#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1531), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Half-Holidays, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon on each day, at the places respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

WEDNESDAY, THE 4TH DAY OF JUNE, 1902, at Avoca; and

WEDNESDAY, THE 18TH DAY OF JUNE, 1902, at Ararat.

### Factories and Shops Acts.

#### REGULATION OF SHOES FOR THE SALE OF COOKED MEATS IN THE CITY OF RICHMOND.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-sixth day of May, 1902.

#### PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations to have effect within any specified municipal district, or any specified part of such district, for, amongst other things, permitting shops of any particular class not included in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* to keep open after the hours mentioned in the said Factories and Shops Acts, provided a petition shall have been previously addressed to the Governor in Council and forwarded to the Minister, certified to by the municipal clerk as having been signed by a majority of the shopkeepers keeping shops of the particular class to be affected within the locality affected: And whereas a petition has been so addressed and forwarded praying that in the City of Richmond all shops for the sale of cooked meats (such shops being shops not included in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* aforesaid) may be permitted to keep open until Ten o'clock on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, and until Eleven o'clock on the evening of Saturday in each and every week: And whereas such petition has been certified to by the municipal clerk of the said district as having been signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers keeping shops of such class in the City of Richmond: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

I shall be lawful for any shop for the sale of cooked meats in the City of Richmond to keep open on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday in each week from Seven o'clock until Ten o'clock, and on the evening of Saturday in each week from Ten o'clock until Eleven o'clock.

And the Honorable Alexander James Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**W**HEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, in order to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in any process, trade, or business usually or frequently carried on in a factory or work-room, the Governor in Council may, if he think fit, from time to time appoint a Special Board, consisting of not less than four or more than ten members, elected as may be prescribed, and a Chairman, and that of such members one-half shall be appointed as representatives of employers and one-half as representatives of employés: And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 20th day of February, 1902, it was directed that a Special Board, consisting of ten members and a Chairman, be appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business connected with or incidental to the manufacturing or making of carriages, carts, and other vehicles (other than perambulators), or any part or parts thereof, such as the ironwork or bodies, hoods, cushions, springs, axles, wheels, tires, rims, hubs, or spokes (being a process, trade, or business usually or frequently carried on in a factory or work-room): And whereas

**W**HEREAS by the Local Government Acts it is enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any apportionment of property rights and liabilities, and give any direction as to any matters and things that may be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and that every such Order shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the said Acts are now exercised upon a petition signed by a majority of the ratepayers of a portion of the West Riding of the Shire of Woorayl with regard to a certain area therein described, notices of such petition having been published in the manner prescribed in the said Acts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in compliance with the prayer of the said petition, doth by this present Order sever from the West Riding of the Shire of Woorayl the portion described in such petition, and doth annex the portion so severed from such shire to the Korumburra Riding of the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho; and with the advice aforesaid doth re-define the boundaries of the said Shire of Woorayl and of the several Ridings thereof, including the West Riding as hereby reduced, and of the said Shire of Poowong and Jeetho and of the several Ridings thereof, including the Korumburra Riding as hereby enlarged, in the manner set forth hereunder, that is to say:—

PART OF THE SHIRE OF WOORAYL SEVERED THEREFROM AND ANNEXED TO THE SHIRE OF POOWONG AND JEETHO.

Woorayl Shire Reduced and Re-defined.

Commencing at a point on the Wild Dog Creek at its intersection with the northern boundary of allotment 80, parish of Korumburra; thence northerly by that creek to its intersection

