NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900

ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF TOORAK.

AN Election of a Member of the Legislative Assembly is about to be held in the above-mentioned Electoral District, and any Elector thereof who appears from the rolls to reside in such District, and who resides at least five miles from the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or who has reason to believe that on the polling day he will not be within five miles of the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or that on account of ill-health or infirmity he will be prevented from voting personally thereat, who desires to vote through the post office at such Election may, on posting an application to the Returning Officer, obtain a Postal Ballot-paper enabling him to vote through the post at such Election.

Such application shall be as nearly as possible in the following form:—

"I hereby apply for a Postal Ballot-paper for the forthcoming election of the Legislative Assembly, and I declare that [here state upon which of the above-mentioned grounds the applicant claims a Postal Ballot-paper].

Printed forms of application may be obtained at any post office, or the application may be in writing.

If applicant is the holder of an elector's right, such right must be attached to application.

Any Elector who intends to vote through the post must apply at once, as no Postal Ballot-paper will be supplied unless the Returning Officer receives application therefor sufficiently early to admit of Postal Ballot-paper being sent to and returned by such Elector so as to reach the Returning Officer before closing of Poll.

Citation.—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

DANGEROUS GOODS.

NOTICE TO SHIPPERS.

FROM inquiry it would appear that shippers, when forwarding dangerous goods for shipment, rely upon the carter's delivery note accompanying such goods as a sufficient intimation to the master or owner of the shipper's intention to ship dangerous goods; but as a delivery note is a form commonly used in connexion with all classes of goods shipped, the Marine Board is of opinion that it does not, in a sufficiently direct manner, bring to the actual notice of the owner or master the fact that "dangerous goods" are to be shipped as cargo, and it is therefore desirable that any person intending to ship dangerous goods shall send a special intimation as early as possible of his intention to do so *direct to the owner or master of the ship*, in addition to the carter's delivery note, in order that the stowage of same on delivery at the wharf may be carefully determined in the interests of life and property.

The attention of all interested is directed to the provisions of sections 157 to 161 of the *Marine Act 1890*.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria in Council, by an Order made on the 25th day of September, 1903, has rescinded, from the 30th September, 1903, the Regulations made on the 2nd day of July, 1900, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 13th July, 1900, page 2760, and has made the following Regulations in lieu thereof, fixing Rates of Allowances for Travelling Expenses of Officers, Sub-Officers, and Constables of the Police Force, such Regulations to have effect from and after the 1st day of October, 1903:—

11. Members of the Force will be allowed, when transferred from one station to another on account of the exigencies of the Service, to travel on requisition and to receive reimbursement, upon vouchers, of a portion of the expenses of their removal as follows:—

Officers.—The actual necessary cost of transport of not exceeding 1 ton of luggage, and half the actual necessary cost of conveyance of their wives and children.

Sub-Officers and Constables.—The actual necessary cost of transport of 10 cwt. of luggage, and half the actual necessary cost of conveyance of their wives and children.

12. Members of the Force, when transferred at their own request or through their own fault, will not be allowed any expenses, and may be required to pay their own rail fare and that of members of the Force sent to relieve them.

13. No travelling expenses will be paid to any member of the Force stationed in the Melbourne District for travelling or attending Courts therein.

14. No travelling expenses or allowances will be paid to any member of the Force in cities or large towns for attending Court or doing other duty at adjoining or adjacent stations.

15. In all cases the hours of duty must be continuous.

16. Allowances under clauses 7 and 8 will be for periods over one day and will not be continued over one month.

17. The first day only going on temporary duty will be allowed under clauses 5 and 6. The remainder, including the day returning, under clauses 7 or 8.

18. No allowance will be paid to any member of the Force travelling on steam or sailing vessel where the ticket covers food and sleeping accommodation.

19. Under these regulations the day shall be reckoned to commence at 6 a.m. and end at 12 midnight; and the night to commence at 12 midnight and end at 6 a.m. But, if unavoidable circumstances necessitate an earlier departure than 6 a.m. the day shall be reckoned as commencing from such starting time.

20. Members of the Force who claim for an absence of eight hours or more extending past midnight cannot also claim for the night.

21. No allowances will be paid under these regulations for attendance at races, sports, shows or special duty when suitable board, lodging, refreshment, or money allowance is given.

22. In cases not provided for in the preceding regulations the Chief Commissioner shall inquire into and deal with claims submitted by members of the Force.

