SMALL-POX ON THE S.S. "EASTERN."

WHEREAS by the Health Act 1890 it is amongst other things provided that in any emergency or sudden necessity with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria and having any infectious or contagious disease on board, or on board of which any such infectious or contagious disease may have appeared in the course of the voyage, the Board of Public Health may take all necessary steps to prevent infection or contagion until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council under the provisions of section 165 of the said Act: And whereas the steam-ship or vessel Eastern has arrived in Victorian waters, and has on board a case of the contagious disease small-pox: And whereas it is expedient to make an order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: And whereas it is also enacted by such Act that all the powers, rights, and authorities vested in the above-named Board shall, whenever he deems fit, be exercisable by the Minister: Now therefore I, the Minister of Health for the State of Victoria, do hereby order and direct that, until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council as aforesaid, and in order to prevent infection or contagion, the said vessel shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean, or at the Outer Anchorage off Williamstown, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the mainmast-head; and do further direct that no person other than the passengers for Victoria, unless directed to do so by the Health Officer or other officer in charge on behalf of the said Board, nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters, shall leave the said vessel, nor be taken, or allowed or suffered to be taken and removed from her, nor shall any boat put off from the said vessel, except only that her mails, cargo, and passengers' luggage for Victoria may be discharged into lighters, and may, after careful disinfection under the supervision of the Health Officer, be afterwards conveyed to shore under his directions; and, further, that cargo, provisions, luggage, and mails may be slung or hoisted on board the said vessel under his supervision; and, further, that no person except the Medical Inspector or Health Officer or person authorized by either of such officers necessarily employed in fumigating or discharging cargo shall be permitted to board or approach the said vessel, nor shall any one remain unnecessarily in her vicinity; and, further, that all persons engaged in conveying any cargo, passengers' luggage, provisions, or mails to or from the said vessel shall immediately afterwards, together with their clothing, be fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Health Officer; and, further, that the said vessel and all persons and things on board of her shall be detained in quarantine until severally released by the Health Officer.

VITAL STATISTICS OF BALLARAT AND SUBURBS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF DECEMBER, 1901.

THE births of 45 boys and 47 girls, or in all of 92 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of December. Of these, 35 occurred in Ballarat East, 47 in Ballarat West, 8 in Sebastopol, and 2 in the outlying districts; included were 13 illegitimate births and 1 case of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 137, viz., 65 of boys and 72 of girls.

The deaths registered in December numbered 66, viz., 33 of males and 33 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 26. In November the recorded deaths numbered 64; in December, 1900, they numbered 64; in December, 1899, they numbered 84; in December, 1898, they numbered 96; in December, 1897, they numbered 73; in December, 1896, they numbered 64; in December, 1895, they numbered 76; in December, 1894, they numbered 69; in December, 1893, they numbered 53; in December, 1892, they numbered 53; and in December, 1891, they numbered 80.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

Twelve deaths, or 18 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—Ballarat Hospital, 7; Benevolent Asylum, 2; Lunatic Asylum, 3.

On the other hand, deaths from diseases of the digestive system fell from 10 to 7; those from diseases of the urinary system from 5 to 1; and those from ill-defined causes from 6 to nil.

In the year 1901, the births registered in Ballarat and suburbs numbered 1,374, viz., 710 of males and 664 of females, as against 1,420 in 1900. The deaths registered during the same period numbered 835, viz., 471 of males and 364 of females, as against 902 in 1900. The apparent gain to the population by excess of births over deaths was thus:—Males, 239; females, 300; total, 539; as compared with 518 in 1900.

VITAL STATISTICS OF BENDIGO AND SUBURBS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BENDIGO AND THE SURROUNDING REGISTRATION DISTRICTS DURING THE MONTH OF DECEMBER, 1901.

THE number of births registered during the month of December in all the Bendigo Districts was 123; of these 56 were of males and 67 of females; included were 4 illegitimate births and 1 case of twins. In the previous month the registered births numbered 87, viz., 51 of males and 36 of females.

