 1891, be extended from the intersection of Bridge and Grenville streets along Bridge-street to the intersection of Bridge and Peel streets, and from the intersection of Main and Barkly streets along Barkly-street to the intersection of Peel and Grant streets.

Maximum Speed.—That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars upon the said tramway shall be increased to fifteen (15) miles in the hour, except in Bridge-street, where the rate of speed shall not exceed ten (10) miles in the hour.

Nature of Traffic.—That such tramway shall be used for passengers, light goods, and parcels only.

Motive Power.—That the motive power to be used upon the said tramway shall be horses in addition to electricity.

Time of Completion.—That the portions of the tramway authorized by the said Order in Council of the twentieth day of January, 1891, together with the extensions authorized by this Order as follows:—

- 1st. Commencing in Bridge-street at its intersection with Grenville-street, thence along Bridge-street to Main-street, thence along Main street to its intersection with Barkly-street.
- 2nd. Commencing in Barkly-street at its intersection with Main-street, thence along Barkly-street to its intersection with Cobden-street.
- 3rd. Commencing in Bridge-street at its intersection with Peel-street, thence along Bridge-street to Victoria-street, thence along Victoria-street to its intersection with Stawell-street, shall be completed and opened for traffic within the period of three years and one half-year from the date of this Order.

The remaining portions of the tramways authorized by the said Order in Council of the twentieth day of January, 1891, to be constructed as warranted during the period of the thirty years delegation.

Construction of Single Tracks.—That in case where a single track shall be first laid such track shall be laid on the crown of the roadway on the following portions, as follows:—

- 1st. Victoria-street from a point one and a half chains east of East-street, thence to the terminus.
- 2nd. Main-street from the intersection with Victoria or Bridge-streets, thence to the intersection with Barkly-street.
- 3rd. Barkly-street from the intersection with the Main street, thence to the terminus.

AREAS OF LANDS INCREASED AND DIMINISHED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1901 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1901, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 7) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said Land Act as lands which may be sold by auction (class 7 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in Division 6 of Part I. of the Land Act 1901 aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said Act as land which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 7, 8, 9, and 10 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1901 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

The price must include delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for the sum of £5 per horse per station, based on the estimated quarterly consumption of 8 centals of oats, 1 of bran, 12 of hay, and 3 of straw per horse, or thereabouts, within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts where the sum stated in the bond is £50 and upwards, and one surety where the sum stated is under £50.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

- The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality. As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.
- The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required at any station, the contractor will be required to supply the extra forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station.
- Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depot for police purposes, at the same rates.
- Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.
- In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.
- If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.
- When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.
- A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.
- Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.
- Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.
- The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

TOWN OF CAULFIELD.

By-Law No. 23.

A By-law of the Town of Caulfield, made under Section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and with the approval of the Governor in Council, under Section 48 of the *Local Government Act 1891*, and numbered 23, for carrying out certain of the purposes provided for in Part V. of the Thirteenth Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1890*, and for regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings and erections, and for requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings and erections, erected or constructed contrary to this By-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by or under this By-law, and for selling the materials and applying the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings and erections, and any fees and penalties due by the owner thereof, and appointing fees to be charged and received by the Council of the Town of Caulfield for any Act done or to be done by any of its officers under this By-law, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council, and for other purposes in connexion with the foregoing purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Caulfield order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall apply to and have force and effect throughout the said Town of Caulfield.
2. The following buildings and works shall be exempt from the operation of this By-law:—

All party fences and greenhouses, so far as the necessary woodwork of the sashes, doors, and frames, and all fern-houses, so far as the necessary framing and lattice-work.

All buildings on land the property of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Caulfield.

All temporary offices and sheds used by builders during the erection of any building at or about the site of such building, for a period not exceeding 12 months.

All buildings the property of the Government of the State of Victoria, or of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia.

Wooden, &c., Buildings.

