WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of section 60 of the Regulations made under Part I. of the *Stock Diseases Act 1890* (54 Vict. THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulation:—

Regulation No. 91, made and passed by the said Commissioners on the sixteenth day of January, One thousand nine hundred and one, is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following Regulation is enacted, and shall be read and construed with and form part of Part I. of the Regulations of the said Commissioners, passed on the twenty-eighth day of March, One thousand nine hundred:—

No. 91. Where goods upon which the rates, tolls, and charges imposed by section 110 of the Act have been paid shall be exported to any place outside Victoria, the Commissioners may allow or refund, by way of drawback, to the owner of the goods at the time of exportation, an amount equal to the rates, tolls, and charges previously paid on the goods so exported, less the sum of One shilling per ton, provided that the claim for such drawback be made on or before the last day of the month next following that in which such goods shall have been so exported. Such drawback may be claimed in the case of all goods, other than tea and grain, only when such goods are exported in the original packages; but where the goods are imported in bulk and subsequently exported, the Commissioners may, in exceptional cases, allow drawback, though such goods were not exported in the original packages. The tonnage shall be ascertained in the case of all goods, except tea, either by weight or measurement, at the option of the Commissioners:—

(a) In the case of tea, by reckoning eight chests, or sixteen half-chests, or forty quarter-chests, or eighty boxes of the original package, or eight hundred pounds of tea, repacked as one ton measurement.

(b) The tonnage on grain shall be ascertained by weight, and drawback allowed only when repacked under Customs supervision.

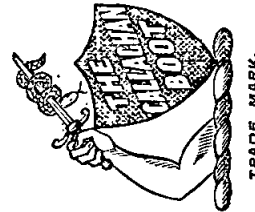

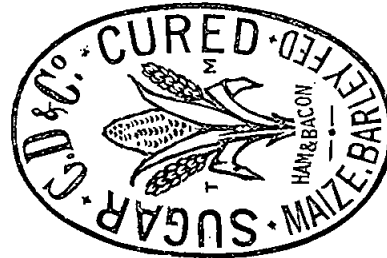

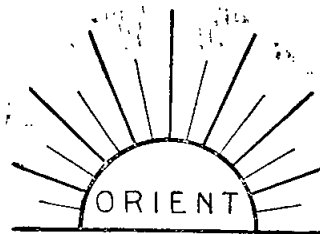

SHIRE OF SEYMOUR.

BY-LAW No. 14.—AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Seymour, by virtue of the provisions of the *Health Act 1890* and the *Health Act 1900*, and every other power enabling them in this behalf, hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 14 of the Council of the said Shire, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Seymour.

4. Registration of Cow-keepers, Dairy-men, and Purveyors of Milk.—Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, for the year 1902, within fourteen days after the publication of this by-law in the *Government Gazette*, and thereafter on or before the first day of January in subsequent years, register himself with the council in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Inspector of Dairies for the Shire an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of the following amount, namely, if the person to be registered keep cows, and the number of such cows is—

- (1) Not more than 5, a fee of Two shillings and sixpence.
- (2) More than 5, but not more than 10, a fee of Five shillings.
- (3) More than 10, but not more than 20, a fee of Seven shillings and sixpence.
- (4) More than 20, but not more than 30, a fee of Ten shillings.
- (5) More than 30, but not more than 40, a fee of Twelve shillings and sixpence.
- (6) More than 40, but not more than 50, a fee of Fifteen shillings.
- (7) More than 50, but not more than 60, a fee of Twenty shillings.
- (8) More than 60, a fee of Twenty-five shillings.
- (9) If the person to be registered does not keep cows, a fee of Ten shillings.

Sir,—I desire to be registered in accordance with the particulars in the schedule hereunder.

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the Inspector of Dairies for the shire shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application, in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said council or by any person authorized, in writing, by the chairman or secretary of the said council, and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said council may, by an order, in writing, signed by the secretary and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in case of an unregistered person served personally or left at his dwelling-place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said council may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk-stores, milk-shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cow-keeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cow-keeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within 24 hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person or member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife, or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the council, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said council or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such council or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy, or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cow-keeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the council, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit, or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this by-law, words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this by-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable in the discretion of the convicting justices to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

The foregoing by-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Council of the Shire of Seymour, this tenth day of March, 1902.

