NATIVE LABOUR.

THE following Letter, with its enclosure, received from the Honorable the Premier of Queensland, is published for general information.

Sir,

I have the honour to forward herewith, for the information of your Government, a copy of a Proclamation issued by the Deputy Administrator of British New Guinea under section 19 of the "Native Labour Ordinance of 1900," with reference to the recruiting of natives in the North-Eastern Division. His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the Possession, in transmitting the Proclamation, states that he has decided in the Executive Council to issue a Proclamation forbidding natives to be removed from their own division, which will be the Magisterial Divisions of the Possession, after 1st July next, except by Licensed Recruiters.

BRITISH NEW GUINEA.

PROCLAMATION

By Sir Francis Pratt Winter, Knight Bachelor, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Chief Judicial Officer and Deputy Administrator of British New Guinea.

FRANCIS P. WINTER.

I, Francis Pratt Winter, the Deputy Administrator aforesaid, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare, under section XIX of "The Native Labour Ordinance of 1900," that no native whose residence is in the North-Eastern District, except as is hereunder otherwise provided, shall, on and after the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and two, be removed from his residence, home, or abode in such district for the purpose of engaging him as a labourer by any person except a Licensed Recruiter duly licensed under the aforesaid Ordinance.

Exceptions.

1. Natives engaged before the Resident Magistrate of the North-Eastern District.
2. Natives engaged to or for any Mission.
3. Natives engaged to serve on vessels or boats.
4. Natives engaged to serve within the North-Eastern District.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Possession this twentieth day of August, One thousand nine hundred and one, and in the first year of His Majesty's Reign.

Melbourne, 1st February, 1902.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

1. (a) Regular examinations will be held in Melbourne in March and September of every year, of which not less than four weeks' notice will be given.

(b) *Visd voce* and practical examinations will be held at any time that may be considered desirable.

2. Every intending candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for examination.

(b) A fee of £2 2s., which must be paid to the Secretary on or before the date of examination.

3. Every candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, a 40 - 20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan drawing, except paper.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

4. Every candidate shall satisfy the Board that he is of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination; but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have reached his majority.

5. Every candidate shall present satisfactory evidence as to character.

6. (1) Every candidate shall have passed, at an Australasian University, the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(2) Or he shall have served under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field, and he shall further produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(3) Or he shall have completed a course of the Degree of Bachelor in Engineering at an Australasian University, or at any University recognised by the Australasian Universities, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

Documentary evidence will be necessary in support of these conditions.

7. Every candidate shall produce, in the form hereafter, or in a like form, a certificate from a qualified surveyor with whom he has served that he is competent to undertake surveys.

Certificate of field service and competency for presentation to the Board of Examiners—

I, A.B., a registered land surveyor of the colony of Victoria, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously

employed with me as _____ in the practice of land surveying for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____, and that he is fully competent to conduct surveys.

8. Every candidate shall produce, before examination, his original field notes, and plan plotted by him therefrom, of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature, or an irregular road. The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the applicant to be entirely his own work.

9. SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

Mathematics.

Trigonometry plane and spherical, geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation:

Reduction of traverses, computation connected with the setting out of roads and curves, adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurements of heights, surveying under the Real Property and Land Transfer Acts.

Levelling, &c.

Levelling, measurement of earthwork.

Principles of Construction, Adjustment and Use of the following Instruments, viz.:—

Steel band, plane table, compass, sextant, level, clinometer, telemeter, theodolite, barometer, thermometer.

Field Astronomy, Godesy, &c.

Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places, elementary godesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians, declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

Plan drawing, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

MISCELLANEOUS.

Physics (Matriculation standard)—Elementary Stratigraphical Geology—Description Writing.

Candidates who cannot comply with the first part of clause 6 (preliminary conditions), will be examined in elementary mathematics.

CERTIFICATE WITH REMISSION OF PART OF OR WITHOUT AN EXAMINATION.

10. A certificate may be granted by the Board to an applicant who has paid the prescribed fee, and who produces satisfactory evidence as to character, and that he has complied with the condition set forth, as follows:—

Having passed an examination equivalent, in the opinion of the Board, to that prescribed in the Australasian Colonies, and producing satisfactory evidence of not less than twelve months' field experience in practical land surveying similar to that required of candidates for examination by the Board.