3. Subject to Clause 4 hereof, and subject to the limitations and conditions hereinafter contained, buildings may be newly erected, or constructed of wood, or if already built, may be added to in wood, on land abutting on any street of the Town, provided that—

- (i.) In the case of the erection of a new building, the external walls shall be distant from the boundaries of the land on which the same stand, and land not in the same possession or occupation, at least 5 feet.
- (ii.) In the case of buildings already erected, additions may be made up to or on the same alignment, if such alignment be less than the 5 feet referred to in Sub-Clause No. 1, but otherwise such Sub-Clause No. 1 shall apply to such additions as if they were new buildings.
- (iii.) Stables or sheds, the external walls and roofs of which are covered with iron, may be built flush with the boundaries of the land on which they stand, if more than 10 feet distant from any building, and more than 50 feet distant from the street.
- (iv.) Two or more dwelling houses may be erected in one block, on land belonging to the same owner, and shall then be separated from each other by a wall of brick or stone at least 8½ inches in thickness, and carried up at least 1 foot above the roof covering or gutter adjoining the same, and projecting at least 1 inch beyond the face of the woodwork or spouting.
- (v.) The external walls of such wooden buildings shall be covered with sound weatherboards, or galvanized corrugated iron, or other approved material.

4. Notwithstanding anything in this By-law, or in Regulation No. 3 (except Clause 2) contained, no building or erection the external walls of which are of other materials than stone or brick shall be erected or constructed within 40 feet of the building lines of any of the street or streets specified in the Schedule hereto, and such other order of the Council, be added to such list, provided that where there is a wooden dwelling-house in existence at the time of the coming into force of this By-law, such dwelling-house may be added to from time to time in wood, provided, however, that such addition shall not extend the frontage of such dwelling-house by a greater length than half the then existing frontage of such dwelling-house; and provided, further, that such extension does not encroach within 5 feet of any boundary of the land or premises occupied by or used in connexion with such dwelling-house. Provided that this Clause shall not apply to any street which may be deleted from such schedule by special order of the Council.

5. No building shall be erected in the Town unless such building be of sound material and approved of in writing by the surveyor.

6. For the purpose of this By-law, the re-erecting of any building pulled down to or below the ground floor, or of any frame building, of which only the framework is left, down to the ground floor, or the conversion into a dwelling-house of any building not originally constructed for human habitation, or the conversion into more than one dwelling-house of a building originally constructed as one dwelling-house only, shall be considered the erection of a new building.

7. With regard to dwelling-houses, which shall be insulated, if any such building be hereafter divided into two or more distinct buildings, then such several parts must be separated from each other by such party walls as are prescribed in the said Regulation.

8. In all dwelling-houses the surface of the earth, or any paving on the outside (except the pavement of any public way) must not at any time be raised to within 6 inches of the surface of the lowest or first floor of such building. And every brick wall and every hearth shall have a damp-proof course of slate and cement, or of asphalt, not less than half-an-inch thick, or of rubberoid through the whole thickness of the wall at the level of the ground floor plates.

Division of Building.

9. And if any building already built, or which shall be hereafter built, be converted, used, or occupied as two or more separate buildings, each having a separate entrance or staircase, such conversion, use, or occupation not having been made or not having taken place prior to this By-law coming into operation, then every such building shall be deemed to be two or more separate houses; and such separate houses must be divided from each other by a party wall, or party arch, or arches built in the manner and of the materials required for party walls or for party arches by the said Regulation No. 3, for the class and rate to which the largest of the buildings so divided shall belong.

External Projections.

Projections from the Face Wall, &c.

