GOD SAVE THE KING!

VICTORIAN GOVERNMENT DEBENTURES (ACT 1 EDW. No. 1753).

PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST PAYABLE IN MELBOURNE,
TRANSFERABLE ON DELIVERY.

TENDERS will be received at the Revenue and Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne, until Noon of Thursday, the 20th March, for the whole or any part of the Victorian Government Debentures for Two hundred and fifty thousand pounds, authorized by the *Railway Loan Act 1901*, which is secured upon the Consolidated Revenue of Victoria.

The Debentures will be repayable on 1st January, 1932 (but may be redeemed after 21 years upon twelve months' previous notice), and will carry interest from the 1st January, 1902.

The interest will be at the rate of 3 per cent. per annum, payable half-yearly, on the 1st January and 1st July in each year, the first half-year's interest being payable on the 1st July, 1902.

The Debentures will, at the option of tenderer, be issued in denominations of Fifty, One hundred, or Five hundred pounds. Each tender must specify the number of Debentures tendered for, the denomination thereof, the face value of Debentures tendered for, the rate per £100, and the purchase-money offered.

Tenderers of the highest premium will have preference; and to those of even rates debentures will, as nearly as practicable, be allotted proportionately. Tenders at a price including a fraction of a shilling other than Sixpence will not have preference given to them by reason of such fraction.

Each tender must be accompanied by a deposit equal to 10 per cent. of the nominal amount of the Debentures tendered for in cash or bank draft, which will be refunded on the following day if tender be not accepted.

The envelope containing the tender must be addressed to the Treasurer, Treasury, Melbourne, and inscribed "Tender for Government Debentures," and may be deposited in the Tender-box in the Revenue and Pay Office, at the Treasury, Melbourne.

Tenders will be opened by the Treasurer in the presence of such of the tenderers as may desire to attend at the Board Room at the Public Offices, Treasury Gardens, at Noon on Thursday, the 20th March, and the result will be announced forthwith.

The Government will not necessarily accept any tender. Successful tenderers must pay up balance in full, including accrued interest from 1st January last, on one-half of the amount tendered for, on or before Noon of Thursday, 1st May, 1902, and the balance on the remainder on or before Noon of Thursday, the 19th June, 1902; if the full amounts, together with accrued interest, be not paid on or before the dates and hour specified the deposit will be forfeited.

The minimum price will be £94. Brokerage of Ten shillings per cent. on face value will be allowed to members of recognised Stock Exchanges of Victoria.

Forms of tender may be obtained on application to the Under-Treasurer, or the Receiver and Paymaster, at the Treasury, Melbourne.

The decision of the Government will be made known on the day following that on which the tenders are opened.

SHIRE OF YEA.

BY-LAW NO. 6.

Dairy Registration.

Commencement.—A By-law of the Shire of Yea, made under Part 3 of the *Health Act 1890* and under the *Health Act 1900*, and numbered 6, for providing for the registration of persons carrying on the trade of cow-keepers, dairymen, purveyors of milk, and for inspection of dairies, and for fixing the fee to be paid for each such registration.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts, the Council of the Shire of Yea, in the name of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, doth hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 6 of the said Shire, that is to say:—

1. *Repeal of former by-laws.*—All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

2. *Date of coming into force.*—This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. *To have operation in whole of shire.*—This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Yea.

4. *Persons who shall register and fees for same.*—From and after the coming into force of this by-law, every person carrying on the trade or business of a cow-keeper, dairymen, or purveyor of milk, shall, within fifteen days from and after the first day of January in every year, and every person about to carry on the trade or business of a cow-keeper, dairymen, or purveyor of milk, shall, previous to carrying on such trade or business, register himself with the said Council in manner following, that is to say:—By signing and forwarding to the Council an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application if he does not keep any cows, pay a fee of Five shillings (5s.), but if he does keep any cows, then he shall, with such application, pay a fee according to the following scale, namely:—

