NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

MELBOURNE PROVINCE AND ELECTORAL DISTRICTS OF ANGLESEY, BRIGHTON, DONALD AND SWAN HILL, EVELYN, GIPPSLAND EAST, LOWAN, NORMANBY, AND WARRNAMBOOL.

AN Election of two Members of the Legislative Council and of Members of the Legislative Assembly is about to be held in the above-mentioned Electoral Province and Districts, and any Elector thereof who appears from the rolls to reside in such Province or District, and who resides at least five miles from the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or who has reason to believe that on the polling day he will not be within five miles of the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or that on account of ill-health or infirmity he will be prevented from voting personally thereat, who desires to vote through the post office at such Election may, on posting an application to the Returning Officer, obtain a Postal Ballot-paper enabling him to vote through the post at such Election.

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Such application shall be as nearly as possible in the following form:—

"I hereby apply for a Postal Ballot-paper for the forthcoming election of the Legislative Council or Assembly [as the case may be], and I declare that [here state upon which of the above-mentioned grounds the applicant claims a Postal Ballot-paper].

Printed forms of application may be obtained at any post office, or the application may be in writing.

If applicant is the holder of an elector's right, such right must be attached to his application.

Caution.—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

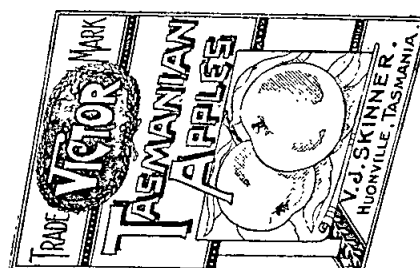

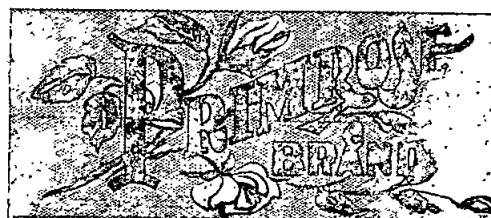

DETERMINATION OF THE SPECIAL BOARD APPOINTED TO FIX THE LOWEST PRICES OR RATES OF PAYMENT FOR BREADMAKING OR BAKING.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates of payment for breadmaking or baking has made the following determination, namely:—

1. That all previous determinations made by the Board be cancelled and annulled from and after the date upon which this determination comes into force and is operative.

2. That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to any person for breadmaking or baking shall be Twelvence halfpenny per hour, or Two pounds ten shillings for a maximum number of 48 hours per week.

3. That the number of apprentices who may be employed in a factory or work-room in the breadmaking or baking trade shall be—

5. That the number of improvers who may be employed in a factory or work-room in the breadmaking trade shall be one improver to every five persons receiving the minimum wage of Two pounds ten shillings per week as determined by the Board.

6. That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to such improvers shall be as follows:—

First year, 5s. per week of 48 hours;

and thereafter Twelvence halfpenny per hour, or £2 10s. per week of 48 hours.

7. That any male person over the age of sixteen years who may be employed in breadmaking or baking for more than 48 hours per week shall be paid for such extra hours *pro rata* rates, and in addition the sum of Threepence per hour.

8. That the above determination shall come into force from and after the 1st day of July, 1902.

SHIRE OF MAFFRA.

By-Law No. 12.

A By-law of the Shire of Maffra made under the provisions of the Health Acts and numbered 12, for the registration of cow-keepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts and every other power enabling them in this behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Maffra hereby make the following By-law, being By-law 12 of the Council of the said shire, that is to say:—

1. By-law No. 9 of the Shire of Maffra for the registration of cow-keepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk is hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the Shire of Maffra.

3. Every person carrying on or who shall carry on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairymen, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of August, 1902, or within one month of the commencement of the carrying on of such trade in any year, and on or before the first day of January in subsequent years, register himself with the Council in the manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Shire an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee in the following amount, viz.:—

(a) If the person to be registered keeps cows, and the number of cows kept be—

1. Not more than four, a fee of One shilling.
2. More than four, a fee at the rate of Threepence for each cow, but not in any case exceeding the sum of Two pounds.

(b) If the person to be registered does not keep cows, a fee of Seven shillings and sixpence.

Upon receipt of such application and fee, the Secretary of the Shire shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

5. In the interpretation of this By-law, words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

6. Every person guilty of any breach of this By-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable in the discretion of the convicting justices to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in a like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

SHIRE OF GOULBURN.

BY-LAW No. 9.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution, the Council of the Shire of Goulburn, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire of Goulburn, doth make the following by-law, that is to say:—

1. No person shall construct, or cause to be constructed, any privy, except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall be furnished with a suitable pan or movable receptacle for night-soil, the contents of which does not exceed 5 cubic feet, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same.

2. For the removal of such night-soil every owner or occupier as aforesaid shall pay the said council the sum of Twenty shillings per annum for every pan used, such sum to be paid half-yearly in advance for a once-a-week service, and in default of payment the same to be and to become recoverable in any court of petty sessions.

This by-law shall apply to and have operation within the proclaimed boundaries of the township of Longwood.

If any person or persons commit a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law, he or they, as the case may be, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds; and a further penalty of not more than Five pounds or less than Five shillings for each day such offence is continued after any conviction.

AMENDMENT OF BY-LAWS.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Board of Land and Works has, in pursuance to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on such Board by the Water Acts, repealed sub-sections (i), (ii), and (iii) of section No. 2 of by-laws approved on the 14th day of February, 1896, and substituted in lieu thereof the following sub-sections. (Alterations to date from 1st July, 1902):—

(i) On every house or tenement of £16 annual value and under, One pound per annum.

