That each female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.

## Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MR. S. CANTOR, TAILOR, FLINDERS BUILDINGS, FLINDERS-STREET, MELBOURNE,

for a period of four weeks from the 29th May, 1902, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than three females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said three females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

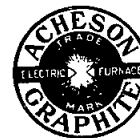

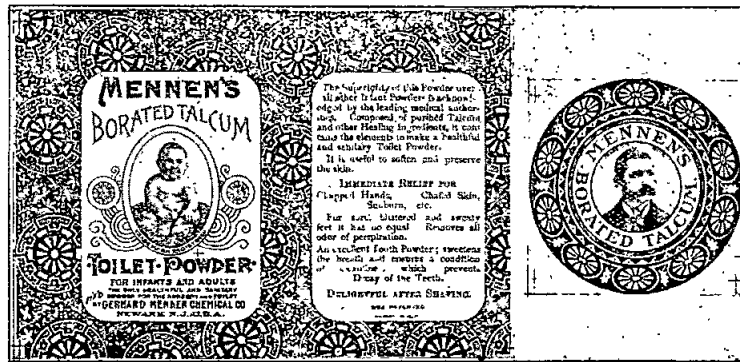

#### SHIRE OF MOORABBIN.

By-LAW No. 26.

A By-law of the Shire of Moorabbin, made under the provisions of the Health Acts, and numbered No. 26.

**I**N pursuance of the powers of the Health Acts, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Moorabbin order as follows:—

1. That By-law No. 21 be repealed.
  2. That every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the 10th day of June in each and every year, register himself with the Council of the Shire of Moorabbin in manner following, that is to say:—By signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Municipality an application in the form set forth in Schedule A hereunder, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay an annual registration fee as set forth in Schedule B hereunder.
- A person carrying on the trade of purveyor of milk shall, for the purpose of this by-law, be deemed to be and include a person carrying on such trade, whether such person shall or shall not have a place within the jurisdiction of the said council where such trade or any part of it is carried on.

For every purveyor of milk the annual registration fee shall be Ten (10) shillings.

Every person who is registered as a cow-keeper or dairyman shall be exempt from this fee.

If any person shall carry on the trade of cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, without having first registered himself as such, and paid the registration fee mentioned in Schedule B hereto, he shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five (5) pounds for every such offence, or to a penalty not exceeding One (1) pound for each day during which such offence is committed or continued, provided the justices before whom any penalty hereby imposed is sought to be recovered may order the whole part or part only, not being less than Five (5) shillings of such penalty to be paid.

#### THE WESTERN WIMMERA IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.

##### REGULATION No. 29.

**R**EGULATION for the making of a rate under the Water Acts on all rateable property within the Wimmera, Dimboola, and Natinuk Divisions of the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply District, as such divisions are described in an Order in Council bearing date the 27th of July, 1896, dividing the Trust District into divisions for rating purposes:—

## REGULATIONS UNDER THE ELECTRIC LIGHT AND POWER ACT 1896,

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-sixth day of May, 1902.*

WHEREAS by section 51 of the *Electric Light and Power Act 1896* (No. 1413) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations in relation to applications for Orders and to the fees and charges to be paid in respect thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations to take the place of the Regulations issued on the 4th April, 1896, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 15th May, 1896, that is to say:—

*Electric Light and Power Act 1896, No. 1413.*

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL WITH RESPECT TO APPLICATIONS  
FOR ORDERS AUTHORIZING THE SUPPLY OF ELECTRICITY, ETC.

1. Every council, company, person, or persons (hereinafter included under the term "Applicant") intending to apply for an Order in Council (hereinafter termed an Order) must give notice in writing of such intended application to the council of every municipal district within the area to which the proposed application refers, also to any council, company, person or persons authorized to supply electricity within such area.

Notices to be given by applicants for an Order.

If the applicant proposes to take power by the Order to interfere with or break up any tramway or railway he must give notice in writing to the council, company, or person by whom such tramway or railway is repairable of his intention to apply for such power.

2. The applicant must publish by advertisement notice of the intended application, and every such advertisement must contain the following particulars, viz.:—

Particulars advertisement must contain.