The number of deaths registered during the month was 92, viz., 56 of males and 36 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 31. In the previous month the recorded deaths numbered 60; in the month of December, 1900, they numbered 94; in the month of December, 1899, they numbered 93; in the month of December, 1898, they numbered 112; in the month of December, 1897, they numbered 150; in the month of December, 1896, they numbered 100; in the month of December, 1895, they numbered 104; in the month of December, 1894, they numbered 94; in the month of December, 1893, they numbered 98; in the month of December, 1892, they numbered 77; and in the month of December, 1891, they numbered 104.

Of the registered births 92 occurred within the city of Bendigo and 31 in the surrounding districts. Of the deaths registered 73 took place within and 19 without the city.

The following table shows the number of deaths registered in each district, distinguishing those of males and females and those of persons under and over five years of age:—

Of the 92 deaths registered during the month, 43, or 47 per cent., were of children under five years of age, and 49, or 53 per cent., were of persons beyond that age. In the previous month these proportions were respectively 23 and 77 per cent.

Fifteen deaths, or 16 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in public institutions, viz., Bendigo Hospital, 12; Benevolent Asylum, 3.

TATURA PUBLIC CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Tatura Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations, which shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

3. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a certificate of right of burial, which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of the ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the Trustees, as hereinafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, fence, or other erection thereon.

4. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or any other erection shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the Trustees.

5. That every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by or at the expense of the owner, and every such erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, and, if required by the Trustees, shall extend to the bottom of grave.

6. The Trustees will not permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for re-interment in this or any other cemetery until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

7. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, and the particulars required in the "Order Form" given, and an order obtained, when the Trustees will cause all graves to be dug or re-opened, as the case may be; but any person requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, subject to the approval of the Trustees; but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

8. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.

9. Applications for interment shall be made at least "eight hours" before the time fixed for burial.

10. The hours for burials shall be:—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m.; on Sundays throughout the year, from Eleven a.m. to Four p.m.

11. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in the cemetery without a certificate from a deputy registrar of deaths, coroner, or justice of the peace; such certificate shall be delivered up to the gatekeeper before the funeral enters the cemetery.

12. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

13. That every person dressing, attending, digging graves, or doing any other work within the cemetery shall comply with the following rules, viz:—

First.—That no rubbish, clay, or other material removed in dressing, attending, digging, or re-opening graves shall be placed on any grave, and when placed on any adjoining ground, or path, shall be removed immediately after interment or completion of the work.

Second.—That all refuse and other material remaining after any work is completed shall be removed from the cemetery at once, by and at the expense of the person causing same, and if the ground is in any way cut up the same shall be neatly levelled off, and left in the same order as before.

Third.—That no loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for dressing graves, or any other purposes, without permission from the Trustees.

Fourth.—That no work other than the sinking of graves shall be done within the cemetery during wet weather, or while the ground is soft.

14. No person shall remove, take, pluck, or destroy any flower, tree, shrub, plant, or in any way interfere with anything in or connected with the cemetery without the permission of the Trustees to do so.

15. No sinking shall be allowed, or any firearms or fireworks be discharged, within the cemetery.

16. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

17. That a plan of the cemetery showing the distribution of the land, compartments, sections, and numbers of the graves, and a register of all burials with all information therein, shall be kept for public information by the Trustees.

SHIRE OF HAMPDEN.
BY-LAW NO. 18.

THE Council of the Shire of Hampden, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Hampden, by virtue of the provisions of the Health Acts, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, doth make the following by-law, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided are hereby repealed.
2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Hampden.
4. From and after coming into force of this by-law, every person carrying on the trade or business of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, within fifteen days from and after the first day of January in every year, and every person about to carry on the trade or business of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, previous to carrying on such trade or business, register himself with the said council in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the council an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application, if he does not keep any cows, pay a fee of ten shillings, but if he does keep any cows, then he shall with such application pay a fee according to the following scale, namely:—

5. Upon receipt of every application for registration and fee, the Shire Secretary shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for the purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used by any person in his trade or business as a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk as a grazing ground for dairy cattle, and all sources of water supply used in connexion therewith, shall whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the council, or by any person authorized, in writing, by the president or secretary of the said council; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or sources of water supply, or any of them, are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said council may, by an order, in writing, signed by the shire secretary, and served personally, or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or, in the case of an unregistered person, served personally, or left at his dwelling, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding or watering dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order; and any such order as aforesaid the said council may revoke, but, upon every fresh inspection, a similar order may from time to time be made. All cattle and other animals used or kept by any person carrying on the trade or business of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, may also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon

or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which, from the poverty or weakness of their bodily condition, are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, and any other diseased animal, shall be forthwith removed from the premises of such cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid.