5. *Registration and books.*—Upon receipt of every application for registration and fee the Shire Secretary shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for the purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. *Inspection of water supply and paddocks.*—*Prohibition of use of same.*—*Inspection by veterinary surgeon.*—All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used by any person in his trade or business as a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, as a grazing ground for dairy cattle, and all sources of water supply used in connexion therewith, shall whenever necessary be inspected by any member or officer of the Council, or by any person authorized in writing by the President or Secretary of the said Council, and if on inspection such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures or sources of water supply, or any of them, are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said Council may by an order in writing signed by the Shire Secretary or other officer of the Council, and served personally or left at the dwelling house of the registered person, or, in the case of an unregistered person, served personally or left at his dwelling, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding or watering dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order, and any such order as aforesaid the said Council may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made. All cattle and other animals used or kept by any person carrying on the trade or business of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk may also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from the poverty or weakness of their bodily condition are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, and any other diseased animal shall be forthwith removed from the premises of such cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid.

7. *Alteration of premises.*—The Council, on receiving a report from an inspector that the construction of any dairy, dairy-farm, milking place, cow-shed, milk-store, milk-shop, or other building in the occupation of any person following the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, is defective or faulty in regard to lighting, ventilation, drainage, or water supply, or in any other respect whatsoever, in such a way as to prejudicially affect the health of the cows or the wholesomeness of the milk or other dairy produce, may order such person to make alterations in any such buildings or structures, and to remedy any such defects within a time to be specified in such order.

8. *Closets, night-soil, &c.*—Such closet accommodation shall be provided for the persons employed on the premises of any person following the trade or business of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and at such distance from the dairy, milking-place, milk-store, milk-shop, or source of water supply of such premises, and such methods shall be adopted for the disposal of the night-soil as may be directed by the Council, and the closets on such premises shall be disinfected daily, to the entire satisfaction of the inspector or other officer as aforesaid.

9. *Horses, stabling, &c.*—Where horses are kept on the premises of any person following the trade or business of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, such stable accommodation shall be provided, and at such a distance from the milking-place, or milk-store, or milk-shop, or source of water supply of such premises as the Council may direct.

10. *Cleanliness to be observed.*—All houses, dairies, milking-places, cow-sheds, milk-stores, milk-shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health by affecting the milk or otherwise, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings and milking-places shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk; and such means of access shall be provided to the source or sources of water supply as may be directed by the Council or duly authorized officer as aforesaid.

11. *Sweeping, fumigating, &c.*—All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within 24 hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector, be fumigated, disinfected, limewashed, or be otherwise dealt with, as may be in any such order so directed.

12. *Scalding and care of vessels.*—All vessels used for holding milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily, and no cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or person employed in the milking or dairy work shall use in connexion with milking or for washing vessels used for holding milk or for any dairy work water that is in any way infected or contaminated or contains matter injurious to health, and the health officer or inspector may, after inspection, prohibit by order, served as prescribed in clause 7 of this by-law, the use for dairy purposes of the water obtained from any well or tank or other source of water supply, and may require any tank to be cleaned and disinfected.

13. *Cow-keeper to notify disease of stock.*—If at any time disease exists in or among the cows, cattle, or other stock of any cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the Council, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

14. *Provision for pigs.*—No cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

15. *Infected persons.*—No person who is suffering from any dangerous infectious or contagious disease, or who has been so situated by contact with any person or persons so suffering or otherwise so that he may have contracted or be in danger of contracting any dangerous infectious or contagious disease, shall milk cows or handle vessels used for containing milk for sale or in any way take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business until authorized by the Council, shire secretary, or health officer so to do.

16. *Epidemics, &c.*—*Milk not to be used.*—If any person (whether an adult or a child) living on or occupying or staying on a visit at any premises used as a grazing ground or dairy, or for cowsheds, or as a milk-shed or milk-store, be attacked by any epidemic, endemic, or contagious disease, the occupier of the house or premises in which such person is (or, if he be the person attacked, his wife, or other person in charge) shall immediately give notice thereof to the Council or health officer or to the nearest member of the police force, and the Council may, whether or not the person so attacked has been removed from the premises by order served as aforesaid, prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk or the produce thereof from the premises until danger, in the opinion of such Council or officer of health, no longer exists, and may order the destruction of the milk or any produce thereof on the premises.