- (a) The objects of the application;
- (b) The address and description of every applicant;
- (c) A description of the proposed area of supply;
- (d) The names of the streets dedicated to public use in or along which it is proposed that electric lines be laid down or erected;
- (e) The time or times within which such electric lines are to be laid down or erected;
- (f) Particulars of any tramway or railway which the applicant proposes to take power by the Order to interfere with or break up; and
- (g) The address of an office in Melbourne, and of an office within the proposed area of supply, at which printed copies of the draft Order, and of the Order when made, can be obtained by any person at a price of not more than One shilling each;
- (h) An address at which copies of notices of objections and other documents may be served on the applicant.

The advertisement must be headed with a short title, descriptive of the undertaking (corresponding with that at the head of the application), and it must state that every council, company, person, or persons desirous of bringing before the Minister of Public Works by whom the said Act is administered, any objection respecting the application must do so within three months from the date of the *Government Gazette* containing the advertisement, by notice addressed to the Minister, marked on the outside of the cover enclosing it *Electric Light and Power Act 1896*, and that a copy of every such notice of objection must also be forwarded to the applicant for the Order.

The advertisement must be inserted once at least in the *Government Gazette* and also once at least in each of two successive weeks in one and the same newspaper, published and circulating in the proposed area of supply, or in such other newspaper as the Minister may direct.

3. Every notice of objection respecting an application for an Order must be sealed or signed by the objector or objectors or by some one on his or their behalf and forwarded under cover addressed to the Minister, marked on the outside *Electric Light and Power Act 1896*, so as to reach the Public Works Department within three months from the date of the *Government Gazette* containing the advertisement of the application.

Objections to the granting of an Order.

A copy of the notice of objection must also be served by the objector or objectors upon the applicant for the Order or served by leaving the same at, or by sending the same in a registered letter to, the address given in the advertisement.

Within the time limited for bringing objections, if any objecting council, company, person or persons desire to have any clauses or other amendments inserted in the Order, the objector or objectors must deliver a copy thereof to the Minister, and also serve a copy on the applicant for the Order, in the manner provided for serving notices of objection.

4. No application for an Order (other than an application from the council of the municipal district), will be entertained by the Governor in Council unless proof of the consent of every council having jurisdiction within the proposed area of supply to the granting of such Order, or a request from the applicant asking the Governor in Council to dispense with the consent of any council that has not consented and giving the reasons for such request, is deposited with the Minister within three months from the date of the said *Government Gazette*.

Consent of council necessary before application is made for Order in Council.

5. At the time of proving the consent of any council to the granting of an Order, the applicant must deposit with the Minister a certified copy of every agreement entered into with such council relating to such consent.

Copy of agreements to be deposited.

