Public Service Act 1890, Section 123.

REGULATIONS FOR THE GUIDANCE OF OFFICERS OF THE PUBLIC SERVICE.

THE Public Service Commissioner, in pursuance of the powers vested in him, hereby substitutes the following Clauses for Clauses 2 and 7 of the Regulations (Chapter XIV.) made under the provisions of Section 123 of the *Public Service Act 1890*, approved on the 28th January, 1896, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 3rd February, 1896:—

Clause 2.—Time allowed for Luncheon.

Three-quarters of an hour will be allowed daily to every officer for luncheon, from One o'clock p.m. to a quarter to Two o'clock p.m.; during this time officers may leave their offices, unless for the better transaction of public business any officer is required by the Permanent Head or the Head of the Branch to attend to duty.

No. 68.—JUNE 25, 1902.—1.

The officer in charge of each room shall report to the Head of the Branch or of the Department all cases in which officers have not returned to duty after luncheon, at a quarter to Two o'clock p.m.

Clause 7.—Hours of Business.

The hours of attendance to be observed by officers shall, unless otherwise ordered, be from Nine o'clock a.m. to Five o'clock p.m., except on Saturdays, when the ordinary hours of attendance shall be from Nine o'clock a.m. to Twelve o'clock noon.

These Regulations to take effect from the 1st July, 1902.

Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MESSRS. C. JENOUR AND CO.,
BOOT MANUFACTURERS, 131 WELLINGTON-STREET, COLLINGWOOD,

for a period of eight weeks from the 13th June, 1902, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than eight females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said eight females shall not be employed for more than fifty-four hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

NOTE.—During the quarter the number of births was 7,071, or 671 less, and the number of deaths 3,886, or 243 less than in the corresponding quarter of the preceding year. The natural increase was thus 3,185, or 428 less than in the first quarter of 1901, and 370 less than in that of 1900.

The recorded arrivals by sea during the quarter numbered 28,172, and the recorded departures 29,528; the former being 337 fewer, and the latter 3,481 more than in the previous corresponding quarter. The net recorded loss by emigration was thus 1,356, as against a recorded gain of 2,462 in the first quarter of 1901, and a recorded loss of 2,281 in that of 1900. The total estimated loss during the quarter was, however, increased by the allowance for unrecorded departures to 3,495, consisting of 3,217 males and 278 females, as shown in the table.

The total recorded increase of population was 1,829, as against 6,075 and 1,274 in the corresponding quarter of the two previous years. After allowing, however, for unrecorded departures, there was a net loss for the quarter of 310, made up of the difference between a loss of 1,703 males and a gain of 1,393 females.

The records regarding the origin or destination of migrants show a net loss of 153 to other parts of the Commonwealth, and of 1,203 to other countries. The former is made up of a net gain of 599 from New South Wales, 221 from Queensland, 351 from South Australia, and 1,798 from Tasmania, counterbalanced by a net loss of 3,122 to Western Australia. The latter resulted from a net gain of 342 from Other British Dominions, and 304 from Foreign Ports, less a net loss of 829 to New Zealand, 527 to the South Seas, 338 to the United Kingdom, and 655 to South Africa.

The emigration to South Africa during the quarter consisted almost entirely of officers and men (who numbered 643) forming part of the Australian Commonwealth Horse. The ordinary emigration has been checked for a time by the restrictions placed upon it in South Africa, no one being permitted to emigrate thither without a permit from the authorities of the Commonwealth. Notwithstanding these restrictions, about 400 permits were issued to applicants in Victoria during the quarter, but it is explained that these did not leave the State until April.

THE births of 60 boys and 52 girls, or in all of 112 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of May. Of these, 51 occurred in Ballarat East, 54 in Ballarat West, 4 in Sebastopol, and 3 in the outlying districts; included were 8 illegitimate births and 1 case of twins. RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BENDIGO AND THE SURROUNDING REGISTRATION DISTRICTS DURING THE MONTH OF MAY, 1902.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE PORT PHILLIP PILOT SICK AND SUPERANNUATION FUND.