On application to the Director State Schools and Private Schools shall (excepting on Sunday) be admitted on payment of one half the charges for admission hereby prescribed. On Sundays and all other days of the week subscribers and members of the Society shall be admitted free.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

BY-LAW No. 167.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, and do hereby repeal so much of all previous By-laws and practices as conflict therewith:—

The rate for the carriage of Victorian coal shall be, until 31st December, 1903, inclusive, Three farthings per ton per mile, of which One halfpenny per ton per mile shall be charged the consignee or consignor, and One farthing per ton per mile shall be charged to and paid the Railway Department out of funds at the disposal of the Honorable the State Treasurer; and from 1st January, 1904, inclusive, the rate shall be Three farthings per ton per mile, of which Five-eighths of one penny per ton per mile shall be charged the consignee or consignor, and One-eighth of one penny per ton per mile shall be charged to and paid the Railway Department out of funds at the disposal of the Honorable the State Treasurer. The minimum charge shall be 2s. per ton for distances up to and inclusive of 6 miles, 2s. 3d. per ton for distances over 6 and up to and inclusive of 8 miles, and 2s. 6d. per ton for distances beyond 8 miles, with a minimum truck load of 9 tons when the carrying capacity of the truck is equal to or exceeds 10 tons, and of 1 ton less than the actual tonnage capacity of the truck when such is less than 10 tons.

The minimum charges and the truck load conditions shall also apply to coal imported into the State of Victoria.

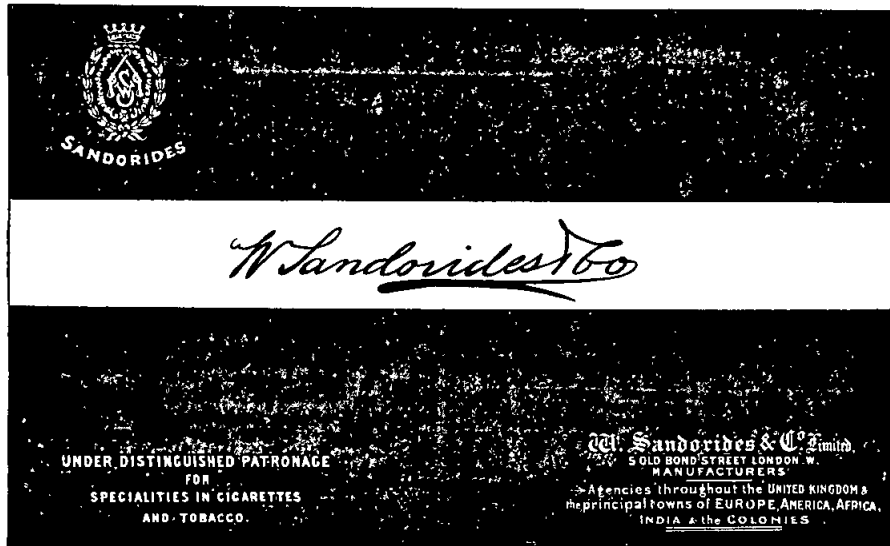

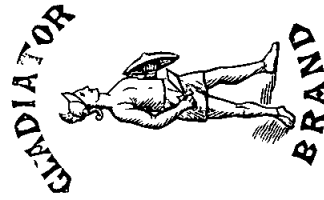

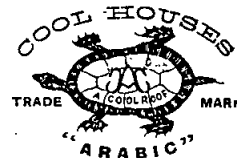

WHEREAS by section 208 of the *Land Act 1901* power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein prescribed: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following additions to the Regulations made by Order of the 8th day of January, 1902 (that is to say):—

Land Act 1901.

ADDITION TO REGULATIONS MADE ON 8TH JANUARY, 1902.

PART III.—MALLEE LANDS.

CHAPTER VII.—EXTENSION OF THE TERM OF MALLEE LEASES.

1. A lessee of a mallee allotment who desires the extension of the term of his lease to the 31st day of December, 1907, may make application therefor, by letter, addressed to the Secretary for Lands, Melbourne, or the lease may be lodged at the Department of Lands and Survey, Melbourne, by any person, with a request that extension of the term of lease be indorsed thereon.
2. The mallee lease or certificate of title must accompany the application for extension of term of lease.
3. Extension of the term of lease shall be given effect to by indorsement on the lease in the form prescribed in Schedule A hereto.
4. The Secretary for Lands shall notify the Registrar of Titles, in writing, when the term of any mallee lease is extended, in accordance with the provisions of section 233 of the *Land Act 1901*.