WANDELLA IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION FOR THE SALE OF WATER.—No. 2.

THE Commissioners of the Wandella Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do make the following Regulation for the sale of water:—

1. All water supplied from the Trust works shall be paid for by measure; all gauges for measurements shall be of a form and pattern approved by the Trust, and shall be fixed under and in accordance with the direction of such officer of the Trust as may be appointed for the purpose; and all quantities shall be computed by the officer of the Trust deputed for that purpose.
2. All water shall be supplied through properly constructed outlets, which shall be fixed in any part of a channel approved by the Commissioners.
3. The Trust reserves to itself the right to fix the quantity of water, from time to time, which shall be supplied to every 320 acres or fractional part thereof.
4. The manipulation of the works shall be solely in the hands of the Trust's officers, who shall turn the water on and off, and any other person, not being duly authorized, who shall in any way interfere, tamper with, or damage any of the works shall be deemed to be guilty of a breach of this Regulation, and the Trust may prosecute such person according to law.
5. The water bailiff shall supply water to each land-holder in succession, and no person shall be supplied out of his turn excepting when surplus water is available, when applicants shall be supplied in order of application for surplus water.
6. The rate or price to be charged for water supplied for the irrigation of grass land shall be Sixpence per inch per acre from the 1st day of April to the 31st day of October, both days inclusive, and for water supplied for similar use between the 1st day of November and the last day of March the charge shall be Sixpence per inch per acre for hard level land, and One shilling per inch per acre for uneven or lignum land.

The rate or price to be charged for water for the irrigation of any kind of crop or cultivated land (excepting sorghum) shall be One shilling per inch per acre.

The rate or price to be charged for water for the irrigation of sorghum shall be One shilling per inch per acre for the first watering, and Sixpence per inch per acre for each successive watering for the same crop.

The rate or price to be charged for water for the irrigation of lucerne shall be Sixpence per inch per acre.

7. The rate or price to be charged for water for filling tanks or water-holes shall be One pound for any tank or water-hole of a capacity not exceeding 1,000 cubic yards for the first filling in each year, and Ten shillings for each successive filling in the same year. For any tank or water-hole of a capacity exceeding 1,000 cubic yards, the charge shall be One pound for each additional 1,000 cubic yards or portion of 1,000 cubic yards.

8. The minimum charge or price to be paid for any water supplied shall be Ten shillings.

Pumping from Lakes under control of the Trust, namely:—Lak^c Meering and Little Lake Meering.

9. No person shall pump water from the lakes for irrigation purposes without a yearly licence from the Trust, and such licence shall give the right to pump surplus water only.

10. The charge for a pumping licence shall be Two pounds ten shillings for any pump not exceeding 10 inches in diameter, and for any pump exceeding 10 inches in diameter the charge shall be Three pounds.

11. Surplus water shall mean any water above a depth of 10 feet in the deepest part of the lakes.

12. No holder of a pumping licence shall pump water on any lands excepting his or her own without the special permission, in writing, of the Trust, and under the supervision of the Trust's water bailiff.

13. All lands within the Trust's district watered by the holders of pumping licences shall be charged the rate or price of Fourpence per inch per acre, and shall be paid to the Trust by the holder of the land on to which the water is pumped. The land-holder shall also pay the hire of pumping plant and all expenses in connexion therewith to the owner of the pumping plant.

14. All pumping licences shall terminate on the 31st day of December in each year.

15. The Trust reserves to itself the right to cancel all or any pumping licence for breach of the foregoing Regulation.

16. Any person or persons pumping from the lakes without a licence may be prosecuted at law.

17. The penalty that may be imposed for any breach of this Regulation shall be a sum not exceeding Fifty pounds.

18. That Regulation No. 1, providing for the sale of water, made by the Wandella Irrigation and Water Supply Trust on the 5th day of April, 1897, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 6th day of July, 1897, shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

1. 2. All water shall be supplied through properly constructed outlets, which shall be fixed in any part of a channel approved by the Commissioners.