thence east by a road to the north-east angle of block 12; thence south by the west boundary of blocks 121, 118a, and 118b to the south-west angle of the allotment last named; thence north-easterly by the north-western boundary of blocks 76a and 75 to the north angle of the last-named block; thence south-easterly by the eastern boundary of the block last named to the north-west angle of block 74; thence north-easterly by a road and the western and north boundary of block 72 to the north-east angle of the block last named; thence north by a road to the south-west angle of block 1, parish of Dumbalk; thence east by the south boundary and north by the east boundary of that block to its north-east angle; thence east by a road to the north-east angle of block 4A; thence south by a road to the south-west angle of block 5; thence east by the south boundary of the block last named to the Tarwin River; thence north-easterly by that river to the main Mirloo and Boolara road; thence northerly by that road to the west boundary of block 68, parish of Mirboo; thence north by a road to the north-west angle of said block; thence east by a road, being the north boundary of allotments 68, 67, 66, 65, 64, 63, and 62 to the Morwell River; thence southerly by said river to the north-west corner of allotment 1, parish of Gunyah Gunyah; thence east along the north boundary of said allotment to its north-east angle; thence south by the east boundary of allotments 1, 2, 3, 4, 13a, and 13 to the south-east angle of the last-named allotment; thence south-westerly by the road from Foster to Rosedale to Mount Fatigue; thence west by a direct line to the north-east angle of allotment 61a, parish of Mirboo South; thence west by the north boundary of allotments 61a and 61A to the south angle of allotment 37, parish of Dumbalk; thence north-westerly by a road to the north-west angle of said allotment; thence west by a road, being the north boundary of allotments 37A, 36, 35, 34, 102b, 102A, 101, 100, and 99 to the north-west angle of the last-named allotment; thence south-westerly by a road, being the north-western boundary of allotment 99, to the road forming the south-west boundary of block 80A; thence southerly by the eastern boundaries of the parishes of Nerrena, Meeniyan, and Tarwin South to the northern boundary of the parish of Waratah; thence easterly by that boundary to the sea coast; thence southerly, westerly, and north-westerly by the sea coast to the east boundary of the parish of Wonthaggi; thence northerly by that boundary to the south-west angle of block 21, parish of Kirrak; thence easterly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 13; thence northerly by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 12; thence easterly by that allotment and allotment 9 and northerly by the latter allotment and a road to the north-west angle of block 51; thence westerly by the road from Anderson's Inlet to the south-west angle of block 50; thence northerly by a road to the north-west angle of block 44a; thence easterly by a road to the north-west angle of block 47; thence northerly by a road to the north-west angle of block 41; thence easterly and northerly by the south and east boundary of the parish of Kongwak to the north-west angle of allotment 51A, parish of Leongatha; thence east by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 51b; thence north by a road to the north-west angle of allotment 52a; thence east by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 72b, parish of Korumburra; thence northerly by a road and the west boundary of allotments 68c, 68a, 68A, 52c, 52b, 52A, 51b, and 51A to the Great Southern Railway; thence easterly by said railway to the south-east angle of allotment 56; thence north-easterly by said allotment to the south-west angle of allotment 57A; thence north-westerly by a road to the southern boundary of allotment 60; thence east by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 59; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of allotment last named to the south boundary of allotment 81; thence south-easterly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment last named; thence north by the east boundary of said allotment to the south-west angle of allotment 80; thence east by a road to the south-east angle of said allotment; thence northerly and westerly by the eastern and northern boundary of allotment last named to the point of commencement.

West Riding Reduced and Re-defined.

Commencing on the northern boundary of the shire at the north-east angle of allotment 100, in the parish of Allambes East; thence south-easterly by the eastern boundary of said allotment to the Tarwin River; thence south-westerly by said river to the north-west angle of allotment 102, parish of Mardan; thence south-easterly by the western boundary of said allotment to its south-west angle; thence easterly by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 22; thence south by a road to the south-east angle of said allotment; thence east by a road to the north-east

angle of allotment 33; thence south by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 43; thence west by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 100; thence south by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 108; thence east by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 123; thence south by the east boundary of said allotment to its south-east angle; thence east by a road to the north-east angle of allotment B2; thence south by the east boundaries of allotments B2, 117A, 117B, and 117C to the south-east angle of allotment last named; thence south-westerly by a road to the southern angle of allotment A1, parish of Nerrena; thence north-westerly to the northern angle of allotment A2; thence south-westerly to the south-west angle of allotment 150; thence north by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 140; thence west by the south boundaries of allotments 140, 14A, 130, and 13A to the south-west angle of the allotment last named; thence north by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 120; thence west by the north boundaries of allotments 120, 12B, 120<sup>1</sup>, 120<sup>2</sup>, and 12A to the north-west angle of the allotment last named; thence south by a road to the south-west angle of said allotment; thence west by the south boundary of allotment 10A to its south-west angle; thence west by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 600, parish of Leongatha; thence north-easterly by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 56A; thence westerly by a road to the shire boundary at the south-west angle of allotment 720, parish of Korumburra; thence following the shire boundary northerly and easterly to the point of commencement.