INTRODUCTION INTO VICTORIA OF SWINE FROM SOUTH AUSTRALIA PROHIBITED.

WHEREAS by section 267 of the *Health Act 1890*, among other things the Governor in Council is empowered to, from time to time, make, alter, or vary such Orders as may seem necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the introduction into Victoria from any country or colony, or part of a country or colony (in which respectively any disease in sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever is known to exist), and for the detention in quarantine in such place and for such period as the Governor in Council by such Order appoints or directs, of all sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever, or of meat, skins, hides, horns, hoofs, or other parts of any animals, or of hay, straw, fodder, or other articles likely to propagate amongst men or other animals any infectious or contagious disease whatsoever: And it is also enacted that all orders for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned shall have the like force and effect as if the same had been inserted in the now in part recited Act: And that all persons offending against any Order made under the authority of the said section shall for each and every offence forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Fifty pounds, or such smaller sum as the Governor in Council may in any case by such order direct; and such sum shall go to and form part of the consolidated revenue: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth, by this present Order, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above recited Act, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows (that is to say):—

The introduction of Swine into Victoria from the State of South Australia is hereby prohibited for an indefinite period.

And the Honorable Thomas Bent, His Majesty's Minister of Public Health for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Education Act 1890.

REGULATIONS VIII., X., AND XXIII. OF THE REGULATIONS UNDER THE EDUCATION ACT 1890 RESCINDED.—NEW REGULATIONS MADE.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-fifth day of September, 1903.

WHEREAS by section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind Regulations Nos. VIII., X., and XXIII. of the Regulations made under the *Education Act 1890*, and doth make the Regulations following in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

VIII.—PART-TIME SCHOOLS.

1. In thinly-populated districts a teacher may be employed to give instruction in schools at two or more places.

2. In part-time schools instruction in the subjects of the free course will be given for at least two and a half hours on every school day, when school is held at each branch on the same day, and for at least five hours on every school day when school is held at each branch on different days, unless otherwise sanctioned by the Minister. When more than two schools are under the charge of one teacher, special arrangements will be made with regard to the time for instruction in each.

3. From 1st October, 1900, teachers in charge of part-time schools, where the distance between the branches is not less than 3 miles, will be granted an allowance for travelling on the following scale:—

3 miles to 8 miles, at the rate of 1s. 6d. per mile per week.

9 miles to 11 miles, at the rate of 12s. per week.

12 miles and over, at the rate of 14s. per week.

An additional allowance at the rate of £12 per annum will be granted, from the 1st August, 1903, to teachers classified in the Seventh class and in charge of part-time schools which are also classified in the Seventh Class.

REGULATION X.—SCHOLARSHIPS.

The Minister of Public Instruction may annually award 40 Scholarships, or any less number, to pupils of State Schools, in the manner and on the conditions hereinafter mentioned:—

1. Scholars will be selected upon competitive examinations held during December of each year. No competitor will be permitted to attend any such examination unless he shall have been classified in the Sixth Class of his school from at least the first day of July immediately preceding, and each successful competitor will be required to produce a certificate of birth showing that he will not have completed his fourteenth year before the first day of January succeeding the examination; and no competitor will be selected unless he shall, during the two years immediately preceding the latter date, have been continuously on the rolls of, and in attendance at, a State school.

2. The subjects for examination will be—

Questions may also be given on the other subjects included in the Programme of Instruction for Class VI., as shown in Regulation I.

3. Each Scholarship will be of the annual value of £10, tenable for three years, upon the following conditions:—

(a) That the scholar shall, at the commencement of the session following the award of the Scholarship, become a student in one of the approved secondary schools or colleges, or in one of such other schools or colleges as may be approved of by the Minister.

- (b) That he shall continue to attend one of the above secondary schools or colleges, and shall obtain at the end of each year a report from the authorities of the same.

If no report or an unfavorable report be received, or if at any time the Minister be satisfied that the conduct of any scholar has been disorderly or immoral, the Scholarship and all the advantages connected therewith shall thereupon cease and determine.

- (c) That the scholar show progress as required in clause 7.

4. Where a scholar does not reside within 3 miles of an approved secondary school or college, the Minister may, at his discretion, allow him such sum (not exceeding £5 per annum) as will cover the cost of transit to and fro, if the school or college is easily accessible by rail or coach; or may commute the Scholarship for one of £20 tenable upon the conditions mentioned in clause 3.

