PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Public Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz. :—

THURSDAY, THE 26TH DAY OF JUNE, 1902, throughout Victoria (Coronation Day).

PORT NICHOLSON.—WELLINGTON HARBOR.

REFERRING to Notice to Mariners No. 21 of 1902, issued by this Department on the 25th March last, it is hereby further notified that two small patches have been found with a least depth of 25 feet at L.W.O.S., and 29 feet and 30 feet on each side of these patches. The diver who examined these patches reports that the bottom was covered with a crust about a foot thick, and underneath this crust were shells mixed with soft stuff like quicksand. The following magnetic bearings will mark the position of the shoals, which are exactly one cable apart from one another:—

VITAL STATISTICS OF BALLARAT AND SUBURBS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF APRIL, 1902.

THE births of 65 boys and 55 girls, or in all of 120 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of April. Of these, 51 occurred in Ballarat East, 61 in Ballarat West, 6 in Sebastopol, and 2 in the outlying districts; included were 6 illegitimate births and 3 cases of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 106, viz., 52 of boys and 54 of girls.

The deaths registered in April numbered 82, viz., 45 of males and 37 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 38. In March the recorded deaths numbered 103; in April, 1901, they numbered 75; in April, 1900, they numbered 89; in April, 1899, they numbered 67; in April, 1898, they numbered 96; in April, 1897, they numbered 56; in April, 1896, they numbered 71; in April, 1895, they numbered 62; in April, 1894, they numbered 76; in April, 1893, they numbered 81; and in April, 1892, they numbered 82.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

In the previous month these proportions were:—Males and females, 61 and 39 per cent.; under and over five years, 37 and 63 per cent. respectively.

Fifteen deaths, or 18 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—Ballarat Hospital, 13; Benevolent Asylum, 1; Lunatic Asylum, 1.

THE number of births registered during the month of April in all the Bendigo Districts was 149; of these, 83 were of males and 66 of females; included were 13 illegitimate births, and 2 cases of twins. In the previous month the registered births numbered 83, viz., 41 of males and 42 of females.

The number of deaths registered during the month was 104, viz., 60 of males and 44 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 45. In the previous month the recorded deaths numbered 71; in the month of April, 1901, they numbered 102; in the month of April, 1900, they numbered 66; in the month of April, 1899, they numbered 85; in the month of April, 1898, they numbered 101; in the month of April, 1897, they numbered 83; in the month of April, 1896, they numbered 97; in the month of April, 1895, they numbered 92; in the month of April, 1894, they numbered 74; in the month of April, 1893, they numbered 76; and in the month of April, 1892, they numbered 86.

Of the registered births 113 occurred within the city of Bendigo and 36 in the surrounding districts. Of the deaths registered 85 took place within and 19 without the city.

The following table shows the number of deaths registered in each district, distinguishing those of males and females and those of persons under and over five years of age:—

Of the 104 deaths registered during the month, 34, or 33 per cent., were of children under five years of age, and 70, or 67 per cent., were of persons beyond that age. In the previous month these proportions were respectively 39 and 61 per cent.

Sixteen deaths, or 15 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—Bendigo Hospital, 12; Benevolent Asylum, 4.

NOTE.—The final figures for the Census of the population taken on the 31st March, 1901, show the actual population of the State on that date to have been 1,201,341 persons, consisting of 603,884 males and 597,457 females.

During the year 1901 the number of births was 31,008, or 229 more, and the number of deaths 15,904, or 689 more than in the preceding year. The natural increase was thus 15,104, or 460 less than in the previous year.

The recorded arrivals by sea numbered 93,107, and the recorded departures 90,126; the former being 10,950 more, and the latter 6,442 more than in 1900. The net recorded gain by immigration was thus 2,981, as against a recorded loss by emigration of 1,527 in the preceding year. The allowance for unrecorded departures, however, converts this gain into an estimated loss during the year of 3,605, consisting of 2,045 males and 1,560 females, as shown in the table, as against an estimated loss of 3,706 in 1900.