11. Subject to the payment of the fee prescribed, the Board may, at its discretion, issue a certificate of competency, under the Regulations adopted by the Australasian Boards, to any applicant holding a certificate as a qualified surveyor conferred prior to the adoption of such Regulations, either without examination, or upon passing such part of the examination therein prescribed as the Board may require.

Provided that the Board may confer the certificate without examination only when there is no reason to doubt that the qualifications required by the Board are possessed by the applicant.

Factories and Sheds Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Sheds Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Sheds Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Sheds Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Sheds Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MESSRS. A. BOWLEY AND CO., CLOTHING MANUFACTURERS, 588 COLLINS-STREET, MELBOURNE,

for a period of one week from the 19th February, 1902, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than twenty-five females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said twenty-five females shall not be employed for more than sixty-three hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Three-pence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

Health Act 1890.

SHIRE OF RIPON.

BY-LAW NO. 8 UNDER THE HEALTH ACT 1890.

A By-law of the Shire of Ripon under the provisions of sections 31, 32, 35, and 273 of the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 8, for amending and repealing certain provisions of By-law No. 7, for regulating the removal and disposal of night-soil, closets, pans, house and yard refuse, and other matters named therein, within the limits of the township of Beaufort, as such boundaries are defined therein.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ripon do make the following By-law, numbered 8:—

1. Clause 10 of By-law No. 7 shall be and is hereby repealed, and the following words enacted:—"Instead thereof every closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service."
2. The words "the said" in clause 11 of By-law No. 7 shall be and are hereby repealed.
3. Clause 18 of By-law No. 7 shall be and is hereby repealed.

4. No occupier or person shall remove, cause to be removed, or contract for the removal of, nor deposit, nor cause to be deposited, nor contract for the depositing of any night-soil, except in accordance with the by-laws and regulations of the Shire of Ripon now or which may hereafter be in force.

5. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds, and a sum not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach be committed or continued.

The minimum penalty shall be Five (5) shillings.

SHIRE OF YACKANDANDAH.

BY-LAW NO. 5.

As to Dairies, Dairy Cattle, and Milk.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Yackandandah, by virtue of the provisions of the *Health Act 1890* and the *Health Act 1900*, and every other power enabling them in this behalf, hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 5 of the Council of the said Shire, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Yackandandah.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the thirtieth day of March, 1902, and on or before the thirtieth day of January in subsequent years, register himself with the council in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the shire an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of the following amounts, namely, if the person to be registered keeps cows, and the number of such cows is—

1. Not more than ten, a fee of Five shillings.
 2. More than ten, but not more than twenty, a fee of Ten shillings.
 3. More than twenty, but not more than thirty, a fee of Fifteen shillings.
 4. More than thirty, but not more than forty, a fee of Twenty shillings.
 5. More than forty, but not more than fifty, a fee of Twenty five shillings.
 6. Over fifty, a fee of Thirty shillings.
- If the person to be registered does not keep cows, a fee of Five shillings.

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the secretary of the shire shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All houses, dairies, cow-sheds, milk-stores, milk-shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cow-keeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cow-keeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

7. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisance, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

8. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

9. If any person or any member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family, or any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever, or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or if the person attacked, his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or officer of health, or the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the council, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said council or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such council or officer of health, no longer exist. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

10. If at any time disease exist in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cow-shed or dairy, or in the herd of any cow-keeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the council, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatever.

11. In the interpretation of this by-law words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

12. Every person guilty of any breach of this by-law or of any of its provisions shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

SHIRE OF GLENLYON.

By-Law No. 3.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts, and for the purpose of regulating the registration of cow-keepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk, and for the payment of fees for such registration, and to impose penalties for non-registration, the Council of the Shire of Glenlyon, in the name and on

behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, doth hereby make the following by-law, being By-Law No. 3 of the said Shire, that is to say:—

1. This by-law shall apply to the whole of the Shire of Glenlyon.

2. Every person carrying on within the Shire of Glenlyon the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any one or more of such trades, shall, on or before the first day of March in each year, or within one calendar month of his commencing to carry on any of such trades, cause himself to be registered as such cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, as the case may be.

3. Registration shall consist in delivering to the Municipal Clerk of the Shire of Glenlyon a description of the full names and addresses of the person proposing to be registered, the trade in respect to which he proposes to be registered, the precise locality of the premises in which he carries on such trade, the number of cows kept by him for the purposes of or in such trade, and in paying to such Municipal Clerk the proper fees, according to the next succeeding clause.

