### Factories and Shops Acts.

# DETERMINATION OF THE BEDSTEAD-MAKERS BOARD.

In accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (including the moulders of bedsteads and excluding the moulders of fenders) employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of metal bedsteads or fenders, or parts thereof, has made the following Determination, namely:—

1. That the lowest rate of wages to be paid to the following classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of metal bedsteads or fenders, or parts thereof, shall be :--

# MALE APPRENTICES OR IMPROVERS.

#### Number.

2. That the number of male apprentices or improvers who may be employed within any factory or work-room, or shop, or place shall be one such apprentice or improver to every two males or fraction thereof employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of metal bedsteads or fenders, or parts thereof, and receiving not less than 36s. per week.

#### WAGES.

3. That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to apprentices or improvers employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of metal bedsteads or fenders, or parts thereof, shall be the following:—

# FEMALE APPRENTICES OR IMPROVERS.

#### NUMBER.

4. That the number of female apprentices or improvers who may be employed within any factory, or work-room, or shop, or place shall be one such apprentice to every two females or fraction thereof employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of metal bedsteads or fenders, or parts thereof, and receiving not less than 22s. 6d. per week.

## FEMALE APPRENTICES OR IMPROVERS.

#### WAGES.

5. That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to female apprentices or improvers employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of metal bedsteads or fenders, or parts thereof, shall be the following:—

For the 1st year's experience ... ... 10s. per week of 45 hours.

" 2nd " ... ... 15s. " "

" 3rd " ... ... 20s. . "

and thereafter the minimum wage.

## OVERTIME.

- 6. That any male employé over the age of 16 years who works in the process, trade, or business of a maker of metal bedsteads or fenders, or parts thereof, for any time in excess of 48 hours per week, shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a quarter.
  - 7. That the above Determination shall come into force from the 28th day of July, 1902.