The total recorded increase of population was 18,085, as against 11,037 in the previous year. After allowing, however, for unrecorded departures (estimated), the net increase for the year was 11,499, consisting of 4,796 males and 6,703 females, as compared with that of 6,858 in 1900.

In regard to the origin or destination of migrants, the records show a net loss of 3,151 to other States of the Commonwealth, but a net gain of 6,132 from other countries. The former resulted from an apparent net loss of 1,529 to New South Wales, of 322 to Queensland, and to 5,333 to Western Australia, less a net gain of 1,186 from South Australia, and of 2,847 from Tasmania. The latter was made up of a gain of 3,083 from the United Kingdom, 1,070 from South Africa, 1,101 from Other British Dominions, and 1,442 from Foreign Ports, less a loss of 440 to New Zealand, and 124 to the South Seas.

Special attention is again directed to the misleading character of the Victorian migration returns as between that and other States individually. The emigration, for example, to Western Australia consists not only of Victorians, but also of emigrants from New South Wales, Queensland, Tasmania, and New Zealand, travelling in vessels which happen to call in at the port of Melbourne on the voyage.

The recorded net emigration to Western Australia—not only from Victoria, but practically from the whole of Eastern Australasia—during the last twelve years was as follows:—786 in 1890, 1,960 in 1891, 1,714 in 1892, 2,255 in 1893, 10,145 in 1894, 11,127 in 1895, 24,497 in 1896, 11,195 in 1897, 817 in 1898, 2,938 in 1900, and 5,333 in 1901; and that to South Africa in the last seven years was as follows:—1,388 in 1895, 2,881 in 1896, 746 in 1897, 130 in 1898, 198 in 1899, and 1,767 in 1900. In only the years 1899 and 1901 did the tide of migration turn in our favour to the extent of 104 and 1,070 persons respectively. The emigration to South Africa was, however, swollen by the inclusion of soldiers bound for the seat of war; up to the 30th June, 1901, over 12,800 soldiers left the Eastern States and New Zealand, of whom about 6,000 returned, and a large proportion of these passed through Melbourne.

Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1850*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF THE MISSES DECKER, DRESS-MAKERS, GILLMAN-STREET, MALVERN,

for a period of one week from the 21st May, 1902, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than three females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said three females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.

2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
 3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
 4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
 5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