4. Each such person as is mentioned in the next preceding clause shall pay annually the following fees, that is to say:—

Where the number of cows kept does not exceed five, the sum of One shilling and sixpence.

Where the number of cows kept does not exceed ten, the sum of Two shillings and sixpence.

Where the number of cows kept does not exceed twenty, the sum of Five shillings.

Where the number of cows kept exceeds twenty, the sum of Seven shillings and sixpence.

Where such person is a purveyor of milk, but keeps no cows, the sum of Ten shillings.

5. If any person commit a breach of this by-law, he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued. Provided that the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid.

The births of 948 children, viz., 492 of boys and 456 of girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of January. The number was, it will be observed, the lowest recorded for the month during the last eleven years, except 1899, and 149 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, or 211 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths recorded in January numbered 661, viz., 353 of males and 308 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 287, or 43 per cent., as against 39 per cent. in January, 1901, and 56 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, 81 less than in January, 1901, and the lowest recorded for the month during the last eleven years, except 1895, 1897, and 1899; it was also 41 below the average of January during the previous ten years, or 80 below it allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 22.58, and of deaths registered to 15.74 per annum, as compared respectively with averages of the same month in 1901 of 25.33 and 18.29, with averages of the month during the last ten years of 27.76 and 17.79, and with averages of the year 1900 of 29.74 and 16.16.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 103.0° on the 31st, and the lowest was 46.2° on the 28th. The mean temperature of the month (66.0°) was one-tenth of a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (45.8°) took place on the 24th, and the least range (3.8°) on the 26th. The mean daily range was 22.3°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.065 inches on the 27th, and the lowest was 29.135 inches on the 21st. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.742 inches) was nearly one-fifteenth of an inch below the average.

Rain fell on nine days, the amount being 1.53 inches, which was lower than in the corresponding month during any of the previous ten years except 1892, 1893, 1894, and 1893.

The mean humidity of the month was .624.

Males contributed 53 per cent. and females 47 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 37 per cent. to that mortality; as against 38 per cent. in 1901; 39 per cent. in January, 1900; 39 per cent. in January, 1899; 39 per cent. in January, 1898; 30 per cent. in January, 1897; 43 per cent. in January, 1896; 43 per cent. in January, 1895; 42 per cent. in January, 1894; 50 per cent. in January, 1893; and 53 per cent. in January, 1892.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 205, as compared with 220 in January, 1901. The rate of infantile mortality was 216 per 1,000 births registered in the month under review, as compared with 214 in January, 1901; 232 in January, 1900; 183 in January, 1899; 248 in January, 1898; 143 in January, 1897; 224 in January, 1896; 178 in January, 1895; 224 in January, 1894; 222 in January, 1893; and 225 in January, 1892.

Sixty-six persons—as against 70 in January, 1901—whose deaths were recorded during the month, had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these, a male of no occupation, aged 75, died of rheumatism; a miner and quarryman, each aged 75, of cancer; a gentleman, aged 75, of cerebral hemorrhage; a female, aged 75, of heart disease; a tailor, aged 75, of Bright's disease; a miner, aged 75, of disease of the prostate; a male of no occupation, aged 76, of diarrhoea; a female, aged 76, of cancer; a photographer, aged 76, of apoplexy; a female, aged 76, of enteritis; a farmer, aged 76, of cystitis; a female, aged 76, of fracture of the femur; a gentleman, aged 77, of cancer; a photographer, aged 77, of hemiplegia; a male of no occupation, aged 77, of valvular disease of the heart; an ironfounder, aged 77, of fatty degeneration of the heart; a watchmaker and a stonemason, each aged 77, of pneumonia; a bricklayer, aged 78, of erysipelas; three females, each aged 78, of apoplexy, hemiplegia, and pericarditis respectively; a gentleman, aged 78, of aneurism; a confectioner, aged 78, of heart disease; a seaman and a female, each aged 78, of bronchitis; a female, aged 78, of dropsy; a clerk, aged 79, of paraplegia; a labourer, aged 79, of pericarditis; two males of no occupation, each aged 79, of Bright's disease; an agent, aged 79, of disease of the prostate; a female, aged 80, of syncope; a male of no occupation, aged 80, of emphysema; a traveller, aged 80, of nephritis; two males of no occupation, each aged 80, of retention of urine and cystitis respectively; a master mariner, aged 82, of enteritis; a tea merchant, aged 82, of strangulation of the bowels; a dealer, aged 83, of hemiplegia; a female, aged 83, of endocarditis; a labourer and a male of no occupation, each aged 84, of diarrhoea; a carpenter and a cheese-maker, each aged 85, of cancer; a female, aged 85, of heart disease; a fisherman, aged 87, of cancer; a female, aged 91, of anaemia; another aged 95, of bronchitis; a labourer, aged 101, of dysentery; a female, aged 73, a station hand, aged 76, a brickmaker, aged 77, a cooper aged 78, a gardener, and a female, each aged 80, and nine females, aged 81, 82, 82, 83, 87, 87, 90, and 91 respectively, of old age.