7. The council, on receiving a report from an inspector that the construction of any dairy, milking-place, cow-shed, milk-store, milk-shop, or other building in the occupation of any person following the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk is defective or faulty in regard to lighting, ventilation, drainage, or water supply, or in any other respect whatsoever, in such a way as to prejudicially affect the health of the cows or the wholesomeness of the milk or other dairy produce, may order such person to make alteration in any such buildings or structures, and to remedy any such defects within a time to be specified in such order.

8. Such closet accommodation shall be provided for the persons employed on the premises of any person following the trade or business of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and at such distance from the dairy, milking-place, milk-store, milk-shop, or source of water supply of such premises, and such methods shall be adopted for the disposal of the night-soil as may be directed by the council, and the closet-pans on such premises shall be disinfected daily to the entire satisfaction of the inspector or other officer as aforesaid.

9. Where horses are kept on the premises of any person following the trade or business of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, such stable accommodation shall be provided, and at such a distance from the milking-place, or milk-store, or milk-shop, or source of water supply of such premises, as the council may direct.

10. All houses, dairies, milking-places, cow-sheds, milk-stores, milk-shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade or business of cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health by affecting the milk, or otherwise, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings and milking-places shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade or business of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and such means of access provided to the source or sources of water supply as may be directed by the council or duly authorized officer as aforesaid.

11. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within 24 hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector, be fumigated, disinfected, lime-washed, or be otherwise dealt with as may be in any such order so directed.

12. All vessels used for holding milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily, and no cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or person employed in the milking or dairy work shall use in connexion with milking, or for washing vessels used for holding milk or for any dairy work, water that is in any way infected or contaminated or contains matter injurious to health, and the health officer or inspector may, after inspection, prohibit, by order served as prescribed in clause 7 of this by-law, the use for dairy purposes of the water obtained from any well or tank or other source of water supply, and may require any tank to be cleaned and disinfected.

13. If at any time disease exists in or among the cows, cattle, or other stock of any cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the council, health officer, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

14. No cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

15. No person who is suffering from any dangerous, infectious, or contagious disease, or who has been so situated by contact with any person or persons so suffering or otherwise, so that he may have contracted or be in danger of contracting any dangerous, infectious, or contagious disease, shall milk cows or handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business until authorized by the council, Shire Secretary, or health officer so to do.

16. If any person (whether an adult or a child) living on or occupying or staying on a visit at any premises used as a grazing ground or dairy, or for cow-sheds, or as a milk-shop or milk-store, be attacked by any epidemic, endemic, or contagious disease, the occupier of the house or premises in which such person is (or if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or health officer, or to the nearest member of the police force, and the council may, whether or not the person so attacked has been removed from the premises by order served as aforesaid, prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk or the produce thereof from the premises until danger, in the opinion of such council or officer of health, no longer exists, and may order the destruction of the milk or any produce thereof on the premises.

17. Every dairy, milk-store, or milk-shop, the premises of any person following the trade or business of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, shall be inspected once in each half-year by the council's inspector, who shall furnish a report to the council on the following matters, that is to say:—Condition of paddocks, water supply, drains, sheds, and buildings, closet and stable accommodation, disposal of night-soil and manure, storage for milk, means of scalding and cleaning vessels, cleanliness of premises, compliance with regulations.

18. In the interpretation of this by-law, words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular number, and the word person shall include a corporation, and the word cows shall mean and include all cows in profit, all cows in calf, heifers, and cows, and dry cows to be subsequently used as milkers.

19. Any person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion not being less than Five shillings to be paid, and any person committing such breach as aforesaid, shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

The foregoing by-law, being By-law No. 18 of the Shire of Hampden, was agreed to by the Council of the said Shire on the 14th day of October, 1901, and adopted by the said Council on the 18th day of November, 1901.

