MUTUAL EXTRADITION OF CRIMINALS.

TREATY BETWEEN HIS BRITANNIC MAJESTY AND HIS MAJESTY THE KING OF THE BELGIANS.

I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the Colony under your Government, a copy of an Order of His Majesty the King in Council, dated the 6th of March, 1992, bringing into operation as from the 17th inst. a Treaty between His Britannic Majesty and His Majesty the King of the Belgians for the mutual extradition of criminals, which was signed at Brussels on the 29th of October, 1901, and of which the ratifications were exchanged at that city on the 6th of December, 1901.

BELGIAN EXTRADITION TREATY.

Saint James', 6th March, 1902.

At the Court at Saint James', the 6th day of March, 1902.

PRESENT:

The King's Most Excellent Majesty.

Lord President. Earl of Kintore. Lord James of Hereford. Sir Arthur Wilson.

Whereas by the Extradition Acts. 1870 to 1895, it is amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals. His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State: and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient.

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the twenty-ninth day of October. One thousand nine hundred and one, between His Majesty and His Majesty the King of the Belgians for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which treaty is in the terms following:—

His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Emperor of India, and His Majesty the King of the Belgians, having mutually resolved to conclude a new Treaty for the extradition of criminals, the said High Con-tracting Parties have named as their Plenipotentiaries to conclude a Treaty for this purpose, that is to say:—

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon the following Articles:—

ARTICLE I.

It is agreed that His Britannic Majesty and His Majesty the King of the Belgians shall, on requisition made in their name by their respective Diplomatic Agents, deliver up to each other reciprocally, under the circumstances and conditions stated in the present Treaty, any persons who, being accused or convicted, as principals or accossories, of any of the crimes hereinafter specified committed within the territories of the requiring party, shall be found within the territories of the other party:

- Murder (including avassination, puricide, infanticide, poisoning), or attempt, or conspiracy to murder, in cases jointly provided for by the laws of the two countries.
- 2. Administring drugs or using instruments with intent to produce the miscarriage of women.
 - 3. Manslaughter.
 - 4. Bigamy.

5.—(a) Counterfeiting or altering money, or uttering counterfeit or altered money.

(b) Knowingly making, without lawful authority, any instrument, tool, or engine adapted and intended for the counterfeiting of the coin of the Realm.

- 6. Abandoning children, exposing or unlawfully detaining
- 7. Forgery, counterfeiting, or altering or uttering what is forged, or counterfeited, or altered.
- Any malicious act done with intent to endanger persons in a railway train.
- 9. Embezzlement or larceny.
- 10. Receiving any chattel, money, valuable security, or other property, knowing the same to have been embezzled, stolen, or feloniously obtained.
- 11. Obtaining money, goods, or valuable securities by false
- 12. Crimes by bankrupts against bankruptey law.
- 13. Fraud by a bullee, hanker, agent, factor, trustee, or director, or member or public officer of any company, made criminal by any law for the time being in force.

Carnal knowledge, or any attempt to have earnal knowledge, of a girl under 16 years of age, so far as such acts are punishable by the law of the State upon which the demand is made.
Indecent assault, indecent assault without violence upon children of either sex under 13 years of age.

- 18. Burglary or housebreaking.

- 25. Revolt or conspiracy to revolt, by two or more persons on board a ship on the high seas against the authority of the master.

 - 27. Malicious injury to property, if the offence be indictable.
- 28. Assault occasioning actual bodily harm. Malicious wounding, or inflicting grievous bodily harm.
- 29. Offeness in connexion with the Slave Trade punishable by the laws of both States.

Provided that the surrender shall be made only when, in the case of a person accused, the commission of the crime shall be so established as that the laws of the country where the fugitive or person accused shall be found would justify his apprehension and commitment for trial if the crime had been therecommitted, and in the case of a person alleged to have been convicted, on such evidence as, according to the laws of the country where he is found, would prove that he had been convicted.

In no case can the surrender be made unless the crime shall be punishable according to the laws in force in both countries with regard to extradition. Provided that the surrender shall be made only when, in the

In no case, nor on any consideration whatever, shall the High
Contracting Parties be bound to surrender their own subjects,
whether by birth or naturalization.