5. Payments will be made quarterly. All payments, however, by the Minister will be conditional on moneys being placed at his disposal by the Legislature.

6. Examinations of State school pupils for Scholarships offered by secondary schools or colleges may be held annually, under the supervision of the Department, provided that the conditions under which such Scholarships are to be offered have been previously approved by the Minister of Public Instruction. Holders of these Scholarships will be eligible to compete for Exhibitions subject to the conditions of the Regulation relating thereto.

7. Holders of Scholarships may, when deemed necessary, be required to attend an examination, and those who fail to pass satisfactorily will have their Scholarships withdrawn.

8. The Council of Agricultural Education offers five Scholarships triennially as provided for in section 19 of Act No. 1062, as quoted below:—

It shall be competent for the Agricultural College Council to cause to be held in each of the five agricultural divisions of Victoria a competitive examination of boys attending State schools in the said divisions, and the boys who shall excel in such subjects as may be submitted to them shall be entitled to be admitted free of charge to the agricultural college or experimental farm for a course of training, such examinations to be held every three years.

The candidates must be over fourteen years of age.

The examination will be held in December, 1903, and the subjects will be those specified in section 2 above.

XXIII.—TRAINING.

1. The members of the Training College will be a Principal, two or more Lecturers, and students.

2. Training will be conducted in the Training College by the Principal and the other officers of the College, or at the University.

3. The course of instruction in the Training College will be free, except as hereinafter provided, and will be for two years, except as hereinafter provided.

4. (a) Studentships will be awarded on competitive examination to classified teachers having a first-class certificate or a certificate of competency, or a licence to teach pending certificate or who have passed in all the subjects of the pupil teacher's course. Provided that no candidate who, for the two years immediately preceding the date of the examination, has not obtained from the District Inspector satisfactory reports as to his conduct and efficiency as a teacher, will be eligible to compete, and that no studentship will be awarded to any candidate who fails to pass a meritorious examination.

(b) In determining the order of precedence of the candidates who pass a meritorious examination, consideration will be given to practical skill and length of experience. In the case of pupil teachers, length of experience will be limited to period of service as first-class pupil teachers.

5. (a) Holders of studentships under section 4 (a) supra, may be allowed to reside at the Training College upon the payment of £12 per annum towards the expense of their board and residence. In the event of the holder of such studentship not being in a position to pay the amount above stipulated, viz., £12 for each year during the currency of his studentship, the Minister may allow him, on his entering into a bond by himself and an approved surety, to pay such amount at such time and in such instalments as the Minister may determine.

(b) Holders of studentships who may reside at home will be entitled to an allowance of £18 per annum towards board and residence.

6. Every student will be required to enter into an agreement, by himself and an approved surety, not to relinquish his course of training without the permission of the Minister, and for four years after the termination of his studentship to teach in any school to which he may be appointed.

7. (a) Holders of State school exhibitions may be granted a studentship for any two years during the currency of their exhibition, but without allowance for board and residence (other than that payable to them as exhibitors.)

(b) Studentships, not exceeding five in number in any one year, may be granted to persons who have passed the matriculation examination of the Melbourne University, or an approved equivalent, who are at least eighteen years of age, and who have been classed as meritorious in the competitive examination under 4 above. Such students will be entitled to tuition in the course of instruction at the College free of expense, but without any allowance for board and residence. Such unpaid studentships will be awarded to such candidates in order of merit.

(c) Persons to whom studentships may be granted under subsections (a) and (b) of this section will be eligible for employment as classified teachers upon passing the examination for the trained teacher's certificate.

8. The subjects of competitive examinations for studentships will be those prescribed for a first-class certificate.

9. The Course of Instruction in the Training College shall be—

FIRST YEAR.

Education, Part I.—

- (a) The history of education (period to be prescribed).
- (b) The leading principles of education and their application.
- (c) School organization and management.
- (d) Infant school teaching and management.
- (e) *Practical*.—During the year 175 hours to be spent in schools, including at least 140 hours in teaching. Attendance at two criticism lessons weekly.

History—

The detailed study of a period of English History and a course in Australian History as prescribed from time to time.

*Mathematics, Part I.—

Algebra.—To Chapter XX., C. Smith's Elementary Algebra, or approved equivalent.
Geometry.—Euclid, Books I. and II., and Book III. to Proposition XX. with deductions, or approved equivalent.

