## AMENDED REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE MARKING OF LOAD LINE ON SHIPS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on it by the Marine Acts the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria in Council, doth hereby repeal the Regulations numbered 4 and 13 of the Regulations known as "The Regulations relating to the marking of Load Lines," made by the Board on the 3rd day of September, 1897, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 1st day of October, 1897, and also the Forms L.L.2, L.L.2a, L.L.3, L.L.3a, and L.L.3b in the schedule to the said Regulations, contained to the extent hereinafter indicated, and in lieu thereof respectively doth hereby make the Regulations and Amendments following, that is to say:—

1. From and after the coming into operation of these Regulations for Regulation numbered 4 of "The Regulations relating to the marking of Load Lines" there shall be substituted the following Regulation, namely:—

4. *Maximum Load Lines.*—Such maximum Load Lines shall be as follows, and the upper edge of such lines shall respectively indicate:—

For fresh water.—The maximum depth to which the vessel can be loaded in fresh water.

For Indian summer.—The maximum depth to which the vessel can be loaded for voyages during the fine season in the Indian seas, between the limits of Suez and Singapore.

For summer.—The maximum depth to which the vessel can be loaded for voyages (other than Indian summer voyages) from European and Mediterranean ports between the months of April and September, both inclusive, and as to voyages in other parts of the world (other than Indian summer voyages) the maximum depth to which the vessel can be loaded during the corresponding or recognised summer months.

For winter.—The maximum depth to which the vessel can be loaded for voyages (other than Indian summer voyages and summer voyages) from European and Mediterranean ports between the months of October and March, both inclusive, and as to voyages in other parts of the world the maximum depth to which the vessel can be loaded during the corresponding or recognised winter months.

For winter (North Atlantic).—The maximum depth to which the vessel can be loaded for voyages to or from the Mediterranean or any European port, from or to ports in British North America or Eastern ports in the United States, north of Cape Hatteras, between the months of October and March, both inclusive.

Such maximum Load Lines shall be distinguished by initial letters conspicuously marked opposite such horizontal lines as aforesaid, such initial letters being as follows :—

- F.W.—Fresh water.
- I.S.—Indian summer.
- S.—Summer.
- W.—Winter.
- W.,N.A.—Winter, North Atlantic.

2. From and after the coming into operation of these Regulations for Regulation numbered 13 of "The Regulations relating to the marking of Load Lines," there shall be substituted the following Regulation, namely :—

13. *Expiration of Certificates.*—On a certificate of approval ceasing to have effect, application shall at once be made by the registered managing owner of the ship for the granting of a new certificate of approval, and the old certificate shall be delivered up to the Marine Board, who shall cancel the same. In default of a certificate which has ceased to have effect, being handed in for cancellation, it shall be competent for an officer of the Marine Board to notify any Collector of Customs that such certificate is no longer valid, and for any Collector on receiving such notice to refuse clearance to the vessel in question.

3. From and after the coming into operation of these Regulations for the Note to the Forms L.L.2., L.L.2B., L.L.3., L.L.3A., and L.L.3B in the Schedule to "The Regulations relating to the marking of Load Lines" that—

"The *freeboard for Winter, North Atlantic trades*, applies to vessels sailing to or from the Mediterranean or any British or European port, and which may sail to or from or call at ports in British North America or eastern ports in the United States, the entrance to which from the sea or the entrance from the sea to the estuary or river on which such ports may be situated, is north of 37° 30' north latitude, from October to March inclusive."

there shall be substituted the following Note :—

"The *freeboard for Winter, North Atlantic trades*, applies to vessels sailing to or from the Mediterranean or any British or European port, and which may sail to or from or call at ports in British North America, or eastern ports in the United States, north of Cape Hatteras, from October to March, inclusive."

4. These Regulations shall come into operation on the first day of June, 1902.

The foregoing amended Regulations and Schedule were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria, held this second day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and two.

## VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

## BY-LAW No. 157.

**T**HE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONER, under the powers conferred by the Railways Acts, hereby makes the following By-law :—

1. The master of every vessel lying alongside or moored to any pier vested in the Victorian Railways Commissioner shall provide and maintain, or cause to be provided and maintained; for the use of persons coming from or going on board such vessel a good and sufficient staging properly secured.

2. In the case of steamers in which passengers are or are intended to be carried the staging to be provided and maintained shall be at least 2ft. 6in. broad, and in the case of other steamers and of sailing and other vessels at least 2 feet broad, and shall be of a length that will overlap the pier at one end and the vessel's side at the other to an extent sufficient to insure its stability, and shall be constructed of planking not less than 2 inches thick, with cross battens at suitable intervals, and unless otherwise securely fenced shall be provided with hand-rails or guide-ropes at each side from the vessel to the pier supported by wooden or iron stanchions not less than 3 feet high.