10. And with regard to buildings hereafter to be built or rebuilt in reference to projections therefrom as to the copings, parapets, cornices to overhanging roofs, blocking courses, piers, columns, pilasters, entablatures, facias, door and window dressings, or other architectural decorations forming part of an external wall—All such must be built of the same materials as are by the said Regulation No. 3 directed to be used for building external walls to which such projections belong, or of such other proper and sufficient materials as the surveyor may approve or permit; and as to all verandahs, porches, porticoes, shop fronts, open enclosures of open areas, and steps, and water pipes, and to all other projections from external walls, not forming part thereof, every such projection must be built of brick, tile, stone, artificial stone, slate, cement, metal, or other fireproof material; and such projections must be so built as not to overhang the ground belonging to any other owner, nor to obstruct the light or air, or to be otherwise injurious to the owner or occupier of the buildings adjoining thereto on any side thereof; nor shall any projections extend beyond the building line at any height less than 10 feet from the level of the public footway, nor encroach upon the building line of any public footway, except that the base or plinth thereof may project beyond the building line to an extent not exceeding 2 inches.

And no projections, including steps, cellar doors, and area inclosures, are to encroach upon the building line of any public footway; and no verandah, except that built upon the public pathway, shall approach nearer to the boundary of the land, on which the same stands, than 3 feet, unless separated from any adjoining verandah or premises by a brick wall, at least 8½ inches in thickness, and projecting 3 inches at least beyond the face of the woodwork and spouting. And with regard to the projecting eaves of any building, on either side thereof such eaves may project beyond the face of the external wall, provided such eaves be at least 3 feet from the ground not in the same possession. And no cornice must project a greater distance, measured from the finished face of the wall to the extreme projection of such cornice, than 4 inches more than the thickness of the wall, of the story surmounted by the same, and every such cornice must have one course of stone flagging, tailed through to the inside face of the said wall, unless the method of construction of such cornice shall have previously been submitted to the surveyor, and shall have been by him approved.

Projected Buildings beyond the General Line of Buildings, and other External Walls.

11. And with regard to buildings already built or hereafter to be built, as to bow windows or other projections of any kind—Such projections must neither be built with nor added to any buildings, on any face of an external wall thereof, so as to extend beyond the general line of buildings in any street (which

general line shall be determined by the surveyor) except so far as hereinbefore provided, with regard to projections from face of wall and shop fronts, nor so as to overhang the ground belonging to any other owner, nor so as to obstruct the light and air, or be otherwise injurious to the owners or occupiers of the buildings adjoining thereto, on any side thereof.

Wooden Shop Fronts, Shutters, Sign and Show Boards.

12. And with regard to shop-fronts and their entablatures, their shutters, and pilasters, and stall boards, made of wood—No part of such shop front, except the cornice, must project from the face of the wall, whether there be an area or not, further than the base line, nor must the cornice project therefrom more than 12 inches; and the wood-work of any shop front must not be fixed nearer than 4½ inches to the face of an external, or to the centre line of a party wall.

13. And with regard to such woodwork if it be put up at such a distance of 4½ inches, then a pier or corbel built of stone, or of brick, or incombustible material, to commence at the level of the underside of the plinth, at bottom of the wood pilasters, and to be of the width of 8½ inches at the least, must be fixed in line of the party wall, so as to be as high as such woodwork, and so as to project 1 inch at the least in front of the face thereof; and no showboard or signboard shall be affixed to the front of any building, so as to extend over any public footway, except by leave of the Council.

Slabs and Hearths.

14. And a slab or slabs of brick, tile, stone, slate, marble, cement, or other proper and sufficient substance, at the least 9 inches longer than the opening of every chimney when finished, and at the least 18 inches in front of the arch over the same, must be laid before the opening of every chimney, and in every floor except the lowest floor, such slab or slabs must be laid upon stone, iron, or wooden bearers, or upon brick trimmers; but where they are laid other than on brick trimmers the slab must rest at least 2 inches on the chimney breast, and be well bedded upon a proper boxing, provided always that in the case of a chimney being built upon corbels, the use of the brick trimmer or stone corbels to support the inner half shall be imperative; but in the lowest floor they may be laid upon a brick fender, or bedded on the solid ground. And the inner half of every chimney must be laid and bedded wholly on brick or stone, or other incombustible substance, which must be solid for a thickness of 9 inches at the least, beneath the surface of any such hearth.

Close Fires.