*Latin, Part I.—

- (a) Accidence and the leading rules of syntax.
- (b) Translation of Latin from book to be prescribed.
- (c) Translation of easy passages at sight.

Science, Part I.—

- (a) Elementary general science, including a course in physics and in chemistry with laboratory work; or
- (b) A course in nature study with field work.

Music—

Theory.—To understand the elements of the Staff and the Tonic Sol-fa Notations, the Great Stave, Key Signatures up to five sharps and five flats, Time Signatures C, 3, 3, 3, 3, 3, ordinary marks of expression and musical terms in general use, Modulation to Dominant, Subdominant and Relative Minor; also the terms Major, Minor, Relative Major, and Relative Minor.

* Part II. of each of these subjects (Latin, Mathematics, and Drawing) may be taken by students in their first year with the approval of the Principal.

Practice.—To pitch and conduct an easy school song. To sing at sight, in correct time and tune, a short, simple exercise, consisting of diatonic intervals which may be written in minims, crotchets, and quavers, with one easy modulation. To name or write four or five notes in any order, the key-note being first sounded; or

At the discretion of the Director, or his deputy, to give a satisfactory singing lesson to a class.

*Drawing, Part I.—

Practical Plane and solid Geometry, including drawing to scale and elementary isometric projection; elementary instrumental perspective; freehand drawing from the flat and from the round; black-board drawing.

Practice.—To give a satisfactory demonstration or lesson in any subject specified under Drawing in Regulation I.

Manual Training, Part I.—

Paper-work or Cardboard-work for men students.

Needlework for women students.

Domestic Economy.

Gymnastics.

SECOND YEAR.

1. Education, Part II.—

As for Education, Part I., of the Diploma of Education, or as prescribed for Infant Teacher's Certificate.

Practical.—At least 60 hours in class teaching in addition to one week spent in the Model Country School. Attendance at criticism lessons.

2. English Language and Literature—

(a) The history and structure of the English language.

(b) The study of prescribed selections.

(c) The history of English literature, so far as is necessary to appreciate the selections prescribed.

(d) The laws of composition and style; or

English, Part I., or Deductive Logic (Melbourne University).

3. Mathematics, Part II.—

Algebra.—Charles Smith's Elementary Algebra, or approved equivalent.

Geometry.—Euclid, Books III., IV., VI. to Proposition XX., or approved equivalent; or

Pure Mathematics, Part I. (Melbourne University); or

Mixed Mathematics, Part I. (Melbourne University).

4. Latin, Part II.—

As for Part I., but of greater difficulty; or

Latin, Melbourne University Matriculation Examination; or

Latin, Part I., Melbourne University.

5. Science, Part II.—

As for Part I., but of greater difficulty; or

Natural Philosophy, Part I.; or Chemistry, Part I.; or Biology, Part I.; or Natural Science (Melbourne University).

6. Music, Part II.—

Attendance for choral practice.

7. Drawing, Part II.—

Drawing with the brush; drawing plant and other forms from nature; drawing in light and shade from casts and models; elementary decorative design and colour composition; elementary modelling; freehand perspective; blackboard drawing and drawing from memory for illustrative purposes.

Practice.—To give a satisfactory demonstration or lesson in any subject specified under Drawing in Regulation I.

8. Manual Training, Part II.—

Cardboard-work or Woodwork.

Needlework for women students.

N.B.—At the discretion of the Director any subject of the Diploma of Education may be taken in lieu of any subject of the second year's course except in the case of Education, Part II.

Students who are preparing for the infant mistress's certificate will not be required to take the full course in mathematics or Latin.

* Part II. of each of these subjects (Latin, Mathematics, and Drawing) may be taken by students in their first year with the approval of the Principal.

10. (a) During their course in the Training College, students will be required to attend lectures at the college regularly and punctually, or, as proscribed in the preceding section, at the University, in the subjects proscribed for a trained teacher's certificate, and in such other subjects as the Principal may direct.

(b) Schools will be selected as practising schools, at which students will attend and teach classes under the direction of the Principal. A special practising school similar to a small country school will also be provided to give students the necessary practice in the work of such schools.