3. The master of every vessel as aforesaid shall provide and maintain, or cause to be provided and maintained, in connexion with and beneath every stage used by persons coming from or going on board such vessel, and extending between the vessel and the pier, a good and sufficient rope netting of such dimensions and so constructed and placed and so secured to the pier and vessel respectively as to prevent persons who use such stage and fall therefrom from falling into the water.

4. The Master of every vessel as aforesaid shall provide and keep lit, or cause to be provided and kept lit, between the hours of sunset and sunrise, a good and sufficient light at each stage used by persons coming from or going on board such vessel.

5. The Pier Master or the Officer of the Commissioner for the time being in charge of the pier shall be the judge of the sufficiency as regards construction, disposition, and otherwise of any stage net or light required to be provided or maintained under this By-law.

6. Any person committing a breach or failing to comply with the provisions of this By-law shall be subject to a penalty of Ten pounds, which is hereby imposed to be recovered in a summary manner before Justices.

7. In this By-law the words following shall include the meaning hereby respectively assigned to them.

"Master" when used in connexion with a vessel shall include the person for the time being in charge of such vessel.

"Pier" shall include wharf and jetty.

"Vessel" shall include every description of navigable vessel, whether possessing independent motive power or means of propelling itself, or not of a greater burden than Fifty tons, calculated in accordance with the provisions of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1899*.

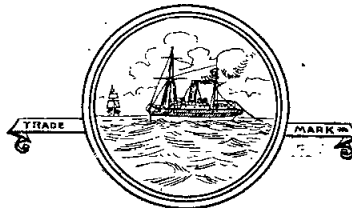

*Health Act 1890.*  
SHIRE OF AVON.  
BY-LAW No. 2.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Avon, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution, do hereby make the By-law following, that is to say:—

1. In the construction and for the purpose of this By-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them:—

"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

2. Part 3 of this council's by-law, made by virtue of the powers contained in the *Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, and numbered 1, shall be and is hereby repealed.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the part or in the places within the jurisdiction of the Avon Shire Council as follows, that is to say:—Within the surveyed boundaries of the township of Stratford, parish of Stratford, county of Tanjil.

4. This By-law shall come into operation immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

5. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy, except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable building, the floor of which is at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pans. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy, shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

6. The ordinary system of pans for night-soil is abolished.

7. Instead thereof every house shall be provided with a privy or closet, and shall be forthwith furnished with a double-pan service.

8. The pans for such service shall be supplied by the council, and every occupier shall permit such pans to be placed in every such closet, and the cost of same must be defrayed by the occupier.

9. Every householder shall use and cause to be placed for use in every such closet a suitable and effectual disinfectant or deodorant.

10. No householder or occupier shall contract with any person or persons for the removal of night-soil or permit or cause same to be removed by any person or persons, save and except the person or persons in that behalf appointed from time to time by the said council, and such pan or pans shall be removed and emptied as the council may direct, and the contents deposited in such manner and place as authorized by such council.

11. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall once at least every week allow each pan to be removed for cleansing purposes.

12. This council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil, to make a charge on each occupier for such double-pan service as specified in this By-law, and for pans supplied, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any court of petty sessions.

13. If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this By-law he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and a further penalty of not more than Five pounds, or less than Five shillings, for every day such offence is continued after any conviction.

DENTAL BOARD OF VICTORIA.  
REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE COURSE OF PROFESSIONAL STUDY.

WHEREAS under section 16 of the *Dentists Act 1898* the Dental Board of Victoria may, with the consent and approval of the Governor in Council, make regulations prescribing the course of study, professional practice, training, and examination of persons desiring to obtain certificates of fitness or diplomas entitling them to practice Dental Surgery or Dentistry.

And whereas under clause VII., section C, of the Regulations as regards the course of professional study made by the Dental Board of Victoria on the 28th day of April, 1889, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 8th day of May, 1899, students shall during their fourth year attend the course of practical laboratory work in dental mechanics and metallurgy at the Australian College of Dentistry, or at such other public educational institution as may from time to time be prescribed by regulation for the purpose, the Board does now hereby prescribe the Working Men's College as a public educational institution for such course of practical laboratory work in metallurgy.

The foregoing Regulation was made and passed at a meeting of the Dental Board of Victoria held on the 25th day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and two.