Thirty-three of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 36 in January, 1901—were from external causes, of which 30 were set down to accident, 2 to homicide, and 1 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A male child, aged 4, died of injury to the head, caused by a fall from a tram; a waitress, aged 21, was killed by falling down a lift shaft; a boy, aged 13, died of injuries to the head, the result of a fall from a swing-boat; a painter, aged 26, of injuries, consequent on a fall from a scaffold; a carpenter, aged 68, of rupture of the kidneys, caused by falling against a counter; a labourer, aged 41, of fracture of the skull, the result of timber falling on him; a blacksmith, aged 39, of fracture of the skull, caused during a fight; a female, aged 76, of fracture of the femur; two females, aged 61 and 62 respectively, of burns; a male child, aged 5 months, of heat apoplexy; a labourer, aged 30, of ptomaine poisoning; three boys, aged 7, 14, and 14 respectively, were drowned whilst bathing in the River Yarra, and a boy, aged 13, whilst bathing in Glen Iris Creek; thirteen persons were found drowned, viz.:—A boats, aged 19, a seaman, aged 21, a station hand, aged 30, a plumber, aged 32, and a female, aged 72, in the River Yarra, a labourer, aged 24, a fireman, aged 37, a carpenter, aged 62, and five females, aged 2, 5, 7, 12, and 31 respectively, in Hobson's Bay; a female infant, aged 10 days, died of umbilical hemorrhage. The homicidal deaths were those of a male child, aged 4, who was suffocated by smoke in a burning room, and a school teacher, who died of blood poisoning following abortion, a verdict of wilful murder being returned in each case. The suicidal death was that of a chemist, who poisoned himself with prussic acid.

One hundred and forty-eight deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—58 in the Melbourne, 16 in the Alfred, 3 in St. Vincent's, 7 in the Women's, 13 in the Children's, 6 in the Homoeopathic, and 7 in the Austin Hospitals; 9 in the Metropolitan, and 3 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 10 in the Immigrants' Home; 11 in the Benevolent Asylums; 1 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor; 3 in the Protestant Refuge, and 1 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 247, of which 125, or 51 per cent., were of males, and 122, or 49 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 205 were under one year of age, 25 were between one and two, 9 were between two and three, 4 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 414. Of these 228, or 55 per cent., were males, and 186, or 45 per cent., were females; 11 were between five and ten, 12 were between ten and fifteen, 11 were between fifteen and twenty, 26 were between twenty and twenty-five, 18 were between twenty-five and thirty, 31 were between thirty and thirty-five, 31 were between thirty-five and forty, 27 were between forty and forty-five, 22 were between forty-five and fifty, 22 were between fifty and fifty-five, 26 were between fifty-five and sixty, 23 were between sixty and sixty-five, 42 were between sixty-five and seventy, 46 were between seventy and seventy-five, 37 were between seventy-five and eighty, 18 were between eighty and eighty-five, 6 were between eighty-five and ninety, 3 were between ninety and ninety-five, 1 at ninety-five, and 1 at one hundred and one.

As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, there was an increase of 23 deaths under zymotic, and 1 under dietic diseases, whilst there was a decrease of 1 under parasitic, 3 under constitutional, 8 under developmental, 76 under local diseases, 3 under the head of violence, and 14 under ill-defined causes. Under the zymotic class, deaths from whooping-cough rose from 4 to 17, those from typhoid fever from 10 to 16, and those from diarrhoeal diseases from 21 to 27. Under the constitutional class, deaths from tubercular meningitis rose from 8 to 16, but those from other forms of tuberculosis, &c., fell from 11 to 8. Under the developmental class, deaths from premature birth fell from 21 to 10. In the local class, deaths from diseases of the nervous and circulatory systems diminished each by 27, those from diseases of the respiratory system by 5, those from diseases of the digestive system by 14, and those from diseases of the urinary system by 4.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1892 to 1901, and the first month of 1902, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality from both causes during the month was below the average.