BY-LAW NO. 13.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mildura, by virtue of the *Health Act 1890* and every other power enabling them in this behalf, hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 13 of the said Shire, that is to say:— That section 9, By-law No. 4, be and is hereby repealed, and that the following is adopted in lieu thereof:—

No person shall construct, or cause to be constructed, any privy except in the form of an earth closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than 6 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and so that there is a clear air space of 6 inches under the floor, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide means of ventilation, also that they be so constructed that the pan when placed under the seat can be readily adjusted to receive all deposits, and that galvanized-iron lips be provided and placed under the seats in front of the opening of same to conduct all urine into the pan, and further that each building be constructed with the requisite apparatus for the supply of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents of the pan, and shall be so constructed and placed as to afford easy means of access for removing the pan and the contents thereof for emptying and cleansing the same.

Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, or work-room, and every public privy, shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination towards the door or opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

Also, that no privy be allowed to be constructed on either avenue or street frontage.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Lancefield by virtue of the provisions of the *Health Acts*, and every other power enabling them in this behalf, hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 2 of the Council of the said Shire, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the shire of Lancefield.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall on or before the 1st day of January, 1902, and on or before the 1st day of January, in subsequent years, register himself with the council in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Shire an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of the following amount, namely, if the person to be registered keeps cows and the number of such cows is—

TOWNSHIP OF CAMBRIAN HILL.—ALTERATION OF BOUNDARIES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may subdivide any county into parishes and townships, and by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* may define the boundaries of such parishes or townships, and may distinguish each by a name; and that after such Proclamation the territory comprised within the boundaries of any of the said divisions shall thenceforward be recognised as a parish or township by the name so given as aforesaid: And whereas by the said Part of the said Act it is further enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, by a notice in the *Government Gazette*, annul and rescind any Proclamation made under the said *Land Act 1890*, or any Act of Parliament thereby or theretofore repealed, of any portion or portions of Crown lands as towns or townships: And whereas by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, made in pursuance of the provisions of *The Land Act 1884*, and bearing date the 1st day of March, 1887, the boundaries of a township were defined and the said township distinguished by the name of the Township of Cambrian Hill: And whereas it is expedient to re-define the boundaries of the said township: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby annul and rescind the Proclamation aforesaid dated the 1st day of March, 1887, so far only as the same defines the boundaries of the said Township of Cambrian Hill, and do hereby re-define the boundaries of the said Township of Cambrian Hill as hereunder described, that is to say:—

TOWNSHIP OF CAMBRIAN HILL.—County of Grenville, parish of Yarrowee: Commencing at a point on the right bank of the River Leigh or Yarrowee where the south side of the road forming the south boundary of the Bonshaw pre-emptive section abuts thereon; bounded thence westerly by that road to the east boundary of allotment 14 of section 1; thence southerly by that allotment to the south-east angle thereof; thence easterly by a road and southerly by the road forming the east boundary of allotment 29 of section 6 to the south boundary of allotment 15; thence easterly by a road to the western boundary of allotment 14 of section 3; thence northerly, easterly, and southerly by that allotment and easterly by the last-mentioned road to the aforesaid river; and thence by that river upwards to the point of commencement.—(Y.2 (P) (91.T.50241).

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Chinese Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1073) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, to exempt any person or class of persons from the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and to declare that such provisions shall not at any time, or for any specified period, apply to the person or class of persons mentioned in such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation exempt the Chinese named in the first column of the Schedule hereto subjoined from the provisions of Part I. of the *Chinese Act 1890* aforesaid, for the periods specified opposite their respective names in the fourth column of the said Schedule, that is to say:—