15. And as to every, oven, furnace, cokel, or close fire, used for the purpose of trade or manufacture—It must be 6 inches at least distant from any party wall, and must not be upon or within a distance of 18 inches of any timber or woodwork, and the floor on or above, which such oven, furnace, cokel, or close fire shall be built or fixed, must be formed and paved under, and for a distance of 2 feet all round the same, with stone, brick, tile, or slate, at the least 2 inches thick, or other proper incombustible and non-conducting materials.

Steam Boilers.

16. And as to any boiler or engine used for the purpose of generating steam—It must not be set or fixed inside any house of the first or dwelling-house class, nor within a distance of 2½ feet of the external wall of any dwelling-house, nor within 5 feet of any land not in the same occupation, the said 2½ feet being in every case measured from the external face of the setting of the said steam boiler.

Rain-water Pipes and Eaves Gutters.

17. And with regard to the roof, flat, and gutter of any building, and of any projection therefrom, and also balconies, verandahs, and shop fronts—They must be so arranged and constructed, and so supplied with gutters and pipes, as to prevent the water therefrom dropping on to or running over any public way, and all such rain-water pipes and eaves gutters are to be made of metal.

Rules concerning Drains to Buildings.

18. With regard to the drains of buildings of any class, and of every addition thereto—Before the several walls of any such buildings are built to the height of 10 feet from their foundations, the drains thereof must have been properly built and made good, that is to say, to the best outlet that can be obtained, so as to render all such drains available for the drainage of the lowest floor of such building or addition thereto, and also of its areas; and the drains under and from every building for drainage purposes must be constructed with glazed earthenware pottery-pipes jointed with good cement, and having in transverse section a circular area of not less than 4 inches diameter. And every such drain must be laid to a sufficient fall, so that the whole of every such drain within the walls of such building shall be wholly covered over under the lowest floor independently thereof; and every such drain within the walls of such building must be built so as to render the drain air-tight, and shall be properly trapped and ventilated. And in no case shall the soil below the floor of any building be left undrained, or so that the water may remain stagnant on any portion thereof.

Rules concerning Privies.

19. And every privy, whether already built or hereafter to be built, must have a door, and be properly enclosed, screened, and fenced from public view. No privy, earth-closet, or urinal shall be erected or remain in front of any dwelling, or at a less distance than 10 feet from any street, or from the door or window of any dwelling, or from any street of a width of 33 feet or upwards, or at a less distance than 2 feet from any partition fence, unless divided by an 8½-inch brick wall.

Rules concerning Ventilation beneath the Floors of Buildings.

20. With regard to the ventilation of the space beneath buildings, of whatever class, and every addition thereto—The space

between the lowermost floor and the ground beneath each room shall be provided with openings on every side, arranged to allow of the free passage of air in any direction, the openings on any side to have an area free from grating bars or other obstruction at the rate of at least 30 square inches to every square in the area of the room. No ventilators to be less than 9 inches by 6 inches.

Rules concerning Dwelling-houses hereafter built or rebuilt, with regard to back yards and areas, and rooms under-ground and in the roof.

Back Yards.

21. With regard to back yards or open spaces attached to dwelling-houses—Every house hereafter built or rebuilt must have an enclosed back yard or open space of at least four squares, exclusive of any building thereon, unless all the rooms of such house can be lighted and ventilated from the street or way.

Lowermost Rooms.

22. And with regard to the lowermost rooms of houses, being rooms of which the surface of the floor is more than 3 feet below the surface or footway of the nearest street or right-of-way, and to cellars or buildings hereafter to be built or rebuilt. If any such room or cellar cannot be otherwise lighted, the same may be lighted by means of apertures or areas extending under the footway, provided such apertures or areas be enclosed by solid masonry or brickwork surmounted by a proper stone kerb, and such apertures or areas to be covered with an approved and immovable horizontal iron grating, with bars fitted at an angle of 90 degrees level with the surface of such footway, and secured to the kerbing by being run thereto with lead or zinc to the satisfaction of the surveyor; provided that no such aperture, area, or grating do extend from the line of building under the footway more than 2 feet, nor be more than 4 feet in length, except with the written permission of the Council.