17. *Report of inspector.*—Every dairy, milk-store, or milk-shop, and the premises of any person following the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, shall be inspected once in each half-year by the Council's inspector, who shall furnish a report to the Council on the following matters, that is to say:—Condition of paddocks, water supply, drains, sheds and buildings, closet and stable accommodation, disposal of night-soil and manure, storage for milk, means of scalding and cleaning vessels, cleanliness of premises, compliance with regulations.

18. *Interpretation.*—In the interpretation of this by-law words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular number, and the word "person" shall include a corporation, and the word "cows" shall mean and include all cows in profit, all cows in calf, heifers, and cows and dry cows, to be subsequently used as milkers.

19. *Penalties.*—Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or to Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion not being less than Five shillings, to be paid, and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

The foregoing by-law, being By-law No. 6. of the Shire of Yex, was agreed to by the Council of the said Shire on the second day of November, One thousand nine hundred and one, and confirmed by the said Council on the fourth day of January, One thousand nine hundred and two.

Health Acts 1890-1900. SHIRE OF MORWELL.

BY-LAW No. 4.

A By-law of the Shire of Morwell, made under the provisions of the Health Acts, for the purpose of regulating the Registration of Cow-keepers, Dairy-men, and Purveyors of Milk.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts 1890 and 1900, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Morwell make the following by-law:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This by-law shall come into force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Morwell.

Registration of Cow-keepers, Dairy-men, and Purveyors of Milk.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the 1st day of January in every year, register himself by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Shire of Morwell an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee in accordance with the following scale:—

For any number of cows in profit at any one time kept, not exceeding ten in all, a fee of Two shillings and sixpence.
For any number of cows in profit at any one time kept, exceeding ten, and not exceeding twenty-five in all, a fee of Five shillings.

For any number of cows in profit a any one time kept, exceeding twenty-five, and not exceeding fifty in all, a fee of Seven shillings and sixpence.

For any number of cows in profit at any one time kept, exceeding fifty, and not exceeding seventy-five in all, a fee of Ten shillings.

For any number of cows in profit kept exceeding seventy-five, a fee of Twelve shillings and sixpence.

Application for Registration.

To the Secretary of the Council of the Shire of Morwell.

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the Secretary for the Council shall indorse the same, with a memorandum of the date upon which it is received, and of the payment of the fee; and shall file the same, and enter the particulars in the Schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be duly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, and buildings used for grazing and feeding dairy cattle shall whenever necessary, and at any time, be inspected by any member or officer of the said Council, or by any other person authorized in writing by the Chairman or Secretary of the said Council, and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or buildings, or any one of them, are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said Council may, by an order in writing signed by the Secretary and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person served personally or left at his dwelling-place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid, and any such order the Council may revoke, but upon fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cow-sheds, milk-stores, milk-shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cow-keeper, milk purveyor, or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of cow-keeper, milk purveyor, or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and kept clean, and shall, within 24 hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime washed; as may be in such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing and conveying milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person or any member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cow-keeper, dairyman, or milk purveyor, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person shall be attacked with typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or, if he be the person attacked, his wife or other person in charge shall immediately give notice thereof to the Council or officer of health or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Council, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said Council or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such Council or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering to milk cows or handle

vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cow-shed or dairy, or in the herds of any cow-keeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the Council, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit, or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this by-law words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a firm or corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this by-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) nor less than Five shillings (5s.), or, in the like discretion, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) nor less than Five shillings (5s.) for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

The journey may be broken for one month on the forward and during the currency of the ticket on the return journey. Sydney excursion tickets will not be available by the express train on the New South Wales line, except on payment of 20s. first class and 15s. second class. Adelaide and Brisbane excursion tickets will be available by the express and ordinary trains.

Luggage.—Excursion passengers to and from stations in Victoria will only be allowed to carry such luggage free as can be stowed under the seats without inconvenience to other passengers, and those who have luggage for the van are required to be at the station half-an-hour before the starting time of train. All luggage should be plainly addressed with the owner's name and the station it is for, and the address should be affixed in such a way that it will not come off.