**DEVIATION OF A ROAD IN THE PARISHES OF
GRETA AND LURG.**

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the eighth day

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1891* (55 Vict. No. 1243) it is amongst other things enacted that if the council of any municipality prove to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable that any road should be deviated, and that such deviation can be conveniently made through Crown land or land held by licensees or pastoral lessees under the *Land Act 1890*, the Minister may cause such road to be deviated accordingly at the cost of the municipality, and that, upon the publication in the *Government Gazette* of an Order of the Governor in Council declaring the new road a public highway, any portion of the old road mentioned in that behalf in such Order shall cease to be a public highway, but shall remain subject to the right of way and passage to and from any premises which cannot be as conveniently approached from the new road, and that, subject as aforesaid, such old road, or so much thereof as adjoins the allotments or areas of the licensees or lessees (if any) through whose allotments or areas the new road has been carried, shall be added to their allotments or areas in proportion to the amount of land taken from each, and shall be accepted by them as full compensation for any loss or damage suffered through the deviation of the road, and that the Minister shall make the distribution accordingly: And whereas it has been proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable to deviate a certain road in the parishes of Greta and Lurg: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby declare the road defined in the following description to be a public highway (that is to say):—

County of Delatite, parishes of Greta and Lurg: Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 14, parish of Greta; bounded thence by a road bearing N. 10° 16' E. eighteen links; thence by lines bearing respectively S. 88° 58' E. five chains twenty-six links, N. 60° 40' E. four chains fifty-three links, N. 88° 12' E. six chains forty links S. 42° 46' E. four chains eighty-two links, S. 77° 13' E. three chains eighteen links, S. 67° 28' E. four chains ninety-three links, and S. 37° 33' E. one chain seventy-one links; thence by a road bearing N. 79° 50' W. one chain forty-nine links; thence by lines bearing respectively N. 37° 33' W. thirty-five links, N. 67° 28' W. four chains fifty-eight links, N. 77° 13' W. three chains forty-one links, N. 42° 46' W. four chains sixty-seven links, S. 88° 12' W. five chains seventy links, S. 60° 40' W. four chains fifty-six links, and N. 88° 58' W. forty links; and thence again by the last-mentioned road bearing N. 79° 50' W. five chains twenty links to the point of commencement.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1891* (55 Vict. No. 1243) it is amongst other things enacted that if the council of any municipality prove to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable that any road should be deviated, and that such deviation can be conveniently made through Crown land or land held by licensees or pastoral lessees under the *Land Act 1890*, the Minister may cause such road to be deviated accordingly at the cost of the municipality, and that, upon the publication in the *Government Gazette* of an Order of the Governor in Council declaring the new road a public highway, any portion of the old road mentioned in that behalf in such Order shall cease to be a public highway, but shall remain subject to the right of way and passage to and from any premises which cannot be as conveniently approached from the new road, and that, subject as aforesaid, such old road, or so much thereof as adjoins the allotments or areas of the licensees or lessees (if any) through whose allotments or areas the new road has been carried, shall be added to their allotments or areas in proportion to the amount of land taken from each, and shall be accepted by them as full compensation for any loss or damage suffered through the deviation of the road, and that the Minister shall make the distribution accordingly: And whereas it has been proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable to deviate a road in the parish of Wonthaggi; Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby declare the road defined in the following description to be a public highway (that is to say):—

County of Mornington, parish of Wonthaggi: Commencing at a point bearing S. 53° 57' E. one chain thirty-five and a half links from the south-east angle of allotment 25c; bounded thence by a line bearing S. 67° 42' E. twenty-five chains sixty-seven links; thence by a road bearing N. 75° 12' W. fifteen chains thirty-two links; thence by a line bearing N. 67° 42' W. two chains thirty-one links; and thence again by the before-mentioned road bearing N. 53° 57' W. eight chains forty-one and a half links to the point of commencement.

HAMILTON WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION No. 6.

THE Hamilton Waterworks Trust, part of whose Waterworks District has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of Part II. of the *Water Act 1890*, doth hereby, under the powers conferred by the *Water Acts*, make the following Regulation in respect of such Urban District:—

The rate to be paid for the several lands and tenements to be supplied otherwise than by measure with water for domestic purposes for the year ending 31st December, 1902, shall be—