*Poowong and Jeetho Shire Enlarged and Re-defined.*

Commencing at the south west angle of allotment 59, parish of Lang Lang; thence easterly by the south boundaries of that parish and the parish of Lang Lang East to the Bass River; thence south-easterly and east by a road to the north-west angle of allotment 33, parish of Jeetho West; thence southerly by a road to the north-west angle of the parish of Jumbunna East; thence further southerly by the road forming the west boundary of that parish to the south-west angle thereof; thence easterly by the north boundary of the parish of Kongwak to the west boundary of allotment 2 in that parish; thence north and east by that allotment to the north-east angle thereof; thence south by a road to the north-west angle of block 30A; thence east by that block and a road to the south-east angle of block 36A; thence north by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 500, parish of Leongatha; thence east by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 51B; thence north by a road to the north-west angle of allotment 52A; thence east by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 720, parish of Korumburra; thence northerly by a road and the west boundary of allotments 680, 68B, 68A, 520, 52B, 52A, 51B, and 51A to the Great Southern Railway; thence easterly by said railway to the south-east angle of allotment 55; thence north-easterly by said allotment to the south-west angle of allotment 57A; thence north-westerly by a road to the southern boundary of allotment 60; thence east by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 59; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of allotment last named to the south boundary of allotment 81; thence south-easterly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment last named; thence north by the east boundary of said allotment to the south-west angle of allotment 80; thence east by a road to the south-east angle of said allotment; thence northerly and westerly by the eastern and northern boundary of allotment last named to the Wild Dog Creek; thence northerly by that creek to its intersection with the southern boundary of allotment 87B; thence easterly by the southern boundary of that allotment to a road; thence northerly by that road running through allotments 87B, 87A, and 82B and a line forming the eastern boundary of allotment last named to the north-east angle of said allotment; thence westerly a road forming the northern boundary of allotments 82B and 82A to the north-west angle of allotment last named; thence northerly by a road forming the eastern boundary of allotment 750, parish of Allambee to the north-east corner of allotment last named; thence westerly along the northern boundary of allotments 750, 75B, and 75A to the north-west angle of allotment last named; thence northerly by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 83; thence westerly by the northern boundary of that allotment to the road known as McDonald's Track; thence southerly by the latter road to the north-east angle of allotment 46, parish of Poowong East; thence west by a road and the north boundary of allotment 45, and south by the west boundary of the last-mentioned allotment to the north-east angle of allotment 43; thence west, north, and west by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 39; thence north by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 30; thence west by a road to the north-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence north by the road forming the west boundaries of allotments 29, 28, 27, and 26 to the Lang Lang River; thence north-westerly by that river to the north-east angle of allotment A2, parish of Longwary; thence west by the north boundary of the last-named allotment to the north-west angle of same; thence south by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 82; thence west by the north boundary of allotment 51, parish of Poowong, to Pleasant Creek; thence southerly by said creek to the north-east angle of allotment 61; thence west by a road to the north-west angle of said allotment; thence south by a road to the south-east angle of said allotment; thence west by a road to the north-west angle of allotment 61, parish of Lang Lang East; thence south by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 63; thence west by the north boundary of the last-named allotment to its north-west angle; thence north by the east boundary and west by the north boundary of allotment 70 to the north-west angle of same; thence south by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 105; thence west by a road and the north boundaries of allotments 104 and 103 to the south-west angle of allotment 730; thence north by the west boundary of the last-named allotment to its north-west angle; thence south-westerly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 53, parish of Lang Lang; thence north-westerly by a road to the north-west angle

**TOWN OF MALVERN RE-SUBDIVIDED.**

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-sixth day of May, 1902.*

**WHEREAS** by the Local Government Acts it is enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight, and to determine and alter, within the limits prescribed by the said Acts, the number of councillors assigned to any municipality; and that every such Order shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by more than one-fourth of the ratepayers whose names appear on the municipal roll of the town of Malvern has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition were published in the *Government Gazette* of the 9th day of April, 1902, and no counter petition received: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order re-subdivide the said town of Malvern into four (4) separate wards, the names and boundaries of which shall be those severally hereunder set forth and described, and doth hereby further order that a council consisting of twelve (12) members be elected accordingly.

**MALVERN TOWN.—RE-SUBDIVISION OF WARDS.**

*North Ward.*

Commencing at a point on the Yarra Yarra River, where the Kooyong-road abuts thereon; thence easterly by the said river to the Kooyong Koot or Gardiner's Creek; thence south-easterly by that creek to the Burke-road; thence south by the Burke-road to High-street; thence west by High-street to Kooyong-road, and thence north by Kooyong-road to the commencing point.

*Central Ward.*

Commencing at the junction of Kooyong-road and High-street; thence east by High-street to the Burke-road; thence south by Burke-road to Wattle Tree-road; thence west by Wattle Tree-road to Kooyong-road, and thence north by Kooyong-road to the commencing point.

*South Ward.*

Commencing at the junction of Kooyong-road and Wattle Tree-road; thence east by the Wattle Tree-road to Burke-road; thence south by Burke-road to the Dandenong-road; thence north-westerly by the Dandenong-road to Kooyong-road; and thence north by Kooyong-road to the commencing point.

Commencing at a point at the junction of the Burke-road and Kooyong Koot or Gardiner's Creek; thence south-easterly by that creek to the north-east angle of allotment 188, parish of Prahran; thence south by the Warragul-road to Dandenong-road; thence north-westerly by that road to Burke-road; and thence north by that road to the commencing point.

## WRITING PAPER.

**TENDERS** will be received until Eleven o'clock a.m. on Wednesday, 4th June, 1902, from persons willing to supply to the Government Printer Writing paper, as per schedule, in the quantities and on the time stated therein.

Printed forms of tender, the schedules, and conditions of contract, &c., may be obtained at the office of the Secretary to the Tender Board. The samples may also be inspected at the office of the Secretary to the Tender Board.

The price must be expressed without alterations or erasures, and the total amount of the tender must be stated.

Tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary of the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

Security will be required either in Government debentures, Savings Bank Deposit Book, or Bank Deposit Receipt (in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board), or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified for tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenders must be enclosed in a separate envelope, marked "Tender for Writing Paper," and be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The supplies are to be equal in quality and colour to the contract sample, but as to weight and otherwise are to conform to the specification.
