PRELIMINARY NOTICE. - LIGHT ON KAHURANGI POINT, WEST COAST, SOUTH ISLAND.

COAST, SOUTH ISLAND.

NOTICE is hereby given that about the end of November, 1903, a light will be exhibited from a light-house now being erected om Kahurangi Point, West Coast, South Island, in lat. 40° 46° 3° S. and long. 172° 13′ 7° E., as measured from the Admiralty Chart. The light will be about 110 feet above the level of the sea at high water, and will be a dioptric fixed white light of the second order, visible to seaward over an arc of 212 degrees of the horizon for a distance of about 16½ miles from the deck of a vessel 15 feet above the sea, with a red sector of 20 degrees so adjusted as to show over the Stewart breaker, distant about 4½ miles N. 25° W. (magnetic) from the light-house site.

As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, there was an increase of 4 deaths under zymotic diseases, whilst there was a decrease of 10 deaths under constitutional, \$3 under local diseases, and 9 under ill-defined causes.

Under the zymotic class, deaths from whooping rose from 1 to 10, and those from diphtheria from 1 to 6, whilst those from influenza fell from 14 to 4. Under the constitutional class, deaths from other forms of tuberculosis, &c., rose from 9 to 17, whilst those from cancer fell from 13 to 20. Under the local class, deaths from diseases of the respiratory system diminished by 61, and those from diseases of the digestive system by 15.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria, typhoid fever, and tubercular diseases in each month of the years 1897 to 1902, and the first nine months of 1903, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to Newspite 1899. of the year. It will be n from July to November.