- (a) For every house or other tenement fronting any street wherein the water pipes of the Trust have been laid, and not being unoccupied land, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation of such house or other tenement, the minimum amount to be paid to be Twenty shillings.
- (b) For unoccupied land where water is not laid on, but which land fronts any street wherein the water pipes of the Trust have been laid, the rate shall be Five per centum per annum on the amount of the municipal valuation thereof in all cases where such rate or such valuation shall exceed Ten shillings, and in all others of such cases the rate shall be Ten shillings.
- (c) For houses proved to the satisfaction of the Trust to have remained unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, the charge per house shall be two-thirds of the amount which would be payable if such house had not been so unoccupied; but in no case shall the rate be less than Twenty shillings, and such rate shall be levied upon the persons and at the times and in the manner provided for the levying of rates by the *Water Acts*.
- (d) For water supplied for domestic and other than domestic purposes by the Trust by measure, the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive in respect of the tenement for which such charge shall be made if the same had been rated under subdivision (a) hereof; and thereafter at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
- (e) For gas engines and oil engines the charge shall be at the rate of Ten shillings per annum, payable yearly in advance for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used, and thereafter no water shall be supplied until such meter shall have been affixed to the supply pipe for such engine to the satisfaction of the engineer of the Trust. The provisions of sub-section (i) shall apply to this clause.
- (f) For steam boilers the charge shall be Ten shillings per annum, payable half-yearly in advance, for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used, and in such cases no water shall be supplied or used after such order shall have been given until the same is complied with to the satisfaction of the engineer of the Trust. The provisions of sub-section (i) shall apply to this clause.
- (g) For buildings in course of erection, where water is required for building purposes, the charge shall be Ten shillings per centum on the contract price of the work, or shall be fixed by special agreement. In the event of such buildings being of wood, the charges shall be one-half of the last-mentioned charge, payment in all cases under this subdivision to be made in advance.
- (h) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein are to be paid for at such charge as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment on account of such charge must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply shall be taken or used.
- (i) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly in each case where water is supplied by measure for other than domestic purposes shall be 10,000 gallons, and such water, where not otherwise provided herein, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
- (j) The charge for water supplied to public gardens, parks, show grounds, cricket grounds, and bowling greens shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons; any quantity supplied in excess of the full measure of a unit of 1,000 gallons shall be charged for as 1,000 gallons. All water so supplied must be through a meter, and paid for half-yearly.
- (k) The charge for water supplied by measure solely for railway purposes shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 1,000,000 gallons.
- (l) The rates hereby made shall be payable in equal moieties half-yearly in advance, on the 1st January and 1st July, 1902.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

**SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—
RATING REGULATION FOR 1902.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following Regulation:—

Regulation for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust District.

- (1) A rate of One shilling and fourpence in the pound sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at Fifteen pounds (£15) and upwards, situated within the Waterworks District of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1902.
- (2) The minimum rate for such year in respect of properties valued at less than Fifteen pounds (£15) sterling on the municipal value shall be Twenty shillings.
- (3) On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Five pounds sterling per cent. on the amount of the annual valuation of same shall be charged, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Two shillings (2s.) per annum.
- (4) Water supplied by measure to be used in private dwellings or other premises for domestic use, or for the irrigation or watering of private gardens or distribution on or about such premises, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons up to an amount equal to that the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid.
- (5) For every steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust, the charge shall be the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power (actual) of such steam boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use, where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made at the same rate as provided in clause four (4) hereof.
- (6) For water supplied for manufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) the charge will be One shilling per thousand (1,000) gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall be not less than equal to One shilling and fourpence in the pound on the municipal valuation of the shire of Shepparton for the year 1902 of the property so supplied.
- (7) Water supplied to Government departments, cricket grounds, bowling greens, show-yards, cattle-yards, and similar properties, shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum charge shall be not less than Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per annum.
- (8) For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrants, for each load of two hundred and fifty (250) gallons or under, Sixpence (6d.) shall be charged.
- (9) For a temporary supply during the erection of a new building, repairs, or additions, the charge shall be Twenty shillings (20s.) per cent. on the amount of contract for stone-work, brick-work, and plastering, or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stone-work, brick-work, and plastering, or the said Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement, at the rate provided in clause four (4) hereof. All persons about to build must, if they require a supply of water for building purposes, notify the Trust, and shall not use any water for such purpose until authorized in writing by the Trust so to do.
- (10) The Trust may require a meter to be used in any case where it is deemed necessary.
- (11) No person shall use or permit to be used on any premises any water for other than domestic, manufacturing, or fire extinguishing purposes, between the hours of Nine p.m. and Five a.m. Any person committing or permitting a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty of One pound.
- (12) Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or who shall use the same in any manner for irrigation purposes (except where the supply is by meter), shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).
- (13) Any person not having agreed to be supplied with water by the Trust who shall, or who having so agreed shall, contrary to such agreement, use, take, or carry away, or wilfully permit to be used, taken, or carried away, water from any drinking-tap, water-trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).
- (14) If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes, or wilfully permits to be done, anything in contravention of this Regulation, or fails to pay his or her rates when due, or fails to do anything which, under this Regulation, ought to be done for