Commencing at a point on the east boundary of said allotment 12D distant nine chains seventeen links and the seven-tenths of a link north thirty-nine degrees forty-eight minutes west from the south east corner thereof; thence by other part of said allotment 12D for twelve chains eighty-seven links and the four-tenths of a link in a straight line bearing north fifty-five degrees west, for four chains ninety-five links and the two-tenths of a link in a straight line bearing north seventy-eight degrees five minutes west, for three chains thirty-seven links in a straight line bearing north eighty-five degrees west, for seven chains forty-six links in a straight line bearing south seventy-eight degrees thirty-five minutes west, and for five chains seventy-eight links in a straight line bearing north twenty-eight degrees two minutes west to a point on the south side of the road intersecting the said allotment 12D in an east and west direction: thence by that road for one chain ninety-four links and the five-tenths of a link in a straight line bearing north eighty-seven degrees forty-seven minutes east, for eight chains twenty-nine links in a straight line bearing north seventy-three degrees twenty-five minutes east, and for eight chains fourteen links in a straight line bearing south seventy-four degrees thirty-six minutes east to the north-west corner of the shire reserve; thence by the west, south, and part of the east boundaries of the said shire reserve respectively for four chains in a straight line bearing south fifteen degrees twenty-four minutes west, for two chains fifty links in a straight line bearing south seventy-four degrees thirty-six minutes east, and for one chain in a straight line bearing north fifteen degrees twenty-four minutes east; thence by other part of said allotment 12D for one chain fifty links in a straight line bearing south seventy-four degrees thirty-six minutes east, for two chains thirteen links and the three-tenths of a link in a straight line bearing south fifteen degrees twenty-four minutes west, and for nine chains sixty-one links in a straight line bearing south fifty-five degrees east to another point on the aforesaid east boundary of said allotment 12D; and thence by a two-chain road forming the said east boundary for thirty-five links and the six-tenths of a link in a straight line bearing south ten degrees twenty-four minutes east and for ninety-five links and the three-tenths of a link in a straight line bearing south thirty-nine degrees forty-eight minutes east to the point of commencement.

Land Act 1901.

AREAS OF LANDS INCREASED AND DIMINISHED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1901 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1901, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 7) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said Land Act as lands which may be sold by auction (class 7 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in Division 6 of Part I. of the Land Act 1901 aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said Act as land which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, and 11 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1901 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

The prices must be expressed without alterations or erasures, in words as well as in figures, and the total amount of the tender stated without any percentage or other reductions.

Printed forms of tender, showing the estimated monthly consumption, and the conditions of contract, may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, Melbourne; for the respective districts from the Receivers and Paymasters at Geelong, Ararat, Ballarat, Beechworth, Bendigo, Castlemaine, Maryborough, and Sale; for Sunbury, from the Medical Superintendent, Hospital for the Insane; and for Queenscliff for Naval Forces only, from the Officer Commanding Victoria Regiment, Royal Australian Artillery, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

Security will be required, either in Victorian Government debentures, Savings Bank Deposit Book, or Bank Deposit Receipt, in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

Tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. #### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. Supplies for country stations for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

3. The Melbourne District will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; Williamstown District will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra, and all Government vessels which may be in Hobson's Bay during the currency of the contract; the Ararat, Beechworth, and Ballarat Districts will include the Hospitals for the Insane, Gaols, Police Gaols, and Lock-ups at these places; and the Geelong District embraces a radius of two miles from the Post Office.

The lock-ups at City Watch-House, Bourke-street West, Brunswick, Carlton, Coburg, Collingwood, Fitzroy, Fitzroy North, Hotham Hill, Little Bourke-street, North Melbourne, Port Melbourne, Prahran, Richmond, St. Kilda, South Melbourne, and South Yarra are included in the contracts for the Melbourne District.

4. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter cases, hogsheds, butter firkins or boxes, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed from the place of delivery at the contractor's expense.

5. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under proper authorized inspection and supervision. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, on report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

6. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department concerned or any officer authorized by him.

7. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

8. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.

9. If the officer in charge of stores be not satisfied as to the quantity or quality of the stores, or if after taking delivery of any stores or material, he shall discover any deficiency or defect therein, he may return such deficient or defective stores or material to the contractor, and shall report the same to the head of his department and to the Tender Board.

10. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the Treasurer of the State for the time being; and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 8.

11. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 8.

12. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a board of survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.

13. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will be competent for a board of survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the State for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required or any like supplies suitable for the service may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

14. As the exact quantity of any article of provisions which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

15. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be obtained by the officer requiring it. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

16. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 8. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

17. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. 18. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

19. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board to terminate the contract, without notice, should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate improperly with a prisoner.

20. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat, or on account of the Federal or other Governments, or for supplies to the aborigines; or by the consumption of the produce or surplus stock of any Government establishment, or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment.

21. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in this contract, the Government or the contractor (as the case may be) may give two months' notice, through the Secretary to the Tender Board, of the termination of the contract for the particular item or items so affected to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made. 22. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clause 21 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

23. 24. Where specially indicated in the schedules no subletting will be allowed, and no delivery shall be made on Sundays; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of

employment of any person engaged in the preparation or manufacture of the articles tendered for in those schedules, or engaged in the delivery of or in any other way in connexion with the supply of the articles tendered for in those schedules, are not to exceed forty-eight per week (unless otherwise stated in the schedules), and every such person shall be paid at the minimum wage specified in the schedules concerned; and a copy of the labour condition, as indorsed on the schedules affected, shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, in the factory, shop, or dairy (and in each part of the factory, shop, or dairy where several rooms are in use) in which goods are prepared or manufactured under these contracts. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulet, not exceeding £50 (Fifty pounds), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.