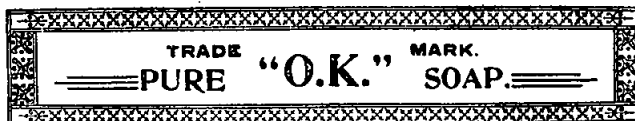

KERANG WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE Commissioners of the Kerang Waterworks Trust, under the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION No. 3.

1. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises to which it is supplied, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or who shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.

2. Every house, tenement, factory, or steam boiler receiving water from the Trust shall have a separate and independent service-pipe connexion with the pipes of the Trust for every such house, tenement, factory, or steam boiler; and not more than one service-pipe shall be connected with any house or tenement unless such house or tenement is rated by the Trust on an annual valuation of Seventy-five pounds or more.

3. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust, appointed for the purpose; and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every breach.

4. The service-pipe for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of the consumers shall in no case, except with the consent of the Trust, exceed the following diameters:—For domestic supply, half-an-inch diameter; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

5. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

6. No person supplied by the Trust with water shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for any such breach.

7. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

8. All water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow.

9. The fire-plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use, of them is allowed, in writing, by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of the officers of the Trust.

10. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

11. *Meters, how placed.*—Every meter shall be placed according to the direction of a duly authorized officer of the Trust, and so as to be open to inspection at all times, and, as far as practicable, where it cannot be affected by frost or injured by any other means, and shall be provided with means of access thereto. A meter shall not be connected with more than one separate and

distinct inlet pipe leading from the service-pipe or other pipe of the Trust, unless permitted in writing under the hand of the duly authorized officer of the Trust. A meter shall not be continued to be used if it is found on being tested by the Trust's officer to be inaccurate, and no meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering 1,000,000 gallons. The keys of the meter shall be in possession of the Trust.

12. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these Regulations, or fails to pay his rates, or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust, when due, or fails to do anything which, under any of these Regulations, ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied, or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

13. The water supplied in the Waterworks District of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these Regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with these Regulations and not otherwise.

14. Before any person shall affix any service-pipes to any pipes of the Trust, or alter, or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipes or service-pipes, cocks, or fittings, connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such work, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any manner interfering with such pipes, service-pipes, cocks, or fittings as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

15. Plumbers and other persons employed to lay on service-pipes and to fix meters, or to relay or refix the same, must satisfy the Trust that they are competent to perform the same in a workmanlike manner, and shall pay a licence-fee of One pound per annum, notwithstanding which the Trust shall have the power of cancelling any such licence at any time.

16. The quality of materials required in laying private services shall be as follows:—

(1) The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles, bends, reducing couplings, plugs, &c., to be of the best galvanized iron.

(2) All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of the same.

(3) All ends of pipes, bends, &c., to be properly and truly threaded, and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c.

(4) The whole of the pipes, tees, bends, &c., to be sound and free from all defects, and capable of withstanding a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 400 feet in height.

(5) All delivery cocks and thimbles for connecting the service-pipes and mains to be high-pressure, and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship, and of approved patterns, to screw into elbows, bends, &c.; all cocks and thimbles to stand the same pressure as the pipes.

(6) No service-pipe shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground of less than 10 inches.

17. *Service-pipes at cost of consumers.*—All service-pipes, with the necessary stop-cocks, shall be supplied and fixed at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same, under the direction and supervision of such officer as the Trust may appoint. All service-pipes shall have a stop-cock at the main with brass ferrule. Trust to bear cost of all repairs to service-pipes between the mains and kerbing in street.

18. If any person throw, or convey, or cause or permit to be thrown or conveyed, any rubbish, dirt, filth, or other noxious things into any stream, reservoir, aqueduct, or other waterworks belonging to the Trust, or wash or cleanse therein any cloth, wool, leather, or skin of any animal, or any clothes or other thing, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five (5) pounds.

