A PROCLAMATION.

EDWARD R. I.

WHEREAS under section 11 of the *Coinage Act 1870*, We have power, with the advice of Our Privy Council, from time to time by Proclamation to determine the design for any coin:

And whereas it appears to Us desirable to determine new designs for the gold and bronze coins mentioned in the First Schedule to the *Coinage Act 1870*:

We, therefore, in pursuance of the said enactment and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct, and ordain as follows:

1. The designs for the said gold and bronze coins shall be as follows:—

#### GOLD COINS.

- (1) *Five-pound Piece*.—Every five-pound piece shall have for the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription, "EDWARDUS VII DEI GRA: BRIT: OMN: REX FID: DEF: IND: IMP:" and for the reverse the image of Saint George armed, sitting on horseback, attacking the dragon with a sword and a broken spear upon the ground, and the date of the year, with a graining upon the edge.
- (2) *Two-pound Piece*.—Every two-pound piece shall have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the five-pound piece, with a graining upon the edge.
- (3) *Sovereign*.—Every sovereign shall have for the obverse impression the aforesaid effigy with the inscription "EDWARDUS VII D. G. BRIT: OMN: REX. F. D. IND: IMP:" and for the reverse the same impression in all respects as the five-pound piece, with a graining upon the edge.
- (4) *Half-Sovereign*.—Every half-sovereign shall have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the sovereign, with a graining upon the edge.

#### BRONZE COINS.

- (1) *Penny*.—Every penny shall have for the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription, "EDWARDUS VII DEI GRA: BRIT: OMN: REX FID: DEF: IND: IMP:" and for the reverse impression the figure of Britannia seated on a rock surrounded by the sea, her right hand holding a shield which rests against the rock, while in her left hand she grasps a trident, and the inscription "ONE PENNY," with the date of the year and a plain edge.
  - (2) *Half-Penny*.—Every half-penny shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the penny, and for the reverse the figure of Britannia seated as described for the penny, and the inscription "HALF-PENNY," with the date of the year and a plain edge.
  - (3) *Farthing*.—Every farthing shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the penny, and for the reverse the figure of Britannia seated as described for the penny, and the inscription "FARTHING," with the date of the year and a plain edge.
2. This Proclamation shall come into force on the first day of January, Nineteen hundred and two.

WEDNESDAY, THE 12TH DAY OF MARCH, 1902, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Kerang;

MONDAY, THE 17TH DAY OF MARCH, 1902, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Yarram Yarram;

THURSDAY, THE 20TH DAY OF MARCH, 1902, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Sale;

WEDNESDAY, THE 26TH DAY OF MARCH, 1902, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Yarram Yarram.

REGULATIONS HAVING REFERENCE TO THE DISTRIBUTION OF SUMS OF MONEY FROM THE VOTE OF SIX THOUSAND POUNDS GRANTED BY PARLIAMENT IN AID OF AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

REGULATIONS.

A SUM of Sixty pounds (£60) may be paid from the Vote of £6,000 granted by Parliament in Aid of Agricultural Societies for the year 1901, to the Baringhup and Maldon Agricultural Society as subsidy on expenditure incurred by that society during the year 1900.

2. A sum not exceeding Forty pounds (£40) may be paid out of the sum of £6,000 granted by Parliament to Agricultural Societies for the year 1901-2, for medals awarded as special prizes at the Grand National Show held under the auspices of the Bendigo Agricultural Society on the 8th, 9th, and 10th days of October, 1901.

AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

REGULATIONS for the distribution of the sum of Six thousand pounds (£6,000) granted by Parliament to Agricultural Societies, 1901-1901-2.

1. Each society shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 1st March, 1902, a statement in the form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the form marked E.

2. On receipt of the above-mentioned statement, so verified, the Minister of Agriculture may cause to be paid to the treasurer of each society a sum equal to one-half of the amount shown to have been awarded and paid away in prizes not exceeding £25 each (except for the exhibits mentioned in the statement above referred to, and such other exhibits the Minister may consider unsuitable), on condition that this sum does not exceed the amount raised by members' subscriptions and private donations; and, if it do exceed the same, that it be in that case reduced to a sum equal to the amount so raised.

3. If the sums claimable be in excess of the sum of Five thousand seven hundred and fifty pounds (£5,750) they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. No society located within 20 miles of any other society shall be entitled to participate in the vote unless the sum awarded and paid away in prizes by such society as hereinbefore specified amounts in the total to One hundred pounds at least. The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria shall participate in the said vote to the extent of an amount not exceeding Two hundred and ten pounds (£210) for special prizes awarded at the first Commonwealth Show.