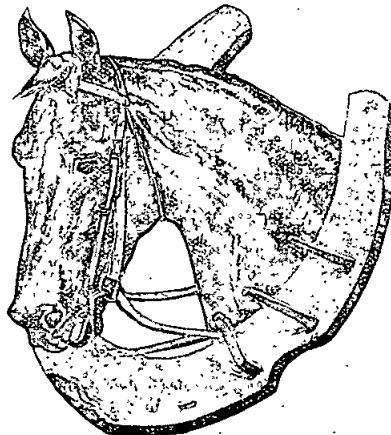

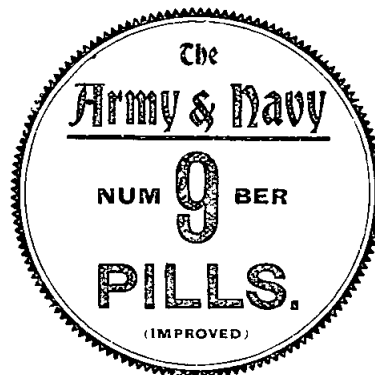

The births of 1,102 children, viz., 571 boys and 531 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of April. The number was, it will be observed, higher than in any previous corresponding month since 1894, and was 34 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but 39 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in April numbered 589, viz., 320 of males and 269 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 513, or 87 per cent., as against 86 per cent. in April, 1901, and 84 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, 64 more than in April, 1901, and the highest recorded for the month during the previous ten years, except 1892, 1893, and 1898. It was also 8 above the average of April during that period, but 32 below it, allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 26.73 and of deaths registered to 14.29 per annum, as compared respectively with averages of the same month in 1901 of 24.11 and 12.93, with averages of the month during the last ten years of 27.41 and 15.02, and with averages of the year 1901 of 24.85 and 15.09.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 88.2° on the 19th, and the lowest was 43.9° on the 12th. The mean temperature of the month (57.8°) was three-tenths of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (36.4°) took place on the 19th, and the least range (4.9°) on the 26th. The mean daily range was 17.6°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.387 inches on the 11th, and the lowest was 29.802 inches on the 25th. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.086 inches) was one-ninth of an inch above the average.

Rain fell on five days, the amount being .57 of an inch, which was 2.56 inches below the average of the month for the previous ten years.

The mean humidity of the month was 74%.

Males contributed 51 per cent. and females 46 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 21 per cent. to that mortality, as against similar proportions in April, 1901 and 1900; 30 per cent. in April, 1899; 40 per cent. in April, 1893; 31 per cent. in April, 1897; 32 per cent. in April, 1896; 31 per cent. in April, 1895; 31 per cent. in 1894; 41 per cent. in 1893; and 33 per cent. in 1892.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 111, as compared with 99 in April, 1901. The rate of infantile mortality was only 101 per 1,000 births registered in the month under review, as compared with 101 in April, 1901; 97 in April, 1900; 131 in April, 1893; 171 in April, 1898; 107 in April, 1897; 103 in April, 1896; 107 in April, 1895; 120 in April, 1894; 145 in April, 1893; and 140 in April, 1892.

Sixty-four persons—as against 69 in April, 1901—whose deaths were recorded during the month, had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these, an orchardist, and a female, each aged 75, died of cancer; two females, each aged 75, of phthisis and apoplexy respectively; a gentleman, aged 73, of bronchitis; an accountant, aged 75, of pneumonia; a female, aged 75, of Bright's

disease; a ship-smith and a lamp trimmer, each aged 75, of cystitis; three females each aged 76, of dysentery, congestion of the brain, and valvular disease of the heart respectively; a pensioner, aged 76, of heart disease; a male, of no occupation, aged 76, of bronchitis; two females, each aged 76, of pneumonia and gangrene of lungs respectively; a jam-maker, aged 76, of Bright's disease; a school teacher, aged 77, of obstruction of the intestines; a female, aged 77, of congestion of the liver; a contractor, aged 77, of chronic nephritis; a gentleman, aged 77, of cystitis; a female, aged 78, of syncope; a draper, aged 78, of bronchitis; two females, each aged 79, of hemiplegia and insanity respectively; a labourer, aged 82, of cancer; a female, aged 82, of syncope; a farmer, aged 82, of paralysis; a gentleman, aged 82, of disease of the brain; a labourer, aged 83, of heart disease; a female, aged 83, of bronchitis; a medical practitioner, aged 83, of cancer; a carrier, aged 84, of bronchitis; a female, aged 85, of burns; another, aged 86, of syncope; a labourer, aged 86, of asthma; a stonemason, aged 86, of bronchitis; a distiller, aged 87, of heart disease; a female, aged 87, of bronchitis; a labourer, aged 87, of Bright's disease; a female, aged 88, of cancer; a gentleman, aged 88, of fracture of the hip; a market gardener, aged 91, of heart disease; a gentleman, aged 75, two females, each aged 77, two females, each aged 78, a baker and two females, each aged 79, a female, aged 80, a groom and a female, each aged 81, a grazier, aged 82, five females, aged 83, 85, 86, 86, and 87 respectively, a gentleman and a female, each aged 88, and a female, aged 90, of old age.

