BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Holidays or Bank Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, that is to say:—

WEDNESDAY, THE 26TH DAY OF MARCH, 1902, at Birchip and Dunolly; and, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Rushworth;

THURSDAY, THE 10TH DAY OF APRIL, 1902, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Maffra.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twentieth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and two, and in the second year of His Majesty's reign.