- How consent of council to be given.
- Form of application.
- Draft Order to be in print, &c.
- Particulars required in draft Order.
- Copies draft Order to be on sale.
- Map to be deposited.
- Further particulars required to be lodged with application.
- Fee to be paid when application lodged.
- Poll of Rate-payers.
6. The consent of any council must be given by a resolution passed at a meeting of the council held after previous notice of the same and of the purpose thereof has been given in the manner in which notices of meetings of such council are usually given.
7. Every application for an Order must within twenty-eight days from the date of the *Government Gazette* in which was published the advertisement of intention to apply be forwarded addressed to the Minister, and shall be signed or sealed by, or on behalf of, the applicant, headed with a short title descriptive of the proposed undertaking corresponding with that at the head of the advertisement hereinbefore mentioned. With the application there must be deposited six copies of the draft Order, as applied for, and also of any schedule or schedules referred to therein.
8. The deposited copies of the draft Order must be in print. They must be printed on one side only, and each schedule annexed must begin on a new page.
- The name and address of every applicant for the Order must be printed on the outside of the draft.
- There must be a notice at the end of the draft stating that notices of objection are to be forwarded under cover addressed to the Minister, marked on the outside *Electric Light and Power Act 1896*, and are to be sent to the Minister within three months from the date of the *Government Gazette* containing the advertisement of the application, and that a copy of every such notice of objection is to be served on the applicant for the Order, or served by leaving the same at, or by sending the same in a registered letter to, the address given in the advertisement.
9. The draft Order must contain amongst other things—
- The address and description of every applicant;
  - A description of the proposed area of supply;
  - A statement of the public or private purposes for which a supply is to be given;
  - Provisions concerning the breaking-up of, or interference with, any tramway or railway, where powers are sought to be obtained by the Order for those purposes or either of them; and
  - Conditions restrictions and liabilities with regard to the several matters set out in section 13 of the *Electric Light and Power Act 1896*.
10. The applicant must also keep available a sufficient number of printed copies of the draft Order at the address in Melbourne and at the place within the proposed area of supply to be specified in the advertisement hereinbefore mentioned; such copies to be there furnished to all persons applying for them, at a price of not more than One shilling each.
11. The applicant must also deposit with the Minister a published map of the locality including the area of supply on a scale of not less than six inches to a mile, or if there is no published map, then the best map or maps procurable, showing the boundaries of the proposed area of supply and the streets in or along which it is proposed that electric lines should be laid down or erected within a specified time or times.
- The applicant must also deposit a copy of the said map for public inspection with the postmaster at every post-office within the proposed area of supply, and at the office of the council of every municipal district in which the proposed area of supply or any part thereof is situate.
- Such deposits must be made before the application is lodged.
12. There must also be deposited with the application—
- A list of the councils in whose districts the area of supply is situate;
  - A list of any councils, companies, or persons authorized to supply electricity within the area of supply;
  - A list of every tramway or railway which the applicant proposes to take powers to break up or interfere with, and a statement showing how section 29 of Act No. 1413 has been complied with in respect to such tramway or railway;
  - A list of any canals and navigable rivers within the proposed area of supply;
  - A statement of the capital proposed to be expended and employed in connexion with the undertaking, and the mode in which such capital is to be provided, or, in the case of an application by a council, a statement of the sums proposed to be expended; and
  - If the applicant is a company incorporated under the provisions of the *Companies Act 1890*, or the promoter of a company which it is proposed to form under that Act, a copy of the (or of the proposed) memorandum and articles of association.
13. Before lodging an application for an Order the applicant shall pay to the Treasurer of the State of Victoria a fee to cover ordinary expenses, and shall lodge the receipt for the same with the Minister. If in consequence of inquiries or otherwise additional expense is incurred, the amount will be charged to the applicant, and must be paid by him in addition to the fee. Such fee shall be in accordance with the following scale:—

14. Attention is drawn to the provisions of the *Amending Electric Light and Power Act 1901*, No. 1775, section 2, in regard to the necessity for a poll of ratepayers being taken prior to consent being given by a council to the granting of an Order.

15. When an Order has been granted by the Governor in Council and delivered to the applicant the applicant must forthwith deposit printed copies for public inspection in the offices specified in Regulation 11, and must supply copies to all persons applying for the same at a price of not more than One shilling each, and must further publish the same as the Governor in Council may direct.

Printed copies of Order to be deposited for public inspection.

16. Where in an Order granted by the Governor in Council a deposited map is referred to, the undertaker must within one month from the grant of the Order deposit with the Minister a published map on a scale of not less than six inches to a mile, or if there is no published map then the best map procurable, showing the area of supply coloured to correspond with the description in the Order. The map must be mounted on linen and must be certified as correct as regards their respective districts by the clerk or surveyor to each council having jurisdiction within the area of supply.

WHEREAS by section 37 of the *Old-age Pensions Act 1901* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations as to the form of pension claims, the form of pension certificates and pass certificates, the mode of transmitting pension claims, the form of receipt, and generally for the purposes of carrying into effect the provisions of the Act, and that such Regulations shall be published in the *Government Gazette*: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby make the following Regulation under the provisions aforesaid, that is to say:—

##### REGULATION.

The form hereunder set forth is prescribed to be used in certain proceedings under the provisions of the *Old-age Pensions Act 1901*, in lieu of the form prescribed by Order in Council of the 17th December, 1901, that is to say:—

*Pension Claim.—Old-age Pensions Act 1901, No. 1751.*

##### Section 14.

I, \_\_\_\_\_, of \_\_\_\_\_, in the State of Victoria, do hereby solemnly and sincerely declare—