19. If any person bathe in any stream, reservoir, or aqueduct, which by notice in the *Government Gazette* has been required to be kept free from contamination or pollution for domestic water supply, or in any other waterworks belonging to the Trust, or wash, or throw, or cause to enter therein any dog or other animal, he shall for each such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five (5) pounds.

20. Any person who, having been served with notice to provide a meter, shall refuse or neglect to supply such meter within one month of receiving such notice, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day after the expiration of the time mentioned in the notice on which he shall refuse or neglect to comply with the terms of such notice.

21. Any person who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust without permission, in writing, of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break open or injure any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, weir, channel, reservoir, or engine, the property of the Trust, or who shall trespass on the Trust's work without leave, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

22. The officers of the Trust shall have power, between the hours of ten in the forenoon and four in the afternoon, to enter any house, building, or lands through or into which water is supplied by the Trust, by measure or otherwise, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, and may from time to time enter any house, building, or land for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus the property of the Trust, and if any person hinder such officer from entering or making such inspection, or effecting such removal, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

23. In the construction of these Regulations the word person shall be deemed to extend and to include a corporation or company, whether aggregate or sole. The word officer shall be deemed and taken to mean any officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf; and the word Trust shall be deemed to mean the Kerang Waterworks Trust.

The foregoing regulations were made and adopted on the 27th day of November, 1901, by the Commissioners of the Kerang Waterworks Trust under the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and the seal of the Trust was affixed hereunto in the presence of—

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is among other things provided that in order to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in any process, trade, or business usually or frequently carried on in a factory or work-room the Governor in Council may, if he think fit, from time to time appoint a Special Board consisting of not less than four or more than ten members and a Chairman; provided that, subject to certain exceptions, no such Special Board shall be appointed unless a resolution has been passed by either House of Parliament declaring it is expedient to appoint such Board: And whereas the Legislative Assembly on the 19th day of December, 1901, passed a resolution declaring that it is expedient to appoint a Special Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business connected with or incidental to the manufacturing or making of carriages, carts, and other vehicles (other than perambulators), or any part or parts thereof, such as the ironwork or bodies, hoods, cushions, springs, axles, wheels, tires, rims, hubs, or spokes (being a process, trade, or business usually or frequently carried on in a factory or work-room): Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby Order that a Special Board be appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business connected with or incidental to the manufacturing or making of carriages, carts, and other vehicles (other than perambulators), or any part or parts thereof, such as the ironwork or bodies, hoods, cushions, springs, axles, wheels, tires, rims, hubs, or spokes: such Special Board to consist of ten members and a Chairman, five of such members being appointed as representatives of the employers and five as representatives of the employees: And His Excellency doth further direct that such Special Board may in any regulation, determination, order or instrument, or legal proceedings be described for all purposes as the Carriage Board.

And the Honorable Alexander James Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts a Special Board was appointed on the 8th day of January, 1902, to fix the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a brewer, or in the process, trade, or business of a bottler of fermented liquors made from malt or a substitute for malt: And whereas under the Factories and Shops Acts it is amongst other things provided that a Special Board in fixing the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in any process, trade, or business usually or frequently carried on in a factory or work-room, shall take into consideration the nature, kind, and class of the work, and the mode and manner in which the work is to be done, and the age and the sex of the workers, and any matter which may from time to time be prescribed: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in Council doth by this Order make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The Brewers Board when fixing the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons shall take into consideration—

The question of providing special prices or rates for work done on Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday and Eight Hours Day.

And the Honorable Alexander James Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth order:—

1. That the annual election for the year 1902 of two Commissioners of the Yatchaw Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be held on the 18th day of March, 1902, notwithstanding anything to the contrary ordered in the regulations providing for the election of such Commissioners approved on the 8th day of January, 1889, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 11th day of January, 1889.

2. For the purposes of such election for the year 1902, the said Yatchaw Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall cause to be prepared, as from the 1st day of February, 1902, a voters' list in the form of the first schedule to the aforesaid regulations bearing date the 8th day of January, 1889, and shall revise the same.

3. That the two Commissioners so elected at such election shall hold office until the third day of February, 1905, inclusive, when they shall be deemed to have held office as such Commissioners for the full period allowed by the said regulations, and shall retire accordingly.