INSTRUCTIONS.

1. The blank spaces in the declaration, form E, for the sums awarded and paid in prizes and raised by members' subscriptions and private donations between the 1st January, 1901, and the 31st December, 1901, must be filled up in words as well as in figures; and the declaration must be made before a justice of the peace by the treasurer of the society.

2. The account, when received, must be signed by the treasurer and be countersigned by the president or the vice-president, or by two members of the committee of management; it should then be returned to the Secretary for Agriculture, Melbourne.

3. Challenge cups must not be included in the return of prize moneys paid, unless such cups have been finally awarded.

4. It must be understood that any society which fails to forward the statement asked for to the Secretary for Agriculture by the 1st March, 1902, is liable to have its claim disallowed.

5. Any society not having a claim on the vote is requested to furnish a—nil—return by 1st March, 1902.

NOTE.—The forms B, C, and D are forwarded herewith by way of guidance, but can be made use of at the option of the society. If, however, extra forms be required, the same must be furnished by the applicant, and be of uniform size and pattern.

## NOTES TO THE ABOVE STATEMENT.

*Development of Mine or Mine Expenditure.*

This item, appearing in balance-sheet under Mine Account, represents the amount expended in managing and in developing connected with earning revenue and is added to the mine, being charged against profits. In a progressive mine which has not reached the self-supporting or revenue-earning stage, a Working Account should be produced in lieu of a Profit and Loss Account, and the balance of the former added to the amount appearing against Development of Mine or Mine Expenditure at the end of each half-year, and this account will then show the total sums expended in this direction at the date of the publication of the Half-yearly Statements.

*Capital Lost on Forfeited Shares.*

It may happen that shares which become forfeited in consequence of non-payment of calls are sold for less than the amount of calls due upon them, and the loss thus caused is a loss of capital. It is proposed to show this item separately, though it is not a realisable asset; it should not be written off to Mine Account.

*Forfeited Shares.*

When forfeited shares are bought in by a company a separate account should be opened, debiting the amount paid at sale for the shares and subsequent calls thereon.

*Bank Balance.*

For the purpose of clearness it is better to show "Balance in Bank" or "Balance due to Bank" as the case might be.

*Capital written up on Shares at Registration.*

The practice with a number of companies is to issue shares with a face value in excess of the actual cash paid for them, and the only way to treat the amount not received is to show it as an asset as part of the cost of the mine. It is debatable whether such course is strictly legal; but in the absence of any decision on the point, and having regard to custom, it is thought desirable to prescribe a method of showing it distinctly in the balance-sheet instead of including it under Mine Account.

*General.*

Any legal manager may produce any additional or supplementary statements he may desire, but it is considered that at the least the particulars in the above statement are absolutely necessary for the information of shareholders.

The statement is compiled as for a quartz gold mining company, such mines being in a majority in this State, but, with slight variations, may be made applicable to alluvial gold, or companies formed for the purpose of any kind of mining under Part II. of the Companies Act 1890.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS,  
VICTORIA.

1. (a) Regular examinations will be held in Melbourne in March and September of every year, of which not less than four weeks' notice will be given.

(b) *Viva voce* and practical examinations will be held at any time that may be considered desirable.

2. Every intending candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for examination.

(b) A fee of £2 2s., which must be paid to the Secretary on or before the date of examination.

3. Every candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, a 40 - 20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan drawing, except paper.

## PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

4. Every candidate shall satisfy the Board that he is of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination; but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have reached his majority.

5. Every candidate shall present satisfactory evidence as to character.

6. (1) Every candidate shall have passed, at an Australasian University, the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(2) Or he shall have served under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field, and he shall further produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(3) Or he shall have completed a course of the Degree of Bachelor in Engineering at an Australasian University, or at any University recognised by the Australasian Universities, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

Documentary evidence will be necessary in support of these conditions.

7. Every candidate shall produce, in the form hereafter, or in a like form, a certificate from a qualified surveyor with whom he has served that he is competent to undertake surveys.

8. Every candidate shall produce, before examination, his original field notes, and plan plotted by him therefrom, of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature, or an irregular road. Steel band, plane table, compass, sextant, level, clinometer, telemeter, theodolite, barometer, thermometer.

#### Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places, elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians, declination of the magnetic needle.

#### Physics (Matriculation standard)—Elementary Stratigraphical Geology—Description Writing:

(d) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

4. The Board of Examiners will accept the degree of Master of Civil Engineering of the University of Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of six months' practical experience under some competent mining engineer, mining surveyor, or mining manager in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations, reserving the right of *visu voce* or other examination in these subjects and also in geology as applied to mining, if deemed necessary.

5.