- (a) that I am now residing in Victoria;
- (b) that I have so resided whether continuously or not for at least twenty years;
- (c) that I have not been absent from Victoria whether continuously or not for more than five years during the time from which the said twenty years commenced to run;
- (d) that I have resided in Victoria continuously for not less than five years immediately preceding the date of making of this declaration;
- (e) that during the period of two years immediately preceding such date I have not been convicted three times or upwards in respect of drunkenness;
- (f) that during the period of five years immediately preceding such date I have not been imprisoned for any period or periods amounting in the whole to six months or upwards in respect of any offence or offences;
- (g) that during the period of twenty years immediately preceding such date I have not for any offence or offences been imprisoned for any period or periods amounting in the whole to three years or upwards with or without hard labour;
- (h) that (if a husband) during the period of five years immediately preceding such date I have not for twelve months or upwards without just cause deserted my wife or without just cause failed to provide her with adequate means of maintenance or neglected to maintain such of my children as were under the age of fourteen years, or (if a wife) that during the period of five years immediately preceding such date I have not for twelve months without just cause deserted my husband or deserted such of my children as were under the said age;
- (i) that my average weekly income during six months immediately preceding such date did not amount to eight shillings or upwards;
- (j) that the net capital value of my accumulated property, whether in or out of Victoria, does not amount to One hundred and sixty pounds or upwards;
- (k) that I have not directly or indirectly deprived myself of property or income in order to qualify for or obtain a pension;

- (l) that I have made reasonable efforts to provide for myself and have brought up a family in decency and comfort;
- (m) that my husband wife father mother or children is or are unable to provide for or maintain me;
- (n) that I am unable to maintain myself;
- (o) that I have not at any time within twelve months been refused by a Commissioner a pension certificate except for the reason that I was disqualified on account of age or for reasons which are now non-existent;
- (p) that I have attained the age of sixty-five years or (as the case may be) I am permanently disabled or in permanent ill-health caused by having been engaged in mining or any unhealthy or hazardous occupation;
- (q) that I am not an alien;
- (r) that I am a naturalized subject of His Majesty and have been so naturalized for the period of six months next preceding the date of this pension claim;
- (s) that I am not a Chinese or other Asiatic whether British subject or naturalized or not;
- (t) that I am not an aboriginal native of any State of the Commonwealth of Australia or of New Zealand;
- (u) that for the last twelve months I have resided at
- (v) that the address of my wife husband father or mother (if alive) is as follows:—
- (w) that the names and addresses of my children over twenty-one years of age are as follow:—

And I make this solemn declaration conscientiously believing the same to be true, and by virtue of the provisions of an Act of the Parliament of Victoria rendering persons making a false declaration punishable for wilful and corrupt perjury.

# VILLAGE COMMUNITIES.—PROCLAMATION PARTLY REVOKED.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part III. of the *Land Act 1901* (1 Edw. VII. No. 1739) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time set apart and appropriate for the purposes of "village community allotments" any land not alienated from the Crown and not being auriferous lands or lands permanently reserved for any purpose whatsoever, provided that such land shall not include any mallee block or allotment except such as may have been or may hereafter be purchased by the Crown in accordance with the conditions of the *Land Act 1901* aforesaid, and may at any time revoke any such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby order as follows, viz.:

## Settlement on Lands Act 1893.

SALE.—The Proclamation bearing date the 13th July, 1896, by which certain lands situate in the municipal district of Sale, and comprising an area of four hundred acres, more or less, were set apart and appropriated for the purposes of village community allotments, is hereby revoked so far only as it relates to the portion of the said lands hereinafter described, viz.:—One rood twenty-four perches, county of Tanjil, municipal district of Sale, being allotment 11 of section D.—(02.V.36696.)