4. That the said regulations bearing date as aforesaid, in so far as the same are not inconsistent with the provisions of this Order, shall be deemed to be regulations for the election of Commissioners at the annual election for the year 1902.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 22 of the *Gold Buyers Act 1901* (1 Edw. VII., No. 1780) power is given to the Governor in Council to make regulations for the various purposes therein prescribed, and generally for carrying out the provisions of the aforesaid Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the following regulations, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

1. Every licensed gold buyer shall keep a book in the form in the schedule hereto marked "A" therein, in which an entry shall be made of every purchase of unwrought gold or gold amalgam, giving particulars of the name, sex, nationality, calling, and address of the seller, the mine and division and district where obtained, the date of purchase, the amount purchased, whether gold or gold amalgam, and the price paid therefor.
2. The clerk of petty sessions of the court at which any application for a certificate for the issue of a licence is made shall keep a book in the form in the schedule hereto marked "B" therein, giving particulars of all applications for certificates for licences or for certificates of renewal thereof, including the names, occupation, address of the applicant, together with the name and address of the warden recommending him and the decision of the court, and shall enter therein particulars of all applications for the revocation of any licence, with the decision of the court.
3. Where a licence issues pursuant to any certificate, and an application is subsequently made to the court issuing the certificate for the revocation of such licence, which application to revoke is granted, the clerk of petty sessions shall, in addition to any entry in such book containing particulars of the application to revoke the licence, also enter in the book, in the column headed "Remarks," opposite to the entry containing the application for the certificate or renewal certificate, as the case may be, the fact that the licence the subject of that application has been revoked, with a reference to the date when the same was so revoked.
4. Within seven days after the issue of a licence the licensee shall forward to the Minister of Mines a notice giving the address of his place of business. Notice shall forthwith be sent to the Minister of any change of such address.
5. Every licensed gold buyer shall place upon the outside of his business premises his name, the nature of his business, and the words "Licensed Gold Buyer."
6. Every licensed gold buyer shall furnish to the Minister of Mines on or before the seventh of each calendar month a return showing each purchase of unwrought gold or gold amalgam made by him or on his behalf during the next preceding calendar month, the name and address of the seller, the mine, and the division and district where obtained, the date of purchase, the amount purchased, whether gold or gold amalgam, and the price paid therefor.
7. The Under Treasurer shall, as soon as possible after the issue of a gold buyer's licence, publish particulars thereof in the *Government Gazette*.
8. Every application for a gold buyer's licence shall be in the form in the schedule hereto and marked "C" therein.
9. Every certificate for the granting of a gold buyer's licence issued by justices of the peace shall be in the form in the schedule hereto and marked "D" therein.
10. Every gold buyer's licence shall be in the form in the schedule hereto and marked "E" therein.
11. Every declaration made by any person tendering gold or gold amalgam to a licensed gold buyer for sale shall be in the form or to the effect of that contained in the schedule hereto and marked "F" therein, with such alterations as the circumstances of the case may require.
12. On the revocation of any gold buyer's licence by any court notice of such revocation shall be at once sent to the Minister of Mines by the clerk of petty sessions at the court where the same was revoked.

VERMIN DISTRICTS.—ANNUAL RATES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Land Act 1901* (1 Edw. VII. No. 1749) it is amongst other things enacted that the local committees for the destruction of vermin of any Vermin District shall, within thirty days from its appointment, and thereafter in the month of January in each and every year, recommend to the Governor an annual rate or assessment, specifying the amount thereof to be paid by the owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within its Vermin District, in respect of each square mile of land owned, held under lease, or occupied under the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and also in respect of the sheep or cattle depasturing thereon; and it is further enacted that such rate or assessment, on being proclaimed by the Governor in Council in the *Government Gazette*, shall be the rate payable by the owners, lessees, and occupiers of land within the Vermin District for the current year for the purposes of the said Part of the said Act, and shall be paid to the Minister at the same time as the rent payable by such lessees and occupiers: And whereas the local committees duly appointed for the Vermin Districts named hereunder have recommended for the current year certain rates per square mile upon all lands within the boundaries of the said Vermin Districts respectively: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby proclaim the rates specified hereunder to be the annual rates per square mile payable for the current year by all

owners, lessees, or occupiers of lands within the Vermion Districts respectively named in conjunction therewith, that is to say:—

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Northern Vermion District shall be Two shillings and sixpence per square mile.

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the North-Eastern Vermion District shall be One shilling per square mile.

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Warracknabeal Vermion District shall be Three shillings per square mile.