(ii) On every house or tenement above the annual value of £16, a rate of Six pounds five shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation up to £100 inclusive; Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £100 up to £300; Three pounds fifteen shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £300 up to £500; and Three pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £500.

(iii) Buildings used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, shall be subject to a rate of Three pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

WARRACKNABEAL WATERWORKS TRUST.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts, the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust hereby make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION RELATING TO HIRING AND FIXING OF METERS.

1. The Trust will, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate per annum of—

For 2-in. meter, Five shillings.
For 1-in. meter, Seven shillings and sixpence.
For 1½-in. meter, Nine shillings and sixpence.
For 1½-in. meter, Twelve shillings.

2. For any other size of meter not herein mentioned the rent per annum shall be at the rate of 10 per cent. upon the cost of such meter, or as near to such rate as can be conveniently calculated; such rent shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount of rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due and must be paid half-yearly in advance on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year, the first payment to date and be made as from the commencement of the then current half-year. Such meter shall be fixed at the cost of hirer on his premises where directed by an officer of the Trust, but shall be kept in repair at cost of the Trust, except in case of its receiving external injury, in which contingency the hirer must bear the cost of repair.

3. In the event of the hirer being dissatisfied with the registering of such meter, he may, by notice in writing, require the Trust to cause such meter to be removed and tested, and, together with such notice, shall forward a sum of One pound, which, if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying the cost of removing, testing, and replacing such meter, and the balance, if any, shall be returned to him; but if such meter be found to fail to register, or be found to register incorrectly, such meter shall be repaired and replaced, or another meter shall be placed instead of it at the cost of the Trust, and the amount deposited by the hirer shall be returned to him. Any person so hiring a meter from the Trust who shall remove from the premises on which such meter shall be fixed without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Trust of his intention to remove from the premises, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

4. If any person who, under the provisions hereinbefore contained, ought to provide a meter, neglect or refuse after having been required by the Trust to provide such meter, he shall, for every day during which such neglect or refusal continues, forfeit a sum not exceeding Two pounds.

5. All meters shall be so affixed that no part of them will be under the level of the surface of the ground, and shall be so affixed as to enable them being easily read and removed. Provision must also be made for contraction or expansion of pipes by lead or elbow joints. All meters must be provided with a proper box with a lid hinged to it. The stop cock shall be affixed near to the meter, and so placed as to be easily seen.

6. Any person being the owner of a meter affixed on premises owned or occupied by him may, if he so desire, avail himself of the hiring system of meters established by this Regulation, by giving notice, in writing, to that effect to the Trust; such notice also to contain an offer from the owner to sell his meter. In the event of the Trust purchasing such meter, it shall, upon the purchase being completed, be deemed to be a meter hired under the terms and conditions of this Regulation, and any person using it shall be deemed to do so under such terms and conditions.

7. All meters in the Trust area or under the control of the Trust, whether already affixed or to be affixed, shall be so affixed as provided in clause 5 of this Regulation.

8. The penalty for a breach of any of the conditions of this Regulation, where not otherwise provided herein, shall be Five pounds.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Stock Diseases Act 1890*, No. 1141, it is among other things provided that the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may from time to time make such regulations under the said Part of the said Act as may be deemed expedient for all or any of the purposes in section 4 of the said Act mentioned, and may rescind the same: And whereas it has been deemed expedient to make the following Regulation: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above-recited Act, and of every other power him enabling in that behalf, make the Regulation following (that is to say):-

WHEREAS by the *Gaols Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1096) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council shall have power from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to revoke any Proclamation theretofore made or which thereafter may be made under section 4 of the said Act, or under any other authority in that behalf, which shall have notified any building, erection, house, enclosed place, or premises to be a public gaol, prison, and house of correction, or penal establishment, and that thereupon the building, erection, house, enclosed place, and premises referred to in such notice shall cease to be a public gaol, prison, house of correction, or penal establishment accordingly: And whereas it is further enacted that the Governor in Council, upon a certificate from the Inspector-General of Penal Establishments that any lock-up is fit for the reception of prisoners whose sentences do not exceed thirty days, may from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, proclaim any police lock-up so certified to be a "police gaol": And whereas by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the 22nd day of October, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, certain buildings and premises therein described were declared, proclaimed, and notified to be public gaols, prisons, and houses of correction within the meaning of and in accordance with the provisions of *The Statute of Gaols 1864*: And whereas the buildings and premises situate at Maryborough which are specified in the said Proclamation are no longer required for the purposes of a public gaol, prison, and house of correction: And whereas the Inspector-General of Penal Establishments has certified that the said buildings and premises are fit for the reception of prisoners whose sentences do not exceed thirty days: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the *Gaols Act 1890* aforesaid, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby revoke as from the 19th June, 1902, so much of the Proclamation hereinbefore mentioned as relates to the buildings and premises therein designated "Maryborough Gaol," and do hereby proclaim the buildings and premises described in the aforesaid Proclamation as the Maryborough Gaol to be a Police Gaol from the aforesaid 19th day of June, 1902.

Every conditional purchase lease will be dated the 1st day of July, 1902, and may be for such a term of years, not exceeding 31½, as may be agreed upon between the lessee and the Board.

The purchase money, with interest at 4½ per cent., must be paid by 63 or a lesser number of half-yearly instalments (including deposit), calculated according to any of the tables under Division 3 of Part I. of the *Swings Banks Act 1890 Amendment Act 1896*. Each instalment will include interest upon the balance of the purchase money remaining unpaid.

On a conditional purchase lease application a deposit equal to the two (2) first instalments of purchase money, together with fees (including survey charge) must be paid within fourteen days after an allotment has been recommended.

Perpetual Lease.
