PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1899* (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz. :—

WEDNESDAY, THE 29TH DAY OF JANUARY, 1902, as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Queenscliff,* and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Dookie, Queenscliff, Nhill, Rochester, and Warracknabeal ;

FRIDAY, THE 31ST DAY OF JANUARY, 1902, as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Watchem ;

MONDAY, THE 3RD DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1902, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Seymour ;*

WEDNESDAY, THE 5TH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1902, as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Kyabram ;

THURSDAY, THE 6TH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1902, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Winchelsea ;*

WEDNESDAY, THE 12TH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1902, as a Public Holiday in the City of Richmond and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Shepparton ;

WEDNESDAY, THE 19TH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1902, as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Korumburra ;

WEDNESDAY, THE 26TH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1902, as a Public Holiday throughout the Boroughs of Castlemaine and Chewton, the United Shire of Mount Alexander, the Shire of Maldon, the Shire of Newstead ; as a Bank Holiday at Maldon ; and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Bridgewater and Inglewood ;

TUESDAY, THE 18TH DAY OF MARCH, 1902, as a Public Holiday throughout the United Shire of Beechworth and the Shire of Yackandandah.

That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than fifty females or more than twelve boys under the age of sixteen years for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said fifty females and twelve boys under the age of sixteen years shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours, in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which he or she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening he or she works overtime.

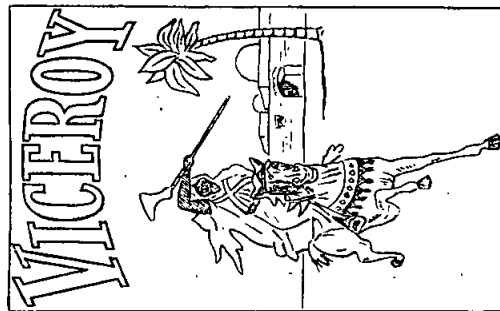

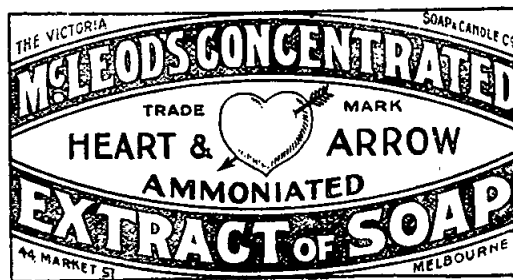

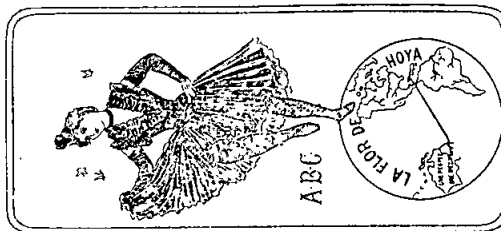