11. At the end of each year, students will be examined in the subjects proscribed for the course of instruction for that year. Each student who passes a satisfactory examination in Education, Parts I. and II., History, Literature, Mathematics, Parts I. and II., Latin, Parts I. and II., Science, Parts I. and II., Drawing, Parts I. and II., or the approved equivalents thereof, and shows satisfactory proficiency in Music, Gymnastics, and Manual Training, and who obtains in the aggregate a satisfactory number of marks, shall be entitled to a trained teacher's certificate; provided that such certificate shall not be issued until such student has satisfactorily performed the duties of a teacher for the period of two years after the termination of his studentship. (In estimating the total number of marks, no credit will be given for less than 25 per cent. of marks in any subject.)

12. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding section, any student who fails to pass in Part I. of any subject of the first year, but who shows satisfactory progress during that year, may, upon passing in Part II. of such subject, be deemed to have qualified for the trained teacher's certificate in that subject.

13. Students who exhibit special merit as determined by examination and report from the Principal, may attend such courses of lectures at the University and at the Training College as the Director may in each case determine, provided that each such student shall have passed in all of the subjects of his first year, and in Latin, Part II., Mathematics, Part II., and Drawing, Part II., for the trained teacher's certificate. Such students will be entitled to a trained teacher's certificate upon their completing their first year of the Diploma of Education.

14. (a) Students who at the end of their second year of training have failed to pass in any of the subjects proscribed for the trained teacher's certificate, may, at the discretion of the Director, be allowed to present themselves in such subject or subjects at any examination for the trained teacher's certificate.

(b) A student may, with the permission of the Director, relinquish his studentship at the end of his first year, and may be permitted to present himself for examination in the subjects of the first or the second year's course for the trained teacher's certificate.

15. Students may be admitted under clause 4, supra, for a course of one year's training for the purpose of obtaining the Infant Teacher's Certificate. If unsuccessful in passing for this certificate at the end of the year, such students may, at the discretion of the Director, be allowed to present themselves at any subsequent examination for such certificate, but they shall not be entitled to have their studentships extended beyond one year.

16. (a) Students will be liable to dismissal from the Training College for idleness or misconduct.

(b) Students who at the progress examinations, which shall be held periodically by the Principal, or who at the examination held at the close of the first year of training, fail to show satisfactory progress, either in the literary work or in the art of teaching, may, on the recommendation of the Principal, have their studentships withdrawn.

17. The Principal will furnish an annual report to the Minister on the students in training, and he will also at the close of each year furnish a report on the conduct of each student.

18. The Minister may, on the recommendation of District Inspectors, grant teachers leave of absence without pay for such period as may be determined, in order that they may attend a course of instruction at the Training College in the Theory and Practice of Teaching. Such instruction will be free, but all other expenses must be borne by such teachers.

19. Persons other than students may, on payment of a fee of £10 10s. per annum, be admitted to the course of instruction at the Training College, or, on payment of a fee of £4 4s. per annum, to the course of instruction in Theory and Practice of Teaching only. Students admitted to a course of instruction in

Theory and Practice of Teaching may, on the payment of an additional fee of £1 1s. per annum, be admitted to a course of instruction in any one of the other subjects of the course.

20. Such persons must be at least eighteen years of age, of good character, must satisfy the Principal of the College that they are qualified to profit by the lectures, and must undertake to comply, while in attendance, with the rules of the college.

21. Such persons may be suspended from attendance at the lectures, or may be required to discontinue the course for repeated unpunctuality, absence from lectures, or breach of the rules of the College.

22. Persons who have paid the fee of £10 10s., and complied during two consecutive years with the conditions prescribed by clauses 10 (a) and (b) for students, will be admitted to the final examination for the trained teacher's certificate without further payment.

23. Persons who have paid the fee of £4 4s. per annum will be admitted without further payment to the final examination in Theory and Practice of Teaching, on production of a certificate signed by the Principal stating that they have complied during two consecutive half-years with the rules of the College, as to attendance at the lectures in Theory and Practice of Teaching, and at the practising schools.

24. Persons other than students, who either pass the final examination for the trained teacher's certificate, or that in Theory and Practice of Teaching, will be awarded special certificates, specifying the subjects in which they have passed and the extent to which they have been trained; but such special certificates shall not entitle the holders to employment in State schools.

25. Persons who have obtained such special certificates may be awarded the Department's trained teacher's certificate on producing satisfactory evidence that they have passed at some examination or examinations of the Department, or of the Melbourne University, in all the subjects in which students in training are required to pass, in order to obtain the same certificate, and that such examinations were of at least equal difficulty with those passed by students; but such special certificates shall not necessarily entitle the holders to employment in State schools.

