PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Public Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, provided that only those State Schools shall be closed which are within fifteen miles of the townships specified in brackets, viz.:

- THURSDAY, THE 15TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1903, throughout the Shire of Seymour (Seymour);
- WEDNESDAY, THE 21ST DAY OF OCTOBER, 1903, throughout the Borough of Rutherglen and the Shires of North Ovens and Oxley (Rutherglen);
- THURSDAY, THE 22ND DAY OF OCTOBER, 1903, throughout the Borough of Korait (Warrnambool), and the Shires of Avon and Rosedale (Maffra);
- FRIDAY, THE 23RD DAY OF OCTOBER, 1903, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the Shire of Moorabbin (Cheltenham);
- WEDNESDAY, THE 28TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1903, throughout the Borough of Majorca (Maryborough);
- THURSDAY, THE 29TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1903, throughout the Borough of Sale and the Shires of Avon and Rosedale (Sale), and the Shire of Bairnsdale (Bairnsdale);
- TUESDAY, THE 3RD DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1903, throughout Melbourne* and Suburbs*;
- THURSDAY, THE 5TH DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1903, throughout the Shire of Winchelsea (Winchelsea);
- WEDNESDAY, THE 11TH DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1903, throughout the Boroughs of Dunolly and Echuca;
- FRIDAY, THE 13TH DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1903, throughout the Shire of Creswick (Smeaton);
- FRIDAY, THE 20TH DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1903, throughout the City of Ballarat, and the Town of Ballarat East;

REGULATIONS.—PROMOTION TO HIGHER CLASSES OF THE CLERICAL DIVISION.

CHAPTER III. (A).

THE Public Service Commissioner, in pursuance of the powers vested in him, hereby makes the following regulations and submits the same for the approval of the Governor in Council:—

1. Candidates for promotion to the higher classes of the Clerical Division (Section 53, Act No. 1133) will be examined in the following subjects:—

Section "A."

Full marks.

- (a) Precise writing, letter drafting, preparing regulations and Orders in Council, expressing in simple language the meanings of sections of Acts of Parliament ... 200
(b) The Acts and Regulations administered by or the law a knowledge of which is necessary in the Department to which the officer belongs, routine of office work, method of dealing with correspondence and the public ... 200

Section "B."

- (a) Outlines of the History of the British Empire during the nineteenth century, with such a knowledge of that of other nations and of political and commercial geography as is necessary for understanding such history ... 200
(b) Outlines of the History of Australia and a more detailed History of Victoria ... 100
Or in lieu of (a) and (b).

French—

- (a) Translation at sight of passages from a French newspaper or journal, writing a letter in French ... 200
(b) French reading and conversation ... 100

Or

German—

(extent of examination the same as in French)

Or

Accounts and auditing ... 300

Section "C."

The Constitution of the Commonwealth of Australia and that of Victoria; Local Government in Victoria ... 150

2. In order to pass the examination the officer must obtain at least three-fifths of the full marks in Section "A," and one-half of the full marks in Sections "B" and "C." Where a subject consists of two parts (a) and (b) the required percentage of full marks must be obtained in each part of the subject.

3. The full marks for each question shall be shown on the examination papers for the information of candidates.

4. (I.) Where the Acts and Regulations administered by a Department are very numerous, the Commissioner may prescribe alternative groups of such Acts and Regulations in which officers may be examined.

(II.) Where the work of an officer does not require him to be acquainted with the Acts and Regulations administered by or with the law a knowledge of which is necessary in the working of the Department to which he belongs, he may, with the approval of the Commissioner, select for his examination the Acts and Regulations administered by any Department or any group of such Acts and Regulations prescribed by the Commissioner as provided in the preceding clause.

(III.) Where an officer has within three years of the examination held an office in a Department other than that to which he belongs at the time of the examination, he may at his option be examined either in the Acts and Regulations administered by his former Department, or in those administered by his present Department.

5. An examination will be held at times to be fixed by the Commissioner, of which due notice will be given.

6. Any officer in the Fourth Class of the Clerical Division desirous of being examined must forward a request in writing to that effect to the Commissioner on or before a date to be fixed by him and published in the *Government Gazette*, and such officer must specify the Department and Branch in which he is employed, and, in the case of optional subjects, the subjects in which he desires to be examined.

7. Candidates shall observe any printed directions or any oral directions of the officer in charge of the examination.

8. Examiners and officers in charge will observe any general directions which may be issued by the Commissioner for the preparation, transmission, and marking of examination papers.

9. Each examiner shall, as soon as practicable after any examination forward to the Commissioner a return showing the names of all candidates examined by him, the marks gained by each, and the names of those candidates who have passed.

10. The Commissioner will from such returns prepare a list of officers who have passed the examination, and such list shall be published in the *Government Gazette*.

PRELIMINARY NOTICE.—LIGHT ON KAHURANGI POINT, WEST COAST, SOUTH ISLAND.

NOTICE is hereby given that about the end of November, 1903, a light will be exhibited from a light-house now being erected on Kahurangi Point, West Coast, South Island, in lat. 40° 46' 3" S. and long. 172° 13' 7" E., as measured from the Admiralty Chart.

The light will be about 110 feet above the level of the sea at high water, and will be a dioptric fixed white light of the second order, visible to seaward over an arc of 212 degrees of the horizon for a distance of about 16½ miles from the deck of a vessel 15 feet above the sea, with a red sector of 20 degrees so adjusted as to show over the Stewart breaker, distant about 4½ miles N. 2½° W. (magnetic) from the light-house site.

Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MRS. E. M. RODGERS-WILSON DRESS AND BLOUSE WORK-ROOMS, 443 CHURCH-STREET, RICHMOND,

for a period of eight weeks from the 12th October, 1903, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than six females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said six females shall not be employed for more than fifty-six hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, there was an increase of 4 deaths under zymotic diseases, whilst there was a decrease of 10 deaths under constitutional, 83 under local diseases, and 9 under ill-defined causes.

Under the zymotic class, deaths from whooping rose from 1 to 10, and those from diphtheria from 1 to 6, whilst those from influenza fell from 14 to 4. Under the constitutional class, deaths from other forms of tuberculosis, &c., rose from 9 to 17, whilst those from cancer fell from 13 to 20. Under the local class, deaths from diseases of the respiratory system diminished by 61, and those from diseases of the digestive system by 15.
