Application of certain Regulations to Ocean Island.

Schedule of Regulations.

Definition of Term "Gilbert and Ellice Protectorate."

Short title.

1. Whereas it is expedient to specify the Regulations made by the High Commissioner for the Western Pacific under the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council, 1893, that are applicable to Ocean Island, otherwise Paanopia.
2. The Regulations included in the Schedule hereto shall, therefore, be held as applying to the said Ocean Island, otherwise Paanopia.
3. In all future Regulations the term "Gilbert and Ellice Islands Protectorate" shall, unless it be otherwise provided, be held to include the said Ocean Island, otherwise Paanopia.
4. This Regulation may be cited as "The Gilbert and Ellice (Ocean Island) Regulation 1902."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Six hundred and four thousand and eighty-five pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and two and One thousand nine hundred and three."

"An Act to amend the Trust Funds Act 1897."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twenty-fourth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and two, and in the second year of His Majesty's reign.

ADDITION TO THE RULES FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE ALFRED GRAVING DOCK AND PATENT SLIP.

RULES AND RATES FOR THE HIRING OF THE 70-TON CRANE ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE RIVER YARRA, AND THE 15-TON STEAM TRAVELLING CRANE AT THE DOCK-YARD, WILLIAMSTOWN.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria in Council has, by an Order made on the 24th day of June, 1902, rescinded the existing Rules and Schedules of Rates for the use of the 70-ton crane on the South side of the River Yarra, and the 15-ton travelling crane at the Dock-yard, Williamstown, and in lieu thereof has made the following Rules and Schedules of Rates for the hiring of such cranes, to take effect from the 17th June, 1902, that is to say:—

RULES FOR THE HIRING OF THE 70-TON CRANE ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE RIVER YARRA, AND THE 15-TON STEAM TRAVELLING CRANE, DOCK-YARD, WILLIAMSTOWN.

1. Any person desirous of hiring either of the cranes must make application to be registered on the form to be obtained from the Officer in Charge of the Ports and Harbors, such application to be lodged between 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on week days, and 9 a.m. and Noon on Saturdays, which will be duly registered in order of receipt.

2. With application for registration, and before registration is made, a deposit of £2 shall be paid to the Officer in Charge of Ports and Harbors, which sum shall be allowed as part payment of crane rates, provided such rates shall be settled within seven (7) days after delivery of the account for same, otherwise such deposit shall be liable to forfeiture, and the dues to be paid in full.

3. Ships requiring the cranes, and for which deposit has been paid, shall have prior claim to use of wharf abreast of cranes so long as they are employing the cranes.

4. Should any vessel not be in a position to use the cranes at such times as may be specified by the Officer in Charge of the Ports and Harbors, the turn of such vessel will lapse, and fresh application for registration must be made, the deposit fee being liable to be forfeited, subject to the decision of the Honorable the Commissioner of Public Works; and the applicant will be responsible for any expenses already incurred in getting the cranes ready for work, unless the inability to use the cranes shall have occurred through stress of weather or other circumstances which the Officer in Charge of the Ports and Harbors shall determine, when such vessel may retain her position upon the register without forfeiture of the deposit.

5. The working day shall consist of eight (8) hours between 7.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. For every hour earlier or later than the fixed working day Fifteen shillings (15s.) is to be paid in addition to the rates.

6. The Department of Public Works accepts no responsibility in regard to these cranes when in use by the hirer, and the persons using the crane when hired on behalf of the hirer are to be deemed the servants of the latter, and not of the Department.

7. The hirer shall be responsible for and make good any damage sustained by the cranes when in use.

Electric Light and Power Act 1896.

SYSTEM OF SUPPLY OF ELECTRICAL ENERGY.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 13 of the *Electric Light and Power Act 1896* (No. 1413), the Governor of the State of Victoria in Council has, by an Order made on the 24th day of June, 1902, directed that the system of supply of electrical energy to be carried out by the Melbourne City Council, under its Order No. 3, shall be the following, that is to say:—

In the heart of the city, low tension direct current three-wire system, with a pressure of 460 volts between the outer leads, and a pressure of 230 volts at the consumers' terminals. The main wires to be underground.

In the more outlying districts of the city boundaries, high tension single phase alternating current system with transformers. Primary potential 2,000 volts, secondary 100 volts, at the consumers' terminals. The main wires to be overhead.

Arc lighting.—Where the underground mains are laid, the public and private arc lighting will be connected to the direct current low tension system. In the outlying districts the arc lighting will continue to be on the direct current high tension series system.

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF BALL & WELCH PROPRIETARY LTD., 180-8 FLINDERS STREET, MELBOURNE (DRESSMAKING DEPARTMENT),

for a period of four weeks from the 23rd June, 1902, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than forty females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said forty females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Three-pence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

"Except when not less than two thousand gallons of water are taken at one delivery, in which case the charge shall be at the rate of Three shillings per thousand gallons."