And the Honorable Arthur Otto Sachse, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by an Order of the Governor in Council dated the 20th day of October, 1896, the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts which relate to shops were extended to the whole of the shops in the Shire of Colac: And whereas by the said Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations to have effect within any specified municipal district or any specified part of such district, for, amongst other things, requiring shops of any particular class within such district other than those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the Factories and Shops Act 1890 to close before the hours mentioned in the said Acts, provided a petition shall have been previously addressed to the Governor in Council and forwarded to the Minister, certified to by the municipal clerk as having been signed by a majority of the shopkeepers of the particular class substantially interested and affected thereby: And whereas separate petitions have been so addressed and forwarded by shopkeepers keeping shops of the following classes respectively (being classes of shops other than those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the Factories and Shops Act 1890 aforesaid), viz.—Boot dealers' shops, butchers' shops, drapers' shops, furniture dealers' shops, grocers' shops, ironmongers' shops, saddlers' shops, tailors' shops, and watchmakers and jewellers' shops within the Township of Colac in the Shire of Colac, each such petition praying that within the township of Colac in the municipal district of the Shire of Colac aforesaid all shops of the particular class specified in the petition shall be closed on Saturday in each week from the hour of Nine o'clock in the evening: And whereas each such petition has been certified to by the municipal clerk of the said shire as having been signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers of the particular class substantially interested and affected thereby: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with

the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

All shops within the Township of Colac in the municipal district of the Shire of Colac of the following classes, viz.—
Boot dealers' shops, butchers' shops, drapers' shops, furniture dealers' shops, grocers' shops, ironmongers' shops, saddlers' shops, tailors' shops, and watchmakers and jewellers' shops shall be closed on Saturday in each week from the hour of Nine o'clock in the evening.

And the Honorable John Murray, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the Thistle Act 1893, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation declare a certain plant named—

Senecio Jacobina, commonly known as "Ragwort,"

to be a thistle within the meaning of the Thistle Act 1890 throughout the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twenty-fifth day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and three, and in the third year of His Majesty's reign.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1901 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I, Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1901, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 7) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided; Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 113 and 132 of the Land Act 1901 aforesaid, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 5, 7, 8, 9, and 10 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1901 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC GARDEN PURPOSES AT HAMILTON.

THE Council of the Borough of Hamilton, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Garden purposes at Hamilton, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from Seven a.m. to half-past Eight p.m. during the months of October to March inclusive, and from Seven a.m. to half-past Six p.m. during the remaining six months of the year.
2. A person shall not enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. A person shall not damage in any way the trees, shrubs, bushes, plants, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the consent of the Council.
4. A person shall not climb any trees, or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or cut or make any incision or puncture on or in the fences, trees, plants, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. A person shall not put in the reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, or poultry.
6. A person shall not bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord.
7. A person shall not erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure, without the consent, in writing, of the Council first obtained.

8. A person, not being a labourer or workman employed in the reserve, shall not enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

9. A person shall not injure, damage, or destroy any building, fence, rail, gate, or other structure in or surrounding the reserve or appurtenant thereto.

10. A person shall not walk or run over, or stand, sit, or lie upon any part of any flower or shrub bed, nor cut or break any tree, bush, shrub, or plant, nor dig up, remove, or carry away any tree, bush, shrub, plant, bulb, corn, or tuber in the reserve.

11. A person shall not remove or in any way interfere with the stones or other materials used for the purpose of a border to any flower or other bed, or for edging of any footpath or walk in the reserve.

12. A person shall not interfere with any stop-cock, water-tap, pipe, hose, Jupiter jet, or other water appliance in the reserve, nor leave any tap open so that water may escape therefrom, or otherwise waste water in the reserve.

13. A person shall not wilfully or intentionally throw, place, deposit, leave, or retain in the reserve any bottle, paper, straw, litter, refuse, broken glass or crockery, or rubbish of any description.

14. Wheeled vehicles, except perambulators or go-carts, shall not be permitted to enter the reserve without the authority, in writing, of the Council.

15. A person shall not fire a gun, pistol, or other fire-arm in the reserve without the authority of the Council.

16. A person shall not wilfully, carelessly, or negligently foul or pollute any water in the reserve, nor take, injure, or destroy, or attempt to take, injure, or destroy, or wilfully disturb any fish in any such water, or wilfully disturb, or worry, or ill-treat any fowl therein or elsewhere in the reserve.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