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1901* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1901*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 7) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said *Land Act* as lands which may be sold by auction (class 7 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in Division 6 of Part I. of the *Land Act 1901* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said Act as land which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 5, 7, 8, 9, and 11 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1901* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

MUTTON BIRDS TO BE DEEMED NATIVE GAME AND PROTECTED IN CERTAIN LOCALITIES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Game Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1035) it is amongst other things enacted that for the purposes of the said Act the term "game" shall mean and include all birds and

other animals mentioned in the Second Schedule to the said Act, and the terms "native game" shall mean and include all birds and other animals mentioned in the Third Schedule to the said Act; provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time after the passing of the said Act by proclamation to name any other bird or animal which shall be included in such Second or Third Schedule respectively, and after the publication of any such proclamation in the *Government Gazette* and the expiration of the period mentioned in such proclamation for the time of its coming into operation, the birds or other animals so named shall be deemed and considered as being thenceforward included in such schedule; and whereas it is also enacted that the period of the year during which the said Act shall be in operation as regards all or any of the birds and other animals mentioned in the Third Schedule shall be the period set opposite the name of each such bird or animal in the said schedule in each year or such other period as the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* from time to time direct: And whereas by the *Game Act 1896* (60 Vict. No. 1463) it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, by proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to specify any part of Victoria as a locality in which during such period or periods in each year as shall be fixed in such proclamation it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game mentioned in such proclamation or to kill or destroy any native game mentioned in such proclamation under such an age as is therein prescribed with regard to such native game: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby direct that the

MUTTON BIRD

shall be included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1890* aforesaid, and that, upon the expiration of the period hereinafter appointed for the coming into operation of this Proclamation, the said Act shall be in operation as regards Mutton Birds at the rookeries known as Red Cliff and Nobby rookeries on Phillip Island during the whole year for a period of four years, from the 1st September, 1902: And, with the advice aforesaid, I do appoint that this my Proclamation shall come into operation from and after the first day of September, One thousand nine hundred and two.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twenty-sixth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and two, and in the second year of His Majesty's reign.

# REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF BARNAWARATHA.

WE, Edward Peter Connolly, William Tanner, John George O'Connor, William Burns, and Arthur Bolton Barlow, a majority of the, duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the Town of Barnawartha, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipts of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred, section 199 of *Land Act 1901*:-

## REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the buildings, fences, trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw sticks, stones, or other missiles in the Reserve, nor remove therefrom any soil or sand.
5. No person shall bring into the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, or poultry without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
7. No person shall be allowed to use or carry any firearms, or shoot or otherwise destroy any game within the Reserve without the sanction, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, or erect thereon any dwelling.
9. No person shall erect in the Reserve any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
10. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any enclosures or plots therein which may be set apart for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
11. No person shall enter the Reserve on any day set apart for races, sports, or fêtes, nor bring therein any horse, carriage, cart, or other vehicle, except on production of a ticket issued by the Committee of Management, duly authorizing the admission of such person; horse, carriage, or other vehicle. But no such tickets of admission shall be of any avail except on the date printed thereon, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any building, erection, or enclosure, or cultivated spot within the Reserve, and every such ticket shall be surrendered on demand to the gatekeepers or other persons authorized by the Committee of Management to collect tickets.
12. Any person being drunk, or disorderly, or assaulting any other person, shall be liable to be removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased, or may be in possession of, a ticket of admission thereto.
13. The maximum scale of fees for admission to the Reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any year) as the Reserve may be set apart for races, sports, or fêtes shall be as follows:-  
For admission to the Reserve of every—Adult, 1s.  
" " " Saddle horse, exclusive of rider, 2s.  
" " " Carriage, cart, or other vehicle drawn by one horse, 2s.  
" " " Additional horse attached to a carriage, cart, or other vehicle, 2s.  
" " " Adult from course to grand-stand reserve or saddling paddock, 5s.
14. The net proceeds of all races, sports, or fêtes, other than those given for the benefit of public charitable institutions, shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve.
15. No person shall, after the 1st of June, 1902, carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, except in and on such portions of the reserve as may be set apart for that purpose, and then only when he shall have complied with the following conditions:-  
(a) That he be registered for each meeting as a bookmaker by the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or the Committee or Stewards of the Barnawartha Turf Club, or by those authorized by such Committee of Management, Committee, or Stewards, on payment of a fee of £1 (one pound) sterling.  
(b) That during the time he shall be in or upon the Reserve carrying on his trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, he shall wear a ticket to be supplied by the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or the Committee or Stewards of the Barnawartha Turf Club, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, Committee, or Stewards which shall be visible to the public and shall have thereon his name.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).
