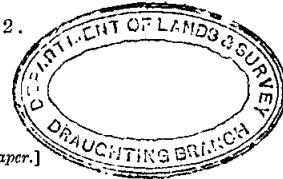

ROAD REDUCED IN WIDTH.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in accordance with the provisions of, and in exercise of the powers conferred by, the *Local Government Act 1891*, doth by this present Order confirm the scheme for the reduction in width of part of the road situated in West Charlton, and known as the Glenloth and Swan Hill road, and being within the municipality of the Shire of Charlton, as shown in pink tint on a plan attached to such scheme, and deposited in the Office of Crown Lands and Survey, Melbourne, and, in accordance with the said scheme, under the seals of the Council of the Shire of Charlton, the Board of Land and Works, and under the hands and seals of the respective owners of land, having a frontage to the portion of road aforesaid.

And the Honorable Malcolm Kenneth McKenzie, His Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein, accordingly.