WHEREAS by Section 96 of the *Marine Act* 1890 it is enacted that, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council, the Pilot Superannuation Board may from time to time make, alter, or amend Regulations for the maintenance of the Port Phillip Pilot Sick and Superannuation Fund and for the distribution of the annual income thereof for the benefit of such pilots as are incapacitated from the performance of their duties by reason of age, infirmity, sickness, or accident, and for the benefit of widows and children of pilots; and whereas the said Board did on the 3rd day of July, 1895, make certain Regulations for the purposes aforesaid, which Regulations are intitled "Regulations relating to the Port Phillip Pilot Sick and Superannuation Fund," and are published in the *Government Gazette* of the 19th July, 1895; and whereas it is expedient to repeal paragraphs numbered 5, 6, and 7 of the said Regulations and to substitute amended Regulations therefor: Now, therefore, the said Board, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following amended Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations shall form portion of the "Regulations relating to the Port Phillip Pilot Sick and Superannuation Fund" hereinbefore referred to (hereinafter in these Regulations called the "said Regulations") and shall be read in connexion therewith, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1902, on which date paragraphs numbered 5, 6, and 7 of the said Regulations shall be repealed.

(2) For paragraph 5 of the said Regulations there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

5. **SUPERANNUATION.**—Pilots who have served ten (10) years and upwards and who have been permitted to retire from the pilot service in accordance with the Regulations of the Marine Board shall be entitled to an annual pension from the Sick and Superannuation Fund according to the scale of pensions set forth in Schedule I. hereto, provided that no pension shall be granted for more than thirty-five (35) years' service.

(3) For paragraph 6 of the said Regulations there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

6. **LUMP SUM IN LIEU OF PENSION OR ON RESIGNATION AFTER TEN YEARS' SERVICE.**—Where any pilot shall have become entitled to a pension as provided in the foregoing Regulation and he is desirous of accepting a lump sum in lieu thereof, or where any pilot who has served as such for not less than ten years, is permitted to resign, he shall be entitled to be paid a sum calculated at the rate of Thirty-five pounds (£35) for each completed year of service as a pilot, provided that such pilot grants a release to the Board from all future claims against the Fund on behalf of himself, or his wife, or his children (if any), and further provided that no payment shall be made for a greater length of service than thirty-five (35) years.

(4) For paragraph 7 of the said Regulations there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

7. **PROVISION FOR WIDOWS OF PILOTS.**—On the decease of a pilot in the exercise of his calling, after having served ten years and upwards, or subsequent to his being placed on the superannuation list, and leaving a widow him surviving, the said widow shall be entitled to receive a pension from the Sick and Superannuation Fund in accordance with the scale prescribed in Schedule II. hereto, subject to the proviso that the pension to the widow of any pilot shall in no case exceed £40 per annum unless she shall have been married to him ten years or upwards at the time of his death or superannuation, whichever may first have happened, and shall in no case exceed £50 per annum unless she shall have been married to him at least fifteen years at the time of such decease or superannuation, whichever may first have happened, and shall in no case exceed the amount specified as pension for the widow of a pilot who has served 35 years.

The foregoing amended Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Pilot Superannuation Board, held this twenty-eighth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and two.

