### TELEGRAPH WIRE.

**GALVANIZED TELEGRAPH WIRE.**—The wire is to be uniformly annealed, soft, pliable, free from scale inequalities, flaws, splits, and other defects, and must be uniformly cylindrical.

The wire is to be drawn in continuous pieces of not less than 90 lbs. nor more than 120 lbs. No piece of wire shall contain any weld, joint, or splice whatever, either in the rod before it is drawn or in the finished wire.

The wire to be well galvanized. It will be tested as under:—

Samples taken from any coil or coils will be placed in a solution of sulphate of copper, saturated at 60° Fahr., and allowed to remain there for one minute, when they will be withdrawn and wiped clean. The galvanizing must admit of this being performed four times without there being any sign of a reddish deposit of metallic copper on the wire, which would be the case if the coating of zinc were too thin.

The diameter of the wire to be 171 mils, and no greater difference than 5 (five) mils under or above will be accepted.

**LADDERS.**—The Ladders are to be of Red or Yellow Baltic Fir, free from large or loose knots, and perfectly straight in grain, sound and free from heart and sap. The rounds are to be cleft, of young and fresh Hickory, English Ash or English Oak, straight in grain, and turned to 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " diameter in centre, and for  $\frac{1}{4}$ " holes at ends. The sides of the Ladders are to be bored to receive the rounds, and the holes are to be tapered outwards, so as to admit of the rounds being opened and wedged. All the rounds are to well fill the holes, and be wedged with glue into the sides, previously having received a coat of wet white lead. Every eighth round a tie-bolt  $\frac{1}{4}$ " diameter with collar at each end 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " diameter is to be inserted below the round with nut and washer at each end, the rounds to be 9" apart centre to centre. The Ladders are to be finished with three coats of good lead and oil paint, of such colour as may be ordered.
