



DETERMINATION OF THE SPECIAL BOARD APPOINTED TO FIX THE LOWEST PRICES OR RATES OF PAYMENT FOR BREADMAKING OR BAKING.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates of payment for breadmaking or baking has made the following determination, namely:—

- 1. That all previous determinations made by the Board be cancelled and annulled from and after the date upon which this determination comes into force and is operative.
- 2. That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to any person for breadmaking or baking shall be Twelvepence half-penny per hour, or Two pounds ten shillings for a maximum number of 48 hours per week.
- 3. That the number of apprentices who may be employed in a factory or work-room in the breadmaking or baking trade shall

- 5. That the number of improvers who may be employed in a factory or work-room in the breadmaking trade shall be one improver to every five persons receiving the minimum wage of Two pounds ten shillings per week as determined by the Board.
- 6. That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to such improvers shall be as follows:—

First year, 5s. per week of 48 hours; Second year, 7s. 6d. " " Third year, 10s. " " Fourth year, 15s. " "

- 7. That any male person over the age of sixteen years who may be employed in breadmaking or baking for more than 48 hours per week shall be paid for such extra hours pro rata rates, and in addition the sum of Threepence per hour.
- 8. That the above determination shall come into force from and after the 1st day of July, 1902.

REGULATION RELATING TO HIRING AND FIXING OF METERS.

1. The Trust will, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate per annum

For 2-in. meter, Five shillings. For 1-in. meter, Seven shillings and sixpence. For 12-in. meter, Nine shillings and sixpence. For 12-in. meter, Twelve shillings.

For 14-in. meter, Twelve shillings.

2. For any other size of meter not herein mentioned the rent per annum shall be at the rate of 10 per cent, upon the cost of such meter, or as near to such rate as can be conveniently calculated; such rent shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount of rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due and must be paid half-yearly in advance on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year, the first payment to date and be made as from the commencement of the then current half-year. Such meter shall be fixed at the cost of hirer on his premises where directed by an officer of the Trust, but shall be kept in repair at cost of the Trust, except in case of its receiving external injury, in which contingency the hirer must bear the cost of repair.

3. In the event of the hirer being dissatisfied with the register ing of such meter, he may, by notice in writing, require the Trust to cause such meter to be removed and tested, and, together with such notice, shall forward a sum of One pound, which, if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying the cost of removing, testing, and replacing such meter, and the balance, if any, shall be returned to him; but if such meter be found to fail to register, or be found to register incorrectly, such meter shall be repaired and replaced, or another meter shall be placed instead of it at the cost of the Trust, and the amount deposited by the hirer shall be returned to him. Any person so biring a meter from the Trust who shall remove from the premises on which such meter shall be fixed without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Trust of his intention to remove from the premises, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

4. If any person who, under the provisions hereinbefore contained, ought to provide a meter, neglect or refuse after having been required by the Trust to provide such meter, he shall; for every day during which such neglect or refusal continues, forfeit a sum not exceeding Two pounds.

5. All meters shall be so affixed that no part of them will be under the level of the surface of the ground, and shall be so affixed as to enable them being easily read and removed. Provision must also be made for contraction or expansion of pipes by lead or elbow joints. All meters must be provided with a proper box with a lid hinged to it. The stop cock shall be affixed near to the meter, and so placed as to be easily seen.

6. Any person being the owner of a meter affixed on premises owned or occupied by him may, if he so desire, avail himself of the hiring system of meters established by this Regulation, by giving notice, in writing, to that effect to the Trust; such notice also to contain an offer from the fowner to sell his meter. WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations to have effect within any specified municipal district or any specified part of such district for, amongst other things, permitting shops of any particular class not included in the Fourth Schedule to the Factories and Shops Acts, provided a petition shall have been previously addressed to the Governor in Council and forwarded to the Minister, certified to by the municipal clerk as having been signed by a majority of the shopkeepers keeping shops of such class within such district: And whereas a petition has been so addressed and forwarded praying that in the municipal district of the City of Richmond all dairy produce dealers' shops (such shops being shops uot included in the Fourth Schedule to the Factories and Shops Act 1859 aforesaid) may be permitted to keep open until Nine o'clock on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday in each week: And whereas such petition has been certified to by the municipal clerk of the shopkeepers keeping shops of such class within the said district: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—