The births of 1,126 children, viz., 547 boys and 579 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of May. The number was, it will be observed, higher than in any previous corresponding month since 1894, except 1898, but 58 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, and 139 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in May numbered 575, viz., 316 of males and 259 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 551, or 96 per cent., as against 72 per cent. in May, 1901, and 109 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, the highest recorded for the month during the previous ten years, except 1892, 1898, and 1901. It was also 9 above the average of May during that period, but 30 below it, allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 26.43 and of deaths registered to 13.50 per annum, as compared respectively with averages of the same month in 1901 of 25.48 and 14.80, with averages of the month during the last ten years of 28.61 and 14.22, and with averages of the year 1901 of 24.85 and 15.09.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 71.7° on the 5th, and the lowest was 37.1° on the 20th. The mean temperature of the month (55.0°) was one and three-fifths degrees above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (26.2°) took place on the 2nd, and the least range (1.4°) on the 29th. The mean daily range was 14.3°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.391 inches on the 26th, and the lowest was 29.697 inches on the 7th. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.136 inches) was one eleventh of an inch above the average.

Rain fell on ten days, the amount being 1.05 inches, which was lower than in any corresponding month during the previous ten years except 1895 and 1901, and 1.22 inches below the average during that period.

The mean humidity of the month was 78.7. Fog occurred on four days during the month.

Males contributed 55 per cent. and females 45 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 21 per cent. to that mortality, as against 21 per cent. in 1901; 20 per cent. in May, 1900; 22 per cent. in May, 1899; 34 per cent. in May, 1894; 25 per cent. in May, 1897; 30 per cent. in May, 1896; 25 per cent. in May, 1895; 28 per cent. in May, 1894; 33 per cent. in May, 1893; and 30 per cent. in May, 1892.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 103, as compared with 97 in May, 1901. The rate of infantile mortality was 88 per 1,000 births registered in the month under review, as compared with 91 in May, 1901; 72 in May, 1900; 85 in May, 1899; 103 in May, 1898; 84 in May, 1897; 106 in May, 1896; 88 in May, 1895; 79 in May, 1894; 91 in May, 1893; and 76 in May, 1892.

Fifty-nine persons—as against 71 in May, 1901—whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these, two females, each aged 75, died of cancer and apoplexy respectively; two gentlemen, each aged 75, of valvular disease of the heart and syncope respectively; a female, aged 75, of bronchitis; an ex-railway employé, aged 75, of jaundice; three females, each aged 76, of tuberculosis of lungs, dilatation of the heart, and heart disease (undefined) respectively;

a tailor, aged 76, of bronchitis; a cabinetmaker, aged 76, of pneumonia; a female, aged 75, of drowning (suicide); two females, each aged 77, of influenza and cancer respectively; a gentleman, aged 77, of heart disease; two females, each aged 78, of rheumatism and mitral disease of the heart respectively; a boatman and a female, each aged 78, of bronchitis; a merchant and a carpenter, each aged 78, of cystitis; a female, aged 79, of apoplexy; a carpenter, a fireman, and a female, each aged 79, of syncope; a female, aged 79, of aneurism; a venetian blind maker, aged 79, of kidney disease; a female, aged 80, of apoplexy; a mariner, aged 81, of paralysis; a female, aged 81, of congestion of lungs; two females, each aged 82, of valvular disease of the heart; a gentleman, aged 82, of heart disease; a female, aged 82, of bronchitis; a watchmaker, aged 83, of bronchitis; a female, aged 84, of hemiplegia; a farmer, aged 84, of paraplegia; a solicitor, aged 84, of thrombosis; a pastoralist, aged 86, of apoplexy; a female, aged 85, of pneumonia; another, aged 89, of heart disease; a dairyman, aged 90, of valvular disease of the heart; a male of no occupation, aged 100, of syncope; a female, aged 76, a labourer and a female, each aged 77, two females, each aged 79, a hotel-keeper and a joiner, each aged 81, a mariner and a storeman, each aged 82, a cabinetmaker and a farmer, each aged 84, a female, aged 86, two gentlemen, each aged 87, a female, aged 90, and a farmer, aged 92, of old age.