THE NECROPOLIS, SPRING VALE.

RULES, REGULATIONS, FEES, AND CHARGES.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1899*, the Trustees of the Necropolis at Spring Vale make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE NECROPOLIS, SPRING VALE.

1. That all fees and charges payable to the trustees shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.

2. That any person desiring ground in the Necropolis for a private grave, vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, or tombstone, or for any other purpose, shall apply to the trustees therefor. If approved, the trustees, on the payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial in the form specified in Schedule A.

3. That any person desiring to construct, add to, alter, or amend a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to erect, add to, or amend a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other construction or erection in any part of the Necropolis shall apply in writing to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit in writing a statement, plan, design, or drawing of the same, with full particulars, and shall obtain such permission in writing before proceeding with the work.

4. That all applications for interment shall be made at the Necropolis, or at the Melbourne office of the Necropolis, at least eight working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made. No free interment shall be allowed, unless applications therefor be made at least eight working hours prior to the time fixed for same.

5. That the name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of the deceased, and other particulars mentioned in Schedule C, shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.

6. That the trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct that portion of same above the surface of the ground, under directions of the manager, on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

7. That every coffin shall have on the lid a lead or copper plate, with the name of the deceased stamped thereon.

8. That the depth of every grave shall be as arranged, but no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 4 feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground, after such interment, and, except in the case of a tomb or vault, a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left above and around the uppermost coffin previously buried in the grave.

9. That no interment shall be permitted in a private grave or vault, without the production of the certificate of right of burial or other satisfactory evidence, and, if required, a statutory declaration shall be made that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided for in the next rule.

10. That in the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault, to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall also be given with the application.

11. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in the cemetery, without a certificate from a Deputy Registrar of Deaths or a coroner. Such certificate shall be delivered to the gatekeeper before the funeral enters the Necropolis, or a guarantee be given by the representative or undertaker to produce same within three days, and satisfactory reasons must be given for the non-production of such certificate in the first instance, otherwise such guarantee will not be accepted.

12. That the hours fixed for burials shall be as follows:—On week days—September to April inclusive, from Eight a.m. to Five p.m.; May, to August inclusive, from Eight a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays throughout the year, from Two to Four p.m.

13. That no burial shall be allowed to take place between the hours of Five p.m. and Eight a.m., except by special permission of the trustees.

14. That the time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the Necropolis, and the same shall be punctually observed.

15. That every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance, and no vehicle except the hearse and mourning coaches shall be permitted to enter the Necropolis or to stand opposite the entrance gates. Breaking out of the procession after passing the outer gates is forbidden. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than at a walking pace within the Necropolis.

16. That every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of owner. Should the owner's residence not be known or be out of the colony, the trustees to have power to do the work and keep an account against the owner.

17. That every person, prior to placing any inscription, epitaph, or other writing or drawing in any part of the Necropolis shall apply in writing to the trustees, and submit a copy thereof to the trustees, and shall obtain their written permission for the same.

18. That any person violating the provisions of clauses 3 and 17 hereof shall be liable to the penalties imposed by law for so doing, and to be further dealt with as a trespasser.

19. The trustees reserve to themselves the sole right to put in all foundations, and to carry out any and every class of work required below the surface of the ground.

20. That all materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the Necropolis, and shall be admitted only at such entrance, as directed by the manager, and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than 4 inches broad shall be permitted to leave the principal roads of the Necropolis.

21. That no catacomb shall be allowed.

22. That no wooden erection shall be allowed.

23. That the trustees shall not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for re-interment in the Necropolis or any other cemetery.

24. That before any such exceptional case be dealt with by the trustees, a written application, setting forth the reasons for the proposed removal, and verified by a statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased, and, in the event of such application being granted, the permission of the Minister administering the *Coroners Act 1896*, or any amendment or substitution thereof, in addition to the permission of the trustees, shall be obtained. If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and air-tight coffin prior to removal.

25. That any workman not employed by the trustees shall be under the supervision and control of the manager or other officer, who shall have power to regulate his hours of labour, to see that his work is completed satisfactorily and with despatch, and to remove him summarily from the Necropolis upon any cause of offence.