Attic Rooms.

23. And with regard to rooms in the roof of any building hereafter built or rebuilt, in reference to the number of floors or rooms in the roof and to the height of such rooms—There must not be more than one floor of such rooms, and such rooms must not be of a less height than 7ft. 6in. except the sloping part (if any) of such roof, which sloping part must not begin at less than 3ft. 6in. above the floor, nor extend more than 3ft. 6in. on the ceiling of such room.

Rooms in other Parts.

24. And with regard to rooms in other parts of the building in reference to the height thereof, every room of the main building used or intended to be used as a dwelling must be at least of the height of 10 feet from the floor to the ceiling, and contain not less than 700 cubic feet of space, but skillion roofs may have a height of not less than 8 feet from the floor to lowest part of roof.

Rule concerning every Building hereafter to be built, so far as relates to the raising thereof, and concerning existing Buildings to be rebuilt.

25. Any building may be raised so that, nevertheless, the party and external walls and chimneys thereof, when so raised, be of materials and of the several heights and thicknesses described in the said Regulation No. 3 for party and external walls and chimneys of the rate which such buildings shall be of when so raised; and with regard to buildings already built, so far as relates to the raising thereof, although the walls of such building be not of the thickness prescribed by the said Regulation No. 3, if, in the opinion of the surveyor, such walls be sufficiently secure to allow of the raising thereof, then any such building already built may be raised to an additional height not exceeding 10 feet; and with regard to any building adjoining one which shall be raised, so far as relates to the raising of the chimneys thereof, then, if any buildings be raised, it shall be the duty of the owner of such building, and he is hereby required to build up, at his own expense, the party wall between his own and any adjoining building and all flues and chimney stacks belonging thereto respectively.

26. With regard to buildings already built, so far as relates to the rebuilding thereof, in conformity with the said Regulation No. 3, in respect to the required area, or in any other respect than the required height and thickness of walls—If a full compliance with the provisions of the said Regulation No. 3 would be attended by great loss and inconvenience, then, subject to the consent of the surveyor, and to such terms as he may impose, it shall be lawful for the parties concerned to rebuild such buildings on the site of the old buildings, as nearly as may be practicable, but so that, nevertheless, both the party walls and the external walls be of the required height and thickness.

27. If any building or erection shall be erected or constructed contrary to the provisions or requirements of any clause in this By-law the owner thereof shall, within 14 days of the receipt of a notice in writing from the surveyor to pull down or remove the same, pull down or remove or cause to be pulled down or removed the said building or erection; and if the same be not pulled down or removed to the satisfaction of the surveyor within the said period of 14 days, then the surveyor may cause the same to be pulled down and removed, and may cause the material thereof to be sold, and the proceeds shall be applied in reimbursing the Council the expenses of such pulling down and removal, and the surplus (if any) shall be handed over to the said owner.

28. The surveyor or building surveyor referred to in this By-law shall be the surveyor to the Town Council for the time being.

29. It shall be the duty of the surveyor, and he is hereby authorized and required to see that all the rules and directions of this By-law, and of the said Regulation No. 3, are well and truly observed and carried out in and throughout the Town of

Caulfield, or such portion or portions of the said town as this By-law or the said Regulation No. 3 or any clause thereof applies, and for that purpose to proceed from time to time in due course upon the receipt of any notice; or if, from ignorance or neglect, or from any other circumstance, notice of any work intended to be done has not been given, then upon such work being observed by, or being made known to him, to inspect the works intended to be done, or which shall have been commenced or executed; and to cause all the rules and directions of this By-law and of the said Regulation No. 3 in respect thereof to be strictly observed and also to attend and perform everything required of him by this By-law and the said Regulation No. 3, whether with or without notice, and also to inspect ruinous buildings and projections, and to take all necessary measures thereupon.

Powers of entry by Surveyor or other authorized person.