In lieu of the foregoing, the Board hereby directs that from the date hereof the following shall be, and be deemed to be sub-clause XI. of clause 2 of the By-law made by the Board, dated 14th February, 1896, relating to Geelong Water Supply.

(XI.) For water supplied to shipping, the charge shall be One shilling per 100 gallons for the first 300 gallons; above 300 gallons, and not in excess of 400 gallons, the charge shall be Ninepence per 100 gallons; above 400 gallons, and not in excess of 500 gallons, the charge shall be Eightpence per 100 gallons; in excess of 500 gallons, and not in excess of 1,000 gallons, the charge shall be Sevenpence per 100 gallons; above 1,000 gallons, and not in excess of 2,000 gallons, when taken at one delivery, the charge shall be Six shillings; in excess of 2,000 gallons, when taken at one delivery, the charge shall be at the rate of Three shillings per 1,000 gallons.

No. 1243) it is amongst other things enacted that if the council of any municipality prove to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable that any road should be deviated, and that such deviation can be conveniently made through Crown land or land held by licensees or pastoral lessees under the Land Act 1890, the Minister may cause such road to be deviated accordingly at the cost of the municipality, and that, upon the publication in the Government Gazette of an Order of the Governor in Council declaring the new road a public highway, any portion of the old road mentioned in that behalf in such Order shall cease to be a public highway, but shall remain subject to the right of way and passage to and from any premises which cannot be as conveniently approached from the new road, and that, subject as aforesaid, such old road, or so much thereof as adjoins the allotments or areas of the licensees or lessees (if any) through whose allotments or areas the new road has been carried, shall be added to their allotments or areas in proportion to the amount of land taken from each, and shall be accepted by them as full compensation for any loss or damage suffered through the deviation of the road, and that the Minister shall make the distribution accordingly: And whereas it has been proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable to deviate a certain road in the parish of Connewarren: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby declare the road defined in the following description to be a public highway (that is to say):—

County of Hampden, parish of Connewarren: Commencing at a point bearing N. 80° 6' E. two chains thirty-five links and eight-tenths from the south-east angle of allotment 41 of section 9; bounded thence by a line bearing N. 80° 6' E. eighty-seven chains fifty-four links and eight-tenths; thence by a road bearing east five chains eighty-one links and six-tenths; thence by a line bearing S. 80° 6' W. ninety-five chains eighty-one links; and thence by a road bearing N. 55° 0' E. two chains thirty-five links and eight-tenths to the point of commencement in lieu of an existing road in the same parish, defined in the following description (that is to say):—

WHEREAS by section 12 of the Old-age Pensions Act 1901, it is enacted that the net capital value of accumulated property shall be computed and assessed in the prescribed manner, and that unless otherwise prescribed certain provisions in the said section contained shall apply, and whereas it is deemed desirable to substitute for the provision contained in sub-section (b) of the said section 12 of the said Act a new provision hereinafter in this Regulation contained: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, for the purpose of prescribing how the net capital value of accumulated property shall be computed and assessed for the purposes of the said Act, doth hereby make the Regulation following (that is to say):—

1. The net capital value of accumulated property for the purposes of the Old-age Pensions Act 1901, shall be computed and assessed in the manner set out in section 12 of the said Act, save and except that in lieu of and in substitution for sub-section (b), the following provision shall apply:—

From the capital value of accumulated property owned by any person there shall be deducted all charges or encumbrances lawfully and properly existing on such property as well as a further sum, as follows:—

- (a) Where no part of such property consists of money, a sum of £50; or
- (b) Where such property, or a part thereof, consists of money of less value than £10, a sum equal to the difference between £10 and the value of so much of the property as consists of money, plus the sum of £40; or
- (c) Where such property, or a part thereof, consists of money of or above the value of £10, a sum of £10.

The residue remaining after the deduction of the charges or encumbrances and of the further sum aforesaid, shall be deemed to be the net capital value of accumulated property.

2. For the purposes of the last preceding clause money shall be deemed to include money in the possession or under the control of the person the value of whose property is in question, as well as money in a bank or savings bank, and either in the current account or on deposit, or in the hands or under the control of third persons, but available on demand, and shall also include money represented by bills of exchange, promissory notes, orders, or acknowledgments, whether negotiable instruments or not.

AREAS OF LANDS INCREASED AND DIMINISHED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1901* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1901*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 7) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said *Land Act* as lands which may be sold by auction (class 7 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in Division 6 of Part I. of the *Land Act 1901* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said Act as land which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 5, 7, 8, 9, and 11 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1901* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—