26. That any person taking any part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules, viz.:—First.—That no rubbish, clay, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately after the completion of the work. Second.—That no loam shall be taken from any portion of the Necropolis for the purpose of dressing any grave. Third.—That no grave shall be dressed in wet weather, except by special permission of the manager, nor shall any materials be wheeled or carted along any path or road while the surface is soft from rain or otherwise. Work in all cases is to be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours, except in extreme cases, when permission may be granted.

27. That, unless otherwise ordered, the principal entrance shall be open daily from Eight a.m. to Six p.m., except on Sundays, when it shall be open from Ten a.m. to Six p.m.

28. That no child under ten years shall be admitted into the Necropolis except in charge of a responsible person.

29. That no smoking shall be allowed within the Necropolis, nor shall any fireworks be discharged therein.

30. That no dogs shall be admitted into the Necropolis, and any found therein are liable to be destroyed.

31. That any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, or otherwise infringing the above Act, or any rule, regulation, or by-law made for protecting the Necropolis, shall be prosecuted as the law directs.

32. That no person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the Necropolis or its approaches any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars or cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

33. That "the secretary or manager," as referred to in these Rules, means the person for the time being employed by the trustees as manager of the Necropolis, and such person shall, subject to the trustees, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Necropolis, and to the carrying out and enforcement of these Rules, and, subject to the provisions of the *Cemeteries Act*, the direction of such person shall in all such matters, and for all purposes, be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the trustees.

34. That no person employed under the trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever in discharging his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Necropolis other than that for which he receives payment from the trustees.

35. That any person employed under the trustees accepting any such gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to be summarily dismissed.

40. That a plan of the Necropolis, showing the distribution of the land, compartments, situations, and numbers of the graves, and a registry of all certificates of right of burial, shall be kept at the office.

PORTS IN VICTORIA.—ADDITIONAL REGULATION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Marine Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1165) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs, and may appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations; but that no rules or regulations made as aforesaid respecting any public wharf shall have any force or validity to repeal or alter any by-law passed by the corporation of the city of Melbourne or of the town of Geelong or by the council of any borough, district, or shire for preventing obstruction and encumbrances in and upon any wharf within the limits of such city, town, borough, district, or shire; and that any such limits, boundaries, rules, and regulations may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed, and others substituted in their stead: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby make the following Additional Regulation for Ports in Victoria, that is to say:—

PORT OF PORT PHILLIP.

Submarine Mining in the Vicinity of Swan Spit Buoy Light.

For the purpose of permitting practice in submarine mining, vessels shall not, on and from the 20th day of March, 1902, until and including the 20th day of April, 1902, be navigated or anchored in the waters to the northward and westward of the No. 3 (Swan Spit) buoy, West Channel, within an area bounded by a supposed line running south-easterly from Swan Beacon to No. 3 (Swan Spit) buoy; thence northerly to small black can buoy, moored east by north, five cables from the north-east end of Swan Island; thence westerly to the outer pile which marks the entrance of the channel leading to Swan Island jetty; thence due south to Swan Point; and from thence southerly along the shore to the starting point; and also that on and from the 25th day of March, 1902, until and including the 1st day of April, 1902, vessels shall not be anchored in the waters within an area bounded by a supposed line from beacon on Duck Island to Swan Island jetty; thence to small black can buoy moored five cables E. by N. from north-east end of Swan Island; thence to starting point.

AREAS OF LANDS INCREASED AND DIMINISHED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1901* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1901*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 7) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said *Land Act* as lands which may be sold by auction (class 7 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in Division 6 of Part I. of the *Land Act 1901* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said Act as land which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9, respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1901* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

PERMANENT FORCE.