the prevention of the waste, misuse, undue consumption, or contamination of the water, or wilfully or negligently allows the water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the water supply from the premises of such person or persons by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may discontinue the supply so long as the cause or injury remains, or is not remedied to the satisfaction of the Trust.

- (15) The officer or officers of the Trust appointed for that purpose may at all reasonable times, between the hours specified in sections 451 and 471 of the *Water Act 1890*, enter any house, tenement, or land to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for measuring, conveying, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or examining if there be any waste or misuse of such water; and if any person hinders or prevents examination the Trust may turn off the water supplied by it from such house or other premises, and cease to supply the same with water until such inspection shall have been permitted and effected.
- (16) Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in the said year 1902. The charges for the sale of water by measure shall be payable monthly, or at such other time or period as the Trust may in any case determine.
- (17) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.
- (18) The word "person" in these Regulations shall include corporation.

PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS.

REGULATIONS in connexion with the vote of Two thousand five hundred pounds (£2,500) for fencing and improving public parks and gardens under the control of borough councils, trustees, committees of management, &c., 1901-1902.

1. A sum not exceeding Five shillings may be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park or garden having a claim on the vote for every One pound expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister may approve, in such park or garden between 1st January, 1901, and 31st December, 1901, out of funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Agriculture on or before the 1st March, 1902. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made in the Form A, and be accompanied by a declaration in the Form B.

2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park or garden from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park or garden, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st of January, 1901, and 31st December, 1901; but it shall not mean nor include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the above-mentioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by Government at any period prior to the 1st January, 1901.

3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park or garden shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1901 (*vide* Form A), and a sum equal to one-fourth of the balance then remaining, if made up of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of Two thousand five hundred pounds they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. In every case in which a claim is sent in an officer of the Department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of expenditure; and if such inspection be refused the claim shall be disallowed.

5. Moneys expended in street planting, or in fencing, formation, or maintenance of land for racing, cricket, football, croquet, tennis, bowling, quoits, or other sports, or in erection or repairs of stands or pavilions for the purpose of witnessing sports, must not be included in any claim upon the vote.

6. The foregoing shall not apply to parks and gardens within the limits of the city of Melbourne, except the Royal Park, or to the Edinburgh Garden, Fitzroy, or the Darling Gardens, Collingwood, or to Albert Park, South Melbourne and St. Kilda, or the Richmond Park, Richmond, or the Botanical Garden, Geelong.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE AVENEL RACE-COURSE AND RECREATION RESERVE.

WE, Patrick Joseph Gleeson, Richard John Shelton, William Donaldson, and John Pratt, a majority of the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Racing and other purposes of Public Recreation at Avenel, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*.—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve, which is parcelled out into the following divisions, shall be open to the public from Sunrise to Sunset, free of charge, except as hereinafter provided:—First Division—the Saddling Paddock. Second Division—the remainder of the Reserve.

2. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the first and second divisions of the Reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for racing, sports, or holiday amusements, shall be as follows:—For the admission of every adult to the first division of the Reserve, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings (2s.). For the admission of every adult to the second division of the Reserve, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling (1s.). Provided always that the Committee of Management may wholly or partially exempt any member of a race club from the payment of all or any such fees.

3. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

4. No person shall damage in any way the buildings, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, or camp or sleep or light fires therein without the written permission of the Committee of Management.

5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates or stick bills thereon or write or cut names on the buildings, fences, or seats in the Reserve.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any articles, without the written consent of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall ride or drive any horse or other animal upon or over the running track in the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

10. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs without the written permission of the Committee of Management: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

11. Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).