The requisition for the surrender shall be made to His Britannic Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs by the Minister or other Diplomatic Agent of His Majesty the King of the Peligians, accompanied by a Judge or Magistrate duly authorized to take cognizance of the acts charged against the accused in Belgium, togother with duly authenticated depositions or statements taken on oath or upon solemn affirmation before such Judge or Magistrate, clearly setting forth the said acts, and containing a description of the person claimed, and any particulars which may serve to identify him.

The said Secretary of State shall transmit such documents to His Britannic Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, who shall then, by order under his hand and seal, signify to some Police Magistrate in London that such requisition has been made, and require him, if there be due cause, to issue his warrant for the apprehension of the fugitive.

On the receipt of such order from the Secretary of State, and on the production of such evidence as would, in the opinion of the Magistrate, justify the issue of the warrant if the crime had been committed in the United Kingdom, he shall issue his warrant accordingly.

When the fugitive shall have been apprehended, he shall be brought before a competent Magistrate. If the evidence to be then produced shall be such as to justify, according to the law of England, the committal for trial of the prisoner, if the crime of which he is accused had been committed in England, the Magistrate shall commit him to prison to await the warrant of the Secretary of State or his surrender, sending immediately to the Secretary of State a certificate of the committal and a report upon the case.

After the expiration of a period from the committal of the prisoner, which shall never be less than fifteen days, the Socretary of State shall, by order under his hand and seal, order the fugitive criminal to be surrendered to such person as may be duly authorized to receive him on the part of the Government of His Majesty the King of the Belgians.

2. In the case of a person convicted-

2. In the case of a person convicted—

The course of proceeding shall be the same as in the case of a person accused, except that the warrant to be transmitted by the Minister or other Diplomatic Agent in support of his requisition shall clearly set forth the crime of which the person claimed has been convicted, and state the fact, place, and date of his conviction. The evidence to be produced before the Magistrate shall be such as would, according to the law of England, prove that the prisoner was convicted of the crime charged.

After the Magistrate shall have committed the accused or convicted person to prison to await the order of a Scerctary of State for his surrender, such person shall have the right to apply for a writ of habous corpus: if he should so apply, his surrender must be deferred until after the decision of the Court upon the return to the writ, and even then can only take place if the decision is adverse to the applicant.

ARTICLE III.

In the dominions of His Majesty the King of the Belgians, other than the colonies or foreign possessions of His said Majesty, the manner of proceeding shall be as follows:—

1. In the case of a person accused-

The requisition for the surrender shall be made to the Minister for Foreign Affairs of His Majesty the King of the Belgians by the Minister or other Diplomatic Agent of His Britannie Majesty, accompanied by a warrant of arrest or other equivalent judicial document issued by a Judge or Magistrate culty authorized to take cognizance of the acts charged against the accused in Great Britain, together with duly authenticated depositions or statements taken on oath or upon solemn affirmation before such Judge or Magistrate, clearly setting forth the said acts, and containing a description of the person claimed, and any other particulars which may serve to identify him.

The Minister for Foreign Affairs shall transmit the warrant of arrest, with the documents thereto annexed, to the Minister of Justice, who shall forward the same to the proper judicial authority, in order that the warrant of arrest may be put in course of execution by the Chamber of the Council (Chambro du Conseil) of the Court of First Instance of the place of residence of the accused, or of the place where he may be found.

The foreigner may claim to be provisionally set at liberty in any case in which a Belgian enjoys that right, and under the same conditions.

The application shall be submitted to the Chamber of the Council (Chambre du Conseil).

The Government will take the opinion of the Chamber of Indictments or Investigation (Chambre des Mises en Accusation) of the Court of Appeal within whose jurisdiction the foreigner shall have been arrested.

The hearing of the case shall be public, unless the foreigner should demand that it should be with closed doors.

The public authorities and the foreigner shall be heard. The latter may obtain the assistance of counsel.

Within a fortnight from the receipt of the documents they shall be returned, with a reasoned opinion, to the Minister of Justice, who shall decide and may order that the accused be delivered to the person duly authorized on the part of the Government of His Britannie Majesty.

The course of proceeding shall be the same as in the case of a person accused, except that the conviction or sentence of condemnation issued in original, or in an authenticated copy, to be transmitted by the Minister or other Diplomatic Agent in suport of his requisition, shall clearly set forth the crime of which the person claimed has been convicted, and state the fact, place, and date of his conviction. The evidence to be produced shall be such as would, according to the Belgian laws, prove that the prisoner was convicted of the crime charged.

ARTICLE IV.