Twenty of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 33 in May, 1901—were from external causes, of which 15 were set down to accident, and 5 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A carriage-cleaner, aged 15, was passed over by a railway engine; a driver, aged 22, by a dray; an office boy, aged 15, and a seaman, aged 19, died of injuries, caused by falling down a lift well, and the hold of a steamer, respectively; a coal lumper, aged 59, of injuries, the result of a fall from a staging; a driver, aged 26, of burns; a seaman, aged 28, and an importer, aged 47, were poisoned by carbolic acid and coal gas respectively; a boy, aged 6, was drowned in the River Yarra; a seaman, aged 35, was found drowned in Hobson's Bay; a new-born male and a female infant, aged seventeen days, were accidentally suffocated; an asphaltor, aged 31, by the inhalation of vomited matter into the air-passages; and a new-born male and a female infant, aged five days, died of umbilical hemorrhage. The suicidal deaths were those of an electrical engineer, aged 58, who poisoned himself with prussic acid; a driver, aged 40, and a female, aged 76, who drowned themselves; and a male, of unknown occupation, aged 60, and a female servant, aged 28, who hanged themselves.

One hundred and sixty-six deaths, or 29 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 122, of which 75, or 61 per cent., were of males, and 47, or 39 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 100 were under one year of age, 13 were between one and two, 5 were between two and three, 2 were between three and four, and 2 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 453. Of these 241, or 53 per cent., were males, and 212, or 47 per cent., were females; 15 were between five and ten, 16 were between ten and fifteen, 14 were between fifteen and twenty, 24 were between twenty and twenty-five, 22 were between twenty-five and thirty, 35 were between thirty and thirty-five, 30 were between thirty-five and forty, 35 were between forty and forty-five, 25 were between forty-five and fifty, 27 were between fifty and fifty-five, 19 were between fifty-five and sixty, 25 were between sixty and sixty-five, 45 were between sixty-five and seventy, 61 were between seventy and seventy-five, 32 were between seventy-five and eighty, 17 were between eighty and eighty-five, 6 were between eighty-five and ninety, 3 were between ninety and ninety-five, and 1 at the age of one hundred.

Under the zymotic class, deaths from influenza fell from 11 to 4, those from diphtheria from 6 to 2, and those from diarrhoeal diseases from 9 to 5. Under the constitutional class, deaths from phthisis fell from 71 to 61. Under the developmental class, deaths from premature birth rose from 15 to 26. Under the local class, deaths from diseases of the circulatory system increased by 4; whilst those from diseases of the nervous system diminished by 3, those from diseases of the respiratory system by 18, those from diseases of the digestive system by 2, and those from diseases of the urinary system by 8.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1892 to 1901, and the first five months of 1902, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality from both causes during the month was below the average.

SHIRE OF BIRCHIP.

REGULATION No. 8.—SPOUTS AND DRAINS FROM HOUSES.
A Regulation of the Shire of Birchip, made under Section 14 of Subdivision 3 of Part I. of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1890*, by virtue of a by-law of the above-mentioned shire, and numbered 8, for regulating the construction, material, and size of Drains and Trunks.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890* the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Birchip do hereby order and direct as follows:—

All drains and trunks to be laid or constructed under any footway shall have a fall towards the channel of not less than one in twenty, and shall be constructed of earthenware or metal pipes not less than 3 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter, according to the directions of the Shire Engineer.

2. Shades and awnings may be allowed by the Shire Engineer, but must have suitable strong gear, approved by him, and be at least 2 feet clear of the footway.

A Regulation of the Shire of Birchip made under Section 26 of Subdivision 4 of Part I. of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1890*, by virtue of a by-law of the above-named shire, and numbered 9, fixing the width, inclination, and depression of Crossings and Materials of which same are to be constructed.

Crossings over or across footways shall be flush with the footways for the whole width of the footway, and shall be constructed of square-dressed bluestone pavers or wooden blocks 8½ inches wide, not less than 7 inches deep, and from 8 to 12 inches long, and shall be laid in courses parallel with the length of the footway, and bedded in good sand at least 3 inches deep, with close joints properly flushed up with sand rammed with heavy pavior's rammer.