Twenty-eight of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 30 in April, 1901—were from external causes, of which 21 were set down to accident, 2 to homicide, 4 to suicide, and 1 to execution. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A farmer, aged 71, died of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall from a cart; a railway employe, aged 47, of injuries, caused by a fall in the street; a female, aged 69, of fracture of femur, consequent on a fall; a labourer, aged 17, of injuries, caused by an explosion of acetylene gas; a labourer, aged 42, of fracture of the skull; a porter, aged 45, of laceration of the brain; a gentleman, aged 88, of fracture of the hip; a female, aged 39, of traumatic tetanus; a female, aged 85, of burns; a boy, aged 7, was drowned by falling into the River Yarra; a butcher's employe, aged 31, by the upsetting of a boat in Hobson's Bay; six persons were found drowned, viz., a baker, aged 38, a painter, aged 49, and a female, aged 40, in the River Yarra; a male of unknown occupation, aged 45, in the Saltwater River; a male of no occupation, aged 40, and a pensioner, aged 66, in Hobson's Bay; a female, aged 53, was accidentally suffocated; a male infant, aged six days, and a female, aged two weeks, were overlain; and a male infant, aged two weeks, died of umbilical hemorrhage. The homicidal deaths were those of a new-born male infant, who was suffocated, a verdict of wilful murder being returned; and a male infant, aged ten weeks, who was found suffocated. The suicidal deaths were those of a gentleman, aged 58, and a female, aged 63, who cut their throats; a scavenger, aged 44, and a carter, aged 51, who hanged themselves. The execution was that of an engine-fitter, aged 39, who was hanged in the Melbourne Gaol.

One hundred and forty-seven deaths, or 25 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—49 in the Melbourne, 21 in the Alfred, 5 in St. Vincent's, 8 in the Women's, 6 in the Children's, 6 in the Homeopathic, and 7 in the Austin Hospitals; 9 in the Metropolitan, and 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum; 9 in the Immigrants' Home; 10 in the Benevolent and 1 in Infant Asylum; 1 in Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor; 5 in the Protestant Refuge; 1 in the Deaf and Dumb Asylum; 1 in the Melbourne Gaol; and 1 in Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 141, of which 69, or 49 per cent., were of males, and 72, or 51 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 111 were under one year of age, 19 were between one and two, 3 were between two and three, 2 were between three and four, and 1 was between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 443. Of these 251, or 56 per cent., were males, and 197, or 44 per cent., were females; 16 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 11 were between fifteen and twenty, 17 were between twenty and twenty-five, 21 were between twenty-five and thirty, 24 were between thirty and thirty-five, 39 were between thirty-five and forty, 39 were between forty and forty-five, 28 were between forty-five and fifty, 33 were between fifty and fifty-five, 19 were between fifty-five and sixty, 32 were between sixty and sixty-five, 48 were between sixty-five and seventy, 50 were between seventy and seventy-five, 33 were between seventy-five and eighty, 16 were between eighty and eighty-five, 13 were between eighty-five and ninety, 1 at ninety-one, and 1 at ninety-six.

As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, there was an increase of 24 deaths under zymotic, 5 under dietic, 8 under constitutional, and 59 under local diseases; whilst there was a decrease of 2 under parasitic, 7 under developmental diseases, 2 under violence, and 21 under ill-defined causes—chiefly debility. Under the zymotic class, deaths from whooping-cough and diphtheria rose in each case from 1 to 6, those from venereal diseases from 2 to 8, and those from septic diseases from 1 to 8, but those from typhoid fever fell from 14 to 10. Under the constitutional class, deaths from cancer rose from 27 to 39, and those from phthisis from 58 to 62, but those from tuberculosis fell from 9 to 5. Under the local class, deaths from diseases of the respiratory system increased by 14, those from diseases of the digestive system by 35—chiefly enteritis; those from diseases of the urinary system by 11, those from diseases of the organs of generation by 3, and those from diseases of parturition by 4; whilst those from diseases of the nervous and circulatory systems diminished in each case by 4.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1892 to 1901, and the first four months of 1902, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality from both causes during the month was below the average.