A fugitive criminal may, however, be apprehended under a warrant signed by any Police Magistrate, Justice of the Peace, or other competent authority in either country, on such information or complaint, and such evidence, or after such proceedings as would, in the opinion of the person issuing the warrant, justify the issue of a warrant if the crime had been committed or the prisoner convicted in that part of the dominions of the two contracting parties in which he exercises jurisdiction: Provided, however, that, in the United Kingdom, the accused shall, in such case, be sent as specifly as possible before a competent Magistrate. He shall be discharged, as well in the United Kingdom as in Belgium, if within fourteen days a requisition shall not have been made for his surrender by the Diplomatic Agent of the requiring State in the manner directed by Articles H and HI of this Treaty.

The same rule shall apply to the cases of persons accused or convicted of any of the crimes specified in this Treaty, and committed on the high seas on board any vessel of either country which may come into a port of the other.

ARTICLE V.

If within two months, counting from the date of arrest, sufficient evidence for the extradition shall not have been presented, the person arrested shall be set at liberty. He shall likewise be set at liberty if, within two months of the day on which he was placed at the disposal of the Diplomatic Agent, he shall not have been sent off to the reclaiming country.

ARTICLE VI.

When any person shall have been surendered by either of the High Contracting Parties to the other, such person shall not, until the has been restored, or had an opportunity of returning to the country from whence he was surrendered, be triable or tried for any offence committed in the other country prior to the surrender, other than the particular offence on account of which he was surrendered.

No accused or convicted person shall be surrendered if the offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded shall be deemed by the party upon which it is made to be a political offence, or to be an act connected with (connexe à) such an offence, or if he prove to the satisfaction of the Magistrato, or of the Court before which he is brought on habeas corpus, or to the Sperctary of State, that the requisition for his surrender has in fact been made with a view to try or to punish him for an offence of a political character.

Warrants, depositions, of statements on eath issued or taken in the dominions of either of the two High Contracting Parties, and copies thereof, and certificates of or judicial documents stating the fact of conviction, shall be received in evidence in proceedings in the dominions of the other, if purporting to be signed or certified by a Judge, Magistrate, or officer of the country where they were issued or taken.

Provided such warrants, depositions, statements, copies, certificates, and judicial documents are authenticated by the oath or solemn affirmation of some witness, or by being scaled with the official scal of the Minister of Justice, or some other Minister of State.

ARTICLE IX.

The surrender shall not take place if, since the commission of the acts charged, the accessation, or the conviction, exemption from prosecution or punishment, has been acquired by layse of time, according to the laws of the country where the accused shall have taken refuge.

ARTICLE \dot{X} .

ARTICLE X.

If the individual claimed by one of the two High Contracting Parties in pursuance of the present Treaty should be also claimed by one or several other Powers, on account of other erimes committed upon their respective territories, his surrender shall be granted to that State whose demand is carliest in date; unless any other arrangement should be made between the Governments which have claimed him, either on account of the gravity of the crimes committed, or for any other reasons.

ARTICLE XI.

ARTICLE XI.

If the individual claimed should be under process, or oundemned by the Courts of the country where he has taken refuge, his surrunder may be deferred until he shall have been set at liberty in due course of law.

In case he should be proceeded against or detained in such country on account of obligations contracted towards private individuals, his surrender shall, nevertheless, take place, the injured party retaining his right to prosecute his claims before the competent authority.

It shall take place even when the surrender, after having been ordered, shall be prevented from taking place by reason of the escape or death of the individual claimed.

The rights of third parties with regard to the said property or articles are, nevertheless, reserved.

ARTICLE XIII.

Each of the High Contracting Parties shall defray the expenses occasioned by the arrest within its territories, the detention, and the conveyance to its frontier, of the persons whom it may consent to surrender in pursuance of the present Treaty.

ARTICLE XIV.

The stipulations of the present Treaty shall be applicable to the Colonies and foreign possessions of the two High Contracting Parties.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in a Colony or foreign possession of either Party shall be made to the Governor or chief authority of such Colony or possession by the Chief Consular Officer of the other in such Colony or possession; or if the fugitive has scaeped from a Colony or foreign possession of the Party on whose behalf the requisition is made, by the Governor or ohief authority of such Colony or possession.

Such requisitions may be disposed of, subject always, as nearly as may be, to the provisions of this Treaty, by the respective Governors or chief authorities, who, however, shall be at liberty either to grant the surrender or to refer the matter to their Government.