1. Clause No. 10 of the Regulations made by the Governor in Council on the 13th day of February, 1895, is hereby rescinded as and from the 1st day of February, 1902, and the following clause is substituted therefor:—

2. "All members of the permanent force may be allowed 24 hours (one day) leave in each week, and an annual leave as follows:—Firemen having completed one year's service, 72 hours (three days); two years' service, 120 hours (five days); four years' service, 168 hours (seven days). In the case of foremen, the annual leave allowed may be 240 hours (ten days); in the case of District Superintendents and Engineers the annual leave allowed may be 336 hours (fourteen days), and in the case of the Deputy Chief Officer and Inspecting Superintendent the annual leave allowed may be 504 hours (twenty-one days), provided always that the Chief Officer may, for sufficient reason, either from stress of work or other cause, cancel any or all leave at any time."

BOROUGH OF TARNAGULLA.

BY-LAW regulating the Rates to be paid for Water Supply purposes on all tenements within reach of the water main, situate in the Township of Tarnagulla.

1. The Council of the Borough of Tarnagulla, by virtue of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, *Water Act 1890*, and *Amended Act 1900*, doth hereby make the following By-law, the same to become law, and be enforced after publication in the *Government Gazette* and local papers, and continue in force until the Council deems fit to alter or amend the same.

2. All regulations previously made relating to the same matter are hereby repealed, save and except as to any agreements made and entered into for the recovery of rates and dues under previous regulations and agreements.

3. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water for manufacturing purposes, or for irrigation, or for water power, or for fountains.

4. The supply of water for other than domestic purposes shall be by measure, or in such manner as the Council from time to time may determine.

The rate to be paid for tenements (otherwise than by measure) with water for domestic purposes shall be as follows, viz.:—

- (a) All tenements (private) connected with the main, £1 per annum.
- (b) All tenements not connected with the main, and unoccupied tenements, 10s. per annum; and 5s. per annum for store rooms.
- (c) All stores or business places, including domiciles, where three or more horses are kept, £2 per annum.
- (d) All stores or business places where only one horse is kept, including domiciles, £1 per annum.
- (e) All hotels, including stables, £2 10s. per annum, with the right to use hose for washing conveyances and horses.
- (f) All butchers' premises, including shops and domiciles, £2 per annum.
- (g) All banks, including domiciles, £2 per annum.
- (h) For Government buildings, £3 per annum.
- (i) For water supplied to private tenements by measure, 2s. per 1,000 gallons, the minimum charge to be £1.
- (j) For water supplied from stand-pipe, 6d. for every 200 gallons.
- (k) For water supplied from the main to milling or mining companies or other industrial purposes where steam-boilers are used, £10 per annum per boiler, the Council reserving the right to cut off the supply when necessary.
- (l) For water supplied from the main to cyanide companies, £10 per annum, the maximum quantity of sand to be treated to be 20 tons per working day, the Council reserving the right to cut off the supply when necessary.

5. It is hereby provided that the Council shall have power to enforce the use of a meter where a hose is found to be used on any premises connected with the main.

6. All persons required to use a meter, or who shall by permission of the Council elect to use and be supplied by meter at 2s. per 1,000 gallons as hereinbefore stated, shall provide the same of approved gauge at their own expense, and supply the cost of maintenance in good working order, provide a box or case to enclose the same with lock and key, which shall be handed over to the officer appointed by the Council to supervise the quantities used from time to time, the minimum charge to be £1 per annum.

7. No overflow pipe will be allowed to any private bath, and any person transgressing or breaking this rule shall be guilty of an offence, and shall forfeit and pay for such offence a penalty not exceeding £5, and for every day such offence is continued after notice by the Council a further penalty of £1 per day.

8. No person shall use a hose or sprinkler to any tap or pipes used for domestic purposes to supply water from the main for watering the garden, and any person breaking this regulation shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

9. No person without the authority of the Council shall affix any service pipe, cock, or fitting, connected with the main, and any person guilty of such offence shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

10. Any person, whether licensed or not as aforesaid, connecting any service pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water from the main without first affixing a self-acting valve to prevent the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and in the event of continuing the offence, a further penalty of £2 shall be imposed for every day such offence is continued.

11. No unauthorized person shall be allowed to shut off or turn on water in the main pipes of the Council, and any person offending shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

12. For the construction of this By-law, the word Council shall mean and represent the Council of the Borough of Tarnagulla.