30. With regard to buildings and works so far as relates to the entry thereon for the supervision thereof, at all times during the progress thereof, within the meaning of this By-law and the said Regulation No. 3—It shall be lawful for the surveyor, or any other person or persons duly authorized by him in that behalf, and they are hereby respectively authorized to enter upon the premises upon which such operations have been commenced or are in progress.

31. Within four days before the following acts or events, that is to say, before any building shall be begun to be built, and also before any addition or alteration, which by this By-law or the said Regulation No. 3 is placed under the supervision of the surveyor, shall be made to any building, and also before any party wall, external wall, chimney stack or flues shall be begun to be built, pulled down, rebuilt, cut into or altered, and also before any opening shall be made in any party or external wall, and also before any other matter or thing shall be done which by this By-law or the said Regulation No. 3 is placed under the supervision of the surveyor, it shall be the duty of the builder (by which term is to be understood, both in this provision and elsewhere throughout this By-law and the said Regulation No. 3, the master builder or other person employed to execute any work, or if there be no master builder or other person so employed, then the owner of the building or other person for whom or by whose orders such work is to be done) and he is hereby required to give to the surveyor at his office notice in writing in the Form (No. 1) contained in the Third Schedule to the said Regulation No. 3, which said schedule is hereby adopted, or to the like effect, and at the time of giving any such notice as aforesaid, to produce to the surveyor plans and specifications of the proposed works, and pay to the treasurer of the town such fees as are provided for by this By-law, and if for any period exceeding three months any builder having duly begun any building requiring compliance with the provisions of this By-law or the said Regulation No. 3, suspend the progress of such building and again go on with the same, or if during the progress thereof the builder be changed, then two days before such builder shall enter or re-enter upon the performance of the work, it shall be the duty of such builder to give notice in writing to the surveyor, and such notices must be in the Forms (Nos. 2 and 3) contained in the Third Schedule annexed to the said Regulation No. 3, which said schedule is hereby adopted, or to the like effect. Provided always that if by reason of any emergency, any act, matter, or thing placed under the supervision of the surveyor be required to be done immediately, or before notice can be given to the surveyor, then it shall be lawful for the builder or any person to do such act, matter, or thing so requisite, but upon this condition, that within 48 hours after beginning to execute such work such builder or person shall give notice thereof in writing to the surveyor.

32. The following words and expressions wherever used in this By-law are intended to have the same meanings as are respectively assigned to them or as they bear in the said Regulation No. 3, that is to say:—The words "square," "floor," "storey," "external wall," "party wall," "alteration," "addition," "building," "already built," and "hereafter to be built."

33. The fees payable under this By-law are the same as those set out in the Second Schedule to the said Regulation No. 3, which said schedule is hereby adopted. Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing By-law shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, nor less than Ten shillings. This By-law shall come into operation and commence to have effect immediately upon its publication, as provided for by the *Local Government Act 1890*, in the *Government Gazette*.

For prohibiting or restraining the use of combustible materials in the construction, alteration, repair, or renewal of buildings, roofs, or chimneys, flues, smoke vents or stove pipes, (hereinafter in this regulation called in common, chimneys), or of parts thereof respectively, as specified in this regulation.

For regulating the distance from any other building at which it shall be lawful to construct any building.

For regulating the height, thickness, construction or materials of the party walls of buildings adjoining each other, and of the external walls of buildings and of chimneys, and the materials for and mode of enclosing the same.

For regulating the construction, materials, and enclosing by building or otherwise of fireplaces or furnaces to be used in the working of engines by steam, or in any mill, brewery, bakehouse or gas work, or in any manufactory whatsoever, although a steam engine be not used therein respectively.

For appointing fees, not in any case exceeding the sum of Two pounds sterling, which may be charged and received on account of the municipal fund by the proper officer of the Council for any inspection, superintendence, or other service made or performed by him under this regulation.

A copy of the said regulation is open for inspection at the office of the Council, at the Town Hall, Caulfield, during office hours thereof.