His Britannic Majesty shall, however, be at liberty to make special arrangements in the British colonies and foreign possessions for the surrender or 6 Belgian criminals who may there take refuge, on the basis, as nearly as may be, of the provisions of the present Treaty.

ARTICLE XV.

ARTICLE XV.

The present Treaty shall come into operation ten days after its publication, in conformity with the laws of the respective countries.

From the day when the present Treaty shall come into force, the Treaty of Extradition between the two countries of the 20th May, 1876; the Declaration between the British and Belgian Governments, dated the 23rd July, 1877, extending the Treaty of the 20th May, 1876, to certain additional crimes; the further Declaration of the 29th Amay, 1876, and the Convention of the 20th May, 1876; and the Convention of the 27th August, 1896, further amending the Treaty of the 29th May, 1876, shall all cease to have effect; but the present Treaty shall apply to all crimes within the Treaty whether committed before or after the day when it comes into force.

Either party may at any time terminate the Treaty on giving to the other six months' notice of its intention.

ARTICLE XVI.

The present Treaty shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Brussels as soon as may be within six weeks from the date of signature.

In witness whereof, the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seals of their arms.

Done at Brussels, the twenty-ninth day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and one.



THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby, pursuant, and in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the Water Act 1890, repeal sub-clause XI. of clause 2 of the By-law made by the said Board on the 14th day of February, 1890, relating to the Geelong Water Supply, and further hereby repeals the Hylaw made by the said Board on the 2nd day of May, 1992, whereby the following words were added to the said sub-clause XI. of clause 2, viz.:—

"Except when not less than two thousand gallons of water are taken at one delivery, in which case the charge shall be at the rate of Three shillings per thousand gallons."

In lieu of the foregoing, the Board hereby directs that from the date hereof the following shall be, and be deemed to be subclause XI. of clause 2 of the By-law made by the Board, dated 14th February, 1896, relating to Geelong Water Supply.

(XI.) For water supplied to shipping, the charge shall be Ona shilling per 100 gallons for the first 300 gallons; above 300 gallons, and not in excess of 400 gallons, the charge shall be Ninepence per 100 gallons; above 400 gallons, and not in excess of 500 gallons, the charge shall be Eightpence per 100 gallons; in excess of 500 gallons, and not in excess of 1,000 gallons; in excess of 2,000 gallons, and not in excess of 2,000 gallons, above 1,000 gallons, and not in excess of 2,000 gallons, when taken at one delivery, the charge shall be Six shillings; in excess of 2,000 gallons, when taken at one delivery, the charge shall be at the rate of Three shillings per 1,000 gallons.

In all cases of a critical or protracted nature it shall be the duty of the honorary medical officer in charge to call a consultation with one or more of the other honorary medical officers, and when a majority of the consultants deem it necessary a consultation of the whole medical staff shall be called.

16. No case, having been admitted for medical treatment, shall be discharged as incurable without a consultation by the honorary medical officers.

17. In cases of a difference of opinion between the honorary medical officers.

18. All surgical operations necessary shall be performed by or under the direction of the honorary medical officer in charge and one or more of the other honorary medical officer in the order of the other honorary medical officer in charge of the case, but no major operations hall be performed (except in case of great emergency) without a previous consultation with one or more of the other honorary medical officers.

In all cases of serious illness or accident a similar consultation shall be held.

No major operation shall be performed without due notice being given to all the honorary medical officers.

He shall also have charge of and be accountable for and keep an inventory of all surgical instruments, appliances, and medicines, the property of the institution.

19s. The committee may suspend any honorary medical officer, provided that such suspension be approved by a majority of the members present at a special meeting convened for the consideration of such suspension, and be confirmed at a special meeting of contributors to be held within fourteen days from the decision of the committee.

19c. The resident medical officer shall reside on the premises, and be not absent from his duties for more than four hours without securing the services of one of the honorary medical officers, and be not absent for more than twenty-four hours without arranging with an honorary medical officer and obtaining the president's consent, and that he and the master shall not be absent at the same time.

19p. The resident medical officer shall superintend and control the master, nursing staff, and all servants and immates of the institution, and in case of neglect of duty or insubordination may suspend any of them and report thereon to the visiting committee.

20. Accident and emergency cases may be received at any time, and shall be attended to by the resident medical officer, pending instructions from the honorary medical officer for the time being in charge, who shall be immediately notified thereof.