3. The Trust reserves to itself the right to fix the quantity of water, from time to time, which shall be supplied to every 320 acres or fractional part thereof.

4. The manipulation of the works shall be solely in the hands of the Trust officers, who shall turn the water on and off, and any other person not being duly authorized who shall in any way interfere, tamper with, or damage any of the works shall be deemed to be guilty of a breach of this Regulation, and the Trust may prosecute such person according to law.

5. The water bailiff shall supply water to each land-holder in succession, and no person shall be supplied out of his turn, excepting when surplus water is available, when applicants shall be supplied in order of application for surplus water.

6. The rate or price to be charged for water supplied for the irrigation of natural or artificial grasses or lucerne or sorghum shall be Sixpence per inch per acre.

7. The rate or price to be charged for water for the irrigation of any kind of cereal crops or fallow land shall be One shilling per inch per acre for the first watering and Sixpence per inch per acre for the second or any subsequent watering of the same crop.

8. The minimum rate or charge for any water supplied shall be Ten shillings.

The foregoing Regulation was made by the Commissioners of the South Kerang Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, under and by virtue of the Water Acts, this 15th day of March, 1902.

CLAUSES 1 AND 13 OF REGULATION No. VI. OF THE REGULATIONS UNDER THE EDUCATION ACT 1890 AND THE TEACHERS ACT 1893 RESCINDED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-ninth day of April, 1902.

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

WHEREAS by section 23 of the Education Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1036) and section 13 of the Teachers Act 1893 (56 Vict. No. 1302) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Acts into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth by this Order rescind Clauses 1 and 13 of Regulation No. VI. of the Regulations made by Order in Council dated the 24th day of September, 1900, and doth make the Regulations following in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATION VI.

1. Candidates for appointment as pupil teachers must if boys be not less than fourteen years of age and if girls not less than fifteen years of age, and must furnish satisfactory evidence of aptitude for teaching. Prior to appointment candidates must furnish certificates of good character, of sound constitution, and of freedom from any physical defect likely to impair their usefulness as teachers; and (1) must have passed in reading, comprehension and history, spelling and composition, writing, arithmetic, grammar, geography, and drawing as prescribed for the Sixth Class in the course of Free Instruction (Regulation I.); or (2) must have passed the Matriculation Examination of the University of Melbourne; or (3) have been the holders of State School scholarships. Girls must have passed also in needlework, as prescribed for the Sixth Class in the course of Free Instruction (Regulation I.). Candidates under (2) and (3) must have passed in Drawing as above.

13. The conditions and mode of filling up vacancies for monitors shall, so far as they are applicable, be the same as those prescribed in sections 3, 4, and 4 (a) *supra* for filling up vacancies for pupil teachers.

And the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers hereinbefore recited, doth hereby make the following addition to the Regulations made under the above-mentioned Acts, that is to say:—

REGULATION VI.

4 (a). In recording the order of merit of candidates at all competitive examinations of pupil teachers and monitors the male and female candidates respectively shall be shown on separate lists, and appointments shall be made from either list, according as the Director may determine that a male or female pupil teacher or monitor is required.

And the Honorable William Gurr, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the *Police Offences Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1126) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Act to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such Proclamation; and that upon any such Proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby extend the provisions of Part I. of the *Police Offences Act 1890* aforesaid to the whole of the Shire of Euroa.

TENDERS will be received until Eleven o'clock a.m. on Tuesday, 13th May, 1902, from persons willing to furnish School Books, Maps, and other Requisites in such quantities as may be ordered by the Victorian Government for a period of two years, commencing 1st July, 1902, as per Schedule No. 41.

Security, 10 per cent. on total amount of tender accepted, but in no case will security of less than £5 be received.

Schedule as above, giving an estimate of the articles required, and printed forms of tender, may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

The total amount of tender must be stated in words as well as in figures.

Tenders having alterations or erasures therein will not be entertained.

Tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit of £5 in bank notes, or a bank draft in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

Security will be required, either in Victorian Government debentures, Savings Bank Deposit Book, or Bank Deposit Receipt in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised or another tender accepted.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of the tender.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for School Books, Maps, and other Requisites" written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne, or, if sent by post, they must be prepaid and addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample, where so stated, and of the particular description indicated in the schedule of tenders. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture.

3. The value of all packages, cases, &c., whether bulk, be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, &c. The net quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores, and the stores shall be packed in such a manner as shall secure them from injury during transit, and until delivery such stores shall be at the risk of the contractor.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the Education Department. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of this contract, Melbourne will include a radius of 6 miles from the General Post Office. The cost of all postage, however, shall be defrayed, and printed forms required under the contract shall be supplied by the Education Department.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the Secretary for Education or such other officer whom he may appoint.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. All orders shall be returned to the Education Department at the end of each month, accompanied by an account under the Audit Act and Regulations for the articles supplied during the month, and, on receipt of same, the contractor shall be entitled to payment when receipts, showing the due delivery of the goods, have been received from the teacher, due time being allowed for the examination and verification of the claim.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. All goods forwarded under this contract shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor by whom consigned.

11. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any school, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 15 of these conditions.

12. An invoice of each parcel shall be by the contractor forwarded by post to the teacher to whom each parcel is directed, together with a form of receipt for him to sign and return. The production of the receipt given by the teacher shall be considered sufficient proof of the delivery of the goods, but should the teacher fail to return the receipt within a reasonable time the payment to the contractor shall not be delayed on that account provided he can produce evidence to the satisfaction of the Secretary of the Education Department for the time being of the delivery of such parcel.

13. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in Condition 7.

14. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Condition 7.

15. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in Condition 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money.

16. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

17. Should an increase or reduction take place in the prices at present charged for books and school requisites contained in the said schedule hereto by the publishers or manufacturers, a corresponding increase or reduction shall be made to or by the contractors in the prices of the articles supplied by them. In case of any disagreement as to the amount of increase or reduction the same shall be decided and settled by the Secretary of the Education Department.

18. It will be competent either for the contractor, on his own behalf, or for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, to terminate the contract, by giving six full calendar months' notice, in writing, to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made, and under no other circumstances will the contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

19. Should the Minister of Public Instruction for the time being decide to discontinue the use of any book, map, or any other article in the schedule, or to direct that any book, map, or any other article, other than those enumerated therein be taken into use, he shall at any time give six months' notice of such intention or decision to the contractor, and after the expiration of the period of such notice the Education Department shall not be bound to take any further supply of such book, map, or any other article, nor shall the contractor be bound to supply the same, and all books or maps not in the schedule but which it may be decided to introduce shall be supplied by the contractor after expiration of such notice at a price to be agreed on between the Minister of Public Instruction for the time being and the contractor.

2. Supplies for country stations for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

3. 4. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter cases, hogsheds, butter tins, or boxes, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. 5. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under proper authorized inspection and supervision. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, on report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

6. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department concerned or any officer authorized by him.

7. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

8. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.

9. If the officer in charge of stores be not satisfied as to the quantity or quality of the stores, or if after taking delivery of any stores or material, he shall discover any deficiency or defect therein, he may return such deficient or defective stores or material to the contractor, and shall report the same to the head of his department and to the Tender Board.

10. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the Treasurer of the State for the time being; and the decision of the board is to be considered final. 12. 13. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will be competent for a board of survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. 14. As the exact quantity of any article of provisions which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

15. Every person driving or riding a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the carriage-way, and whomever any such person shall overtake with such machine any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle (excepting any tramcar) or any horse or other beast of burden, such person shall keep such machine to the right or outside of such vehicle, or horse, or other beast of burden.
5. No person shall drive, ride, or impel a machine along or across any street or any public thoroughfare furiously or negligently, or at such a rate of speed as to endanger the safety of, or injure, any person, vehicle, or property in the street or thoroughfare along or across which such machine is being driven, ridden, or impelled.
6. No person shall ride, drive, or impel any machine along any street, or any other public thoroughfare, in such a manner or in such order that more than two machines shall be travelling side by side in the same direction, except when such machines shall form part of a duly authorized parade or procession.
7. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable, on conviction thereof, to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.
